TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY; APPROVING \$833,532 FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND ("UUFB") FOR THE NAVAJO DEPARTMENT OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT, CHINLE CHAPTER, AND NAZLINI CHAPTER FOR EXPENSES ARISING OUT OF FLOODING IN AND AROUND CHINLE CHAPTER; WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §820(E), §820(F), §820(J), AND §820(L) TO ALLOW USE OF UUFB FUNDS FOR RECURRING EXPENSES

PURPOSE: The purpose of this proposed resolution is to provide a supplemental appropriation for emergency assistance relief in and around Chinle Chapter.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

19	BE IT ENACTED:
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21	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY
22	A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §102(A).
23	As such, the Council may approve supplemental appropriations whenever additional
24	sources of revenues above current revenue projections are anticipated and such revenues
25	exceed the required reserve amount. 12 N.N.C. §820(L).
26	B. The Navajo Nation Council may approve emergency legislation to address any matter
27	"constituting an emergency [that] shall be limited to the cessation of law enforcement
28	services, and disaster relief services, fire protection services or other direct services
29	required as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or Federal law, or which directly threaten
30	the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Such an emergency matter must arise due to the

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pressing public need for such resolution(s) and must be a matter requiring final action by the Council." 2 N.N.C. §164 (A)(16).

- C. This resolution is being offered as an emergency due to the current and immediate need to provide disaster relief services to Navajo Nation communities, particularly those residents living in isolated and remote locations impacted by the severe winter weather conditions. The flooding in Chinle, which began April 21, 2023, the effects of which are still continuing, constitutes an emergency necessitating the use of disaster relief services throughout the area.
- D. The restrictions on supplemental appropriations, including all-monies-from the Navajo Nation's UUFB, include:
 - 1. Payment of recurring government operating expenses shall be from recurring revenues and payment of nonrecurring expenses shall be from nonrecurring revenues such as UUFB funds. 12 N.N.C. §820(E) and §820(F).
 - 2. Specifically, the UUFB shall not be used for recurring government expenditures or operations. 12 N.N.C. §820(J) and §820(L).
 - 3. Nonrecurring revenues funds may be used only after the Controller determines whether or not such revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between the Navajo Nation's recurring revenues and expenditures, and government expenditures shall only be authorized if a long-term (3-year to 5-year year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue; otherwise, nonrecurring revenues will be added to the UUFB. 12 N.N.C. §820(F).
 - 4. The above provisions in Title 12 may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. §820(F) and 12 N.N.C. §880.
 - 5. In compliance with 12 N.N.C. §820(F) all UUFB funding requests must be reviewed by the Controller. Such review is also required because the Controller determines which revenues and expenses are recurring and which are non-recurring. 12 N.N.C. §820(L).
 - 6. In compliance with 12 N.N.C. §820(M) all UUFB funding requests must be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for a budget impact analysis.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

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- A. The Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management approved Resolution CEM 23-01-19, attached as Exhibit A, declaring a State of Emergency for the Navajo Nation due to severe inclement winter weather conditions, including heavy snow, heavy winds, significant mud conditions, and flooding.
- B. The Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management approved Resolution CEM 23-04-25, attached as Exhibit B, declaring a State of Emergency for the Chinle Chapter, Navajo Nation, Apache County Arizona, for the areas significantly impacted by flooding due to snow accumulation, snow melt, and run-off, creating a public health and safety risk.
- C. The Board of Supervisors for Apache County approved Resolution 2023-09, attached as Exhibit C, declaring a State of Emergency on April 24, 2023, due to impassable roadways from mud and water runoff that caused Apache County citizens within the Chinle Wash on the Navajo Nation to be stranded in their homes denying them access to food and medical assistance, putting their lives and well-being at risk.
- D. This State of Emergency is ongoing and continues to impact Chinle Chapter, and other areas of the Navajo Nation, creating severe conditions requiring the Navajo Nation to provide the necessary resources to address the needs of the impacted communities, such as mobilized relief to mitigate further threats to human lives and to provide safety.
- E. The Navajo Nation Department of Emergency Management ("DEM") within the Navajo Department of Public Safety, requested a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$78,532 to Business Unit 116019, Department of Emergency Management, and submitted Appendix K "Supplemental Funding Proposal Funding Summary," along with Budget Forms 1, 2, and 4, with a memo justifying that supplemental funding is needed for the overall emergency response efforts all of which are included in Exhibit D. The supplemental funds will be used for personnel who are responding to the emergency for overtime and travel expenses, including mileage and lodging, as well as ATV/UTV supplies and to purchase diesel fuel for the mobile command unit.
- F. The Office of the Controller ("OOC") has provided a memorandum, dated May 17, 2023, attached as Exhibit E, to satisfy the requirements of 12 N.N.C. §820(F) and §820(L) indicating that DEM's supplemental appropriation request for BU# 116019 is recurring and that the unaudited balance of the UUFB as of May 4, 2023 is \$15, 236, 298.

- H. The DEM requested a supplemental appropriation of \$ 500,000 to Business Unit 116020,

 Emergency Management / Disaster Account, and submitted Appendix K "Supplemental

 Funding Proposal Funding Summary," along with Budget Forms 1,2, and 4, all of which

 are included in Exhibit G. The supplemental funds in this Business Unit will be used for

 direct services and will be used to purchase food, water, propane, fire wood, fuel for

 equipment, and other supplies needed for emergencies.
 - I. The OOC reviewed DEM's request for Business Unit 116019 and prepared a memo, dated May 17, 2023, which is attached as **Exhibit E.** The OOC determined DEM's request for a supplemental appropriation in Business Unit 116020 is **recurring** and noted the unaudited balance in the UUFB as of May 4, 2023 is \$15,236,298. The Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") reviewed DEM's submission and noted its comments in a memo dated May 12, 2023, attached as **Exhibit F.**
 - J. Chinle Chapter requested a supplemental appropriation of \$220,000 into Business Unit 108015 and submitted Appendix K, "Supplemental Funding Proposal Funding Summary," along with Budget Forms 1, 2, and 4, all of which are included in **Exhibit H**, along with a letter from Chinle Chapter's President and a Chapter Resolution indicating the need for the funding.
 - K. The OMB memo related to Chinle Chapter's request for a supplemental appropriation, dated May 12, 2023, is attached as **Exhibit I.** The OOC memo related to Chinle Chapter's request, as previously noted, is attached as **Exhibit E**, and noted that the supplemental funding request is **non-recurring.**
 - L. Nazlini Chapter requested a supplemental appropriation of \$ 35,000 into Business Unit 108020 and submitted Appendix K, "Supplemental Funding Proposal Funding Summary," along with Budget Forms 1, 2, and 4, all of which are included in **Exhibit J**.
 - M. The OMB memo related to Nazlini's Chapter's request for a supplemental appropriation, dated May 12, 2023, is attached as **Exhibit K**. The OOC memo related to Chinle Chapter's

9	A. The Navajo Nation Council approves \$78,532 from the UUFB to the Department of
10	Emergency Management, Business Unit # 116019 as indicated in Exhibit D.
11	B. The approved UUFB funds shall be from those revenues that exceed the 10% minimum
12	balance of the UUFB which must be maintained according to 12 N.N.C. §820(J).
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14	SECTION FOUR. APPROVAL OF A SUPPLEMETAL APPROPRIATION
15	FROM THE UUFB FOR THE NAVAJO DEPARTMENT OF EMERGENCY



9	ALLOW USE OF UUFB FUNDS FOR RECURRING EXPENSES
10	The Navajo Nation hereby waives 12 N.N.C. §820(E), §820(F), §820(J), and §820(L) to allow
11	use of the UUFB to Navajo DEM Business Units 116019 and 116020, as shown in Exhibits D
12	and G. These waivers are necessary because the proposed UUFB expenditures are considered
13	recurring government expenses.
14	
15	SECTION TEN. EFFECTIVE DATE
16	This Act shall become effective pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §221(B) and 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(17).
17	
18	SECTION ELEVEN. SAVING CLAUSE
19	If any portion of this Action is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by
20	a District Court of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the
21	remainder of this Act shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COMMISSION ON EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

DECLARING A STATE OF EMERGENCY FOR THE NAVAJO NATION DUE TO SEVERE WINTER SNOW STORMS AND SUBSEQUENT MUD FROM SNOW MELT CREATING POTENTIAL PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY RISKS ACROSS THE NAVAJO NATION

WHEREAS:

- Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 881, the Navajo Nation Council established the Commission on Emergency
 Management. The Commission is authorized to assess, verify, recommend and declare states of emergency
 with the concurrence of the President of the Navajo Nation; and
- Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 883, (A) and (C) the Commission in conjunction with the Department of Emergency Management is empowered to coordinate emergency and disaster relief services by Navajo Nation and nontribal entities and to recommend and deploy appropriate resources regarding natural and man-made emergencies; and
- 3. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 884 (B) (2), the Commission on Emergency Management may seek assistance from federal, state, other tribal governments, and local and private agencies to address emergency and disaster related situations; and
- 4. Communities within the Navajo Nation are experiencing impacts from the severe inclement winter weather conditions, including, but not limited to, heavy snow, high winds, significant mud conditions and flooding, particularly impacting residents living in isolated and remote locations of the Navajo Nation; and
- 5. Due to potential impacts and substantial public health and safety from severe winter snow storms and subsequent mud conditions resulting from snow melt that creates potential public safety risks across the Navajo Nation; and
- 6. Any or all initial response(s) are first at the local level. However, communication and coordination are to be established for effective response(s); and
- 7. It is necessary and crucial to ensure public health and safety issues are addressed through adequate assessments, establishment of priorities, communication, safety measures, coordination, and use of appropriate resources to mobilize relief efforts.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- The Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management hereby declares a State of Emergency for the Navajo Nation due to severe inclement winter weather conditions, including, but not limited to, heavy snow, high winds, significant mud conditions and flooding, particularly impacting residents living in isolated and remote locations of the Navajo Nation; and
- 2. The needs of the Navajo Nation are to be addressed in a manner so as to provide the necessary resources required to address said declared State of Emergency. This includes, but not limited to, resources of personnel, equipment, monetary funding, and other resources as may be required to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the Navajo Nation; and
- Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management hereby finds it necessary and crucial to address the
 needs of the Navajo Nation through adequate assessments, establishment of priorities, communications, safety
 measures, coordination, and use of appropriate resources to mobilize relief and mitigate further threats to
 human lives and safety; and
- The Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management finds it necessary for responsible Navajo Nation
 entities to immediately begin and maintain coordination for use of resources to meet the needs of all
 communities; and
- 5. The Navajo Nation activate available emergency resources such as funding to cover personnel, equipment, and other means as determined fit and feasible to restore and sustain vital community infrastructure.

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COMMISSION ON EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

DECLARING A STATE OF EMERGENCY FOR THE CHINLE CHAPTER, APACHE COUNTY, NAVAJO NATION, ARIZONA, SPECIFICALLY FOR THE AREAS SIGNIFICANTLY IMPACTED BY FLOODING DUE TO SNOW ACCUMULATION, SNOW MELT, AND RUN-OFF, CREATING PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY RISKS

WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 881, the Navajo Nation Council established the Commission on Emergency Management. The Commission is authorized to assess, verify, recommend and declare states of emergency with the concurrence of the President of the Navajo Nation; and
- 2. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 883, (A) and (C) the Commission in conjunction with the Department of Emergency Management is empowered to coordinate emergency and disaster relief services by Navajo Nation and non-tribal entities and to recommend and deploy appropriate resources regarding natural and man-made emergencies; and
- 3. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 884 (B) (2), the Commission on Emergency Management may seek assistance from federal, state, other tribal governments, and local and private agencies to address emergency and disaster related situations; and
- 4. Chinle Chapter has experienced severe impacts from flooding as a result of accumulation of water from natural sources such as snow melt, which has caused extreme seasonal run-off, and exacerbated mud conditions, particularly impacting individuals, residences, and other community attributes along the Chinle Wash (downstream, i.e., Many Farms), including damages to homes, property, roads, and continued threats to life, health, safety, infrastructure, and property;
- Flooding has displaced residents living along the Chinle Wash, triggered evacuations, power outages, potential impacts to utility systems, opening of shelters for the displaced, injuries, damages and loss of possessions; and
- 6. Local transportation networks have been affected, roads closures have occurred, flooding has damaged local roads, with physical damages evident, including erosion and gullying; and
- 7. Flood waters eroded an existing berm, significantly impacting homes, property, residents, and presents ongoing threats to public health and safety, with potential to increase deposition of silt and sedimentation; and
- 8. There remain substantial hazards, threats, and impacts to public health and safety from on-going flooding, which need to be addressed through adequate assessments, establishment of priorities, communication, safety measures, coordination, and use of appropriate resources to mobilize relief efforts in the impacted areas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management hereby declares a State of Emergency for the Chinle Chapter, Navajo Nation, Apache County, Arizona, for the areas significantly impacted by flooding due to snow accumulation, snow melt, and run-off, creating potential public health and safety risks; and
- 2. The needs of the Chinle Chapter are to be addressed in a manner so as to provide the necessary resources required to address said declared State of Emergency. This includes, but is not limited to, resources of personnel, equipment, monetary funding, and other resources as may be required to protect the health, safety and welfare of the affected residents of the Chinle Chapter (including downstream, i.e., Many Farms); and
- 3. Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management hereby finds it necessary and crucial to address the needs of the Chinle Chapter through adequate assessments, establishment of priorities, communications, safety measures, coordination, and use of appropriate resources to mobilize relief and mitigate further threats to human lives and safety; and
- The Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management finds it necessary for responsible Navajo Nation entities to immediately begin and maintain coordination for use of resources to meet the needs of all communities; and
- The Navajo Nation and the Chinle Chapter shall activate available emergency resources such as funding to cover personnel, equipment, and other means as determined fit and feasible to restore and sustain vital community infrastructure.



This memorandum is justification to request for emergency funding for the Navajo Department of Emergency Management (NDEM) from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance (UUFB) in the amount of \$ 578,532 from the 25th Navajo Nation Council as a result of the Emergency Declarations that have been issued by the Commission on Emergency Management (CEM 23-01-19) due to the recent extreme Winter Snowstorms that affected many Navajo residents throughout the Navajo Nation. Another Emergency Declaration was issued by the Commission on Emergency Management (CEM 23-04-25) due to Flooding from Snow Accumulation, Snow Melt and Run-Off creating Public Health and Safety Risks in the Chinle Community.

The Navajo Department of Emergency Management is responsible for managing the Navajo Nation Emergency Operations Center (EOC) in response to the Emergency Declarations issued by the Commission on Emergency Management (CEM) as a result of the severe winter snowstorms and flooding throughout the Nation, which has also created a concern for the public health and safety.

The Department has exhausted its own Department General Funds BU #116019 account responding to emergencies throughout the Nation. The Disaster Assistance BU # 116020 account is also being depleted from these emergencies mentioned. The Disaster assistance account is the

The Chinle Chapter Government has been impacted by flood waters, which has impeded on our local community members homes and property, as of April 21, 2023. We continue to battle the flood, with mobilization of all departments (Chinle Chapter, Navajo Nation Department of Emergency Management, Apache County, Navajo Nation Police, Navajo Nation EMS, Navajo Nation Fire, Navajo Nation Department of Transportation, Navajo Nation OPVP, Army Corps of Engineers, and NECA), we are working to develop staging of emergency assistance, berm repairs, heavy equipment operations, and overall assistance (temporary housing, food/water, funding assistance, etc.). With the multiple meetings attended, the Chapter will need emergency funding. The Chinle Chapter has been the main point of contact for all additional resources and employees and needs additional monetary support to help with emergency response.


