## AN ACTION

RELATING TO NAABIK' ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE; SUPPORTING AND RECOMMENDING THE PASSAGE OF HOUSE BILL 2198, 53rd LEGISLATURE - STATE OF ARIZONA TITLED AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES STUDY COMMITTEE

WHEREAS:
A. The Navajo Nation established the Naabik'íyati' Committee as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered Naabik'íyáti' Committee to assist and coordinate all requests for information, appearances and testimony relating to proposed county, state and federal legislation impacting the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A) (9), 701 (A) (4), $701(A)(6)$ (2015); CO-45-12.
B. Statements of policy are written statements submitted to federal, state or local governments by a Navajo Nation official stating the official position of the Navajo Nation on proposed legislation or other action by that government. 2 N.N.C. § 100 (W).
C. House Bill 2198 (H.B. 2198) sponsored by Carter and cobb was introduced to the 53rd Legislature First Regular Session 2017 State of Arizona; H.B. 2198 is attached as Exhibit A.
D. H.B. 2198 is an act establishing the adverse childhood experiences study committee.
E. The Navajo Nation respectfully requests an amendment to H.B. 2198 to include a member of the Arizona Advisory Council on Indian Healthcare to the adverse childhood experiences study committee.
F. It is within the best interest of the Navajo Nation to support the passage of H.B. 2198 with a proposed amendment to include a committee member from the Arizona Advisory Council on Indian Healthcare.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:
A. The Navajo Nation hereby supports and recommends the passage of H.B. 2198 with a proposed amendment to include a committee member from the Arizona Advisory Council on Indian Healthcare, attached as Exhibit A.
B. The Navajo Nation hereby authorizes the Navajo Nation President, the Navajo Nation Speaker, the Navajo Nation Chief Justice and their
designees, to advocate for the passage of H.B. 2198 with a proposed amendment to include a committee member from the Arizona Advisory Council on Indian Healthcare.

## HB 2198

AN ACT<br>ESTABLISHING THE ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES STUDY COMMITTEE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:
Section 1. Adverse childhood experiences study committee: duties: report: delayed repeal: definition
A. The adverse childhood experiences study committee is established consisting of the following members:

1. Three members of the house of representatives who are appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, not more than two of whom are members of the same political party. The speaker of the house of representatives shall designate one of these members to serve as cochairperson of the committee.
2. Three members of the senate who are appointed by the president of the senate, not more than two of whom are members of the same political party. The president of the senate shall designate one of these members to serve as cochairperson of the committee.
3. One member who represents an Arizona free-standing children's hospital with more than three hundred 1 icensed beds and who is appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.
4. One member who represents an Arizona hospital that serves both adult and pediatric patients and who is appointed by the president of the senate.
5. One member who represents a regional behavioral health authority and who is appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.
6. One mental health expert with experience with pediatric health and adverse childhood experiences who is appointed by the president of the senate.
7. Two health care professionals, one of whom is appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and one of whom is appointed by the president of the senate.
8. Two citizens who reside in this state with personal history of adverse childhood experiences, at least one of whom is a member of an ethnic minority group, one of whom is appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and one of whom is appointed by the president of the senate.
9. Two members of a community organization dedicated to researching adverse childhood experiences in this state, one of whom is appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and one of whom is appointed by the president of the senate.
10. The director of the department of health services or the director's designee.
11. The director of the department of child services or the director's designee.
12. The director of the department of economic security or the director's designee.
B. Members of the committee are not eligible to receive compensation or reimbursement of expenses.
C. A majority of the members of the committee constitutes a quorum.
D. The committee shall conduct a thorough study of all matters relating to adverse childhood experiences, including prevention, treatment, long-term effects on individuals and effects on the health and well-being of citizens in this state as a whole, including effects on high school graduation rates, unemployment rates, risky health behaviors and chronic health conditions.
E. On or before March 1, 2018, the committee shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the governor, the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives and shall provide a copy of this report to the secretary of state.
F. This section is repealed from and after June 30, 2018.
G. For the purposes of this section, "health care professional" means a person who is licensed pursuant to title 32 , chapter $13,14,17$ or 25. Arizona Revised Statutes, or a nurse practitioner who is licensed pursuant to title 32 , chapter 15 , Arizona Revised Statutes.
