AN ACTION

RELATING TO THE HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE AND THE BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEES; APPROVING THE TITLE IV-E FUND MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR THE NAVAJO NATION DIVISION OF SOCIAL SERVICES

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee has oversight of the Division of Social Services. 2 N.N.C. § 401(C)(1).
- B. The Budget and Finance Committee is empowered to approve fund management plans upon the recommendation of the appropriate oversight committee and the affected division or branch. $2 \times 10^{-2} \, \mathrm{N.N.C.} \, \mathrm{S} \, 301(\mathrm{B}) \, (14)$.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. Title IV-E of the Social Security Act ("Title IV-E") allows states, territories, and tribes to claim partial federal reimbursement for the cost of providing foster care, adoption assistance, and kinship guardianship assistance to children who meet federal eligibility criteria. The Title IV-E program also provides support for monthly payments on behalf of eligible children, as well as funds for related case management activities, training, data collection, and other costs of program administration.
- B. The Navajo Nation Division of Social Services ("DSS") has prepared the Title IV-E Fund Management Plan, attached as **Exhibit A**, to govern the expenditure of funds received under the federal government's Title IV-E program.

- C. The Title IV-E Fund Management Plan provides that the Department of Family Services within DSS can expend Title IV-E funds for the benefit of Foster Care, Adoptions Assistance, and Guardianship Assistance Programs as indicated in Section IV.B. of Exhibit A.
- D. The Office of Management and Budget, Office of the Controller, and Department of Justice have reviewed the proposed Title IV-E Fund Management Plan as part of an Executive Official Review, attached as **Exhibit B**, and determined that the proposed fund management plan is legally sufficient provided that the Navajo Nation Council approved the DSS' use of the Title IV-E funds.
- E. The Navajo Nation Council approved the DSS' use of Title IV-E funds in Council Resolution CAP-32-23, attached as **Exhibit** C.

SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

The Navajo Nation approves the Title IV-E Fund Management Plan as detailed in **Exhibit A**.

Fund Management Plan Title IV-E Fund

I. ESTABLISHMENT

There is established a Fund Management Plan ("FMP") for the Title IV-E Fund ("Fund"), for use by the Department of Family Services (DFS) of the Division of Social Services in the management of the Fund. The DFS shall administer and manage the Fund pursuant to this FMP in compliance with all applicable Navajo Nation and federal laws and policies.

II. PURPOSE

- A. The Fund is established for the purpose of claiming, receiving, and using any and all Title IV-E funding reimbursement pursuant to approved Title IV-E Plan.
- B. The FMP is established for the purpose of ensuring that the funds received from the Children's Bureau under the Administration for Children and Families (ACF) are expended only for the benefit of Foster Care, Adoption Assistance, and Guardianship Assistance Program.
 - 1. Expend in compliance with this FMP.
 - 2. The FMP is subject to monitoring, accountability, reporting, and auditing.

III. ADMINISTRATION

- A. Funding source: Reimbursement of Title IV-E Foster Care from the ACF's Children's Bureau for the purpose of the Eligible Expenditures listed at Section IV. B. of this FMP, for the Foster Care, Adoption Assistance, and Guardianship Assistance Program.
- B. Legislative Oversight: The Health, Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council provides legislative oversight.

C. Program Management

- 1. The DFS shall manage and administer the Fund pursuant to this FMP and approved Title IV-E Plan.
- 2. The DFS shall develop, implement, monitor, and report on the Navajo Nation Title IV-E operating budget consistent with applicable Navajo Nation Budget Instruction Manual, including budget forms and subject to internal review and approval processes that will ensure appropriate expenditure of the Fund for its intended purpose.

IV. FUND MANAGEMENT

A. Fund Accounting

1. The Office of the Controller (OOC) shall draw down reimbursements through the Payment Management System (PMS) which operates as a "banking system."

- 2. The OOC shall comply with established policies and procedures for drawing down, recording, and depositing all reimbursement into the Fund and accounting for the Fund in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.
- 3. All records and accounts for the Fund shall be separately maintained, including a separate Balance sheet(s) and Expenditure Statement(s).
- 4. The DFS shall account for all reimbursement disbursed from the Fund, and such accounting shall be included in the DFS' fiscal quarterly report.
- 5. Funds do not lapse and automatically carry over to the next fiscal year.

B. Eligible Expenditures

The Funds shall be used solely for the benefit of the Foster Care, Adoption Assistance, and Guardianship Assistance Program including, but not limited to the following:

- 1. Foster Care maintenance payments for eligible children;
- 2. Adoption assistance payments for eligible children;
- 3. Kinship/guardianship payments for eligible children;
- 4. Prevention efforts, follow-up care, and aftercare services;
- 5. Continuous quality improvement;
- 6. Allowable cost associated with training, including parenting classes;
- 7. Allowable cost associated with administering the Title IV-E program;
- 8. Referral service:
- 9. Preparation for and participation in judicial determination;
- 10. Placement of the child;
- 11. Case management and supervision, case planning, case reviews;
- 12. Recruitment of foster, guardianship, and adoptive homes;
- 13. Licensing studies of foster homes and facilities;
- 14. Data collection and reporting;
- 15. Share of related agency overhead such as indirect costs, including costs that are supportive of programs and program operation like organization leadership; central financial and accounting staff; human resources staff; central information systems staff; and payroll, property and procurement staff.

V. EFFECTIVE DATE

This FMP for the Fund shall become effective upon establishment of the Fund.

VI. AUDIT REQUIREMENTS

The Fund shall be audited as part of an overall annual audit of the Navajo Nation government, by the Office of the Controller, and by any contracted independent auditor.

VII. RESTRICTIONS

The Fund shall not be expended or allocated for uses other than those as provided by this FMP, approved Title IV-E Plan, and Navajo Nation Title IV-E operating budget

VIII. COMPLIANCE

The use and management of the Fund shall comply with applicable federal law and with all Navajo Nation laws, including but not limited to the Navajo Nation Procurement Act, Navajo Business Opportunity Act, and the Navajo Nation Ethics in Government Law.

IX. AMENDMENT

This FMP may be amended, as necessary, upon proposal by DFS, for approval by the Budget and Finance Committee of the Navajo Nation Council.

We no longer report on these awards as they have expired but they are still on the Payment Management System Federal Cash Transaction Report. The main concern is if in the future the drawdowns accumulate and DSS expends more than the Single Audit threshold of \$3 million in expenditures, funds will be audited. So business units should not be set up under the external funds.

I recommend you possibly should talk with Dominic and Cordell or the Division's AG attorney.

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 25th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - FIRST YEAR, 2023

AN ACTION

RELATING TO BUDGET AND FINANCE, HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES, AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING THE USE OF TITLE IV-E FUNDS BY THE NAVAJO DIVISION OF SOCIAL SERVICES

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Budget and Finance Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the budgeting, appropriation, investment, and management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. § 301(B)(2).
- B. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to review and recommend resolutions relating to social services, health, environmental health, education, veterans and veterans' services, employment and labor. 2 N.N.C. § 401(B)(6)(a).
- C. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council serves as the oversight committee for the Division of Social Services. 2 N.N.C. § 401(C)(1).
- D. The Naabik'iyati' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to review all proposed legislation which requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9).
- E. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation and empowered to enact positive law of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council approved Resolution NABIJA-12-14 to allow the Navajo Nation to obtain reimbursement from the United States government under Title IV-E of the Social Security Act ("Title IV-E.")
- B. Title IV-E provides partial reimbursement to states and eligible tribes for foster case maintenance payments, adoption assistance payments, kinship or guardianship payments for

- eligible children, and allowable costs associated with administering Title IV-E programs.
- C. Title IV-E is not a grant program, nor a complete child welfare system, but a program for the partial reimbursement of costs incurred. A document that provides an overview of the Title IV-E program is attached as Exhibit A.
- D. Once Council has approved its use of Title IV-E funds, the Division of Social Services will prepare a fund management plan to govern the use of the funds consistent with the original purpose of Title IV-E funds.

SECTION THREE. APPROVAL FOR THE DIVISION OF SOCIAL SERVICES TO USE TITLE IV-E FUNDS

- A. The Navajo Nation Council approves the use of Title IV-E funds by the Division of Social Services consistent with the original purpose of Title IV-E funds.
- B. As new revenue to the Navajo Nation, Title IV-E funds are subject to all statutory set asides.

SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Act is effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. 221(B).

SECTION FIVE. SAVING CLAUSE

Should any provision(s) of this Act be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of the Act shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.



TITLE IV-E PROGRAM

Title IV-E of the Social Security Act allows states, territories, and tribes to claim partial federal reimbursement for the cost of providing foster care, adoption assistance, and kinship guardianship assistance to children who meet federal eligibility criteria. The Title IV-E program, as it is commonly called, provides support for monthly payments on behalf of eligible children, as well as funds for related case management activities, training, data collection, and other costs of program administration.

Title IV-E reimbursement funds are to be used for purpose of supporting and/or enhancing the Navajo child well-being system. In addition to the snip below from the Fund Management Plan, funds should be used to support:

- capacity building in terms of staff directly involved with the child well-being system (social workers, prevention service workers, fiscal staff, IT staff, clinical/behavioral health staff, etc.),
- incentives for staff and clients
- professional development for staff associated with the child well-being system including law enforcement, judicial staff
- establishment of child well-being training program
- procurement/implementation of evidence-based practices and/or assessment curriculum/tools
- · educational training for eligible children, caregivers, staff, and prospective staff
- resources for adoptive parents and guardians
- infrastructure development/repairs

The Division of Social Services will use the Title IV-E reimbursement funds for the benefit of the Foster Care, Adoption Assistance, and Guardianship Assistance Programs. Eligible expenditures may include:

- Foster maintenance payment for eligible children;
- Adoption assistance payments for eligible children;
- Guardianship payment for eligible children;
- Prevention efforts, follow-up care, and aftercare services;
- Continuous quality improvement;
- Allowable costs associated with training including parenting classes;
- Allowable costs associated with the Title IV-E program;
- Referral service:
- Preparation for and participation in judicial determination;
- Placement of the child;
- Case management and supervision, case planning, case reviews;
- Recruitment of foster, guardianship, and adoptive homes;

- Licensing studies of foster homes and facilities;
- Data collection and reporting; and
