23RD NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - FIRST YEAR, 2015

AN ACTION

RELATING TO THE NAABIK'IYATI' COMMITTEE; APPROVING SPEAKER'S APPOINTMENT TO THE NAVAJO-HOPI LAND COMMISSION

BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Findings

- 1. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation standing committee and as such the Naabik'íyáti' Committee approves the Navajo Nation Speaker's appointment to the Navajo-Hopi Land Commission. 2 N.N.C. §§ 700 (A) (2012) and 852(A) (2009) (current version at CJY-27-11 , 22nd N.N.C. §3 (as passed by Navajo Nation Council, July 19, 2011).
- The Navajo Nation Council established the Navajo-Hopi Land Commission within the Legislative Branch. 2 N.N.C. § 851 (A) (2009).
- 3. The Navajo-Hopi Land Commission's purpose is to "[m]onitor, collect, and update information on any and all land use conflicts between Navajo Nation and the Hopi Tribe, and any claimants in and to lands within the area described in the Act of June 14, 1934 (48 Stat. 960) [and to] [s]peak and for the Navajo Nation with respect to the land selection and land exchange provisions of P.L. 96-305." 2 N.N.C. § 851(B) (2009).
- 4. The Speaker shall appoint nine Navajo Nation Council voting members who represent areas affected by the Navajo-Hopi Land Dispute. 2 N.N.C. §852 (A). (current version at C0-44-15, 23rd N.N.C. §2 (as passed by Navajo Nation Council, October 21, 2015). EXHIBIT A.
- 5. The Speaker has appointed Kee Allen Begay, Jr., Council Delegate, Tachee/Blue Gap, Many Farms, Nazlini, Tselani/Cottonwood, Low Mountain, to the Navajo Hopi Land Commission. EXHIBIT B.

- 6. Navajo-Hopi Land Commission members shall serve at the pleasure of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. §852(B)(2) (2009) (CJY-27-11, 22nd N.N.C. §3, as passed by Navajo Nation Council, July 19, 2011).
- 7. Navajo-Hopi Land Commission members shall serve a term coinciding with their term as Navajo Nation Council Delegates and until their successors are appointed. 2 N.N.C. § 852 (D) (2009).

Section Two. Approving Appointment

The Naabik'íyáti' Committee, pursuant to its authority under Navajo Nation law, hereby approves Kee Allen Begay, Jr. as a Commission member to the Navajo Hopi Land Commission from the Chinle Agency.

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL

23rd NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL -- First Year, 2015

AN ACT

RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING 2 N.N.C. § 852(A) AND (B)(1) OF THE NAVAJO-HOPI LAND COMMISSION ACT TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF VOTING MEMBERS FROM EIGHT TO NINE

BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Findings and Purposes

- A. The Law and Order Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 601(B)(14), reviews and makes recommendations to the Navajo Nation Council proposed amendments to the Navajo Nation Code.
- B. The Naabik'iyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9), reviews proposed legislation which requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council.
- C. Enactments of positive law must be reviewed and approved by resolution by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A).
- D. The Navajo Nation Council established the Navajo-Hopi Land Commission within the Legislative Branch. 2 N.N.C. § 851(A) (2009).
- E. The Navajo-Hopi Land Commission's purpose is to "[m]onitor, collect, and update information on any and all land use conflicts between Navajo Nation and the Hopi Tribe, and any claimants in and to the lands within the area described in the Act of June 14, 1934 (48 Stat. 960) [and to] [s]peak and for the Navajo Nation with respect to the land selection and land exchange provisions of P.L. 96-305." 2 N.N.C. § 851(B) (2009).
- F. Currently the Navajo-Hopi Land Commission consists of eight regular voting members of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. §852 (A) and (B)(1) (2009) (current version at CJY-27-11, as passed by 22nd Navajo Nation Council, July 19, 2011).

- G. It is necessary to increase the number of delegates that serve as voting members of the Navajo-Hopi Land Commission from eight to nine regular voting members, to ensure adequate representation of the areas affected by the Navajo-Hopi Land Dispute.
- H. It is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation to amend Title 2 of the Navajo Nation Code to increase the number of regular voting members of the Navajo-Hopi Land Commission from eight to nine voting members of the Navajo Nation Council.

Section Two. Amendments to Title 2 of the Navajo Nation Code

The Navajo Nation hereby amends Navajo Nation Code, Title 2, § 852 (A) and (B)(1) as follows:

* * * * * * * * *

NAVAJO NATION CODE ANNOTATED TITLE 2. NAVAJO NATION GOVERNMENT CHAPTER 3. LEGISLATIVE BRANCH SUBCHAPTER 11. BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS ARTICLE 1. NAVAJO-HOPI LAND COMMISSION

* * * * * * * * *

§ 852. Membership; selection; Chairperson and Vice-chairperson; term of office; ex-officio

A. The Commission shall consist of <u>eight nine</u> regular voting members and two ex-officio members who shall be appointed by the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council with the approval of the Naabik'iyati' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. The Commission shall have the authority to establish subcommittees as deemed appropriate to provide advisory input from citizens, professionals, federal and other non-elected sources.

B. The Commission shall consist of:

1. Eight Nine voting members of the Navajo Nation Council representing areas affected by the Navajo-Hopi Land Dispute.

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Section Three. Effective Date

The Act enacted herein shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §221(B).

Section Four. Codification

The provisions of this ordinance which amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

Section Five. Saving Clause

Should any provisions of this ordinance be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those portions of this ordinance which are not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.
