LEGISLATIVE SUMMARY SHEET

TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACT RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING THE NAVAJO NATION ELECTION CODE AT 11 N.N.C. §3(C) BY CHANGING THE PRIMARY ELECTION DATE IN NAVAJO NATION ELECTIONS

PURPOSE: This bill will change the Primary Election dates for Navajo Nation Chapter Elections and Navajo Nation General Elections to the first Tuesday in August in which there is a general election (for chapter elections or for elections for Office of Navajo Nation President and delegates to the Navajo Nation Council).

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

17	BE IT ENACTED:

19	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY
20	A. The Law and Order Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council. 2
21	N.N.C. § 600(A). The Committee, among other delegated duties, "review[s] and make[s]
22	recommendations to the Navajo Nation Council on proposed amendments to the Navajo Nation
23	Code." 2 N.N.C. § 601(B)(14).
24	B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9), "[a] proposed resolution that requires final action by
25	the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to standing committee(s) having authority over
26	the subject matter at issue and the Naabik'íyáti' Committee."
27	C. The Navajo Nation Council enacts and amends laws of the Navajo Nation. The Council
28	also sets policy for the Navajo Nation. See generally, 2 N.N.C. § 102.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. Under the Navajo Nation Election Code, primary elections are held on the "tenth Tuesday prior to a general election." 11 N.N.C. § 3(C).
- B. The primary elections in Arizona are held on the first Tuesday in August in a general election year. ARS §16-201, as amended by S.B. 1154.
- C. To ensure higher Navajo voter turn-out, it is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation that the Navajo Election Code be amended to provide that primary elections be held on the first Tuesday in August in an election year for chapter elections and elections for Navajo Nation President and Council Delegates. This change will maximize voter turn-out in both Arizona and Navajo Nation elections.

SECTION THREE. AMENDING ELECTION CODE

The Navajo Nation Council hereby amends the Navajo Nation Election Code as follows:

Title 11. Elections

Chapter 1. Navajo Election Code of 1990

Subchapter 1. General Provisions

§3. Elections; election dates

- A. General elections shall be held on the first Tuesday of November 2006 and every fourth year thereafter on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November.
- B Chapter elections shall be held on the first Tuesday of November 2004 and every fourth year thereafter on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November.
- C. Primary elections shall be held on the tenth Tuesday prior to a general election first Tuesday in August in any year in which a general election is held and at which candidates for public office are to be elected.
- Special elections shall be held when required.
- E. The Board of Election Supervisors is authorized to postpone for a maximum of 60 days any Navajo election for the purpose of printing new ballots required because of changed circumstances.

SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE

The amendments enacted herein shall be effective pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §221(B).

SECTION FIVE. CODIFICATION

The provisions of these amendments of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amendments in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

SECTION SIX. SAVINGS CLAUSE

Should any provision of these amendments be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those amendments that are not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Nation.
