PURPOSE: The purpose of this resolution is to supports Nageezi Resolution \# NC 18-043 and request the New Mexico Department of Transportation to address the concerns of the Nageezi residents and decrease the speed limits on U.S. Highway 550 between mile markers 126 and 128 and mile markers 112 and 116 from 70 mph to 55 mph .

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

## AN ACTION

## WHEREAS:

A. The Navajo Nation established the Resources and Development Committee as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered the committee "to promulgate rules and regulations governing transportation, community development, local government units, land acquisitions for the Navajo Nation, environmental protection, and the use, sale, exchange and development of Navajo Nation lands and/or resources, whether held in fee or trust status." 2 N.N.C. §§ 500 (A), 501 (B)(1).
B. The Navajo Nation established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered Naabik'iyáti' Committee to coordinate all state programs, i.e. New Mexico Department of Transportation, to provide efficient services to Navajo members. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 700 (A), 701 (A)(4) (2012). See also CO-45-12.
C. The Navajo Nation has a government-to-government relationship with the State of New Mexico.
D. On February 2, 2018, the Nageezi Chapter of the Navajo Nation passed Resolution \# NC 18-043 titled "Requesting New Mexico Department of Transportation ("NMDOT") to Decrease Speed Limits on U.S. Highway 550 Between Mile Markers 126 and 128 and Mile Markers 112 and 116 from 70 MPH to 55 MPH ; and Requesting New Mexico State Senator Benny Shendo, Jr. to Assist Nageezi Chapter in their Request to NMDOT" and is attached hereto as Exhibit A.
E. The residents of the Nageezi Chapter vicinity have expressed their concerns about the current speed limit and the chapter has made previous requests to the NMDOT with no response or action. Residents have witnessed vehicular accidents and deaths of both passengers and pedestrians along the highway and attribute the accidents and deaths to the current speed limit. Id.
F. The Navajo Nation supports Nageezi Chapter's request as the community has expressed a legitimate concern for the health, safety and welfare of their residents based on their observation of the impact the current speed limit has on the community.

## NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

A. The Navajo Nation hereby supports Nageezi Resolution \# NC 18-043 titled "Requesting New Mexico Department of Transportation ("NMDOT") to Decrease Speed Limits on U.S. Highway 550 Between Mile Markers 126 and 128 and Mile Markers 112 and 116 from 70 MPH to 55 MPH; and Requesting New Mexico State Senator Benny Shendo, Jr. to Assist Nageezi Chapter in their Request to NMDOT" attached hereto as Exhibit A.
B. The Navajo Nation respectfully requests the New Mexico Department of Transportation to address the concerns of the Nageezi residents and decrease the speed limits on U.S. Highway 550 between mile markers 126 and 128 and mile markers 112 and 116 from 70 mph to 55 mph .
C. The Navajo Nation hereby authorizes the President of the Navajo Nation, the Navajo Nation Washington Office, the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council and
their designees, to advocate the concerns expressed herein by the Nageezi Chapter.

# RESOLUTION OF NAGEEZI CHAPTER EASTERN AGENCY, DISTRICT 19 

## RESOLUTION \# NC 18-043

REQUESTING NEW MEXICO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION ("NMDOT") TO DECREASE SPEED LIMITS ON U.S. HIGHWAY 550 BETWEEN MILE MARKERS 126 AND 128 AND MILE MARKERS 112 AND 116 FROM 70 MPH TO 55 MPH ; AND REQUESTING NEW MEXICO STATE SENATOR BENNY SHENDO, JR. TO ASSIST NAGEEZI CHAPTER IN THEIR REQUEST TO NMDOT

## WHEREAS:

Pursuant to 26 N.N.C. $\S 1(B)$, the Nageezi Chapter is delegated the governmental authority to make decisions over local matters consistent with Navajo Law, Custom, and Tradition and under 11 N.N.C., Part 1, Section 10, is delegated authority to make local decisions in the best interest and welfare of the community members; and

Nageezi Chapter with the population of 2500 to 3000 residents, registered and non-registered voters, is made of up of nine (09) sub-communities including and not limited to: Nageezi, Lybrook, Twin Pines, Blanco, Kimbeto, Chaco Canyon, Escavada, Betoni Wash, Kinnadiz, and Dzilth-na-o-dithhle, being one of the largest land base chapter in the Eastern Agency of the Navajo Nation; and

Nageezi Chapter had made numerous requests to NMDOT to decrease the speed limits on U.S. Highway 550 between mile markers 126 and I28 and mile markers 112 and 116 but Nageezi Chapter doesn't receive no response from NMDOT; and

Nageezi Chapter community members have been raising concerns about the current speed limit of 70 mph between mile markers 126 and 128 and mile markers 112 and 116 due to these areas being very congested. Dzilth-na-o-dith-hle Community School, Dzilth-na-o-dith-hle Health Center, Dzilth-na-o-dith-hle Fire Station, Dzilth-na-o-dith-hle Navajo Nation Police Substation, and Navajo Housing Authority subdivision are located approximately 500 feet off of U.S. Highway 550 between mile markers 126 and 128. Nageezi Chapter, Nageezi Senior Center, Nageezi Head Start Program, Nageezi Veteran Office, and United States Post Office are located approximately 100 feet off of U.S. Highway 550 between mile markers 112 and 113. San Juan Road 7900 is off of U.S. Highway 550 between mile markers 113 and 112, which is a major access road to the Chaco Historical National Park; and

Numerous fatality auto accidents have occurred between mile markers 126 and 128 and mile markers 112 and 116 on U.S. Highway 550 due to the congestion of these areas and speed limit at 70 mph.

Very too often, Navajo pedestrians going to the above facilities have been hit by vehicles on U.S. Highway 550 between mile markers 126 and 128 and mile markers 112 and 116; and

Nageezi Chapter community members are pleading with NMDOT to decrease the speed limits from 70 mph to 55 mph on U.S. Highway 550 between mile markers 126 and 128 and mile markers 112 and 116.

## NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

NAGEEZI CHAPTER HEREBY REQUESTS NEW MEXICO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION ("NMDOT") TO DECREASE SPEED LIMITS ON U.S. HIGHWAY 550 BETWEEN MILE MARKERS 126 AND 128 AND MILE MARKERS 112 AND 116 FROM 70 MPH TO 55 MPH; AND REQUESTING NEW MEXICO STATE SENATOR BENNY SHENDO, JR. TO ASSIST NAGEEZI CHAPTER IN THEIR REQUEST TO NMDOT
