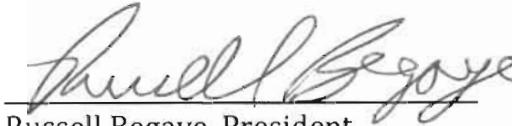

SUBJECT: Resolution No.: CJY-34-15 Relating to Resources and Development, Health, Education and Human Services; Budget and Finance, Naa'bik'iyáti', and Navajo Nation Council; Approving Supplemental Funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the Amount of Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) for the 110 Navajo Nation Chapter's Youth Employment and Scholarship/Educational Assistance; Approving Supplemental Funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the Amount of \$1,500,000 for Teetso Chapter House Replacement

Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. 1005 (C) (10), action for Legislation CJ-33-15, is being submitted to the Navajo Nation Council, through the Office of the Speaker, within the ten (10) days requirement. Furthermore, the Navajo Nation President has line item veto authority for budget items within the annual Navajo Nation Comprehensive Budget or Supplemental appropriations, which are not subject to override by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. 164(A)(17)

After careful consideration and consultation with the Divisions, I have decided to exercise my line-item veto authority and veto **1) \$3,000,000 for the 110 Navajo Nation Chapter's Youth Employment and Scholarships/Educational Assistance; and 2) \$1,500,000 for Teetso Chapter House Replacement.** The justification for use of the President's line-item veto is set forth below.

The original legislation that was circulated for the 5-day public comment period appropriated \$3,000,000 for Summer Youth Employment. This legislation was subject to two (2) amendments. The first amendment was to change the appropriation from "Summer Youth Employment" to "Youth Employment and Scholarship/Educational Assistance". The second amendment was an appropriation

rider in the amount of \$1,500,000 for the Teetso Chapter House replacement. Pursuant to Rule 14(A) of the Navajo Nation Council Rules of Order state "An amendment to the main motion shall only amend a portion of the main motion and not its entirety and shall not *change the intent and purpose of the legislation.*" (Italicized for emphasis)

The original legislation was specifically identified for **summer** youth employment. The purpose was to provide a source of income and work experience for our youth during the summer. The amendment changed "summer" employment to "school break" employment, which would encompass other times of the year such as Christmas or Spring Break. The amendment also expanded the use of the funds beyond employment to scholarship and educational assistance.

From a realistic view, school has begun, summertime is over and the original intent for the legislation is no longer viable unless Council would have appropriated the funds for summer 2016. I understand the reason for removing "summer" to other "school breaks" and expanding the use for scholarships, because it is the immediate need for our Navajo students. The future of the Navajo Nation is our youth and paramount to this administration. Scholarships and financial assistance to further educate and teach our Navajo youth is a priority and we are pleased to see the Council shares this vision. However, we cannot begin our administration by supporting legislation that compromises our own laws. Sovereignty is the ability to make our own laws and be governed by them. We should and must strive to respect and abide by the laws that have been put in place by the Navajo Nation Council and Navajo Nation President. This administration will stand firm on this position.

As such, the intent and purpose for the original resolution was for summer youth employment, not for employment other times of the year and not for scholarships, it should be legislated under a separate resolution, thus Resolution No. CJY-34-15 violates the Navajo Nation Council's Rules of Order 14(A).

Though, this administration strongly appeals to the Navajo Nation Council to **immediately** introduce legislation for our Students. We will fully support legislation that will appropriate funds to all 110 Chapters with an emphasis on scholarships. As the school year is beginning, scholarships and financial assistance is the immediate need for our students. Moreover, this administration fully supports the original legislation and implores the Council to introduce legislation in the spring to appropriate funds for summer youth employment for 2016. Being able to offer paid jobs by the Chapters, prior to summer will be a great incentive for our youth to return home. It is important to this administration to not only educate, provide work experience but bring our youth and our people home.

Lastly, the Teetso Chapter House was not apart of the original legislation, but added to this supplemental appropriation as an appropriation rider. The administration has been clear and unwavering that it will not support appropriation riders. Supplemental appropriations should be closely vetted and prioritized to

meet the greatest needs of the Navajo Nation. Appropriation riders can oftentimes be dangerous and lead to wasteful and reckless spending. As we face upcoming challenges with the budget deficit, the Navajo Nation, including all three branches, must be prudent in the use of the Undesignated, Unreserved Fund Budget.

Furthermore, a claim was filed with the Navajo Nation Risk Management Department. The replacement of the Chapter House is currently being assessed. Once a determination is completed, the building may be replaced through our Insurance Program or cash value given to the Chapter. Until a determination is made, supplemental funding is premature.

RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT, HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES; BUDGET AND FINANCE, NAA'BIK'ÍYÁTI', AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF THREE MILLION DOLLARS (\$3,000,000) FOR THE 110 NAVAJO NATION CHAPTER'S YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND SCHOLARSHIP/EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE; APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,500,000 FOR TEESTO CHAPTER HOUSE REPLACEMENT

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS

- A. The Navajo Nation established the Resources and Development Committee (RDC) as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such gave RDC oversight over Navajo Nation Chapters. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 500 (A), 501 (C)(1) (2012) see also CJA-03-13.
- B. The Navajo Nation established the Health, Education and Human Services Committee (HEHS) as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered HEHS to review and recommend resolutions regarding employment. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 400 (A), 401 (B)(6)(a) (2012) see also CJA-03-13.
- C. The Navajo Nation established the Budget and Finance Committee (B&F) as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered B&F to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 300 (A), 301 (B)(2) (2012) see also CJA-03-13 and 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L) (2009).
- D. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation standing committee and as such proposed legislation that requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 700 (A) (2012) see also CO-45-12.

- E. At the recommendation of RDC, B&F may recommend supplemental appropriations to the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L) (2009).
- F. "Diné Customary Law declares and teaches that [i]t is the right and freedom of the people that our children are provided with education to absorb wisdom, self-knowledge, and knowledge to empower them to make a living and participate in the growth of the Navajo Nation." 1 N.N.C. § 204 (F) (2009).
- G. One way for the Navajo Nation to honor Diné Customary Law is to assist high school and college/university students with temporary employment.
- H. The Youth Employment and Scholarship/Educational Assistance programs offer high school and college/university students the opportunity to gain work experience during their school breaks.
- I. The Youth Employment and Scholarship/Educational Assistance programs offer high school and college/university student the opportunity to have the funds to pay for some of their school expenses.
- J. Allowing high school and college/university students the opportunity to gain work experience and earn money to help pay for some of their school expenses; the Youth Employment and Scholarship/Educational Assistance program aligns with Diné Customary Law by providing Navajo Nation children with "education to absorb wisdom, self-knowledge, and knowledge to empower them to make a living and participate in the growth of the Navajo Nation." *Id.*
- K. The Supplemental Funding will be deposited with each of the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters, allocated at 50/50 Formula (12 N.N.C. § 820(O)); the Program Budget Summary. EXHIBIT A.
- L. The Teesto Chapter was burned on September 6, 2014 and needs to be replaced in order for the community to hold meetings. Budget is attached as Exhibit "C."
- M. The Navajo Nation hereby finds it is in the best interest of the Navajo People to approve this supplemental funding request.

**SECTION 2. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,000,000 FOR 110 NAVAJO NATION CHAPTERS, BUSINESS UNIT NUMBERS 108014-108123**

- A. The Navajo Nation, having received certification by the Office of the Controller that as of May 31, 2015 the balance in the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance is \$4,906,679. EXHIBIT B.
- B. This supplemental appropriation of \$3,000,000 shall be to the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters, Business Unit Numbers 108014-108123; and from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller, pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L) (2009).
- C. The Navajo Nation hereby approves supplemental funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of \$3,000,000 for the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters, Business Unit Numbers 108014-108123, to fund the Youth Employment and Scholarship/Educational Assistance program. This appropriation maybe used to provide up to \$300 to fifty (50) high school students at each Chapter.
- D. The supplemental funding to the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters shall be allocated as follows: "fifty percent (50%) of the appropriation shall be divided equally among all chapters and the remaining fifty percent (50%) shall be divided proportionately among the chapters using a percentage equal to that figure which the number of registered voters in each chapter bears to the whole of registered Navajo Nation votes as determined by the most current voter registration figures available as of the date of the appropriation." *Id.*

**SECTION 3. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$\$1,500,000 FOR TEESTO CHAPTER HOUSE REPLACEMENT, BUSINESS UNIT NUMBER NEW**

- A. The Navajo Nation, having received certification by the Office of the Controller, Exhibit B, of the availability of certain funds from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance hereby approve supplemental appropriation of \$1,500,000 for Teesto Chapter to replace its meeting building with a chapter house/multi-purpose building, as further described in Exhibit "C."

- B. This supplemental appropriation of \$1,500,000 shall be to the Teesto Chapter, Business Unit No. NEW, and from that amount of funds, that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance.

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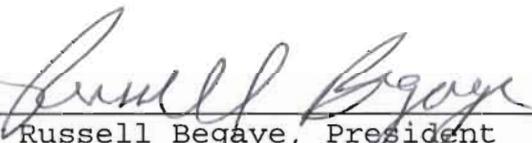

SUBJECT : Financial Update-(General Fund Revenue, Expenditures, UUFB)

The following is the financial data from the General Fund for FY 2015. The total year to date gross General Fund Revenues, see Exhibit "A", as of May 31, 2015 is \$183,370,227 and the total set asides is \$47,549,773. The Net Revenue for the General Fund is \$133,663,586 which is 77.42% of the projection. The total expenditures by branch are shown on Exhibit "B". The Legislative Branch has actual expenditures of \$8,350,802, encumbrances of \$1,047,644, with a remaining budget of \$8,794,501. The Executive Branch actual expenditures are \$126,927,813, encumbrances of \$13,547,442, with a remaining budget of \$83,073,111. The Judicial Branch actual expenditures are \$8,789,840, encumbrances of \$61,953 and remaining budget of \$6,789,909. Total General Fund expenditures are \$144,068,455; total encumbrances are \$14,657,039 leaving an overall remaining General Fund budget of \$98,657,521. The updated UUFB as of May 31, 2015 is 4,906,679, attached Exhibit "C."
