PURPOSE: This resolution, if approved, will include additional FRF-Eligible projects to Hon. Vince R. James' Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Projects Plan (Chapters: Jeddito, Cornfields, Ganado, Kinlichee, Steamboat) enacted under CD-61-22 and CAP-09-23.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review the proposed resolution in detail.

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §102(A).
- B. The Naabik'iyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the delegated responsibility to hear proposed resolution(s) that require final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9).
- C. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, incorporated herein by reference, mandates that Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund ("NNFRF") Delegate Region Project Plans be approved by Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law

1 by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A) and 2 N.N.C.
2 §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).

3 D. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CD-61-22, herein by reference, mandates that
4 amendments to the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan
5 for Honorable Vince R. James' Delegate Region (Chapter: Jeditio, Cornfields,
6 Ganado, Kinlichee, Steamboat) be approved by a Navajo Nation Council resolution
7 and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164
8 (A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).

9 E. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CAP-09-23, herein by reference, mandates that
10 amendments to the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan
11 for Honorable Vince R. James' Delegate Region (Chapter: Jeditio, Cornfields,
12 Ganado, Kinlichee, Steamboat) be approved by a Navajo Nation Council resolution
13 and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164
14 (A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).

15 16 **SECTION TWO. FINDINGS**

17 A. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, AN ACTION RELATING TO
18 THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL;
19 ALLOCATING \$1,070,298,867 OF NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY
20 FUNDS; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND
21 EXPENDITURE PLANS FOR: CHAPTER AND REGIONAL PROJECTS; PUBLIC
22 SAFETY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS, E911, AND RURAL
23 ADDRESSING PROJECTS; CYBER SECURITY; PUBLIC HEALTH PROJECTS;
24 HARDSHIP ASSISTANCE; WATER AND WASTEWATER PROJECTS;
25 BROADBAND PROJECTS; HOME ELECTRICITY CONNECTION AND
26 ELECTRIC CAPACITY PROJECTS; HOUSING PROJECTS AND
27 MANUFACTURED HOUSING FACILITIES; BATHROOM ADDITION
28 PROJECTS; CONSTRUCTION CONTINGENCY FUNDING; AND REDUCED
29 ADMINISTRATIVE FUNDING, was signed into law by the President of the Navajo
30 Nation on July 15, 2022.

1 B. CJN-29-22, Section Three, states, in part and among other things, that

- 2 1. The Navajo Nation hereby approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter
3 and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from the Navajo Nation Fiscal
4 Recovery Fund in the total amount of two hundred eleven million two
5 hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148)
6 to be divided equally between the twenty-four (24) Delegate Regions in the
7 amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty
8 dollars (\$8,802,340) per Delegate Region . . . and allocated through Delegate
9 Region Project Plans approved by Navajo Nation Council resolution and
10 signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation . . . See CJN-29-22,
11 Section Three (B).
- 12 2. The Delegate Region Project Plan funding will be allocated to the Navajo
13 Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community
14 Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department,
15 to implement the projects rather than directly to the Chapters. See CJN-29-
16 22, Section Three (D).
- 17 3. The Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of
18 Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or
19 Department, shall manage and administer funds and Delegate Region
20 Project Plans on behalf of Non-LGA-Certified Chapters. The Navajo Nation
21 Central Government may award funding to LGA-Certified Chapters through
22 sub-recipient agreements to implement and manage specific projects, but
23 shall maintain Administrative Oversight over such funding and Delegate
24 Region Project Plans. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (E).
- 25 4. Each Navajo Nation Council delegate shall select Fiscal Recovery Fund
26 eligible projects within their Delegate Region to be funded by the NNFRF
27 Chapter and Regional Projects Expenditure Plan through a Delegate Region
28 Projects Plan. The total cost of projects selected by each Delegate shall not
29 exceed their Delegate Region distribution of eight million eight hundred two
30

1 thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340). *See* CJN-29-22, Section
2 Three (F).

- 3 5. Each Delegate Region Project shall identify its Administrative Oversight
4 entity and its Oversight Committee(s) and be subject CJY-41-21's NNDOJ
5 initial eligibility determination. *See* CJN-29-22, Section Three (L)(5) and
6 (L)(6).

7 C. The Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CD-61-22, AN ACTION RELATING TO
8 THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL;
9 APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE
10 REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE VINCE R. JAMES' DELEGATE
11 REGION (CHAPTERS: JEDDITO, CORNFIELDS, GANADO, KINLICHEE,
12 STEAMBOAT), was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on January
13 6, 2023.

14 D. CD-61-22, Section Four, states that:

- 15 1. Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved
16 herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and
17 approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17)
18 and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).

19 E. The Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CAP-09-23, AN ACTION RELATING
20 TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL;
21 APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE
22 REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE VINCE R. JAMES' DELEGATE
23 REGION (CHAPTERS: JEDDITO, CORNFIELDS, GANADO, KINLICHEE,
24 STEAMBOAT), TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL PROJECTS FOR THIS DELEGATE
25 REGION was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on May 4, 2023.

26 F. CAP-09-23, Section Four, states that:

- 27 1. Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved
28 herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and
29 approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17)
30 and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).

1 G. All additional projects listed in the Hon. Vince R. James' Delegate Region Projects
2 Plan, attached as **Exhibit A**, have been deemed Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible by
3 NNDOJ. In addition, Hon. Vince R. James' Delegate Region Projects Plan does *not*
4 exceed the amount of \$8,802,340, as set forth in CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).

5 H. The Navajo Nation Council hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the Navajo
6 Nation and the Hon. Vince R. James' Delegate Region Chapters and communities to
7 approve and adopt the additional projects as part of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery
8 Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Vince R. James' Delegate Region
9 (Chapters: Jeddito, Cornfields, Ganado, Kinlichee, Steamboat) as set forth in **Exhibit**
10 **A**.

12 **SECTION THREE. AMENDING CAP-09-23 AND CD-61-22, THE NAVAJO**
13 **NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN**
14 **FOR HONORABLE VINCE R. JAMES' DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS:**
15 **JEDDITO, CORNFIELDS, GANADO, KINLICHEE, STEAMBOAT), TO**
16 **INCLUDE ADDITIONAL PROJECTS FOR THIS DELEGATE REGION**

17 A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the additional projects as part of the Navajo Nation
18 Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Vince R. James' Delegate
19 Region (Chapters: Jeddito, Cornfields, Ganado, Kinlichee, Steamboat) set forth in
20 **Exhibit A**.

21 B. The Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall comply with all applicable
22 provisions of CJY-41-21, CJN-29-22, and BFS-31-21.

23 C. Any inconsistencies between this legislation, the Delegate Region Project Plan, and the
24 individual project appendix, shall be resolved in favor of the project appendix reviewed
25 by Department of Justice during their eligibility determination(s).

26
27 **SECTION FOUR. AMENDMENTS**

28 Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein
29 shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the
30

1 President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005
2 (C) (10), (11), and (12).

3
4 **SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE**

5 This legislation shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221(B), 2 N.N.C.
6 § 164 (A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).

7
8 **SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE**

9 If any provision of this legislation is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court,
10 or by a Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court,
11 those provisions of this legislation not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo
12 Nation.

Cornfields Chapter Expenditure Plan

The purpose of the Cornfields Chapter Expenditure Plan is to allow the use and expenditure of nine hundred eighty thousand four hundred sixty-eight dollars (\$980,468.00) to support the Cornfields Chapter to assist families with home improvement/renovation. This will ensure that the people are adequately protected from exposure to the further spread of COVID-19 and interior and exterior repairs ensure the longevity of homes.

The Cornfields Chapter home improvement/renovation project will assist approximately 100 homes with; roofing, interior and exterior walls, flooring, plumbing repairs, replacing windows, doors, bedroom addition, chimney, handicap ramp, and electricity upgrade.

Building materials will be purchase up to \$5,200.00 per home. To qualify community members must submit an application. Homes will then be identified and assess which will then determine the type of improvement or renovation is needed.
