PURPOSE: The purpose of this resolution is to approve an appropriation for chapters with less than \$25,000 in available emergency funds.

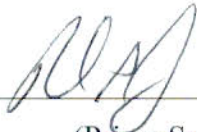
This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

EMERGENCY FUNDS; WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820 (E) AND (F) REGARDING TO THE
RESTRICTION OVER MATCHING RECURRING REVENUES WITH RECURRING
EXPENDITURES

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation established the Resources and Development Committee (RDC) as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such gave RDC oversight over Navajo Nation Chapters. 2 N.N.C. §§ 500 (A) and 501 (C)(1).
- B. The Navajo Nation established the Budget and Finance Committee (BFC) as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered BFC to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. §§ 300 (A) and 301 (B)(2).

- 1 C. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo
2 Nation standing committee and as such proposed legislation that requires final
3 action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti'
4 Committee. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9).
- 5 D. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing of body of the Navajo Nation. 2
6 N.N.C. § 102(A).
- 7 E. The Navajo Nation Council has the authority to approve supplemental
8 appropriations. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- 9 F. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:
- 10 1. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be
11 submitted to the Office of Management and Budget for budget impact
12 analysis. 12 N.N.C. § 820(M).
- 13 2. When the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and
14 beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental
15 appropriations may be approved by the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C.
16 § 820(L).
- 17 3. Supplemental Appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall
18 only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at §
19 820(F). The Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for
20 designation recurring and non-recurring revenues. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- 21 4. The Nation shall budget all recurring operating expenses, including capital
22 maintenance, from recurring revenues. Long term debt shall not be used to
23 finance recurring operating expenses. 12 N.N.C. §820(E).
- 24 5. The Navajo Nation Code provides, "[t]he Nation shall restrict non-
25 recurring revenues to budget non-recurring expenditures. In addition, non-
26 recurring revenues will be budgeted only after an examination by the
27 Controller to determine whether or not the revenues are subsidizing an
28 imbalance between recurring revenues and expenditures, and expenditures
29 may be authorized only if a long-term (three-five year) forecast shows that
30 the operating deficit will not continue. Otherwise, non-recurring revenues

will be added to the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund balance. This provision may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full Navajo Nation Council.” 12 N.N.C. § 820(F).

SECTION 2. FINDINGS

- A. This supplemental funding request is made for the purpose of emergency financial stability to address all aspects of providing emergency services including, preparedness, mitigation, response, and recovery. The aim of the funding is to reduce the harmful effects of all hazards incurred by chapters.
- B. The amount requested is One Million Eight Hundred Seventy-Four Thousand Three Hundred Fifty-Three Dollars (\$1,874,353). The supplemental funding proposal and budget documents are attached as **Exhibit A**.
- C. The intent of this supplemental funding request is to bring chapters with less than \$25,000 in emergency funds to \$25,000. Any chapter with a zero after it in **Exhibit A** had at least \$25,000 in its emergency funds at the time the budget was prepared. Any chapter listed to receive more than \$25,000 had a negative balance when the documents in **Exhibit A** were prepared.
- D. The Executive Branch has completed a Section 164 Review which is attached as **Exhibit B**.
- E. The memorandum provided by the Office of Management and Budget, dated October 8, 2019, satisfies the budget impact analysis required by 12 N.N.C. 820(M) and is included in **Exhibit B**.
- F. The Office of the Controller provided a memorandum, dated November 1, 2019, indicating this request for funding is recurring. This memorandum satisfies the requirements provided in 12 N.N.C. § 820(L) and is included in **Exhibit B**.

SECTION 3. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. § 820 (E) AND (F)

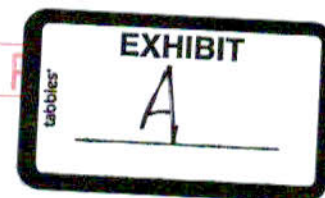
The Navajo Nation Council waives 12 N.N.C. § 820(E) and (F) with regard to the restriction on matching recurring revenues with recurring expenditures.

1 **SECTION 4. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE**
2 **UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF**
3 **ONE MILLION EIGHT HUNDRED SEVENTY FOUR THOUSAND THREE**
4 **HUNDRED FIFTY THREE DOLLARS (\$1,874,353) FOR CHAPTER**
5 **EMERGENCY FUNDS**

6 A. This supplemental appropriation of \$1,874,353 shall be from that amount of
7 funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated
8 Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller and as indicated the
9 documents in **Exhibit A**.

10 B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves supplemental funding from the Unreserved,
11 Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of \$1,874,353 for chapter emergency
12 funds as indicated in the documents in **Exhibit A**.

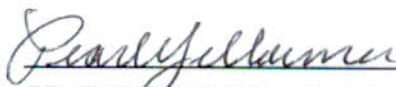

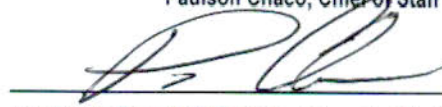

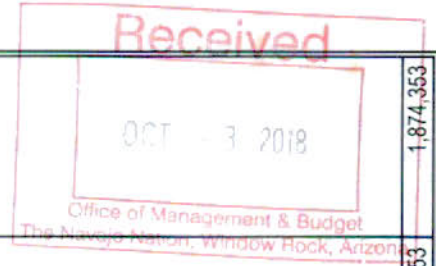

In addition, there are currently requests from the UUFB for water rights and UNM Lobo Rainforest that would further reduce the amount of the UUFB, if approved.
2. This request is for \$1,874,353 for funding of Emergency Financial Stability. This amount to bring the chapters funding levels for emergency purposed back up to an adequate amount. There is no current emergency the funding is for the chapters to have the financial stability and be prepared for any type of emergency that comes up.
3. This request would be considered **RECURRING** expenses.

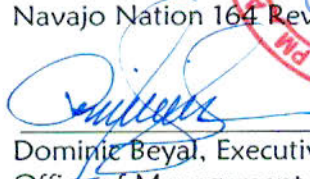

SUBJECT: Review of Doc. No. 013542, Funding Proposal by Division of Community Development for NN 110 Chapters Emergency Financial Stability in the Amount of \$1,874,353

Pursuant to 12 NNC 820 (M) requiring OMB reviewed the subject document and provides the following information

1. The Proposal is for NN 110 Chapters for emergency financial stability, but some Chapters has zero amounts, some are less or more than \$25,000. The amounts for each Chapters are inconsistent. No explanation is provided why Chapters are at either zero or \$25,000. This should be justified.
2. According to Office of the Auditor General's latest report as of June 30, 2019 (Exhibit B) has available fund balances for the 110 NN Chapters for Emergency and Disaster Relief Funds varying from \$101,000 to zero balance for each Chapters.
3. The Office of the Controller says the UUFB has an amount of \$16,960,422 available at this time. This project appears to be eligible for funding from this source.
4. Because of the limited availability of funds, OMB advises the Branch Chiefs to prioritize all supplemental funding proposals pursuant to the FY 2020 Budget Resolution CS-30-19 (paragraph 'M'), the FY 2020 Budget Instructions Manual (Section XII), and the Appropriations Act. This activity should be completed by the three branches to determine priorities.
 - a) The Resources Development Committee by resolution RDCJY-033-19, recommended a total of \$11,310,074 for a number of DCD unmet needs. There are now 5 proposals (#'s 012551, 031448, 013449, 013542, 013544), totaling \$9,187,427 in the Executive Order review process.
 - b) Because of all these proposals totaling over \$90 million from all 3 Branches, including the group from DCD, the President/Vice-President said the 3 Branches will decide on prioritize as indicated in the September 3, 2019, budget message to the Navajo Nation Council.
 - c) Therefore, DCD should prioritize these proposals and the OPVP should prioritize all Executive Branch proposals.

Navajo Nation Fiscal Year 2020 Comprehensive Budget Session Message

Dear Honorable Members of the 24th Navajo Nation Council,

The Office of the President and Vice President is grateful for the dedicated work of the 24th Navajo Nation Council in developing a proposed Fiscal Year 2020 Comprehensive Budget.

As leaders of the Navajo government, we are responsible to account for public funds, to manage finances wisely, and to plan for the adequate funding of services desired by the Navajo People. Furthermore, we assert the 2018 Navajo Nation election expressed the will of the Navajo People to change how government manages its financial resources. We as leaders can no longer tolerate poor use of the financial resources of the people by the government. The Nez-Lizer Administration honors and supports this position of responsible, accountable, and effective use of all public funds as we carry out the mandate of change. We must protect the Navajo peoples' money.

Allocating Funds Based on Priorities

With the Executive Branch allocation, we have prioritized program expenditures for operational use to deliver needed services to the Navajo People through the *Hozhó Diné Bì Nahat'á Plan*. This plan is a carefully thought out strategy designed to guide us over the next four years. Executive Branch Division Directors deliberated the proper use of these public funds as authorized by the Branch Chiefs Agreement. However, by amending their proposed program budgets without consulting Division Directors, tribal programs may be adversely impacted and these changes could lead to setbacks for programs.

Budget and Finance Committee Amendments

One such example is the amendment approved by the Budget and Finance Committee to reduce the allocated amount for chapter stipends and compensation from \$2 million to \$1 million. In years past, chapters have called on us to fully fund this line item. With this in mind, the Division of Community Development recommended that it be funded at \$2 million in this

year's budget through the use of the Personnel Lapse Fund, but with this amendment, we will once again be kicking the can down the road and be faced with a budget shortfall. Recently, the Eastern Agency Council passed a resolution requesting full funding for chapter stipends as well. While this amendment had good intentions, it creates financial uncertainty and threatens the stability we seek to establish through the *Nahat'a Plan*. We respectfully ask the Council to fully fund the chapter stipends.

Another amendment approved by the Budget and Finance Committee is the reallocation of \$250,000 from the Retirement Plan Account for Radiation Exposure Compensation Act lobbying efforts. While our Administration strongly supports the reauthorization of the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act, we feel the best way to lobby is through the Navajo Nation Washington Office and through face-to-face meetings with House and Senate members. Our Administration is committed to continuing the advocacy efforts to ensure compensation for downwinders and others, but not at the expense of risking the retirement plan for our retired employees who earned this benefit through years of dedicated work to the Nation. We propose to restore the Retirement Plan Account to \$500,000 and work together to strengthen our advocacy efforts to ensure that the reauthorization of RECA with expanded benefits is passed through the House and Senate and signed into law.



Unmet Needs - UUFB

We are aware of unexpected and unmet needs. To this end, the Nez-Lizer Administration will consider proposals that use the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance (UUFB) to address unmet program and project needs. Each offered UUFB request will be individually evaluated based on its own merits. We ask that you work directly with Division Directors to create meaningful legislation that resolves a particular need and keeps us within our budget.

In short, we must coordinate the use of public funds to optimize effectiveness. Our government must learn to strategically plan and create expected results with existing funds. We request that the Council hold a special session dedicated to addressing and considering unmet needs, in accordance with 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), which requires the three branches to prioritize unmet needs.

We appreciate your willingness to save a significant part of the \$40 million from the UUFB for anticipated decline in revenues for the Nation. That saved amount of \$21 million is part of the FY2020 budget. It is through this shared exercise that we can survive unknown economic trials that loom ahead of us. In addition, we greatly appreciate your support of the General Wage Adjustment for all Navajo Nation employees, including employees of the 110 chapters.

Closing Remarks/Request for Special Session

In closing, the financial times we live in are challenging. We can no longer continue the undisciplined spending practices of the past. As President of the Navajo Nation, I am held to

the highest standard to ensure fiscal responsibility and financial integrity. I will not violate my fiduciary responsibility to the Navajo People by overspending or any other means. We respectfully request for your support of the FY2020 Comprehensive Budget and to fully fund chapter stipends, and consideration for a special session to address unmet needs. Once again, we thank you for your leadership and advocacy on behalf of our people and our communities. We look forward to a productive and positive budget session. Ahe'hee'

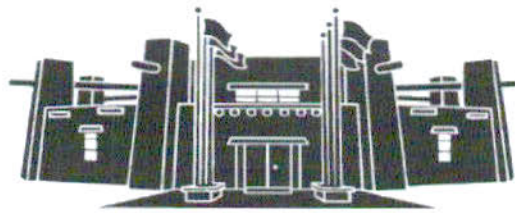

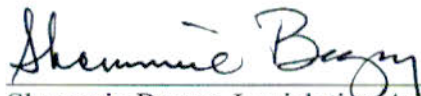
