
A. The Navajo-Hopi Land Commission Office operates under the direction of the President of the Navajo Nation. The President of the Navajo Nation shall appoint a staff assistant

- who shall head the Land Commission Office who shall serve at the pleasure of the President of the Navajo Nation; and the Commission shall utilize the Navajo-Hopi Land Commission Office in performing its assigned functions. 2 N.N.C. § 856(A)-(B).
- B. Wenona Benally, Executive Director for the Navajo-Hopi Land Commission Office (NHLCO) has been elected and currently serving on the State of Arizona House of Representatives, Fifty-third Legislature for District 7.
- C. The Voices of the People has requested the current Executive Director be replaced and expressed that the NHLCO Executive Director is a very critical position by working with the residents of the Hopi Partition Land, Former Bennett Freeze Area, New Lands and legal issues with the Hopi Tribe and United States Federal Government. The letter to the President is attached as **Exhibit A**.
- D. Due to Ms. Benally now serving on the Arizona State Legislature the work being conducted by the NHLCO has been impacted.
- E. The Navajo Nation hereby finds it is in the best interest of the Navajo People to direct the Navajo Nation President and Vice-President to replace the Executive Director for the NHLCO.

SECTION THREE: DIRECTIVE TO SELECT THE CHIEF OF POLICE

A. The Navajo Nation Naabik'íyáti' Committee hereby directs the Navajo Nation President and Vice-President to replace the Executive Director for the Navajo-Hopi Land Commission Office.

Dear Mr. President:

This is a follow-up letter dated November 9, 2016 in regards to Wenona Benally, Executive Director of the Navajo-Hopi Land Commission Office (NHLCO), who was elected as the U.S. State House of Representative, District #7 for the State of Arizona. The Voices of the People (VOP) Organization and members of the Hopi Partition Land (HPL) are concern with Ms. Benally is not working on Navajo and Hopi Issues at 100% as the NHLCO Executive Director. The Navajo Nation is also paying her salary while she is working and conducting business as the State House of Representative, where she is also being paid from the State at the same time. She is being paid double from both governments.

The NHLCO Executive Director is a very critical position by working with the residents of HPL, Former Bennett Freeze Area (FBFA), New Lands, Navajo Partition Land (NPL) and legal issues with the Hopi Tribe and U.S. Federal Government. Also, since she was appointed as the NHLCO Executive Director, she has not come out to meet with the residents or communities. She is not familiar with our issues, history, needs and laws relating to the dispute, and she is not fluent in our Navajo language to communicate to our grass-root communities.

Therefore, the VOP members respectfully request that Roman Bitsuie be appointed as the NHLCO Executive Director. He is very knowledgeable of the people living in the impacted areas, laws, history, and he works very well with the Hopi Tribal government.
