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20	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY
21	A. The Resources and Development Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation
22	Council with oversight authority over all 110 Navajo Nation Chapters. 2 N.N.C. §500(C); 26
23	N.N.C. §102.
24	B. The Budget and Finance Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council
25	with the responsibility to "review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the
26	budgeting, appropriation, investment and management of all funds." 2 N.N.C. §301(B)(2).
27	C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council that
28	considers all proposed final actions by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(9).
29	D. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §102(A).
30	As such, the Council may approve appropriations from the Navajo Nation's Síhasin Fund.

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E. 12 N.N.C. §2502, as amended by CJA-03-18, states the purpose of the Navajo Nation Síhasin Fund ("Síhasin Fund") as follows:

§2502 Purpose

- A. The purposes of this Fund are to provide financial support and/or financing for:
  - 1. The planning and development of economic development and regional infrastructure supporting economic development and community development, including such infrastructure as, but not limited to, housing, commercial and government buildings, waterline, solid waste management development, powerline projects, and transportation and communication systems, within the Navajo Nation; . . .
- B. For the Purpose in §2502(A)(1), Fund expenditures for infrastructure shall not be limited by 12 N.N.C. §1310(F) or TCDCJY-77-99.
- C. Leveraging the Fund by way of guaranteeing loans, match funding, direct funding in part, and other weighted uses of the Fund, including loan financing from the Fund, for the purposes in §2502(A)(1), shall be favored over direct funding in whole.
- F. The Síhasin Fund provides that "Fund Principal" shall consist of all deposits made to the Síhasin Fund and that "Fund Income" shall consist of all earnings (interest, dividends, etc.) generated and realized by the Fund Principal, and that Síhasin Fund Income shall be deposited in, and added to, the Fund Principal until such time as a Fund Expenditure Plan is duly approved. 12 N.N.C. §2504 and §2505(C).
- G. The Síhasin Fund provides that "Fund Principal and Income shall not be expended except pursuant to a Fund Expenditure Plan consistent with the purposes set forth in §2502 of this Chapter and adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Navajo Nation Council." 12 N.N.C. §2505(A).

### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

A. The Division of Economic Development ("DED"), on behalf of the Chiłchinbeto Chapter, is requesting \$5,000,000 from the Sihasin Fund for the planning, design, and construction of a proposed Convenience Store/Fuel Station Project ("Project") in the Chapter. DED explains

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# SECTION THREE. ALLOCATING \$5,000,000 FROM THE SÍHASIN FUND FOR THE CHIŁCHINBETO CONVENIENCE STORE/FUEL STATION PROJECT; APPROVING THE RELATED EXPENDITURE PLAN FOR THE PROJECT

DED with the requested \$5,000,000 in Síhasin Funds is in the best interest of the Navajo

- A. In accordance with 12 N.N.C. §2505(A), the Navajo Nation hereby approves \$5,000,000 out of the Síhasin Fund for the Chiłchinbeto Convenience Store/Fuel Station Project, as explained in the attached EXHIBIT A and EXHIBIT C.
- B. The \$5,000,000 in Síhasin funds approved herein may be further leveraged by bond or loan financing pursuant to the Navajo Nation Bond Financing Act (12 N.N.C. §1300 *et seq.*, as amended), using Síhasin Fund earnings for repayment and financing costs, upon approval of the Budget and Finance Committee and upon further approval by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the full membership of the Navajo Nation Council.

- C. The Controller shall determine whether the source of the \$5,000,000 approved herein will be Síhasin Fund Principal or Síhasin Fund Income, or a combination of both.
- D. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the Expenditure Plan for the Chiłchinbeto Convenience Store/Fuel Station Project, as set forth in the attached EXHIBIT A and EXHIBIT C.
- E. The \$5,000,000 approved herein shall be disbursed to DED within twenty (20) business days after the effective date of this Act. DED shall then arrange for use of the \$5,000,000 for the planning, design, and construction of the Chiłchinbeto Convenience Store/Fuel Station Project.
- F. The DED shall be responsible for ensuring compliance with the Project's Expenditure Plan, as well as all Navajo Nation laws and regulations pertaining to the Project.
- G. Any and all savings or unused amounts of the Síhasin funds approved herein shall be immediately returned to the Síhasin Fund Principal once the Project is completed, or upon the reversion deadline in Section Three (H) below.
- H. The \$5,000,000 shall not lapse on an annual basis, which would otherwise occur pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §820(N). However, any Síhasin funds not spent or encumbered within twenty-four (24) months of the date DED receives the \$5,000,000 shall then immediately revert to the Síhasin Fund Principal, unless otherwise approved by both the Resources and Development Committee and the Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council.
- I. The Síhasin Fund shall be reimbursed the \$5,000,000 amount approved herein, from funds available to the Navajo Nation from any and all state and federal sources, including Congressional appropriations under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 or other COVID-19-related relief, so long as the Project expenditures described herein are deemed eligible under such COVID-19-related or other funding sources.

### SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Act and the approved Expenditure Plan for the Chiłchinbeto Convenience Store/Fuel Station Project shall become effective pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §2505.

### SECTION FIVE. SAVING CLAUSE

If any portion of this Act is invalidated by the Supreme Court of the Navajo Nation, or by any

The store, gas station, and the laundry mat will be occupied by and operator who will pay lease to the Navajo Nation. The community of Chilchinbeto be served by the new development after completion. During the Covid-19 pandemic the Chilchinbeto community was an effected area by the virus. During these uncertian time the community was isolated and didn't have a store, gas station, and laundry mat for taking care of personal amenities needed by the community members. Shopping center were miles away 25 mile to northwest and 34 mile to the southeast was the nearest store with less infected resident residing there. Communities should have access to its own resources, like now during the Covid-19 pandemic, and for the safety of the community.

Chilchinbeto is a rural area with many miles of travel to the grocery stores, gas station, and laundry mats. The convenient store will help the community boost their economy, buy food, fuel for their vehicle, home, and cooking. Employment opportunity for people living in the area. The availibility of Luandry mat where people can go to wash their clothes. For those that do not has washing machine ot running water or traveler who are visiting the area. Chilchinbeto has a 75% unemployment rate and about 70% improvish rural community of 600 people.





The purpose of this letter is to express the desire of Red Mesa Trading Co., Inc. ("Red Mesa") to obtain a new business site lease for the proposed development located on Navajo Route 59 in Chilchinbito, Arizona.
