PURPOSE: This resolution, if adopted, would accept Grant No. 2020-Vd-Bx-0632 for project entitled Navajo Nation Coronavirus Emergency Response in the amount of \$486,348.00 from the Office of Justice Programs, U.S. Department of Justice for the period January 20, 2020 to January 31, 2022.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

C. The Navajo Nation has a government-to-government relationship with the federal government. *Treaty of 1868*.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

A. The Navajo Nation Division of Public Safety, under project entitled "Navajo nation Coronavirus Emergency Response" and pursuant to pursuant to the Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding Program, Public Law 116-136 submitted a grant request to the Office of Justice Program, U.S. Department of Justice. On May 20, 2020, the Office of Justice Program approved the request and authorized an award in the amount of \$486,348.00. See attached **Exhibit A**, award notice and conditions of the award.

B. The Navajo Nation Department of Justice reviewed the award and related documents, and determined such documents to be legally sufficient. See attached **Exhibit B**.

C. On August 21, 2020, Navajo Nation President Jonathan Nez signed the grant as awarded.

D. It is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation that the grant award provided to the Navajo Nation in the amount of \$486,348.00 by the Office of Justice Program, U.S. Department of Justice.

SECTION THREE. ACCEPTING AND APPROVING GRANT AWARD

The Navajo Nation hereby accepts and approves grant no. 2020-VD-BX-0632 for project entitled "Navajo Nation Coronavirus Emergency Response" in the amount of \$486,348.00 from the Office of Justice Programs, U.S. Department of Justice for the period January 20, 2020 to January 31, 2022. On behalf of Attorney General William P. Barr, it is my pleasure to inform you that the Office of Justice Programs (OJP), U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), has approved the application by Navajo Nation Tribal Government for an award under the OJP funding opportunity entitled "BJA FY 20 Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding Program." Congratulations on your recent award. The Office for Civil Rights (OCR), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) has been delegated the responsibility for ensuring that recipients of federal financial assistance from the OJP, the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS), and the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) are not engaged in discrimination prohibited by law. 5. Required training for Point of Contact and all Financial Points of Contact

Both the Point of Contact (POC) and all Financial Points of Contact (FPOCs) for this award must have successfully completed an "OJP financial management and grant administration training" by 120 days after the date of the recipient's acceptance of the award. Successful completion of such a training on or after January 1, 2018, will satisfy this condition.

9. Employment eligibility verification for hiring under the award

1. The recipient (and any subrecipient at any tier) must--

4. Rules of construction

A. Staff involved in the hiring process

For purposes of this condition, persons "who are or will be involved in activities under this award" specifically includes (without limitation) any and all recipient (or any subrecipient) officials or other staff who are or will be involved in the hiring process with respect to a position that is or will be funded (in whole or in part) with award funds.

B. Employment eligibility confirmation with E-Verify

For purposes of satisfying the requirement of this condition regarding verification of employment eligibility, the recipient (or any subrecipient) may choose to participate in, and use, E-Verify (www.e-verify.gov), provided an appropriate person authorized to act on behalf of the recipient (or subrecipient) uses E-Verify (and follows the proper E-Verify procedures, including in the event of a "Tentative Nonconfirmation" or a "Final Nonconfirmation") to confirm employment eligibility for each hiring for a position in the United States that is or will be funded (in whole or in part) with award funds.

any person or other entity, to violate any federal law, including any applicable civil rights or nondiscrimination law.

E. Nothing in this condition, including in paragraph 4.B., shall be understood to relieve any recipient, any subrecipient at any tier, or any person or other entity, of any obligation otherwise imposed by law, including 8 U.S.C. 1324a(a)(1) and (2).



All recipients of CESF funding must assist BJA in complying with NEPA and other related federal environmental impact analyses requirements in the use of grant funds, whether the funds are used directly by the grantee or by a sub-grantee or third party.

BJA's expectation is that none of the following activities will be conducted whether under this federal award or a related third party action:

(1) New construction

(2) Any renovation or remodeling of a property located in an environmentally or historically sensitive area, including property (a) listed on or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places, or (b) located within a 100-year flood plain, a wetland, or habitat for an endangered species
