

RESOLUTION OF THE
NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' STANDING COMMITTEE OF THE
23rd NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL -- Fourth Year, 2018

AN ACTION

RELATING TO HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES AND
NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES; SUPPORTING THE EFFORTS TO ESTABLISH A
NATIVE AMERICAN HEALTH CARE INSTITUTE AT ARIZONA STATE UNIVERSITY

WHEREAS:

- A. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee (HEHSC) is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council. The Committee is empowered to review and recommend resolutions regarding certain matters, including health, education and social services. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 400 (A), 401 (B)(6)(a) (2012); see also CO-45-12.
- B. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council. Among other duties and responsibilities, it "coordinate[s] all federal, county and state programs with other standing committees and branches of the Navajo Nation government to provide the most efficient delivery of services to the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 701(A)(4).
- C. Efforts are underway to attempt to establish a health care degree and educational institution at Arizona State University focusing specifically on Indian health care (Native American Health Care Institute). See **Exhibit A**.
- D. A Native American Health Care Institute (Institute) would provide specific curriculum and multi-disciplinary education to students in administering, managing, and providing direct services to, and designing facilities for, an Indian Health Care Network.
- E. The Institute would establish an internship program for students to receive direct placement, training, and mentorship from tribes and organizations of the Indian Health Care Network.
- F. Students of the Institute would be able to obtain a degree, minor or certification in Indian Health Care.
- G. The Institute would also provide referral and employment opportunities to graduates through the Tribal Employment Rights Offices.

H. The Navajo Nation finds it to be in its best interest to support efforts to establish a Native American Health Care Institute at Arizona State University.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

The Navajo Nation hereby supports efforts to establish a Native American Health Care Institute at Arizona State University.

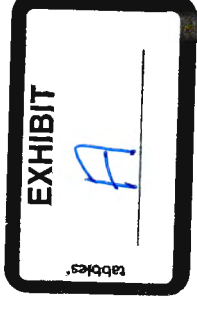

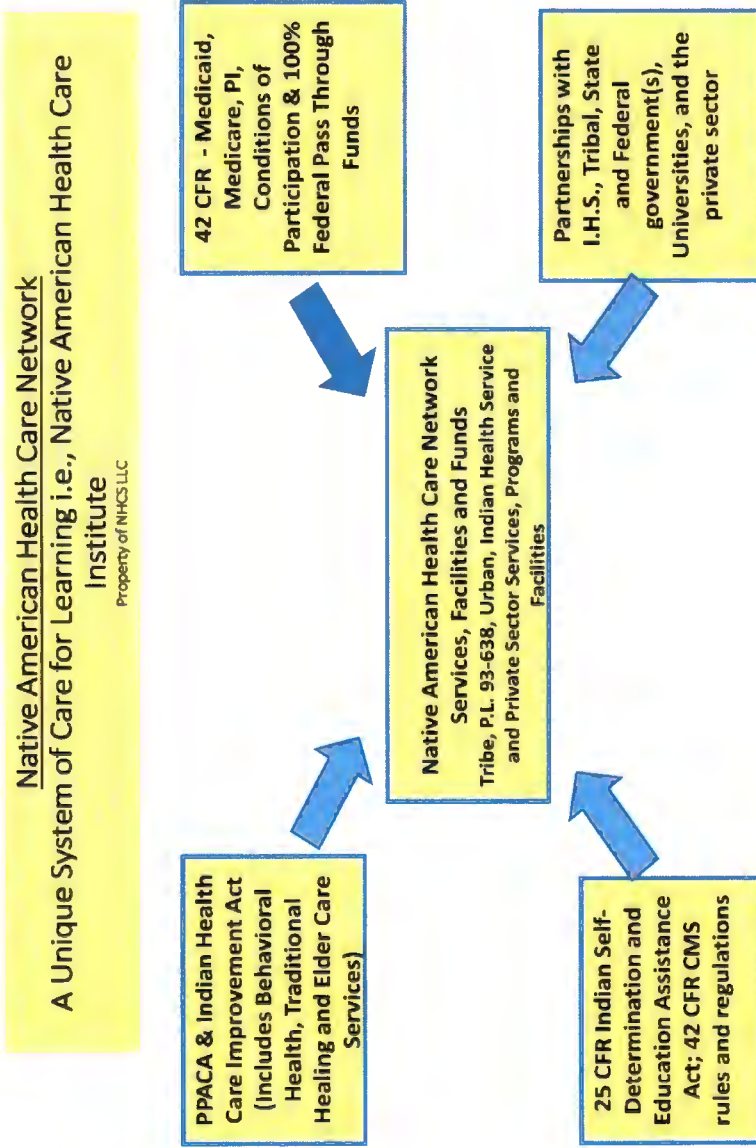

- To establish a health care degree and educational institution at Arizona State University focusing specifically on Indian health care
- To provide a specific curriculum and multi-disciplinary education to students in administering, managing, and providing direct services to, and designing facilities for, the Indian Health Care Network
- To establish an internship program for students to receive direct placement, training, and mentorship from tribes and organization of the Indian Health Care Network
- To establish an Institute for students to obtain a degree, minor, or certification in Indian Health Care
- To provide referral and employment opportunities to graduates of the Native American Health Care Institute through Tribal Employment Rights Offices (TERO)

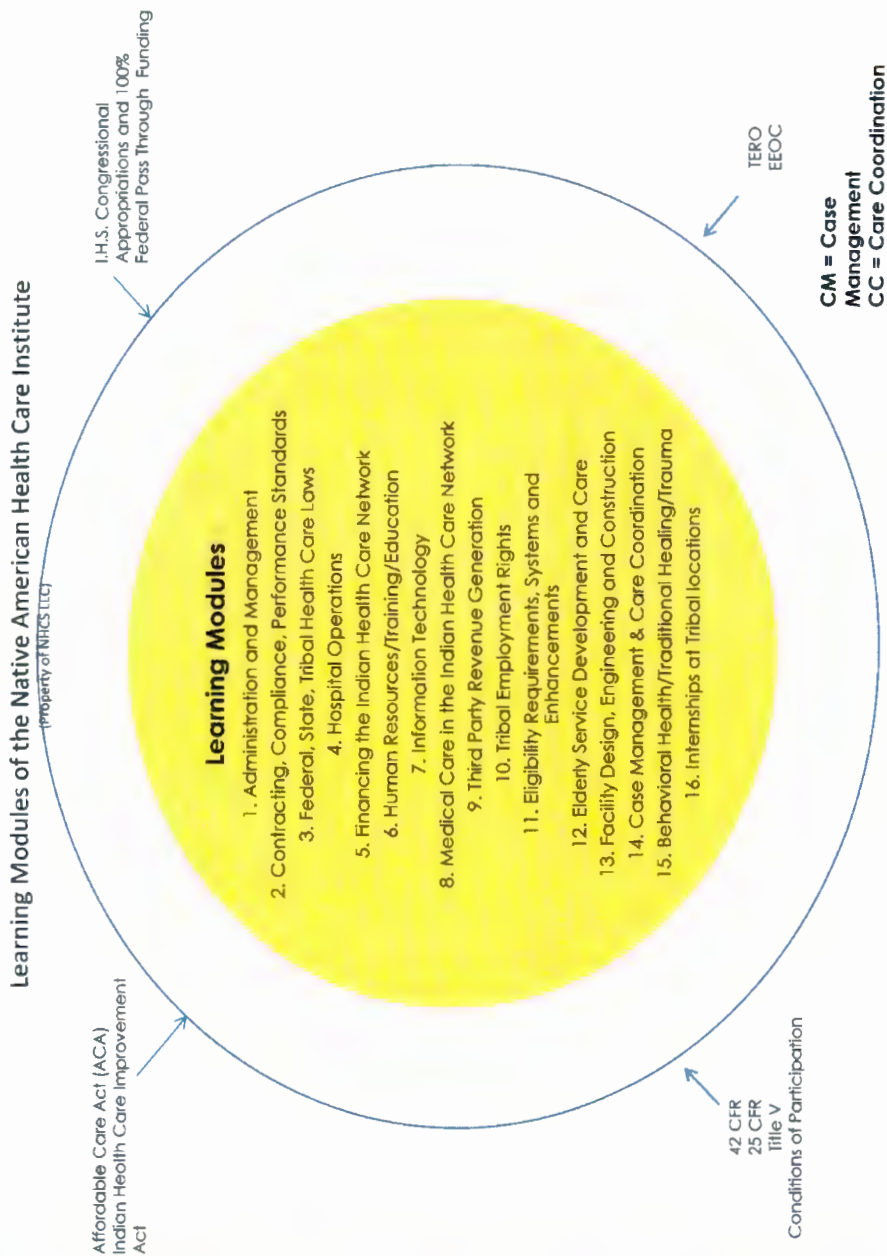
