AN ACTION

RELATING TO NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE; APPROVING FOR THE NAVAJO NATION POLICE DEPARTMENT DONATION OF POLICE RADARS FROM THE NAVAJO AREA INDIAN HEALTH SERVICES; AND DIRECTING THE NAVAJO NATION POLICE DEPARTMENT TO RECORD THE DONATION OF PROPERTY WITH THE ETHICS AND RULES OFFICE

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 700(A).
- B. Navajo Nation law provides that the President of the Navajo Nation, on behalf of the Navajo Nation, can either accept or decline offers of gifts and donations of property to the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §1010. Gifts or donations, exceeding \$1,000, or estimated values thereof, must be approved by the Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C §§700(A) and 1011. All gifts and donations to the Navajo Nation remain property of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 1010.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS


The Navajo Area of Indian Health Services has donated eight police radars to the Navajo Nation Police Department. See Exhibit "A". The total value of the donated radars is \$19,723.28. Navajo Nation President Russell Begaye accepted the donated radars. *Id.*

SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby concurs with the President of the Navajo Nation's acceptance of police radars donated by the Navajo Area Indian Health Services.
- B. The Navajo Nation Police Department shall record the receipt of the donation accepted here with the Ethics and Rules Office as required by 2 N.N.C. §1012.





Dear Ms. Benally:

The Navajo Nation, through the Navajo Police Department of the Navajo Division of Public Safety ("NDPS"), hereby accepts the radars listed in the attached August 31, 2017 "Request for Property Action Form" from Navajo Area Indian Health Services in Saint Michaels, AZ. These radars, valued in the total amount of \$19,723.28 (nineteen thousand seven hundred twenty-three dollars and twenty-eight cents), is a gift from Navajo Area Indian Health Services. The radars will be used to assist our personnel identifying those drivers that are speeding in excess of the posted speed limit using legally sufficient means. The Navajo Police Department accepts maintenance responsibility for the radars.

Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §§ 1010-1011 and Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJA-06-11, the President accepts this gift on behalf of the Navajo Nation with the concurrence of the Nabik'iyati' Committee because the valuation of this gift exceeds \$1,000 (one thousand dollars). The Navajo Nation appreciates Navajo Area Indian Health Services' significant contribution of radars that will be assist our police officers.

Pursuant to the 2 N.N.C. § 1010 I am requesting your consideration for accepting a donation of property from the Office of Environmental Health of the Navajo Area Indian Health Service in Saint Michaels, Arizona. The donation is for eight Directional Golden Eagle IIX radars. The unit price is \$2,465.41 for a grand total of \$19,723.28 for the eight radars.

Pollack, Frattaroli, Young, Dana-Sacco and Gielen (2012) stated American Indians have the highest motor vehicle death rates and that our ethnic population has four times the motor vehicle death rate than the national average. Speeding is a significant contributor to all manner of crashes—whether fatal, injury or property related. A component of the Navajo Police Department's strategy to address high speed driving is to deploy radars from established vendors into the hands of our commissioned officers. This proposed gift would assist our personnel in identifying those drivers that are speeding in excess of the posted speed limit using legally sufficient means.

Twyla Z. Benally, Area Injury Prevention Specialist, has been working with our office to create this opportunity. She initially reached out to our office on July 17, 2017 inquiring if our department could use equipment related to reducing injuries. She stated she had a budget of approximately \$20,000 to assist the department. She was informed of our need for additional radars. She did request for quote. Those quotes were submitted on the same date. On July 18, 2017 a letter was submitted to her office justifying her consideration for our request. On August 29, 2017 our office was informed that the radars had been approved and had been delivered. They were subsequently received by this office on September 11, 2017.

Our office looks forward to a favorable response from your office and we sincerely appreciate the continued support given from your office to the Division of Public Safety and the Navajo Police Department. Should there be any questions, please do not hesitate in contacting me at 928-871-6363.



SUBJECT : DUI INTERVENTION EFFORTS

The Navajo Police Department is the active law enforcement entity on the Navajo Nation. It is well documented that instances of DUI related traffic crashes are impacting Native American populations disproportionately (Ragland, Bigham, Oum, Chen, & Felschundneff, 2014¹). Therefore, I am seeking partners to expand our infrastructure to reduce these instances of DUI related traffic crashes.

An intervention that I desire to deploy is a traffic enforcement program utilizing commissioned officers that are dedicated to traffic enforcement efforts and expanding the use of unallocated time of officers in the role for traffic enforcement. As a former traffic officer, I found that my contacts with DUI drivers was greatly increased while engaged in traffic speed enforcement. The probable cause to initiate a traffic stop is the verification of the speed infraction using a radar and, consistent with NHTSA guidelines, an officer can then initiate the phases of a DUI investigation if it is warranted.

It has come to my understanding that your office has identified \$20,000 for equipment purchases. I have attached the following three quotes for police traffic enforcement radars. I request your office to consider their purchase to allow the Navajo Police Department to engage in traffic enforcement efforts to impact rates of DUI. Should this purchase be made, the radars will be deployed in patrol vehicles of the Navajo Police Department with commissioned police officers to enforce Title 14 of the Navajo Nation Code for speed infractions which will lead to increased contacts with DUI offenders using the radar as a method of probable cause for the contact.

This purchases would be made consistent with Title 2 Navajo Nation Code §§ 1010 identifying the manner of accepting equipment to the Navajo Nation.
