Of the 23rd Navajo Nation Council---Second Year 2016**

AN ACTION

**RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT; WAIVING 16 N.N.C. § 1159
(B) REGARDING ACREAGE LIMIT OF 1.5 ACRES FOR A MISSION SITE FOR
PURELY RELIGIOUS REASONS; AND, APPROVING A REVOCABLE USE PERMIT
FOR TWO ACRES FOR AN EXISTING MISSION SITE FOR THE GLORY ROAD
MINISTRIES ON NAVAJO NATION TRUST LANDS IN THE VICINITY OF
PINEDALE CHAPTER, NAVAJO NATION (MCKINLEY COUNTY, NEW MEXICO)**

Section One. Standing Committee Authority

Pursuant to 16 N.N.C., Section 1151 (C), the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has the authority to give approval on behalf of the Navajo Nation all permits for Mission Sites.

Section Two. Title 16 Provisions with Respect to Mission Sites

A. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. Section 1153 (B) the application for a mission site shall contain:

1. An exact description of the Navajo Nation land for which application is made.
2. A detailed statement of the purpose or purposes for which the said Navajo Nation land shall be used. If a missionary or mission body proposes to establish facilities for educational, medical, or other non-religious activities, the application shall set forth fully the extent and character thereof.
3. A signed petition of a substantial number of Navajos residing in the vicinity of the proposed site endorsing the proposed permit.
4. An endorsement of Navajo Nation Council Delegates of the District in which the proposed site is located.

5. A description of buildings and improvements to be placed on Navajo Nation lands and an estimate of the cost thereof.

B. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1155 the Resources and Development Committee is authorized to deny or grant, on behalf of the Navajo Nation, any permit with special consideration to the establishment of too many missions in any one area or at any one point.

C. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1159 (B) the following acreage limitations shall apply to all applicants for permits:

- a. Mission site for purely religious activities: one and one-half (1 1/2) acres;
- b. mission site for religious activities and community services facilities: three and one-half (3 1/2) acres;
- c. Mission site for religious activities and either substantial medical or accredited educational programs: eight (8) acres; and
- d. The Resources and Development Committee may, in the case of applications for mission sites in or near areas withdrawn for townships in the Navajo Nation, limit site acreage to less than two and five-tenths (2 5/10) acres, and may set rental fees with due regard for present or future competing demands for land use in such areas.

D. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1159 (C) "community service facilities" shall be deemed to include only those permanent improvements upon the permitted site which are for the purpose of providing recreational programs, non-religious educational programs, including adult education, and other non-religious programs of benefit to the community.

E. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1160 (A) the acreage limitations established by 16 N.N.C. § 1159 may be waived by the Resources and Development Committee upon a showing by the applicant that planned programs will be of sufficient benefit to the Navajo People to justify waiver of acreage limitations. No waiver of acreage

limitations shall be granted unless the applicant has complied with 16 N.N.C. §§ 1153 and 1161, and all other procedures provided by law.

F. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1160 (B) no waiver of acreage limitations shall be granted in cases of applications subject to acreage limitations established by 16 N.N.C. § 1159(B)(1).

G. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1161 no application for a mission site permit for an area of Navajo Nation land in excess of the limitations established in 16 N.N.C. § 1159 shall be granted by the Resources and Development Committee unless the application for such permit has been reviewed and approved by the Division of Community Development of the Navajo Nation, and by the Navajo Land Department of the Navajo Nation.

Section Three. Findings

A. Glory Road Ministries, Post Office Box 150, Rehoboth, New Mexico 87322 applied for a Revocable Use Permit for Mission Site within the Pinedale Chapter vicinity, as further described herein in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference; and

B. The existing mission site is located on 2.00 acres of trust lands within the south One-Half (S1/2) of Section 21, Township 16 North, Range 15 west, N.M.P.M., located near the vicinity of Pinedale Chapter, Navajo Nation, District 16, Crownpoint, Agency (McKinley County, New Mexico) and is more particularly described on the survey plat attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "B"; and

C. The District Grazing Official Wilbur Murphy identified one land user, Delbert Nez, and his consent is attached hereto as "Exhibit "C." The chapter resolution and the signed petition by the local residents are also attached herein as Exhibit "D"; and

D. Biological, Historical, Cultural and Archaeological surveys and clearances for this permit were completed including an Environmental Assessment and are all attached herein as Exhibit "E"; and

E. On June 16, 2015, the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council through resolution RDCJN-33-15 delegated the Director of Navajo Land Department (NLD), Division of Natural Resources, the power and authority to give final approval of all land withdrawal designations on the Navajo Nation. The Land Withdrawal Designation has been approved for mission site for Glory Road Ministries for 2.00 acres of tribal trust land for five (5) years, attached hereto land withdrawal designation from Navajo Land Department as Exhibit "F"; and

F. It is in the best interest of Pinedale Chapter and the Navajo Nation that a Revocable Use Permit for Mission Site be approved for Glory Road Ministries.

Section Four. Waiver of 16 N.N.C. § 1159 (B) Regarding Acreage Limit of 1.5 Acres

The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby waives the 16 N.N.C. § 1159 (B)(1) requirement that a mission site for purely religious activities be limited to one and one-half acres (1 1/2) with regard to the Glory Road Ministries request for a Revocable Use Permit for Mission Site within the Pinedale Chapter vicinity for a total of two (2) acres.

Section Five. Approval of Mission Permit

A. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby approves and consents to the Revocable Use Permit to the Glory Road Ministries, subject to, but not limited to the attached Terms and Conditions contained herein as Exhibit "G" which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

B. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council does hereby authorize President of the Navajo Nation to execute all documents to affect the intent and purpose of this resolution.

All corporations must attach hereto a certified copy of their Articles of Incorporation. If foreign to the state where religious site is to be located, the corporation must supply a certified copy of their authority to do business in the state.

All corporations must furnish evidence of authority of the person(s) signing this application to execute papers on their behalf. Evidence should ordinarily be in the form of a general resolution of the Board of Directors certified by the Secretary over the seal of the corporation.

For the purpose of conducting business within the Navajo Reservation, all corporations must file their Articles of Incorporation with the Economic Development Commerce Department of the Navajo Nation. The Commerce Department will issue a corporate number to the church organization.

In all cases of applications on behalf of Unincorporated bodies where documents do not explicit give one individual authority to execute necessary papers, a power of attorney executed before a notary public by all associated parties for this purpose should be attached. If this is not supplied, all such persons must personally sign this application and all other documents submitted to the Navajo Agency.

Unincorporated applicants should submit articles depicting their organization, unless none exists, in which case an explanation of the nature of the organization should be listed on a separate sheet.

Applicant agrees to give preference to qualified local residents of the Navajo Nation for employment in the construction of any improvement on the church site if the permit is granted.

RESPECTFULLY REQUESTING OF PINEDALE CHAPTER , NAVAJO NATION RESOURCES COMMITTEE, THE NAVAJO LAND DEPARTMENT, COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DIVISION, AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL TO APPROVE AND AUTHORIZE GLORY ROAD MINISTRIES' PETITION TO ACQUIRE TWO (2) ACRES OF NAVAJO TRIBAL LAND WITHIN PINEDALE COMMUNITY FOR A MISSION SITE TO BUILD A CHURCH AND MULTI-PURPOSE BUILDING, WITH PARKING LOTS, FOR MINISTRY PURPOSES.

WHEREAS:

1. Pursuant to the authority vested in Pinedale Chapter through N. N. C. Title 26, Chapters 1.1.B1 and 1.1. B2, Pinedale Chapter is a certified Navajo Nation Chapter empowered by the Navajo Nation Council to review all matters affecting the community and make favorable decisions in the best interest of the community.
2. The board of trustees of Glory Road Ministries has authorized its officers and agents to take action and execute all documents necessary to acquire land to carry out its short and long term mission goals and outreach.
3. The Glory Road Ministries is requesting two (2) acres of Tribal land for its proposed new mission site which will be established to support various church ministries that will serve and benefit the community.
4. The proposed mission site and facilities, including the vision and goals for a better community, have been discussed with community members and is found to be reflective of the needs of the people to bring about renewal in all areas of their lives as well as spiritual ministry.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Chapter approves the request for two (2) acres of land located in Pinedale Community and that the land be designated as Glory Road Ministries property to develop, maintain, and operate as a mission site.
2. This petition be reviewed in a fair and timely manner, taking into consideration the common vision and goals of the Chapter and Glory Road Ministries to improve economic and social conditions of the community for present and future generations.

14. REPORT OR SUMMARY (REPORT ATTACHED) //		
a. Description of Undertaking: The sponsors, Delbert & Ella Nez, propose to construct a church and install associated facilities within the two acre church site. The total area of effect equals approximately 87,126 sq ft (8094 sq m) or 2.0 ac (0.81 ha). Ground disturbance, both surface and subsurface, is expected to be intensive and extensive from the use of heavy equipment. The lead agency for the proposed undertaking is the Bureau of Indian Affairs-Navajo Area Office.		
b. Existing Data Review: A check of NNHPD archival records indicates that four archaeological survey projects HPD 87-105, HPD 03-245, HPD 03-764 and HPD 03-1323 has been conducted, and one archaeological site, NM-Q-28-36 has been recorded within an approximate 100 m radius of the current project area. NM-Q-48-11 is located within the buffer zone of the project area.		
c. Area Environmental & Cultural Setting: The project is situated on a north facing slope at an elevation of 7081 ft (2158 m). Vegetation consists of juniper snakeweed and small seasonals. The surface sediment is aeolian sand. The nearest water source is an unnamed drainage, located 400 ft (121 m) east of the project area. The surrounding area has been impacted by the existing church, nearby homes, dirt roads, waterlines, powerlines and natural erosion.		
d. Field Methods: The requested archaeological survey and a TCP interview were conducted by Genevieve Pino. A Class III pedestrian survey was conducted by walking parallel transects spaced 15 m (45 ft) covering the project area. The total area inventoried equalled approximately 158,928 ft (14,764 sq m) or 3.6 ac (1.4 ha). Also a brief interview was conducted with Mr. Nez regarding Traditional Cultural Properties in and around the project area.		
15. CULTURAL RESOURCES FINDINGS: One archaeological site (previously recorded) and one (1) currently in-use area were identified during the inventory; no other cultural resources were encountered or identified.

EVALUATION OF SIGNIFICANCE OF EACH RESOURCE: Site NM-Q-28-36 possesses integrity of location and setting, meets the 50-year guideline, and is eligible for nomination to the National Register of Historic Places under criterion d. The site is more than 100 years old and is of archaeological interest: therefore it warrants protection under the Archaeological Resources Protection Act (ARPA). The site is ineligible for protection under the American Indian Religious Freedom Act (AIRFA) since it has no known religious significance.

The in-use area is less than 50 years old and is not distinctive enough to justify waiving the 50- year age guideline of the National Register. Being less than 100 years old, it does not meet the definition of an archaeological resource as required for protection under ARPA. The IUA is not eligible for protection under the American Indian Religious Freedom Act (AIRFA) since it does not have known religious significance.

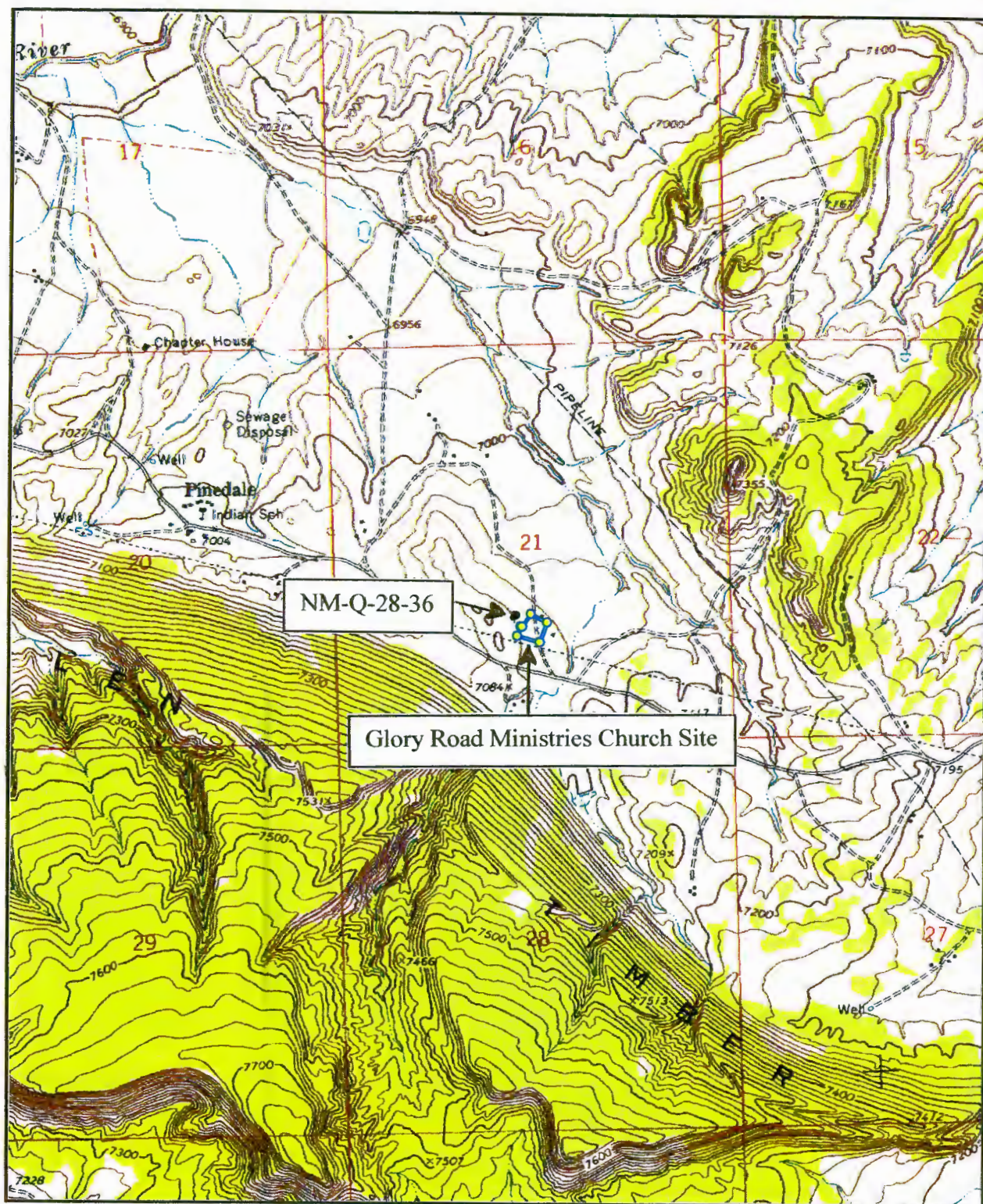


Figure 1. Map showing location of the project area and of identified cultural resource. USGS 7.5' map reference: Pinedale, N. Mex., 1963.

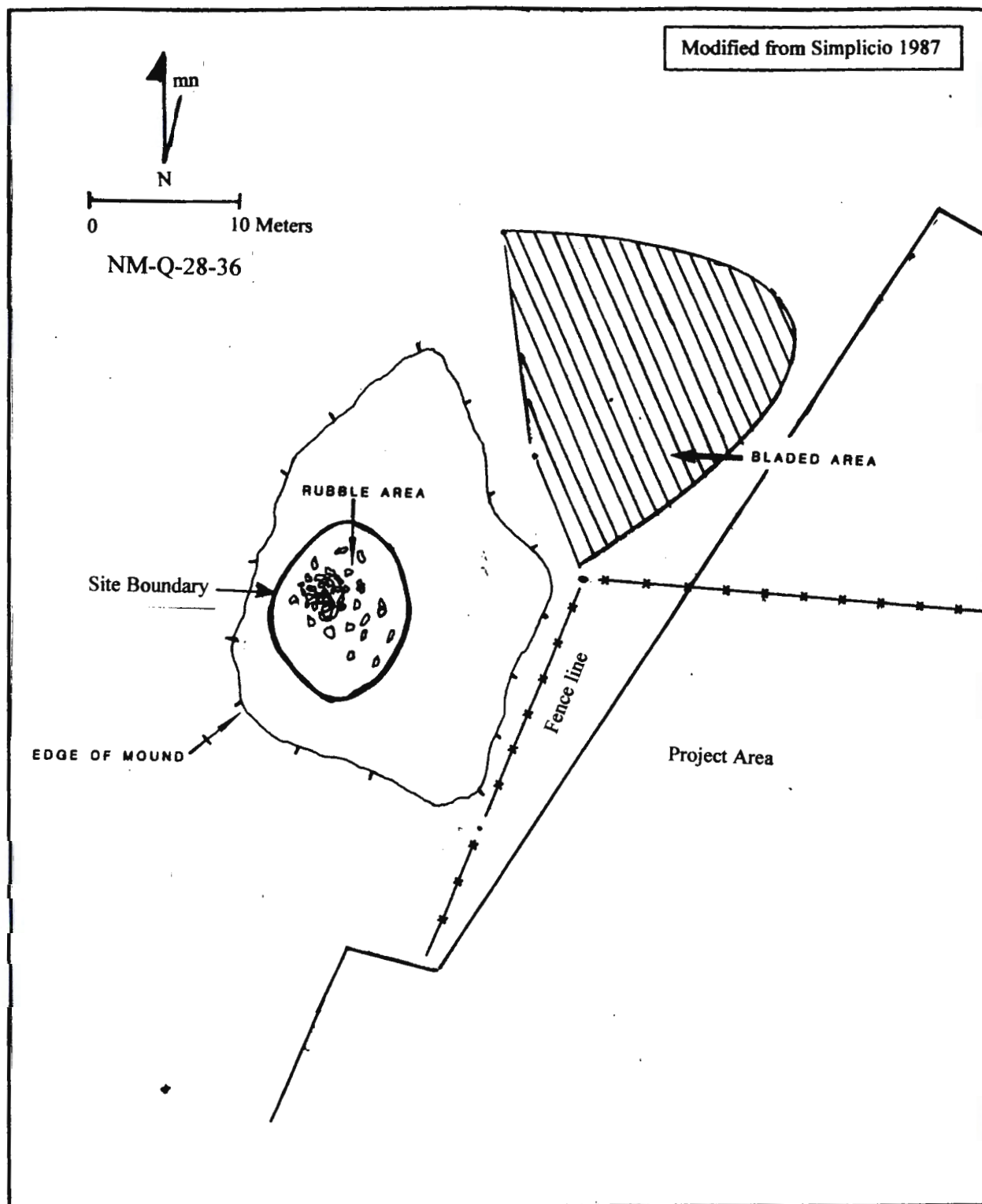


Figure 2. Plan map of site NM-Q-28-36.

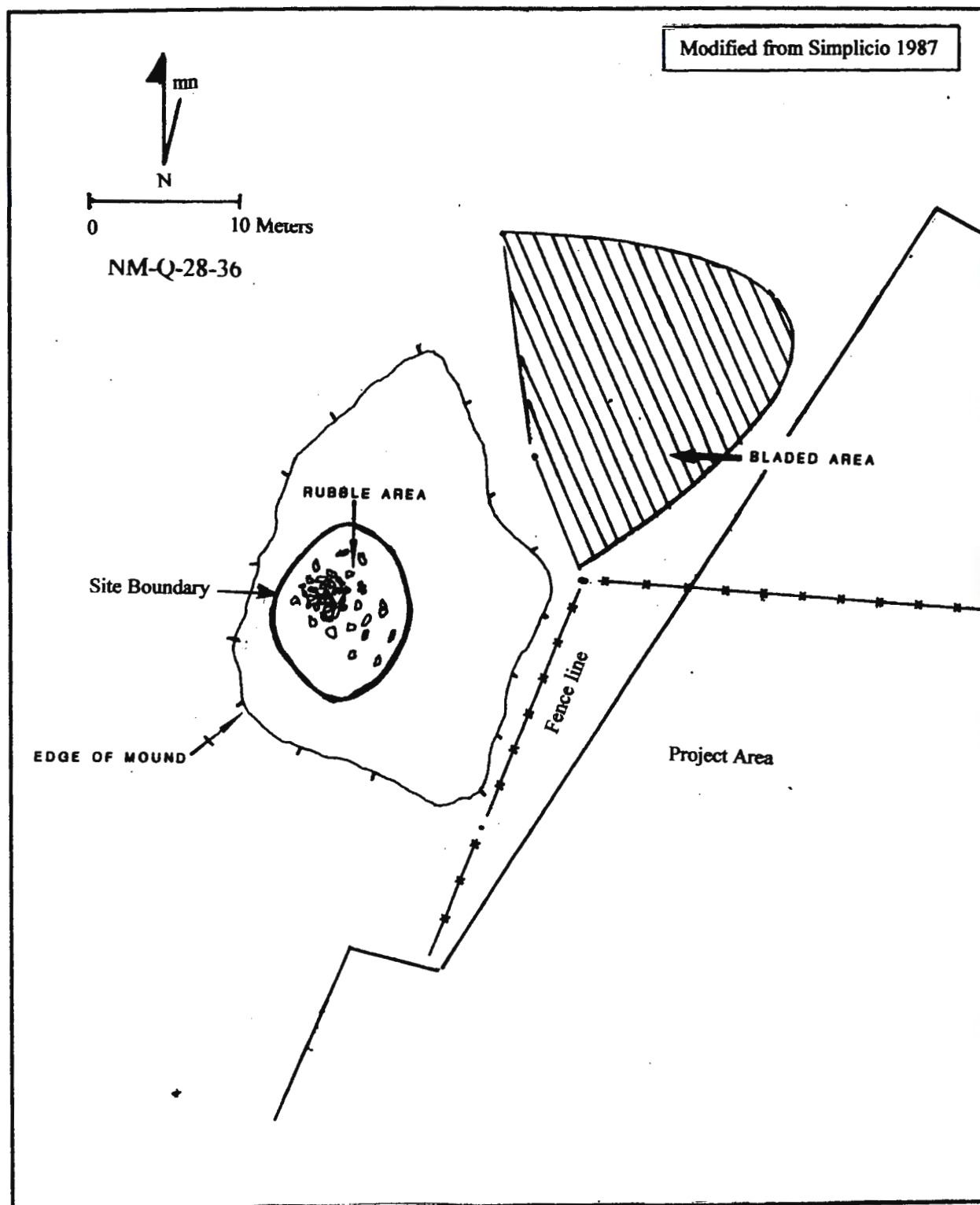

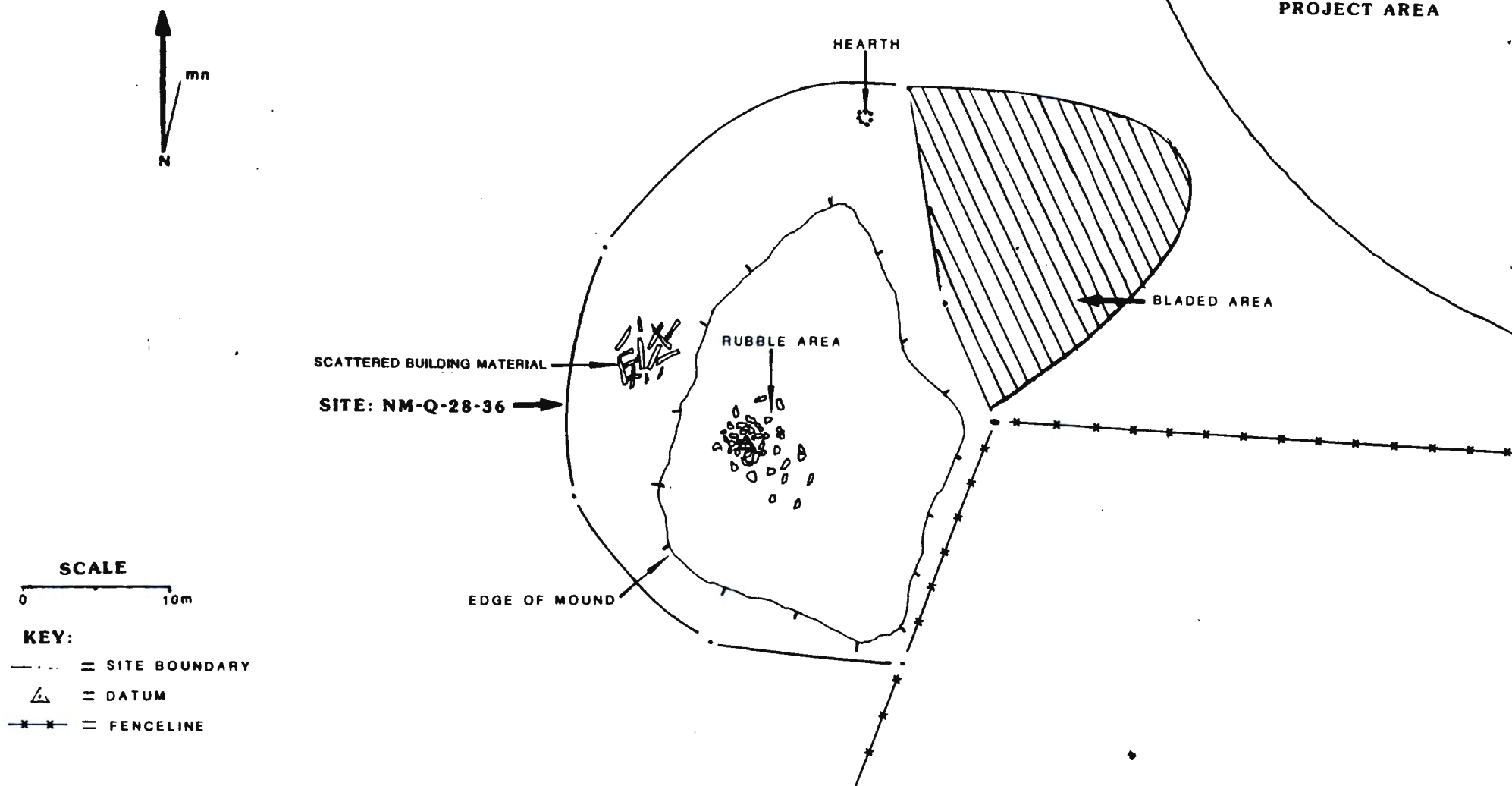


Figure 2. General plan map of Site NM-Q-28-36 (NNCRMP-87-105)

SITE DESCRIPTION: The site consist of a rubble mound, hearth, build material scatter, and a sparse scatter of artifacts. The rubble mound consist of sandstones 8m in diameter which appears to be a structure, but has no visible rock alignment. A sparse scatter of artifacts was located in the

rubble area which included a groundstone fragment, and a few sherds. The ceramic assemblage included one PII-PIII indented corrugated with medium coarse sand tempering and a dark core. This ceramic appears to be an outwash. No other Anasazi ceramics were located throughout the site. Other ceramics included Navajo Gray ware with sherd and sand temper and a dark core with striations on the outer surface; and a Gobernador Polychrome sherd with a buff colored slip on both sides of surfaces along with sherd and sand temper and medium gray core with no carbon streak. The Navajo ceramics date to 1700-1800 A.D. Northwest of the rubble mound is a scatter of building material 6m in diameter consisting of scrap lumber, scrap metal, roofing material, and miscellaneous glass fragments. These materials were placed there by local residents (see ethnographic data below). North of the rubble mound is a hearth 1m in diameter with metal fencing material partially buried within the ash and charcoal. The hearth does not appear to be associated with the older components of the site (see Figure 2).

The site has sustained heavy disturbance along the northeast border of the site due to tractor blading.

using scrap material that he put within the site area. Mr. Yazzie was then asked whether he knew when the site was in use or abandoned. He replied by saying no, his family did not move out there until about 1960. He was then asked if any of his other relatives knew of the site. Again, he replied "no". Mr. Yazzie then stated now that he knows there is a site there, he would seek an alternate location to build his shed. At this point, the archaeologist concluded the interview.

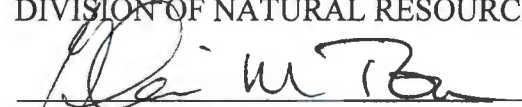

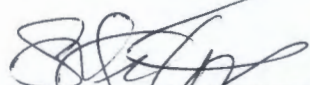

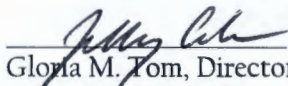

**TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR MISSION SITE PERMIT
GLORY ROAD MINISTRIES (PERMITTEE)**

1. This Mission Site Permit is issued to Glory Road Ministries, Post Office Box 150, Rehobeth, New Mexico 87322, to use and occupy Navajo Nation Trust Lands for religious purposes, and shall be subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein. The term of the Mission Site Permit is effective beginning on the date the permit is approved by the Resources & Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council or authorized representative. This Permit is authorized by Resources and Development Committee No. _____.
2. This permit is revocable at the discretion of the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. The permit shall immediately be revoked for the failure to use the land herein described for religious purposes. It is understood and agreed that this instrument is "NOT A LEASE" and is not to be taken or construed as granting any leasehold interest or right in or to the land herein described, but is merely a temporary permit, terminable and revocable.
3. The Permittee shall be given at least thirty (30) days written notice before this Mission Site Permit is terminated and revoked. Upon termination of the Mission Site Permit, the Permittee shall have ninety (90) days in which to remove from the site to dispose of any and all buildings, structures, materials and equipment and other personal property owned by the religious organization. After the expiration of the ninety (90) days, the Permittee shall peacefully and without legal process deliver the possession of the premises to the Navajo Nation. All improvements not removed after ninety (90) days will become the property of the Navajo Nation, unless the Navajo Nation demands in writing that the improvements be removed.
4. This Permit is not transferable, except with the consent of the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council.
5. This Permit shall be reviewed every five (5) years to reevaluate the rent and compliance with the terms and conditions.
6. The legal land description of the premises is described as follows:

TRACT DESCRIPTION

A Tract of land situated within the South One-Half of Section 21, Township 16 North, Range 15 West, New Mexico Principal Meridian. Located near the vicinity of Pinedale, District 16, Crownpoint Agency, Navajo Nation, McKinley County, State of New Mexico and being more particularly described as follows:

Thence, South 66° 39' 27" West, a measured distance of 2,656.90 feet, to the Point of Beginning of the herein described tract;

Thence, South 19° 08' 42" West, a distance of 280.17 feet;
Thence, North 74° 07' 40" West, a distance of 311.45 feet;
Thence, North 19° 09' 42" East, a distance of 135.03 feet;
Thence, South 73° 02' 00" East, a distance of 19.93 feet;
Thence, North 33° 34' 10" East, a distance of 199.49 feet;

Thence, South 63° 31' 30" East, a distance of 243.28 feet to the Point of Beginning

The described Tract of land contains 2.00 acres or 87,119.54 square feet, more or less.

7. The annual rental is set at \$ _____ per year and is due on or before the first day of January of each year the Permit remains in effect. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1157, if the Permittee fails to pay the rent when due, this permit shall automatically terminate. The Permittee is responsible to make direct payments to the Navajo Nation Accounts Receivable Section, Post Office Box 3150, Window Rock, Arizona 86515.
8. The Permittee may develop, use and occupy the area under the permit for the purpose(s) of Mission Site. The Permittee may not develop, use or occupy the area under the permit for any other purpose without the prior written approval of the Navajo Nation. The approval of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon conditions or withheld in the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation. The Permittee may not develop, use or occupy the area under the permit for any unlawful purpose.
9. In all activities conducted by the Permittee within the Navajo Nation, the Permittee shall abide by all laws and regulations of the Navajo Nation and of the United States, now in force and effect or as hereafter may come into force and effect, including but not limited to the following:
 - a. Title 25, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 162;
 - b. All applicable federal and Navajo Nation antiquities laws and regulations, with the following additional condition: In the event of a discovery all operations in the immediate vicinity of the discovery must cease and the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department must be notified immediately. As used herein, "discovery" means any previously unidentified or incorrectly identified cultural resources, including but not limited to archeological deposits, human remains, or location reportedly associated with Native American religious/traditional beliefs or practices;
 - c. The Navajo Preference in Employment Act, 15 N.N.C. §§ 601 et seq., and the Navajo Nation Business Opportunity Law, 5 N.N.C. §§ 201 et seq.; and
 - d. The Navajo Nation Water Code, 22 N.N.C. § 1101 et seq. Permittee shall apply for and submit all applicable permits and information to the Navajo Nation Water Resources Department, or its successor.
10. The Permittee shall ensure that the air quality of the Navajo Nation is not jeopardized due to violation of applicable laws and regulations by its operations pursuant to the permit.
11. The Permittee shall clear and keep clear the lands within the permit area to the extent compatible with the purpose of the permit, and shall dispose of all vegetation and other materials cut, uprooted, or otherwise accumulated during any surface disturbance activities.

12. The Permittee shall at all times during the term of the permit and at the Permittee's sole cost and expense, maintain the land subject to the permit and all improvements located thereon and make all necessary and reasonable repairs.
13. The Permittee shall indemnify and hold harmless the Navajo Nation and their respective authorized agents, employees, land users and occupants, against any liability for loss of life, personal injury and property damages arising from the development, use or occupancy or use of the permit area by the Permittee.
14. The Permittee shall not assign, convey or transfer, in any manner whatsoever, the permit or any interest therein, or in or to any of the improvements on the land subject to the permit, without the prior written consent of the Navajo Nation. Any such attempted assignment, conveyance or transfer of the permit without such prior written consent shall be void and of no effect. The consent of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon conditions or withheld in the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation.
15. The Navajo Nation may terminate the permit for violation of any of the terms and conditions stated herein. In addition, the permit shall be terminable in whole or part by the Navajo Nation or authorized representative for any of the following causes:
 - a. Failure to comply with any terms and conditions of the permit or of applicable laws or regulations;
 - b. Non-use of the permit; and
 - c. The use of the land subject to the permit for any purpose inconsistent with the purpose for which the permit is granted.
16. At the termination of the permit, the Permittee shall peaceably and without legal process deliver up the possession of the premises, in good condition, usual wear and tear excepted. Upon the written request of the Navajo Nation, the Permittee shall provide the Navajo Nation, at the Permittee's sole cost and expense, with an environmental audit assessment of the premises at least sixty (60) days prior to delivery of said premises.
17. The Permittee shall give written notice to the Navajo Nation Land Department regarding any change to the Permittee's contact information, address, leadership, organizational name, or any other substantial change to the organization. The notice shall be given within thirty (30) days and delivered to the Navajo Land Department at Post Office Box 2249, Window Rock, Arizona 86515.
18. Holding over by the Permittee after the termination of the permit shall not constitute a renewal or extension thereof or give the Permittee any rights hereunder or in or to the land subject to the permit or to any improvements located thereon.
19. The Navajo Nation shall have the right, at any reasonable time during the term of the permit, to enter upon the premises, or any part thereof, to inspect the same and any improvements located thereon.
20. By acceptance of the grant of permit, the Permittee consents to the full territorial legislative, executive and judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation, including but not limited to the jurisdiction to levy fines and to enter judgments for compensatory and punitive damages and injunctive relief, in connection with all activities conducted by the Permittee within the Navajo Nation or which have

a proximate (legal) effect on persons or property within the Navajo Nation.

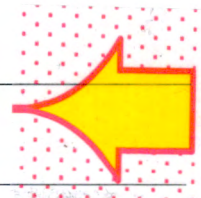
21. By acceptance of the grant of the permit, the Permittee covenants and agrees never to contest or challenge the legislative, executive or judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation on the basis that such jurisdiction is inconsistent with the status of the Navajo Nation as an Indian nation, or that the Navajo Nation government is not a government of general jurisdiction, or that the Navajo Nation government does not possess full police power (i.e., the power to legislate and regulate for the general health and welfare) over all lands, persons and activities within its territorial boundaries, or on any other basis not generally applicable to a similar challenge to the jurisdiction of a state government. Nothing contained in this provision shall be construed to negate or impair federal responsibilities with respect to the land subject to the permit or to the Navajo Nation.
22. Any action or proceeding brought by the Permittee against the Navajo Nation in connection with or arising out of the terms and conditions of the permit shall be resolved administratively under the laws of the Navajo Nation, and no action or proceeding shall be brought by the Permittee against the Navajo Nation, in any court of any state.
23. Nothing contained herein shall be interpreted as constituting a waiver, express or implied, of the sovereign immunity of the Navajo Nation.
24. Except as prohibited by applicable federal law, the law of the Navajo Nation shall govern the construction, performance and enforcement of the terms and conditions contained herein.
25. The terms and conditions contained herein shall extend to and be binding upon the successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees and agents, including all contractors and subcontractors, of the Permittee, and the term "Permittee," whenever used herein, shall be deemed to include all such successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees and agents.
26. There is expressly reserved to the Navajo Nation full territorial legislative, executive and judicial jurisdiction over the area under the permit and all lands burdened by the permit, including without limitation over all persons, including the public, and all activities conducted or otherwise occurring within the area under the permit; and the area under the permit and all lands burdened by the permit shall be and forever remain Navajo Indian Country for purposes of Navajo Nation jurisdiction.
