Dear Speaker Damon,

Pursuant to the authority provided by the Navajo People and vested in the Navajo Nation President, I am using the line item veto authority for CJY-58-20.

Using Fiscal Year 2020 funds for outstanding expenses in Fiscal Year 2017 is not good financial management or sound fiscal practice. There is no supporting documentation for this resolution and no rational explanation of the shortfall for the Forest Lake Chapter. The Navajo Division of Community Development is put in a difficult situation of rectifying a situation that should have been addressed in Fiscal Year 2017, or at the latest Fiscal Year 2018. Also, there is no indication from the Office of the Controller on the appropriateness of opening Fiscal Year 2017 financial records to resolve a stipend issue with 2020 funds.

The Chapter Official's stipend is a constant issue each year and our Administration has addressed this matter to ensure sufficient funding for Chapter Officials. We are open to policy changes to address this issue; however, Forest Lake Chapter's issue may be beyond financial repair. Nevertheless, we will look closely at the matter for other possible solutions. The only reasonable choice at this time is a line item veto of Resolution CJY-58-20.

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 24th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - SECOND YEAR, 2020

AN ACTION

RELATING TO, RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT, BUDGET AND FINANCE, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES, AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND, BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,000) FOR FOREST LAKE CHAPTER OFFICIALS' STIPENDS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017; WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820 (E) AND 820 (F) REGARDING THE DESIGNATION OF RECURRING AND NON-RECURRING REVENUES

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation established the Resources and Development Committee (RDC) as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such gave RDC oversight over Navajo Nation Chapters. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 500 (A), and 501 (C)(1).
- B. The Navajo Nation established the Budget and Finance Committee (BFC) as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered BFC to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 300 (A), and 301 (B)(2).
- C. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation standing committee and as such proposed legislation that requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9) and 700 (A).
- D. The Title 12 Appropriations Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:
 - 1. When the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be allocated by the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
 - 2. Supplemental appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at § 820 (F). The Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for designating recurring and non-recurring revenues. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L).

3. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget for budget impact analysis. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (M).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. This is a request for supplemental funding to pay Forest Lake Chapter Officials stipends from Fiscal Year 2017.
- B. In Fiscal Year 2017, Forest Lake suffered a budget shortfall and was unable to pay stipend compensation in the amount of \$3,000 to its chapter officials.
- C. A supplemental funding proposal summary, budget forms 1, 2, and 4 are attached as Exhibit A.
- D. A section 164 review is attached as Exhibit B. The 164 review includes a budget impact analysis by the Office of Management and Budget, a memorandum from the Controller. The Controller has indicated these costs are recurring.
- E. As a result of the Controller's designation of the costs as recurring, waiver language is included.
- F. Forest Lake Chapter submitted Resolution FLC-19-04-002 in support of this request for supplemental funding, which is attached as **Exhibit C**.

SECTION THREE. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820 (E) AND 820 (F) REGARDING THE DESIGNATION OF RECURRING AND NON-RECURRING REVENUES

The Navajo Nation Council hereby waives 12 N.N.C. §§ 820 (E) and (F) with regard to the restriction of the appropriating of non-recurring revenues to recurring costs.

SECTION FOUR. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,000 FOR FOREST LAKE CHAPTER OFFICIALS' STIPENDS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017, BUSINESS UNIT NUMBER 108016

This supplemental appropriation of \$3,000 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller for the Forest Lake Chapter officials' stipends for Fiscal Year 2017, Business Unit Number 108016.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves supplemental funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of

\$3,000 for the Forest Lake Chapter officials' stipends for Fiscal Year 2017, Business Unit Number 108016.

Unmet needs amounts for FY2020 Comprehensive Budgets have yet to be determined and if any are approved would also reduce this available balance. In addition, there are currently requests from the UUFB for water rights and UNM Lobo Rainforest that would further reduce the amount of the UUFB, if approved.
- 2. This request is for \$3,000 for Forest Lake Chapter Officials Stipends.
- 3. This request would be considered **RECURRING** for operational expenses.

Pursuant to 12 NNC 820 (M) requiring OMB reviewed the subject document and provides the following information

1. It is not clear about the how the stipends were not paid to Chapter Official and no supporting documents are attached. Normally, OMB understands that the Chapter Officials FY 2017 September stipend would be paid with the FY 2018 carryover. Is there a reason why this has not been done?

2. The Office of the Controller says the UUFB has an amount of \$16,960,422 available at this time. This project appears to be eligible for funding from this source.

3. Because of the limited availability of funds, OMB advises the Branch Chiefs to prioritize all supplemental funding proposals pursuant to the FY 2020 Budget Resolution CS-30-19 (paragraph 'N'), the FY 2020 Budget Instructions Manual (Section XII), and the Appropriations Act. This activity should be completed by the three branches to determine priorities.

a) The Resources Development Committee by resolution RDCJY-033-19, recommended a total of \$11,310,074 for a number of DCD unmet needs. There are now 5 proposals (#'s 012551, 031448, 013449, 013542, 013544), totaling \$9,187,427 in the Executive Order review process.

b) Because of all these proposals totaling over \$90 million from all 3 Branches, including the group from DCD, the President/Vice-President said the 3 Branches will decide on prioritize as indicated in the September 3, 2019, budget message to the Navajo Nation Council.

c) Therefore, DCD should prioritize these proposals and the OPVP should prioritize all Executive Branch proposals.

Navajo Nation Fiscal Year 2020 Comprehensive Budget Session Message

Dear Honorable Members of the 24th Navajo Nation Council,

The Office of the President and Vice President is grateful for the dedicated work of the 24th Navajo Nation Council in developing a proposed Fiscal Year 2020 Comprehensive Budget.

As leaders of the Navajo government, we are responsible to account for public funds, to manage finances wisely, and to plan for the adequate funding of services desired by the Navajo People. Furthermore, we assert the 2018 Navajo Nation election expressed the will of the Navajo People to change how government manages its financial resources. We as leaders can no longer tolerate poor use of the financial resources of the people by the government. The Nez-Lizer Administration honors and supports this position of responsible, accountable, and effective use of all public funds as we carry out the mandate of change. We must protect the Navajo peoples' money.

Allocating Funds Based on Priorities

With the Executive Branch allocation, we have prioritized program expenditures for operational use to deliver needed services to the Navajo People through the *Hozhó Diné Bi Nahat'á Plan*. This plan is a carefully thought out strategy designed to guide us over the next four years. Executive Branch Division Directors deliberated the proper use of these public funds as authorized by the Branch Chiefs Agreement. However, by amending their proposed program budgets without consulting Division Directors, tribal programs may be adversely impacted and these changes could lead to setbacks for programs.

Budget and Finance Committee Amendments

One such example is the amendment approved by the Budget and Finance Committee to reduce the allocated amount for chapter stipends and compensation from \$2 million to \$1 million. In years past, chapters have called on us to fully fund this line item. With this in mind, the Division of Community Development recommended that it be funded at \$2 million in this

year's budget through the use of the Personnel Lapse Fund, but with this amendment, we will once again be kicking the can down the road and be faced with a budget shortfall. Recently, the Eastern Agency Council passed a resolution requesting full funding for chapter stipends as well. While this amendment had good intentions, it creates financial uncertainty and threatens the stability we seek to establish through the *Nahat'a Plan*. We respectfully ask the Council to fully fund the chapter stipends.

Another amendment approved by the Budget and Finance Committee is the reallocation of \$250,000 from the Retirement Plan Account for Radiation Exposure Compensation Act lobbying efforts. While our Administration strongly supports the reauthorization of the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act, we feel the best way to lobby is through the Navajo Nation Washington Office and through face-to-face meetings with House and Senate members. Our Administration is committed to continuing the advocacy efforts to ensure compensation for downwinders and others, but not at the expense of risking the retirement plan for our retired employees who earned this benefit through years of dedicated work to the Nation. We propose to restore the Retirement Plan Account to \$500,000 and work together to strengthen our advocacy efforts to ensure that the reauthorization of RECA with expanded benefits is passed through the House and Senate and signed into law.

Unmet Needs - UUFB

We are aware of unexpected and unmet needs. To this end, the Nez-Lizer Administration will consider proposals that use the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance (UUFB) to address unmet program and project needs. Each offered UUFB request will be individually evaluated based on its own merits. We ask that you work directly with Division Directors to create meaningful legislation that resolves a particular need and keeps us within our budget.

In short, we must coordinate the use of public funds to optimize effectiveness. Our government must learn to strategically plan and create expected results with existing funds. We request that the Council hold a special session dedicated to addressing and considering unmet needs, in accordance with 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), which requires the three branches to prioritize unmet needs.

We appreciate your willingness to save a significant part of the \$40 million from the UUFB for anticipated decline in revenues for the Nation. That saved amount of \$21 million is part of the FY2020 budget. It is through this shared exercise that we can survive unknown economic trials that loom ahead of us. In addition, we greatly appreciate your support of the General Wage Adjustment for all Navajo Nation employees, including employees of the 110 chapters.

Closing Remarks/Request for Special Session

In closing, the financial times we live in are challenging. We can no longer continue the undisciplined spending practices of the past. As President of the Navajo Nation, I am held to

the highest standard to ensure fiscal responsibility and financial integrity. I will not violate my fiduciary responsibility to the Navajo People by overspending or any other means. We respectfully request for your support of the FY2020 Comprehensive Budget and to fully fund chapter stipends, and consideration for a special session to address unmet needs. Once again, we thank you for your leadership and advocacy on behalf of our people and our communities. We look forward to a productive and positive budget session. Ahe'hee'

President to Reallocate and Dispense Omitted Meeting Stipend Funds for the Forest Lake

Chapter Officials for September 2017

WHEREAS:

- Pursuant to the Local Governance Act, 26 N.N.C., Chapter 1, Sub-Chapter, Section 3

 (a) the Forest lake Chapter is continued as a certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation by the Navajo Nation Council Resolution number CAP-34-98; and
- Pursuant to Chapter 1, Section 131 (1) (2), of the same Act, the Chapter has the
 responsibility and authority to promote, protect and preserve the interest and
 general welfare including the safety of it community, people, programs, property,
 etc.; and
- 3. The three Forest Lake Chapter officials (President, Vice, President and Secretary-Treasurer) were not compensated for any monthly meeting stipends in fiscal year 2017, in the month of September.
- Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. Title 26, 1002 (Resolution number CN-50-10 passed in Dec. 8, 2010) states Each chapter president, vice president, secretary/treasurer shall be paid \$500 each for one regular chapter meet and one chapter planning meeting per month in accordance with the approved fiscal year budget; and
- The Forest Lake Chapter officials have actively pursued the reallocation starting in November 2017 by discussing budget shortfall with the Chapter CSC and consulting their council Delegate, B&F committee members and President's Chief of Staff and lastly Legislative Legal Counsel; and
- No solution has been offered, and recently in March 2019, the lacking and omitted fund was brought to the Navajo Nation Speaker's attention; he is the former Chair of Budget and Finance Committee and a chapter resolution was call for.
