AN ACTION

RELATING TO THE BUDGET AND FINANCE, HEALTH, EDUCATION, AND HUMAN SERVICES, AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES, AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING \$863,570 FROM THE SÍHASIN FUND TO THE OFFICE OF DINÉ YOUTH TO COVER A FUNDING SHORTFALL FOR THE CROWNPOINT YOUTH COMPLEX; APPROVING THE RELATED EXPENDITURE PLAN

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Budget and Finance Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the responsibility to "review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the budgeting, appropriation, investment and management of all funds." 2 N.N.C. § 301(B)(2).
- B. The Health, Education, and Human Services Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with authority over education matters, and the Department of Diné Education. 2 N.N.C. § 400(C)(1); 2 N.N.C. § 401(C)(1)
- C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council that considers all proposed final actions by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9).
- D. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A). As such, the Council may approve appropriations from the Navajo Nation's Síhasin Fund.
- E. 12 N.N.C. § 2502, as amended by CJA-03-18, states the purpose of the Navajo Nation Síhasin Fund ("Síhasin Fund") as follows:

§ 2502 Purpose

- A. The purposes of this Fund are to provide financial support and/or financing for:
  - 1. The planning and development of economic development and regional infrastructure supporting economic development and community development, including such infrastructure as, but not limited to, housing, commercial and government buildings, waterline, solid waste management development, powerline Projects, and transportation and communication systems, within the Navajo Nation; . . .

- B. For the Purpose in § 2502(A)(1), Fund expenditures for infrastructure shall not be limited by 12 N.N.C. § 1310(F) or TCDCJY-77-99.
- C. Leveraging the Fund by way of guaranteeing loans, match funding, direct funding in part, and other weighted uses of the Fund, including loan financing from the Fund, for the purposes in § 2502(A)(1), shall be favored over direct funding in whole.
- F. The Síhasin Fund provides that "Fund Principal" shall consist of all deposits made to the Síhasin Fund and that "Fund Income" shall consist of all earnings (interest, dividends, etc.) generated and realized by the Fund Principal, and that Síhasin Fund Income shall be deposited in, and added to, the Fund Principal until such time as a Fund Expenditure Plan is duly approved. 12 N.N.C. § 2504 and § 2505(C).
- G. The Síhasin Fund also provides that "Fund Principal and Income shall not be expended except pursuant to a Fund Expenditure Plan consistent with the purposes set forth in § 2502 of this Chapter and adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Navajo Nation Council." 12 N.N.C. § 2505(A).

## SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Office of Diné Youth ("ODY"), under the Department of Diné Education, is requesting \$863,570 from the Síhasin Fund to cover a funding shortfall for its Crownpoint Youth Complex project. **EXHIBIT A.**
- B. ODY has provided a detailed Scope of Work for the project shortfall. **EXHIBIT B.**
- C. ODY has also provided a detailed Cost Estimate for each aspect of the project shortfall, explaining the individual proposed expenditures that total the requested amount of \$863,570. **EXHIBIT C.** Detailed proposals from each of the seven companies listed in EXHIBIT C are available from ODY.
- D. ODY has provided Budget Forms for the requested \$863,570. **EXHIBIT D.**
- E. The Crownpoint Chapter has expressed its support for ODY's funding request to finish the Crownpoint Youth Complex project. **EXHIBIT E.**
- F. Receipt of the \$863,570 in Síhasin funds will enable ODY to complete its Crownpoint Youth Complex project. Therefore, the Navajo Nation finds the approval of the requested Síhasin funds

to be in the best interests of the Navajo Nation and the Navajo People.

**SECTION THREE. APPROVING \$863,570 FROM THE SÍHASIN FUND TO THE OFFICE OF DINÉ YOUTH TO COVER A FUNDING SHORTFALL FOR THE CROWNPOINT YOUTH COMPLEX; APPROVING THE RELATED EXPENDITURE PLAN**

- A. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 2505(A), the Navajo Nation hereby approves \$863,570 from the Síhasin Fund to the Department of Diné Education/Office of Diné Youth for the completion of its Crownpoint Youth Complex project, as explained in EXHIBITS A-D. Further, the Navajo Nation hereby approves the related Expenditure Plan as set forth in the listed EXHIBITS A-D.
- B. The Navajo Nation Controller shall determine whether the source of the approved \$863,570 amount from the Síhasin Fund will be from Fund Principal or Fund Income or a combination of both.
- C. The Síhasin funds allocated for the Expenditure Plan approved herein may be further leveraged by bond or loan financing pursuant to the Navajo Nation Bond Financing Act, at 12 N.N.C. § 1300 *et seq.*, as amended, using Síhasin Fund earnings for repayment and financing costs upon the recommendation of the Budget and Finance Committee and approval by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Navajo Nation Council.
- D. The Síhasin funds approved herein shall be disbursed to the DODE/ODY within twenty (20) business days following the effective date of this Action. Upon receipt of the approved funds, DODE/ODY shall promptly implement the Expenditure Plan approved herein.
- E. The approved Síhasin funds shall not be comingled with any other funds, and shall be used by strictly for the Expenditure Plan approved herein. DODE/ODY shall be responsible for ensuring that all expenditures comply with the approved Expenditure Plan.
- F. The approved Síhasin funds shall not lapse at the end of any fiscal year, as might otherwise occur under 12 N.N.C. § 820(N), so long as: (1) all Síhasin funds are accounted for as of September 30 of each fiscal year; and (2) any/all remaining Síhasin funds are budgeted in the next upcoming fiscal year for use on the same Expenditure Plan.
- G. Notwithstanding Section Three (F) above, any remaining amount of Síhasin funds not expended or encumbered by September 30, 2024 shall revert to the Síhasin Fund, unless determined otherwise prior to such reversion by the Naabik'íyáti' Committee.

**SECTION FOUR. DIRECTIVE**

ODY shall submit written reports, and verbal reports if so requested, explaining the ongoing status of the Expenditure Plan approved herein and its expenditures of the \$863,570 in Síhasin funds. Said reports shall be provided to the Health, Education, and Human Services Committee, the Budget and Finance Committee, and the Naabik'íyáti' Committee by the end of each Fiscal Year Quarter until the Crownpoint Youth Complex project is completed, or until all approved Síhasin funds are exhausted, or upon the September 30, 2024 reversion deadline in Section Three (G) herein.

**SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Action and the related Expenditure Plan shall become effective pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 2505(A) and 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).

**SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE**

If any part of this Action is invalidated by the Supreme Court of the Navajo Nation, or by any Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Action shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.

**CERTIFICATION**

I, hereby, certify that the foregoing resolution was duly considered by the 25<sup>th</sup> Navajo Nation Council at a duly called meeting in Window Rock, Navajo Nation (Arizona), at which a quorum was present and that the same was passed by a vote of 21 in Favor, and 01 Opposed, on this 18<sup>th</sup> day of April 2023.



SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR ADDITIONAL FUNDINGS

The Diné YOUTH – Crownpoint Agency is currently in construction of the Crownpoint Youth Complex of which it is 98% complete. The Construction has a shortfall and requires additional funding in the amount of \$863,570.00 to cover unanticipated costs, including but not limited to the following:

- o Material costs, including but not limited to steel, have substantially increased due to changes in the Federal Trade Policy. In addition, overall cost of construction track with the cost of inflation, typically at 3% per year and due to the Pandemic.
- o IT infrastructure Implementation Project: Internet, Telephone Service, Video Surveillance, TV devices, Network switching, Wireless network.
- o Technologies scope of work entail numerous items, such as: Telecommunication cabling installation, routing, designing, and testing in fiber optics-multi mode, signal mode, ribbon, patch cables, terminations, and testing.
- o Frontier; DIA (Dedicated Internet Access)
- o CDEC; Transformer; underground primary services
- o NTUA; Natural Gas Line Services
- o Gymnasium Flooring; Mondo flooring for the Gymnasium and the weight room.
- o Norcom; Curtain rods, Backstop/Volleyball Posts, Scoreboard/wireless Controllers, Premier paired panels, two tier lockers/wood locker benches, stage curtains and lighting.

I am kindly requesting your approval to complete the Crownpoint Youth Complex for our Navajo youth. Thank you.

Diné Y.O.U.T.H-Crownpoint Agency was established by the Navajo Tribal Council in 1979. Our program is within the Department of Diné Education.

Our Program believes it has the moral obligation to insure that the Navajo Youth be entitled to all benefits and services available to them and that they be provided in a manner that develops positive attitudes, enhances self-image, confidence, maturity and pride in being a productive member of society.

We are located in the midst of what is known as the "Checkerboard Area". Crownpoint Agency offers a unique setup with Crownpoint being the "Central Point". The target group of the Dine Y.O.U.T.H. is 5 – 24 years of age. We provide services to Chapters, Schools and surrounding Communities with Crownpoint Agency. The hours of our operation are Monday – Friday, 8:00 am to 7:00 p.m. If necessary, the hours will go well beyond normal working hours including weekends; catering to the program's activities. At the present time, we have nine (9) regular status employees whom provide services to approximately 15,000 through out year in the areas of; Recreation, Prevention and Youth Employment Program.

The mission of Diné Y.O.U.T.H. is to advocate, educate and develop resilient healthy generations of youth through partnerships to balance and live in a diverse society. Our goal is to instill in our youth a sense of personal responsibility and accountability for their actions.

**Through our Afterschool Program** our goal is to inspire and enable young people to realize their full potential as productive, responsible and caring citizens. Our strategy is to promote the development of young people by instilling a sense of competence, a sense of usefulness, a sense of belonging and a sense of power or influence. When this strategy is fully implemented, self esteem is enhanced and an environment is created which helps our young Children achieve their full potential. The age groups that we serve are from five (5) to eighteen (18) years of age. Services are provided Monday thru Friday and some weekends.

**Through the Recreation Program** our goal is to basically provide a variety of recreational activities that enable the youth to show improvement in their self-esteem and lifestyles; and be inspired to continue their creativeness and ability to communicate with others, mentally and physically through group/team efforts such as Sports, Cultural teachings and other social activities. The age groups that we serve are from five (5) years to eighteen (18) years of age,

**Through the Prevention Program** our goal is to identify positive alternatives for youth, while emphasizing and encouraging family and social interaction through direct services. Prevention is a healing tool and may be very helpful to youth whom confront various issues involving substance abuse, violence, staying in school and others.

**Through the Youth Employment Program** our goal is to provide temporary employment opportunities for youth ages 14 – 24. Employment is utilized as an encouragement and to motivate youth to stay in school and complete High School, College or Vocational Technical education.

**Background Narrative:**

The Crownpoint Youth Complex consists of the construction of a new 27,140 sf youth complex in Crownpoint, New Mexico, situated adjacent to the existing Office of Dine Youth. The facility includes a gymnasium with adjacent stage area and adjoining locker/shower facilities, full kitchen, wight room, teen center, art classroom, library, offices, equipment rental space, and classrooms for the growing membership of local children, ages 5 to 18. Exterior amenities will include a playground, Amphitheatre and gardening area along with much needed parking.

The single-story structure is comprised of masonry and steel stud clad with either metal panels or EIFS, steel roof joists and membrane roofing, and a concrete slab on an engineered fill foundation along with related site improvements. The arrangement of building masses and interior spaces provide high visibility during operational and especially non-operational hours. Hard, durable, and easily maintainable surfaces including exposed architectural concrete, load-bearing masonry construction in various colors, textures and massing throughout the building and insulated metal wall systems, provide a building that is not only beautiful but able to withstand many years of heavy use. In ongoing efforts to address every increasing concerns for energy conservation and sustainability, both passive and active energy conserving strategies are employed throughout.




