# RESOLUTION OF THE LAW AND ORDER COMMITTEE OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCL

#### AN ACTION

RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER COMMITTEE; AMENDING LOCJA-01-16 "APPROVING THE REALLOCATION OF THREE HUNDRED FIFTY-FOUR THOUSAND FORTY-EIGHT DOLLARS (\$354,648)FROM HUNDRED JUDICIAL/PUBLIC SAFETY FACILITIES FUND, BUSINESS UNIT NUMBER 1310, TO THE RAMAH NAVAJO DETENTION CENTER, BUSINESS UNIT NUMBER NEW, TO PURPOSE AUTHORIZING COMPLETE CONSTRUCTION" FOR THE OF APPROVING REIMBURSEMENT TO RAMAH NAVAJO CHAPTER FOR CONSTRUCTION COSTS

#### BE IT ENACTED:

#### SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation established the Law and Order Committee (LOC) as a Navajo Nation standing committee and as such gave LOC approval authority to fund public safety facilities from the Navajo Sales Tax revenue. 2 N.N.C. § 600 (A); See also CJA-03-13, 22nd Navajo Nation Council, sect. 5, 30 (2013) and BFD-66-11 approving the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Management Plan, sects. I and II (2011).
- B. The Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund was originally established by CJA-03-07 in which the Navajo Nation Council amended the Navajo Nation Sales Tax, 24 N.N.C. §§ 605 and 620. Twenty-Five percent (25%) of the revenue collected shall be deposited into the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund to be appropriated pursuant to a fund management plan approved by the Budget and Finance Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. See CJA-03-07 and CJA-03-13.

#### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

A. The revenue from the Navajo Sales Tax is deposited into the Judicial/Public Safety Fund that is managed by a Fund Management Plan as approved by the Budget and Finance Committee. See BFD-66-11.

- B. The fund was established as a special revenue fund to provide funding for judicial and public safety facilities as approved by the Law and Order Committee in the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Priority List. See BFD-66-11.
- C. The projects or activities which may be funded by the Fund include, but are not limited to: (A) Planning, site clearance, and development; (B) Site improvement and landscape development; (C) Utility access; (D) Street access and parking area; (E) construction, maintenance, renovation and repair; and (F) Debt service for financing of the above activities. See BFD-66-11. (Emphasis added).
- D. In 2016, the Law and Order Committee "approved the reallocation of three hundred fifty-four thousand six hundred forty-eight dollars (\$354,648) from the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund to the Ramah Navajo Detention Center to complete construction." Resolution LOCJA-01-16 attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- E. Due to the delay in the appropriation of funds from the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund the Ramah Navajo Chapter paid for the offsite waterline extension to the Ramah Navajo Detention Center from Chapter funds in the amount of \$69,586.92. Memorandum from Delores Greyeyes attached hereto as Exhibit B.
- F. Ramah Navajo Chapter is requesting a reimbursement for the \$69,586.92 expended on the offsite waterline extension from the remaining balance appropriated to the Ramah Navajo Detention Center from the Judicial/Public Safety Fund. Letter and supporting documents from Ramah Navajo Chapter to Ms. Delores Greyeyes attached hereto as **Exhibit C**.
- G. It is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation to amend Resolution LOCJA-01-16 to allow Ramah Navajo Chapter to be reimbursed for their financial assistance with the Ramah Navajo Detention Center construction costs and to approve a reimbursement in the amount of \$69,586.92 to Ramah Navajo Chapter from the funds appropriated through Resolution LOCJA-01-16.

#### SECTION THREE. AMENDMENT TO LOCJA-01-16

The Navajo Nation amends Resolution LOCJA-01-16, as follows:

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## Section Four. Approving Reimbursements for Expended Funds for the Ramah Navajo Detention Center

The Navajo Nation approves and authorizes the reimbursement of funds to Ramah Navajo Chapter for funds appropriated and expended for construction costs for Ramah Navajo Detention Center offsite waterline as listed in the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Management Plan listed as Priority (E).

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#### SECTION FOUR. APPROVING AMENDMENT TO LOCJA-01-16

The Navajo Nation hereby approves and authorizes the amendment to LOCJA-01-16 to allow reimbursement of funds to Ramah Navajo Chapter for funds appropriated and expended for construction costs for Ramah Navajo Detention Center offsite waterline as listed in the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Management Plan listed as Priority (E).

## SECTION FIVE. APPROVING REIMBURSEMENT TO RAMAH NAVAJO CHAPTER IN THE AMOUNT OF \$69,586.92

The Navajo Nation hereby approves and authorizes the reimbursement in the amount of \$69,586.92 to Ramah Navajo Chapter for construction costs expended on the offsite waterline extension, attached as **Exhibit C**, from the remaining balance of funds appropriated to the Ramah Navajo Detention Center from the Judicial/Public Safety Fund through Resolution LOCJA-01-16, attached as **Exhibit A**.

#### AN ACTION

RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER; APPROVING THE REALLOCATION OF THREE HUNDRED FIFTY-FOUR THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED FORTY-EIGHT DOLLARS (\$354,648) FROM THE JUDICIAL/PUBLIC SAFETY FACILITIES FUND, BUSINESS UNIT NUMBER 1310, TO THE RAMAH NAVAJO DETENTION CENTER, BUSINESS UNIT NUMBER NEW, TO COMPLETE CONSTRUCTION

#### **BE IT ENACTED:**

#### Section One. Findings.

- A. The Navajo Nation established the Law and Order Committee (LOC) as a Navajo Nation standing committee and as such gave LOC approval authority to fund public safety facilities from the Navajo Sales Tax revenue. 2 N.N.C. §§ 600(A) see also CJA-03-13, 22<sup>ND</sup> Navajo Nation Council, sect. 5, 30 (2013) and BFD-66-11, 22<sup>nd</sup> Navajo Nation Council, sects. I and II (2011) (Approving the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Management Plan).
- B. "Budget Reallocation' means the redesignation of appropriated or budgeted funds from one account to another account or to a *newly-created account* for a different use or purpose." 12 N.N.C. § 810(D) (2009). The Law and Order Committee is redesignating from the Judicial/Public Safety Trust Fund to the Ramah Navajo Detention Center. The Law and Order Committee possess oversight authority over both the Judicial/Public Safety Trust Fund and Navajo Nation Public Safety. See BFD-66-11 AND 2 N.N.C. § 601(C) (2012).
- C. Reallocating funds between business units, here between Business Unit Number 1310 and NEW, requires LOC's oversight approval. NAVAIO NATION FISCAL YEAR 2016 BUDGET INSTRUCTIONS MANUAL §X (D)(1)(B)(2015).
- D. The revenue from the Navajo Sales Tax is deposited into the Judicial/Public Safety Fund that is managed by the Fund Management Plan. BFD-66-11.
- E. The Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Management Plan require the Law and Order Committee to approve a Fund Priority List. *Id.*
- F. Ramah is on the current Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Construction Priority Listings. LOCJY-07-13.
- G. The Ramah Detention Facility is approximately 95% complete. EXHIBIT A.
- H. Ramah Navajo Chapter has a funding shortfall of three hundred fifty-four thousand six hundred forty-eight dollars (\$354,648). EXHIBIT A.

- J. LOC accomplishes their purpose of improving the quality and effectiveness of the justice system within the Navajo Nation with providing funding to complete the Ramah Detention Facility so these individuals do not have to be incarcerated several miles away from their community. 2 N.N.C. §600(C)(2).
- K. In order to establish and develop the Navajo Nation justice infrastructure, funding Ramah Navajo Detention Facility's construction shortfall is in the Navajo Nation's best interest.

#### Section Two. Approving the Budget Reallocation

The Navajo Nation approves the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund, business unit number 1310, three hundred fifty-four thousand six hundred forty-eight dollar (\$354,648) reallocation to the Ramah Navajo Detention Center, business unit number *NEW*, to complete construction on the Ramah Detention Facility. Exhibit B.

However, due to added fire alarm requirement and other unanticipated additional cost to final completion we are experiencing construction funding shortfall in the amount of \$354,648.

The additional funding will cover required items to meet final inspection compliance to acquire the Certificate of Occupancy and to place the facility on the BIA Inventory to received operation and maintenance funds from the Bureau of Indian Affairs. It will also ensure that we will be operating out of a safe and efficient facility.

The Ramah Navajo Chapter is requesting the Navajo Nation to appropriate the additional funds of \$354, 648 to complete the facility. Attached is the budget and statement of need. Any assistance is greatly appreciated.

#### PART III. SCOPE OF WORK/METHODOLOGY

A majority of the items (Items 1-7) are associated with improvements to the fire protection system contained within the construction documents. These items were added by either the BIA or the Navajo Nation as a result of their progress inspections or submittal reviews. The remainder of the items will assist the Ramah Navajo Chapter in ensuring the construction of the facility follows the required contract documents, specifications and applicable building codes.

In summary, all of these items are required to ensure the constructed facility will operate safely and efficiently. These items will also reduce the need for maintenance of the facility, roadways and site in the future and will be a benefit to the project as a whole.

#### RESOLUTION OF THE RAMAH NAVAJO CHAPTER

NO. 051513

Approval to submit to the State of New Mexico and Navajo Nation ICIP Listing for Ramah Navajo Chapter's Infrastructure Capital Improvements Plan (ICIP) for 2017-2021 as required by the State of New Mexico.

#### WHEREAS:

- The Ramah Navajo Chapter is a certified and recognized Chapter of the Navajo Nation
  pursuant to Tribal Council Resolution No. CCJ-20-55, and exercises authority over the
  administration of various government services and programs within the Ramah Navajo
  Chapter pursuant to grants and contracts with the Department of the Interior and other federal
  agencies; and,
- 2. Pursuant to resolution No. ACJN-125-89 of the Advisory Committee of the Navajo Tribal Council approving the Ramah Navajo Chapter to enter "Mature Contracts" with Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) as authorized by Public Law 93-638, and amendments thereof; and,
- 3. Subsequently, on May 23, 2013, the Navajo Nation Council by its Resolution No. CAP-34-98, repeals @ NN Code Section 4001 et. Seq., and enacted the "Navajo Nation Local Governance Act," for the Navajo Nation Chapters, Chapter Officials and Chapter Administration, which the Act also clearly defined the establishment of Chapter government as a separate political sub-division with the Central government; and,
- 4. Pursuant to Navajo Tribal Council Resolution No. CAP-34-98, the enactment of the "Local Governance Act," at the Resolved Section No. 4, the Chapter is given the grants and governmental authority with respect to making decisions over local matters consistent with Navajo Nation law, including Navajo custom and traditions; and,
- 5. The Ramah Navajo Chapter coordinates closely with the State of New Mexico for infrastructure funding through both the New Mexico Indian Affairs Department (NMIAD) Tribal Infrastructure Funds (TIF) and Legislative Capital Outlay Funds; and,
- 6. The State of New Mexico requires that all municipalities and tribal organizations submit an updated 5 year Infrastructure Capital Improvements Plan (ICIP) annually; and,

- 7. The deadline for providing the updated ICIP and additional required documentation to the State of New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) is July 13, 2015; This resolution shall supersede all other resolutions and,
- 8. The State of New Mexico requires, through executive order, that projects submitted for funding by municipalities and tribal organizations be identified within their ICIP. In some cases, the funding agencies additionally require projects requesting funding to be identified within the municipalities and tribal organizations top five priorities to receive consideration for funding; and,
- The Ramah Navajo Chapter Community Development Department maintains a list of the desperately needed infrastructure improvements within the Ramah Navajo community. This list is based on coordination with other agencies, Chapter Officials and community members; and,
- 10. By this resolution, the Ramah Navajo Chapter recommends the following projects be identified as the top five priority projects within the Ramah Navajo Chapter ICIP for FY 2017-2021.
  - 1. Construct Sewer / Waste Water
  - 2. Ramah Detention Center
  - 3. Section 21 / 27 Master Site Development Plan
  - 4. Interior Finishing, for Livestock Training Facility
  - 5. Ramah Transfer Station
  - 6. Ramah Navajo Senior Citizens Renovation: Matching Funds with the State of New Mexico
- 11. The attached project list also includes additional projects, their estimated project costs, and the approximate year which will be included in the State of New Mexico ICIP database; and,
- 12. Although this list suggests a planned priority for these projects, it does not preclude the Ramah Navajo Chapter from modifying these priorities based on funding availability, emergency situations, or a change in consideration of the importance of these projects by either Chapter administration, Chapter Officials or community members; and,
- 13. It is in the best interest of the Ramah Navajo Chapter Administration, Officials and community members to pursue funding for these infrastructure projects in order to improve the safety, well being and quality of life for the members of the Ramah Navajo Chapter community.

#### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Ramah Navajo Chapter hereby approves the submittal to the State of New Mexico the Ramah Navajo Chapter's Infrastructure Capital Improvements Plan (ICIP) for 2017-2021 as required by the State of New Mexico.

The Office of Management and Budget has reviewed the above referenced document. Upon review of the proposed supplemental funding proposal, OMB notes the following:

1. The attached copy of the Navajo Nation Capital Improvement Plan 2013-2017, which was approved by resolution CAP-18-14, does not show or list Ramah Detention Center as an approved project for construction in the amount of \$350,000. The Appropriations Act, Section 820 (I), addresses the Capital Budget requirements in the following language: "All budget requests for capital improvements shall be in compliance with an adopted Capital Improvement Plan and shall not be approves unless in compliance with the Plan."

The Office of Management & Budget (OMB) has the following comments:

#### LOCAU-14-15:

- 1. The memo from the Acting Controller refers to LOCAU-14-15 which does not have any budget forms attached. OMB needs correct budget form for further review
- 2. On page 4 of 4 of the resolution LOCAU-14-15 it refers to Exhibit B but there is no Exhibit B attached. Is this resolution complete and correct?
- 3. The resolution recommends that it be a reallocation but it would be setup as an appropriation from the Judicial/Public Safety Facility Fund as a capital account because the funds are to be used toward the Ramah Detention Facility.
- 4. The resolution suggests the fund would go into the Ramah Chapter General Fund, business unit 108049, but the funds would be allocated under a NEW business unit for the Ramah Detention Facility.
- 5. A budget was not attached to LOCAU-14-15 so a budget with oversight approval is needed.
- 6. The lead agent for this project should be Design and Engineering Services (DES) under the Division of Community Development in conjunction with Department of Corrections.

#### LOCAU-17-15:

- 1. Provided by the Legislative Branch is LOCAU-17-15, which is same project in the same amount, and it contains both Exhibits A and B which are necessary for OMB review because the budgets are included. Is this the correct resolution?
- 2. LOCAU-17-15 approves the amount for reallocation as \$354,648 and the budgets in Exhibit B have this amount but no signatures. The 164 review make reference to \$350,000 for the project and have capital budgets for \$350,000. Which is the correct amount?
- 3. The resolution suggests the fund would go into the Ramah Chapter General Fund, business unit 108049, but the funds would be allocated under a NEW business unit for the Ramah Detention Facility.

These questions need to be answered before further OMB action. If there are any further questions, contact Lisa Jymm with the Office of Management and Budget at extension 6230.

The Department of Corrections requests that the attached legislation allocating funds to the Ramah Chapter to complete work on the Ramah Detention facility be modified. This modification is requested to assist the Ramah Chapter in recouping Chapter program funds that were spent on the installation of the waterline at the detention facility in the amount of \$69,586.92. This amount should be reimbursed to the Ramah Navajo Chapter (RNC) for the water line installation. The supporting documents are attached.

A decision was made by RNC and the team working on the detention facility to use Chapter funds to pay for the extension of the water line onto the detention facility site. This decision was made to expedite the meet the deadline set by the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Program (USDJO/OJP) to complete the project and to close out the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) by September 30, 2015.

Due to the delay in the approval process of funds from the Judicial Public Safety Special Revenue funds and continued pressure from the USDOJ/OJP the RNC Detention Project made a decision to pay for the waterline extension to keep the project moving. This payment in the about of \$69,586.92. Legislation number LOCJA-01-16 appropriated \$354,648; \$159,843.13 was allocated to Whiteriver Construction, Inc., \$25,133.00 to Arcadis Project Management and \$16,250.00 to the Architect with a balance of \$197,000 that remains to be used. The RNC is requesting that the \$69,58692 be taken out of the remaining balance of \$153,421.87, to reimburse RNC for the waterline extension which they paid for.

The original legislation that created the Judicial Public Safety Special Revenue account did not identify in its' purpose to reimburse entities when it spends its own funds even if it relates to the "the planning, construction of judicial and public safety facilities". I am requesting that NDOC and the Legislative Branch Council review this section and provide legal guidance to the Navajo Department of Corrections.

Your assistance in review and approval for modification of this legislation appropriating funds to include reimbursement of RNC funds is requested.

#### Option 1: Executed successfully.

The Ramah Navajo Chapter (RNC) has been successful in providing internal Chapter funding and teaming with the Ramah Navajo Utility Authority (RNUA) in placing the new offsite water line for the Detention facility site. This decision was made to ensure that the new Detention facility would be able to reach the substantial completion stage of construction with available budget funds. Timing and availability of water to the site for testing and inspections also became critical issues. The new 6,050 feet of water line has been connected to the existing Rocky Ridge well system piping. The new water line has been chlorinated, tested and has been in operation with no issues since June 2015. The RNC expended \$69,586.92 to cover costs for the water line placement. The costs covered staff salaries, materials, rental/lease of excavation and trenching equipment, maintenance of equipment and fuel. Backup data has been attached for review and confirmation. The Ramah Navajo Chapter is respectfully requesting reimbursement for cost incurred by the Chapter for the water line. The Ramah Navajo Chapter saved \$227,815.68 by installing the new water line internally.

#### Option 2: Contractor estimate to install proposed water line.

The RNC project team requested an estimate from the General Contractor that constructed the Detention facility. After value engineering efforts and the contractor covering insurances, bonds, overhead, materials and labor the probable cost estimate received was \$297,402.60. The estimate backup documentation has been attached for review and confirmation. The RNC project team was not able to absorb the estimated cost and chose to go with option 1 above. This saved the RNC project team a substantial amount of costs as indicated.

#### Initial water well drilling attempt, Engineer's estimate:

Souder Miller and Associates (SMA) provided a Hydrogeological Report in the area of the project site and Mountain View, New Mexico. The report indicated water would only be found less than 500 feet deep or in excess of 2500 feet (no water anticipated between 500 and 2500).

Test drilling was initiated at the new project site. The test well was drilled down to 700 feet (extra deep just to make sure) and unfortunately no water was found. The proposed new well was abandoned at the project site.

At the direction of RNC, SMA designed a new offsite water line that would connect to the existing Rocky Ridge well system that is 6050 feet in length. SMA also provided an engineer's estimate of \$197,737.50. The RNC project team could not absorb the estimated cost. Backup documentation is attached for review and confirmation.

We are looking forward to a favorable decision on the RNC request for reimbursement of \$69,586.92. Please contact me at 505-775-7110 if any questions should arise.

- 2. Any amendments to the Judicial-Public Safety Facilities Management Fund Management Fund requires action by the Law and Order Committee.
