RESOLUTION OF THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' STANDING COMMITTEE 24th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL -- Second Year, 2020

AN ACTION RELATING TO HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI'; SUPPORTING HOUSE BILL 116, A BILL INTRODUCED IN THE UTAH STATE LEGISLATURE TO CREATE THE "MURDERED AND MISSING INDIGENOUS WOMEN AND GIRLS TASK FORCE"

WHEREAS:

- A. There exists a crisis in the United States concerning missing indigenous women and girls. In 2016, the Urban Indian Health Institute found that of the 5716 such missing cases, only 117 cases were inputted in the database maintained by the United States Department of Justice. See, "Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls, a report issued by the Urban Indian Health Institute, http://www.uihi.org. It is also reported, "generations of killings and disappearances disregarded by law enforcement and lost in bureaucratic gaps concerning which local or federal agencies should investigate." See, https://www.nytimes.com/2019/12/25/us/native-womengirls-missing.html.
- B. The legislature of the state of Utah has introduced a bill to create a task force on "Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women and Girls." See Exhibit A. The Task Force would consult with tribal and federal governments on issues regarding missing and murdered indigenous women and girls, including developing procedures for addressing new and unsolved cases.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

The Navajo Nation hereby supports the legislature of the state of Utah in its proposed bill to create a task force on "Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women and Girls," House Bill 116.

33	(1) As used in this section, "task force" means the Murdered and Missing Indigenous				
34	Women, Girls, and LGBTQ+ Task Force created in Subsection (2).				
35	(2) There is created a Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women, Girls, and LGBTQ+				
36	Task Force consisting of the following 15 members:				
37	(a) three members of the Senate appointed by the president of the Senate, no more than				
38	two of whom may be from the same political party;				
39	(b) three members of the House of Representatives appointed by the speaker of the

63	(4) (a) The president of the Senate shall designate a member of the Senate appointed
64	under Subsection (2)(a) as a cochair of the task force.
65	(b) The speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate a member of the House
66	of Representatives appointed under Subsection (2)(b) as a cochair of the task force.
67	(5) (a) A quorum consists of:
68	(i) a majority of the legislator members from each chamber; and
69	(ii) a majority of the nonlegislator members.
70	(b) The action of a majority of a quorum constitutes an action of the task force.
71	(6) (a) Salaries and expenses of the members of the task force who are legislators shall

91	(c) study an effective mechanism for law enforcement in Utah to collect uniform data					
92	improvements for law enforcement in addressing the murdered and missing indigenous

94	(d) based on review and analysis of the collected data, recommend improvements in					
95	the criminal justice and social service systems for preventing and addressing the murdered and

97	(9) (a) On or before November 30, 2020, the task force shall provide a report, including					
98	any proposed legislation, to the Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Interim Committee.

00	(i) existing or proposed institutional policies and practices that are effective in reducing					
01	gender violence and increasing safety of indigenous women, girls, and LGBTQ+; and					
02	(ii) recommendations for improvements in the criminal justice and social service					
03	systems for preventing and addressing the murdered and missing indigenous women, girls, and					
04	LGBTQ+ crisis in Utah.					
05	Section 2. Appropriation.
