TAOS has submitted a grant application to the Navajo Nation requesting \$446,595 for the purpose of purchasing eleven (11) new vehicles to replace its aged fleet of vehicles. I am happy to support organizations that help Navajo People lift themselves out of poverty.

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 25th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - SECOND YEAR, 2024

AN ACTION

RELATING TO THE HEALTH, EDUCATION, AND HUMAN SERVICES, BUDGET AND FINANCE, AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES, AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING \$446,595 FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE FOR THE TOHATCHI AREA OF OPPORTUNITY & SERVICES, INC. FOR THE PURCHASE OF 11 NEW VEHICLES TO PROVIDE TRANSPORTATION SERVICES FOR ITS CLIENTS

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Health, Education, and Human Services Committee is a Navajo Nation Council standing committee with the authority to oversee all health-related and social services-related activities of the Navajo Nation and its tribal organizations and enterprises." 2 N.N.C. § 401(C)(2).
- B. The Budget and Finance Committee is a Navajo Nation Council standing committee empowered to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. § 300(A), and § 301(B)(2).
- C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a Navajo Nation Council standing committee with the responsibility to review all proposed legislation requiring final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9) and § 700(A).
- D. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation, with the authority to approve supplemental appropriations. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A), 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- E. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), the Navajo Nation Council may approve supplemental appropriations within the current fiscal year, if and when additional revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are collected and which are in excess of the minimum reserve amount required by 12 N.N.C. § 820(J).
- F. Further Title 12 restrictions on supplemental appropriations, including all amounts from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance ("UUFB"), include:

- 1. Payment of recurring government operating expenses shall be from recurring revenues, and payment of nonrecurring expenses shall be from nonrecurring revenues such as UUFB funds. 12 N.N.C. § 820(E); 12 N.N.C. § 820(F).
- 2. Specifically, the UUFB shall not be used for recurring government expenditures or operations. 12 N.N.C. § 820(J); 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- 3. Nonrecurring revenues such as UUFB funds may be used only after the Controller determines if such revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between the Navajo Nation's recurring revenues and expenditures, and expenditures shall only be authorized if a long-term (3-year to 5-year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue; otherwise, nonrecurring revenues will be added to the UUFB. 12 N.N.C. § 820(F).
- 4. The above provisions in Title 12 may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full membership of the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820(F); 12 N.N.C. § 880.
- 5. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. \$ 820(F) all UUFB funding requests must be reviewed by the Controller, to ensure compliance with 12 N.N.C. \$ 820(L).
- 6. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M) all UUFB funding requests must be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for a budget impact analysis.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Tohatchi Area of Opportunity & Services, Inc. ("TAOS"), formerly known as "A School for Me, Inc." was recognized as a Tribal Organization in 1982 by Resolution No. ACJN-69-82. TAOS provides assisted living services, adult rehabilitation, community-based support, employment support, transportation, and other critical services to adults and children with intellectual and developmental disabilities. TAOS serves many Navajo Nation communities.
- B. TAOS is requesting \$446,595 from the UUFB to assist them in providing transportation services to its intellectually and developmentally disabled clients, all of whom are Navajo.
- C. In a letter from the TAOS Executive Director dated September 15, 2023, TAOS explains that the organization urgently needs 11 new vehicles to replace much of their aging, high-mileage,

- high-maintenance, fleet of vehicles. **EXHIBIT 1**. Their current vehicles are old and unreliable and some have been deemed unsafe and cannot be used. See **EXHIBIT 2**.
- D. With the approved UUFB funding, 11 new vehicles can be purchased to provide ready and reliable transportation for TAOS' Navajo clients, so they are able to participate in community activities, attend medical appointments, job interviews, and other critical appointments. **EXHIBIT 3**. The new vehicles will allow TAOS' clients to be empowered and to function as independently as possible.
- E. TAOS' Grant Application (Appendix F from the FY2024 Budget Instructions Manual) and relevant Navajo Nation budget forms, are attached as **EXHIBIT 4**.
- F. The Office of the Controller issued a memorandum dated November 16, 2023 pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L). **EXHIBIT 5**. The Controller has identified TAOS' proposed expenditures as non-recurring. Therefore, this UUFB funding request fits within 12 N.N.C. § 820(F).
- G. The Office of Management and Budget issued a memorandum dated November 13, 2023 pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M). **EXHIBIT 6.**
- H. TAOS's UUFB funding request went through the Section 164 Executive Review and the Navajo Nation Department of Justice has deemed the request to be sufficient. **EXHIBIT 7.**
- I. Several Navajo Nation Chapters and the TAOS Board of Directors have voiced their support for this funding request for TAOS to obtain the needed vehicles. **EXHIBIT 8.**

SECTION THREE. APPROVING \$446,595 FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE FOR THE TOHATCHI AREA OF OPPORTUNITY & SERVICES, INC.

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves \$446,595 from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance for the purchase of 11 new passenger vehicles that will be provided to the Tohatchi Area of Opportunity Services, Inc., as listed in **EXHIBIT 3**.
- B. This \$446,595 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller.

- C. The \$446,595 shall be distributed to the Navajo Nation Division of Social Services ("NNDSS") within twenty (20) days following the effective date of this Action.
- D. Upon receipt of the funds NNDSS shall promptly purchase the 11 new passenger vehicles listed in **EXHIBIT 3** and shall arrange for delivery of the vehicles and transfer of all vehicle titles, to TAOS.
- E. TAOS shall obtain appropriate liability and other insurance policies covering the operation and use of the 11 vehicles. After transfer of title to TAOS, TAOS shall be wholly responsible for the operation, maintenance, and repair of the 11 vehicles, and the Navajo Nation shall not be liable for any condition or event pertaining to the 11 vehicles.
- F. The Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance may be reimbursed the \$446,595 from prospective funds available to the Navajo Nation from any and all state and federal sources, including Congressional appropriations under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 or other sources.

SECTION FOUR. DIRECTIVE

Within ninety calendar days of the effective date of this Action, NNDSS shall provide a written report on the status of expenditures under this legislation, to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee and to the Office of the President and Vice-President.

SECTION FIVE. SAVING CLAUSE

If any provision of this Action is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a District Court of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the rest of the Action shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

SECTION SIX. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Action shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. \S 221(B) and 2 N.N.C. \S 164(A)(17).

WHEREAS:

- 1. The Board of Directors (hereinafter referred to as the "Board") of Tohatchi Area of Opportunity & Services, Inc., (hereinafter referred to as "TAOS") is empowered to look in the best interest of the organization, the individuals served and its employees; and
- 2. TAOS, Inc., is a non-profit, community-based organization that provides Customized Community Supports Individual, Group, Small Group, Community Integrated Employment Services, and Supported Living and Residential Services; and
- 3. The TAOS, Inc., formerly known as A School for Me, was recognized as a Tribal Organization in 1982, by Resolution ACJN-69-82; and
- 4. By Resolution # CO-54-21, the Navajo Nation Council approved supplemental funding form the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to TAOS, Inc to provide transportation services to its clients, in the amount of \$258,512 to purchase 8 vehicles; and
- 5. The funds were provided to the Division of Social Services to administer the funds on behalf of TAOS, Inc. and due to the lengthy processes, the funds were not encumbered in a timely manner, missing the timeline set by the Office of Controller; and
- 6. There were several attempts made by the Office of the President/Vice President and Division of Social Service to process the documentation for the purchase of the vehicles, to no avail and did not meet the cutoff date for submittal of documents for the vehicles; and
- 7. To date TAOS, Inc organization is down to 14 vehicles which has high maintenance, mileage and constantly in repairs, but the clients are still in need of transportation to medical facilities and other essential transportation needs.
- 8. The cost of vehicles has increased and a new amount of \$461,645.49 is included in the proposal.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The TAOS, Inc. Board of Directors hereby approves the proposal to have the Navajo Nation Council reconsider the proposal for 11-vehicle in the amount of \$461,645.49.
- 2. The TAOS Board of Directors further authorizes the Executive Director, Jefferson Kee, to take any and all actions to execute and effectuate the purpose of this resolution.
