RESOLUTION OF THE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE 23rd Navajo Nation Council --- Fourth Year, 2018

AN ACTION

RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE; APPROVING A WAIVER OF THE 16 N.N.C. § 1159 (B) (2) AND APPROVING A MISSION SITE PERMIT FOR 5.0 ACRES FOR THE REZLINE BIBLE CHURCH, INC., IN THE VICINITY OF INDIAN WELLS CHAPTER, NAVAJO NATION (NAVAJO COUNTY)

BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Authority

- A. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. Section 1151 (C), the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has the authority to give approval for permits of mission sites on behalf of the Navajo Nation.
- B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. Section 501 (B)(2), the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has the authority to give final approval for all land withdrawals, non-mineral leases, permits, licenses, rights-of-way, surface easements and bonding requirements on Navajo Nation lands and unrestricted (fee) land. This authority shall include subleases, modifications, assignments, leasehold encumbrances, transfers, renewals, and terminations.

Section Two. Title 16 of the Navajo Nation Code Provisions with Respect to Mission Sites

- A. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. Section 1153 (A), No permit to enlarge the area of Navajo Nation land presently under permit to a missionary or mission body, and no permit to grant Navajo Nation land for a new mission site will be granted by the Resources Committee unless the application for such permit has first been reviewed by the Navajo Land Department of the Navajo Nation.
- B. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. Section 1153 (B), the application for a mission site shall contain:

- 1. An exact description of the Navajo Nation land for which application is made.
- 2. A detailed statement of the purpose or purposes for which the said Navajo Nation land shall be used. If a missionary or mission body proposes to establish facilities for educational, medical, or other nonreligious activities, the application shall set forth fully the extent and character thereof.
- A signed petition of a substantial number of Navajos residing in the vicinity of the proposed site endorsing the proposed permit.
- 4. An endorsement of Navajo Nation Council Delegates of the District in which the proposed site is located.
- 5. A description of buildings and improvements to be placed on Navajo Nation lands and an estimate of the cost thereof. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1155, the Resources and Development Committee is authorized to deny or grant, on behalf of the Navajo Nation, any permit with special consideration to the establishment of too many missions in any one area or at any one point.
- C. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1159 (B), the following acreage limitations shall apply to all applicants for permits:
 - Mission site for purely religious activities: one and one-half (1 1/2) acres;
 - Mission site for religious activities and community services facilities: three and one-half (3 1/2) acres;
 - 3. Mission site for religious activities and either substantial medical or accredited educational programs: eight (8) acres; and
 - 4. The Resources and Development Committee may, in the case of applications for mission sites in or near areas withdrawn for townships in the Navajo Nation, limit site acreage to less than two and five-tenths (2 5/10) acres, and may set rental fees with due regard for present or future competing demands for land use in such areas.

- D. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1159 (C) "community service facilities" shall be deemed to include only those permanent improvements upon the permitted site which are for the purpose of providing recreational programs, non-religious educational programs, including adult education, and other non-religious programs of benefit to the community.
- E. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1160 (A), the acreage limitations established by 16 N.N.C. § 1159 may be waived by the Resources and Development Committee upon a showing by the applicant that planned programs will be of sufficient benefit to the Navajo People to justify waiver of acreage limitations. No waiver of acreage limitations shall be granted unless the applicant has complied with 16 N.N.C. §§ 1153 and 1161, and all other procedures provided by law.
- F. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1160 (B), no waiver of acreage limitations shall be granted in cases of applications subject to acreage limitations established by 16 N.N.C. § 1159(B)(1) (regarding a mission site for purely religious activities which is limited to one and one-half (1 1/2) acres).
- G. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1161, no application for a mission site permit for an area of Navajo Nation land in excess of the limitations established in 16 N.N.C. § 1159 shall be granted by the Resources and Development Committee, unless the application for such permit has been reviewed and approved by the Division of Community Development of the Navajo Nation, and by the Navajo Land Department of the Navajo Nation.

Section Three. Findings

- A. The Rezline Bible Church, Inc., Post Office Box 883, Holbrook, Arizona 86025 has applied for a Revocable Use Permit for Mission Site within the Indian Wells Chapter, as further described in **Exhibit B**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.
- B. The proposed mission site is located on 5.0 acres, more or less, within the vicinity of Indian Wells, Navajo Nation (Arizona). The land description appears on the survey plat attached hereto and incorporated as Exhibit C.
- C. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. Section 1153 (A) and 16 N.N.C. § 1161, this request for a mission site permit has been reviewed by the Navajo Land Department and the Division of Community Development. The Executive Official Review shows that the

Navajo Land Department and the Division of Community Development have "approved" the applicant's request. See Executive Official Review Document No. 008217 attached as **Exhibit D**.

- D. The District 7-4 Grazing Official identified two land users who gave their consents which are attached hereto as **Exhibit E**.
- E. The Indian Wells Chapter Resolution dated March 18, 2012 entitled "Supporting and Recommending the Rezline Bible Church, Inc., to Establish a Mission the Community of Indian Wells and to Secure a Land Lease from the Navajo Nation; and further, the Navajo Nation Land Administration and the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to Support the Effort of the Rezline Bible Church, Inc., to Lease Five (5) Acres of Land Within the Indian Wells Chapter" and the signed petition by the local residents are also attached herein as **Exhibit F**.
- F. The White Cone Chapter Resolution WC-12-12-089 and Teesto Chapter Resolution TEE-May-68-013 supporting the establishment of a mission site are attached as **Exhibit G**.
- G. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1159 (B), the acreage limitations for permits for a mission site for religious activities and community services facilities is three and one-half (3 1/2) acres. The Rezline Bible Church request is for five (5) acres. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1160 (A), the acreage limitations established by 16 N.N.C. § 1159 may be waived by the Resources and Development Committee upon a showing by the applicant that planned programs will be of sufficient benefit to the Navajo People to justify waiver of acreage limitations.
- H. In justification for the request for five (5) acres, a letter from the Secretary of the Rezline Bible Church, attached as **Exhibit H**, states that "The Church also desires to build additional facilities for community service programs, such as youth recreation, health and wellness programs, tribal and non-tribal social programs, and emergency response. ... RezLine Bible Church envisions the full use of the 5 Acres mission site to support its growing congregation in a location to provide a place of worship and its related activities. Furthermore to support and provide a place for rural community youth and elders to gather for recreational fitness services, meal programs, afterschool tutoring program(s) and other related student enrichment activities to improve the livelihood of our youth."

- I. The Resources and Development Committee finds that the planned programs will be of sufficient benefit to the Navajo People to justify waiver of acreage limitations.
- J. The Biological Resources Compliance Form is attached as EXHIBIT I; the Cultural Resources Compliance Form is attached as Exhibit J; the Archaeological Inventory Report is attached as Exhibit K; the Final Environmental Assessment Rezline Bible Church Site is attached as Exhibit L; the NTUA Utility and Sanitation Clearance is attached as Exhibit M; the Public Water Systems Supervision and Domestic Water Program Memorandum is attached as Exhibit N; and the Procurement Clearance is attached as Exhibit O.
- K. The Terms and Conditions for the Mission Site Permit is attached as **Exhibit A**.

Section Four. Approval

- A. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby waives the 16 N.N.C. § 1159 (B)(2) acreage limitation of three and one-half (3 1/2) acres for a mission site for religious activities and community services facilities; and, hereby approves the Rezline Bible Church Mission Site for five (5) acres.
- B. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby approves and consents to the Revocable Use Permit for a Mission Site for the Rezline Bible Church, subject to but not limited to the attached Terms and Conditions contained herein as **Exhibit A** which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.
- C. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby authorizes the President of the Navajo Nation to execute all documents to affect the intent and purpose of this resolution.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR MISSION SITE PERMIT <u>REZLINE BIBLE CHURCH, INC.</u> (PERMITTEE)

- This Mission Site Permit is issued to the <u>Rezline Bible Church, Inc, P.O. Box 883 Holbrook</u>, <u>Arizona 86025</u> to use and occupy Navajo Nation Trust Lands for religious purposes, and shall be subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein. The term of the Mission Site Permit is effective beginning on the date the permit is approved by the Resources & Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council or authorized representative. The Permit is authorized by Resources and Development Committee No.
- 2. This permit is revocable at the discretion of the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. The permit shall immediately be revoked for the failure to use the land herein described for religious purposes. It is understood and agreed that this instrument is '<u>NOT A</u> <u>LEASE</u>' and is not to be taken or construed as granting any leasehold interest or right in or to the land herein described, but is merely a temporary permit, terminable and revocable.
- 3. The Permittee shall be given at least thirty (30) days written notice before this Mission Site Permit is terminated and revoked. Upon termination of the Mission Site Permit, the Permittee shall have ninety (90) days in which to remove from the site to dispose of any and all buildings, structures, materials and equipment and other personal property owned by the religious organization. After the expiration of the ninety (90) days, the Permittee shall peacefully and without legal process deliver the possession of the premises to the Navajo Nation. All improvements not removed after ninety (90) days will become the property of the Navajo Nation, unless the Navajo Nation demands in writing that the improvements be removed.
- 4. This Permit is not transferable, except with the consent of the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council.
- 5. This Permit shall be reviewed every five (5) years to reevaluate the rent and compliance with the terms and conditions.
- 6. The legal land description of the premises is described as follows:

TRACT DESCRIPTION

A tract of land situated within Protracted Section 8, Township 20 North, Range 21 East, Gila and Salt River Meridian, near the vicinity of Indian Wells, Navajo County, State of Arizona and being more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at a United States Department of the Interior, Geological Survey, Bench Mark, brass cap, 3 inches diameter set in a concrete box (1 feet x 1 feet), with the concrete box projecting 5 inches above ground, brass cap dated 1972, marked "3 MPS", located along the barbed wire fence parallel to Navajo Route 4 and the Point of Beginning of the herein described tract,

THENCE, South 70° 38' 13" West, a distance of 1,077.78 feet to a ¹/₂" rebar with plastic cap stamped "RLS 48459" (SET);

THENCE, North 31° 52' 24" West, a distance of 349.99 feet to a ¹/₂" rebar with plastic cap stamped "RLS 48459" (SET);

THENCE, North 58° 07' 32" East, a distance of 622.28 feet to a ¹/₂" rebar with plastic cap stamped "RLS 48459" (SET);

THENCE, South 31° 52' 22" East, a distance of 350.02 feet to a ¹/₂" rebar with plastic cap stamped "RLS 48459" (SET);

THENCE, South 58° 07' 43" West, a distance of 622.28 feet to the Point of Beginning.

The described Tract of Land contains 5.00 acres, more or less in area, and being subject to any and all existing easements for underground and aerial utilities located thereon unless denoted.

- 7. The annual rental rate will be <u>\$ 75.00</u> per year and is due on or before the first day of December each year the Permit remains in effect. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1157, if the Permittee fails to pay the rent when due, this permit shall automatically terminate. The Permittee is responsible to make direct payments to the Navajo Nation Accounts Receivable Section, Post Office Box 3150, Window Rock, Arizona 86515.
- 8. The Permittee may develop, use and occupy the area under the permit for the purpose(s) of Mission Site. The Permittee may not develop, use or occupy the area under the permit for any other purpose without the prior written approval of the Navajo Nation. The approval of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon conditions or withheld in the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation. The Permittee may not develop, use or occupy the area under the permit for any unlawful purpose.
- 9. In all activities conducted by the Permittee within the Navajo Nation, the Permittee shall abide by all laws and regulations of the Navajo Nation and of the United States, now in force and effect or as hereafter may come into force and effect including but not limited to the following:
 - a. Title 25, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 162;
 - b. All applicable federal and Navajo Nation antiquities laws and regulations, with the following additional condition: In the event of a discovery all operations in the immediate vicinity of the discovery must cease and the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department must be notified immediately. As used herein, "discovery" means any previously unidentified or incorrectly identified cultural resources, including but not limited to archeological deposits, human remains, or location reportedly associated with Native American religious/traditional beliefs or practices;
 - c. The Navajo Preference in Employment Act, 15 N.N.C. §§ <u>et seq.</u>, and the Navajo Nation Business Opportunity Law, 5 N.N.C. §§ <u>et seq.</u>; and
 - d. The Navajo Nation Water Code, 22 N.N.C. § 1101 <u>et seq.</u> Permittee shall apply for and submit all applicable permits and information to the Navajo Nation Water Resources Department, or its successor.
- 10. The Permittee shall ensure that the air quality of the Navajo Nation is not jeopardized due to violation of applicable laws and regulations by its operations pursuant to the permit.

- 11. The Permittee shall clear and keep clear the lands within the permit area to the extent compatible with the purpose of the permit, and shall dispose of all vegetation and other materials cut, uprooted, or otherwise accumulated during any surface disturbance activities.
- 12. The Permittee shall at all times during the term of the permit and at the Permittee's sole cost and expense, maintain the land subject to the permit and all improvements located thereon and make all necessary and reasonable repairs.
- 13. The Permittee shall indemnify and hold harmless the Navajo Nation and their respective authorized agents, employees, land users and occupants, against any liability for loss of life, personal injury and property damages arising from the development, use or occupancy or use of the permit area by the Permittee.
- 14. The Permittee shall not assig, convey or transfer, in any manner whatsoever, the permit or any interest therein, or in or to any of the improvements on the land subject to the permit, without the prior written consent of the Navajo Nation. Any such attempted assignment, conveyance or transfer of the permit without such prior written consent shall be void and of no effect. The consent of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon condition or withheld in the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation.
- 15. The Navajo Nation may terminate the permit for violation of any of the terms and conditions stated herein. In addition, the permit shall be terminable in whole or part by the Navajo Nation or authorized representative for any of the following causes:
 - a. Failure to comply with any terms and conditions of the permit or of applicable laws or regulations;
 - b. Non-use of the permit; and
 - c. The use of the land subject to the permit for any purpose inconsistent with the purpose for which the permit is granted.
- 16. At the termination of the permit, the Permittee shall peaceably and without legal process deliver up the possession of the premises, in good condition, usual wear and tear excepted. Upon the written request of the Navajo Nation, the Permittee shall provide the Navajo Nation, at the Permittee's sole cost and expense, with an environmental audit assessment of the premises at least sixty (60) days prior to delivery of said premises.
- 17. The Permittee shall give written notice to the Navajo Nation Land Department regarding any change to the Permittee's contact information, address, leadership, organizational name, or any other substantial change to the organization. The notice shall be given within thirty (30) days and delivered to the Navajo Land Department at Post Office Box 2249, Window Rock, Arizona 86515.
- 18. Holding over by the Permittee after the termination of the permit shall not constitute a renewal or extension thereof or give the Permittee any rights hereunder or in or to the land subject to the permit or to any improvements located thereon.
- 19. The Navajo Nation shall have the right, at any reasonable time during the term of the permit, to enter upon the premises, or any part thereof, to inspect the same and any improvements located thereon.

- 20. By acceptance of the grant of permit, the Permittee consents to the full territorial legislative, executive and judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation, including but not limited to the jurisdiction to levy fines and to enter judgements for compensatory and punitive damages and injunctive relief, in connection with all activities conducted by the Permittee within the Navajo Nation or which have a proximate (legal) effect on persons or property within the Navajo Nation.
- 21. By acceptance of the grant of the permit, the Permittee covenants and agrees never to contest or challenge the legislative, executive or judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation on the basis that such jurisdiction is inconsistent with the status of the Navajo Nation as an Indian nation, or that the Navajo Nation government is not a government of general jurisdiction, or that the Navajo Nation government does not possess full police power (i.e., the power to legislate and regulate for the general health and welfare) over all lands, persons and activities within its territorial boundaries, or on any other basis not generally applicable to a similar challenge to the jurisdiction of a state government. Nothing contained in this provision shall be construed to negate or impair federal responsibilities with respect to the land subject to the permit or to the Navajo Nation.
- 22. Any action or proceeding brought by the Permittee against the Navajo Nation in connection with or arising out of the terms and conditions of the permit shall be resolved administratively under the laws of the Navajo Nation and no action or proceeding shall be brought by the Permittee against the Navajo Nation, in any court of any state.
- 23. Nothing contained herein shall be interpreted as constituting a waiver, express or implied, of the sovereign immunity of the Navajo Nation.
- 24. Except as prohibited by applicable federal law, the law of the Navajo Nation shall govern the construction, performance and enforcement of the terms and conditions contained herein.
- 25. The terms and conditions contained herein shall extend to and be binding upon the successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees and agents, including all contractors and subcontractors, of the Permittee, and the term "Permittee," whenever used herein, shall be deemed to include all such successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees and agents.
- 26. There is expressly reserved to the Navajo Nation full territorial legislative, executive and judicial jurisdiction over the area under the permit and all lands burdened by the permit, including without limitation over all persons, including the public, and all activities conducted or otherwise occurring within the area under the permit; and the area under the permit and all lands burdened by the permit shall be and forever remain Navajo Indian Country for purposes of Navajo Nation jurisdiction.

All corporations must attach hereto a certified copy of their Articles of Incorporation. If foreign to the state where religious site is to be located, the corporation must supply a certified copy of their authority to do business in the state.

All corporations must furnish evidence of authority of the person(s) signing this application to execute papers on their behalf. Evidence should ordinarily be in the form of a general resolution of the Board of Directors certified by the Secretary over the seal of the corporation.

For the purpose of conducting business within the Navajo Reservation, all corporations must file their Articles of Incorporation with the Economic Development Commerce Department of the Navajo Nation. The Commerce Department will issue a corporate number to the church organization.

In all cases of applications on behalf of Unincorporated bodies where documents do not explicit give one individual authority to execute necessary papers, a power of attorney executed before a notary public by all associated parties for this purpose should be attached. If this is not supplied, all such persons must personally sign this application and all other documents submitted to the Navajo Agency.

Unincorporated applicants should submit articles depicting their organization, unless none exits, in which case an explanation of the nature of the organization should be listed on a separate sheet.

Applicant agrees to give preference to qualified local residents of the Navajo Nation for employment in the construction of any improvement on the church site if the permit is granted.



ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF



REZ LINE BIBLE CHURCH, INC.

The undersigned Incorporators hereby submit the following Articles of Incorporation pursuant to Navajo Nation Nonprofit Corporation Act (N.N.N.C.A.) 301 et seq.

<u>ARTICLE I</u>

The Name of the Corporation is Rez Line Bible Church, INC.

ARTICLE II

The Period of Duration of the Corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE III

The **Purpose** for which this Corporation is organized shall include any or all lawful affairs for which corporations may be incorporated under the N.N.N.C.A. 301 et seq., including, but not limited to, religious and charitable purposes, including religious education, in order to bring honor and glory to our Lord Jesus Christ.

ARTICLE IV

The **Character of Affairs** of the Corporation will include, but is not limited to, the establishment of a Church. Based on the Bible as the standard of truth, the Church intends to honor God by bringing lives into harmony with Him and one another through balanced emphasis on Worship, Bible Teaching, Fellowship, Discipleship, Outreach, and Service.

ARTICLE V

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distribution in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article III. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Not withstanding any other provision of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on: (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal Income Tax under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

ARTICLE VI

Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by the Superior Court of the county in which the principle office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purpose or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purpose.



Therefore, we respect and honor the sense of our Navajo identity that people everywhere have. We do not seek to remake others in the image of some supposed Christian culture or to take away those things which are dear to their hearts.

At the same time, we recognize that every culture and nation in the world, including the Englishspeaking culture of the United States, has its problems, and that we must all stand under the scrutiny of the Moral Law of Almighty God.

Our goal, then, is to offer to all men everywhere the teachings of the Holy Bible in a way that they may be able to apply them to the problems of their own culture, so that they may find peace with God and the path of a just and peaceful society.

We do this by gathering people together into churches where they may worship the One true and Living God, and learn from His book, how to live in harmony with Him and with their fellow

a. Description of Undertaking: Rezline Bible Church is proposing to develop a 5-acre church site. The development will include the construction of a sanctuary, fellowship hall, four classrooms, one conference room, the pastor's housing quarters, and an outdoor ramada. A cistern system and water tank will also be installed. Surface and subsurface will occur within the 5 acre area of effect.

b. Existing Data Review: A check of NNHPD records revealed that two projects have been recorded within a 500 feet radius of the project area, with no sites recorded (HPD-04-021/HPD-03-429).

c. Area Environmental & Cultural Setting: Topography of the project area is characterized as relatively flat. Elevation at the project area is approximately 5,643 feet. The project site is located in the Plains and Great Basin Grasslands biotic community. Vegetation within the project area consists of snakeweed, rabbitbrush, narrow leaf yucca, Mormon Tea, prickly pear cactus, galleta, and sand dropseed. The soil is described as light brown eolian soils eroding out of the Palma-Clovis-Trail Association. Disturbances at the project area include vehicular traffic, livestock grazing, and natural erosion.

d. Field Methods: A Class III pedestrian inventory was conducted by Mathilda Burke, using parallel pedestrian transects spaced approximately 15 meters apart. The total area of effect is 5 acres/2.02 hectares. A 50 feet buffer zone was surveyed around the 5 acre site making the total area surveyed 7.45 acres/3.01 hectares. This method provided 100% coverage of the total area

surveyed. A *Garmin extrex* (GPS Unit, NAD 1983) was used to obtain UTM points for the project area boundary. An ethnographic interview was conducted over the phone with Alberto Peshlakai, who grew up in the area, concerning burials, sacred places, and plant/herb gathering areas in order to determine if there were any potential TCP's in or near the project area. Mr. Peshlakai stated that he had no knowledge of TCPs occurring on or near the project area.



1.0 PURPOSE AND NEED FOR PROJECT

1.1 Introduction

Rezline Bible Church proposes to develop a five-acre church facility in Indian Wells Chapter of the Navajo Nation, Navajo County, Arizona. The project sponsor will apply for a revocable land use permit from the Navajo Nation, Window Rock. The Navajo Nation's Environmental Protection Agency will review this Environmental Assessment (EA) to determine if the proposed project will create a significant impact on the human environment.

1.2 Purpose and Need for Project

The purpose of the project is to build a church facility that will provide space for worship service, Sunday school, bible study, revival, camp meeting, vacation bible school, and special events. The Church also desires to use the facility for community service programs, such as youth recreation, health and wellness programs, tribal and non-tribal social programs, and emergency response. Indian Wells and surrounding Chapters lack community facilities and venues to support these types of programs. Therefore, there is a need for *Rezline Bible Church* to build the proposed facility.

1.3 Location




Figure 1. General location map for project.

The proposed site is located in Indian Wells Chapter (Figure 1). It is situated north of Holbrook Arizona, along Navajo Route 6. It can be access by traveling north from Interstate 40 on State Highway 77, which turns into Navajo Route 6 at Navajo Nation boundary. The legal description is Township 21 North, Range 21 East (projected and unplatted) of the Gila and Salt River Meridian.

2.0 ALTERNATIVES

This chapter describes the proposed action and the no action alternative. No alternative sites were evaluated for the project because local land users and the Chapter Membership approved the proposed location.

2.1 Proposed Action




Figure 2. Aerial photo showing the proposed church site (Google Earth, 2012)

Under the proposed action, *Rezline Bible Church* will develop a church facility on five-acres in Indian Wells near Indian Route 6. The development would consist of a Hogan-style structure that will contain a sanctuary/fellowship hall, four classrooms, and conference rooms. In addition, an outdoor ramada and a pastor's housing quarters will be constructed. A cistern and septic systems would be installed for water and waste water utilities. The project sponsor is working with Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA) to gain access to nearby power line. Figure 2 depicts aerial photo of the five-acre church site and surrounding area.

2.2 No Action

Under the no action alternative, the proposed project would not be approved by the Navajo Nation, and there would be no impact to the surrounding natural and human environment.

3.0 DESCRIPTION OF THE AFFECTED ENVIRONMENT

This chapter describes the existing conditions in and around the project area and establishes the baseline data upon which the impacts have been evaluated (Chapter 4).

3.1 Land Resources

This section discusses topography, soils and geology of the project site.

3.1.1 Topography




Figure 3. Topographic map of the church site (Base Map: Mitten Peak, Arizona, USGS 7.5' Quadrangles)

The topography of the project site is characterized as relatively flat with a gently sloping down to the southwest. Elevation at the project site ranges from 5,635 feet to 5,651 feet. This region of the Navajo Nation lies in the Painted Desert Subdivision. Towering sandstone buttes are located north of the project site. The nearest Wash is Leroux Wash located to the southeast. It flows southwestward toward the Little Colorado River. Figure 3 presents a topographic map with 20 feet contours covering the project site.

3.12 Soils

Soils at the site are classified as Begay complex (NRCS 1980). Begay series consists of very deep, well drained soils that formed in eolian deposits derived mainly from sandstone. Be soils are on rolling uplands and broad mesas.

3.13 Geologic Setting and Mineral Resources

The Navajo Nation is situated in the southern Colorado Plateau physiographic province. This region is known as the Painted Desert Hydrogeologic Subdivision (Cooley et. al. 1969) named from the multicolored rock units of the Chinle Formation.

3.2 Water Resources

3.2.1 Surface Water

The drainage pattern in the project region is to the southwestward to the Little Colorado River. Leroux Wash and Pueblo Colorado Wash are major tributaries crossing Indian Wells Chapter as they flow to the Little Colorado River. Leroux Wash is the closest stream to the project site and is located over 4.4 miles away. No surface water occurs on or near the project site.

3.2.2 Ground water

Data from the Navajo Nation Water Management Branch in Ft. Defiance, Arizona, reveals that no wells within a one-mile radius of the project site.

3.2.3 Floodplains

Due to the distance to the nearest stream, the site is not located in any floodplain boundaries. Floodplains are generally defined as "lowland and relatively flat areas adjoining inland and coastal waters..." and, as "a nearly level alluvial plain that borders a stream and is subject to flooding unless protected artificially" by Executive Order 11988-Floodplain Management and by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, respectively.

3.3 Air Resources

3.3.1 Quality/Visibility

The National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) establish limits for pollutants considered harmful to public health and the environment. NAAQS establishes criteria for six principal pollutants. Maps posted at the U.S. EPA website (http://www.epa.gov, September 2012) reveals that air quality within this region of the Navajo Nation is in attainment of these standards. Overall, the air quality and visibility are generally good to excellent for most of the Navajo Nation.

3.3.2 Climate/Meteorology

The project region experiences cold, harsh winters, low precipitation scattered more or less throughout the year, and extremes in both daily and seasonal temperatures. The average total annual precipitation at the project site is 8.3 inches. The average annual total snowfall is 8.1 inches. The average maximum temperature (mid July) is 93.9° Fahrenheit. The average minimum temperature (mid January) is 18.7° Fahrenheit. Winds are generally from the southwest (Western Regional Climate Center 2012).

3.4 Biotic Resources

This section describes the existing vegetation and wildlife observed on the site during a field visit by Matt Turner, Project Biologist, ETD, Inc. It also summarizes a biological evaluation report of impacts to threatened, endangered, and sensitive species.

3.4.1 Vegetation and Wildlife

The project site lies entirely within the Plains and Great Basin Grassland biotic community. These two continental fasciations of the North American prairie both reach their southern terminus in the American Southwest (Brown 1994).

The vegetation found at the project consists mainly of snakeweed, prickly-pear cactus, rabbitbrush, cholla, and bunch grass.

No wildlife was observed during a field visit on July 24, 2012.



3.4.2 Threatened, Endangered and Sensitive Species

Potential impacts to threatened and endangered and sensitive (TES) species were evaluated as part of the BE. A list of TES species was obtained from the Navajo Department of Fish and Wildlife (NDFW)-Natural Heritage Program. The list included three special-status species known to occur, or have potential to occur, on or near the project site (Table 1). These species that are protected under the Navajo Endangered Species List the federal Endangered Species List, Migratory Bird Treaty Act, and the Eagle Protection Act (Appendix A).

This Biological Evaluation of the project site identifies special-status species with suitable habitat in or near the project site. The conclusion of this evaluation is that no adverse effects to the identified species or their habitats are anticipated as a result of the proposed project. While some individual specimens may experience minor effects from loss of small amounts of potential habitat, no long-term, adverse effects are anticipated.

3.5 Cultural Resources

A cultural resources inventory of the proposed project site was conducted by Mathilda Burke, Project Archaeologist, ETD, Inc. The inventory consisted of a records search at the Navajo Historic Preservation Department (NHPD) and a field survey on August 15, 2012. The records search revealed that no sites were previously recorded within 300 feet of the project area. The result of the cultural resource inventory is discussed below.

3.5.1 Archaeological Resources

A field survey of the five-acre church site was conducted by Mathilda Burke using a Class III pedestrian inventory method using transects spaced approximately 7.5 meters apart across the project site, including a 50-feet buffer zone on all sides of the project site. No cultural resources were encountered during the field survey. A report was prepared by the Project Archaeologist and submitted to the Navajo Historic Preservation (NHPD) who later issued a Cultural Resources Compliance Form for the proposed project (*Appendix B*).

3.5.2 Traditional Cultural Properties (TCP), Historic, and Religious Properties

Mathilda Burke conducted an interview with Albert Peshlakai, who grew up in the area, about TCP that potentially occur in the area, such as burials, sacred sites, and plant/herb gathering areas found on or near the proposed project area. He stated that he was unaware of any TCPs on or near the project site.

3.6 Socioeconomic Conditions

This section discusses the employment and income, demographics and trends, and lifestyles, cultural values, attitudes, expectations, and community infrastructure existing within the project area.

3.6.1 Employment and Income

According to the U.S. Census 2010 website (www.census.gov), the median household income in the Indian Wells Chapter was \$32,019 and the per capita income was \$10,316. The unemployment rate was nearly 25.4 percent. Approximately 20 percent of the Chapter residents lived below the poverty level. Employment of the Chapter residents includes Navajo Nation Government departments, educational services, Brimhall Sand and Gravel, and public administration.

3.6.2 Demographic and Trends

The U.S. Census 2010 (www.census.gov) reported the population of the Indian Wells Chapter to be 853, representing a decrease in the population from the previous 2000 census count by 117. The median age is currently around 33 years of age. There were approximately 381 households within the Chapter with an average 3.66 persons per household. In comparison, the average household size for the U.S. is about 2.5 persons.

3.6.3 Lifestyles, Cultural Values, Attitudes, Expectations

The communities of the Navajo Nation are generally composed of at least 85.9% Navajo residents (LSR, 2004). These residents continue to practice the traditional Navajo lifestyle, often combining that with the typical American lifestyle. The majority of families travel to off reservation towns for shopping and entertainment.

3.6.4 Community Infrastructure

Infrastructure systems that serve the Indian Wells Chapter are described below:

Roads and Accessibility. The project site is accessed via Navajo Route 6 and a short dirt roadway. .

<u>Power</u>. The electrical power infrastructure in the project area is owned and operated by the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA). Power utilities are located adjacent to the site.

<u>Water and Wastewater</u>. Water utilities in the project area are owned and operated by NTUA. The project sponsor will not connect to NTUA water and wastewater systems. Instead a cistern and septic tank will be used.

<u>Solid Waste.</u> Solid waste generated in the Indian Wells Chapter is taken to the local transfer station. Waste collected at the transfer stations is hauled by Navajo Sanitation, Inc. to a permitted landfill in Joseph City, Arizona, west of Holbrook, Arizona.

3.7 Environmental Justice

The proposed project is located in Indian Wells Chapter where 100% of the population is Native American. Environmental justice has been defined as the pursuit of equal justice and equal protection under the law for all environmental statutes and regulations without discrimination based on race, ethnicity, and/or socioeconomic status. No environmental justice issues were indentified for the project.

3.8 Environmental Module

This section discusses hazardous, non-hazardous, and toxic waste sites regulated under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA), and the Toxic Substance Control Act (TSCA). The information was obtained from the U.S. EPA Envirofacts website (www.epa.gov/enviro) and verified during field survey by Mathilda Burke, ETD, Inc.

- RCRA Subtitle C Sites: No Subtitle C hazardous waste sites occur on or near any of the proposed project site. Furthermore, hazardous waste will not be used, generated, handled, or stored on or near the proposed project site as part of the proposed project.
- RCRA Subtitle D Sites: No RCRA Subtitle D solid waste sites occur on or near the proposed project sites. During construction and operation, waste will be generated that will be hauled to certified landfill or local transfer station.
- RCRA Subtitle I Sites: No RCRA Subtitle I underground storage tank sites occur on or near the project sites. No underground gasoline storage tanks will be installed as part of the proposed project.
- CERCLA Sites: No CERCLA sites on or near any of the proposed project sites.
- Toxic Substances Control Act Sites: No toxic substances will be used, generated, handled, or stored on or near the project site as part of the construction or operation of the proposed project.

3.9 Resources/Land Use Patterns

This section describes land uses or practices found in the project site area, including transportation use network, land use planning, and agriculture. Resources or land uses not found in the project area are hunting, fishing, plant gathering, timber harvesting, mining, or solid waste dumpsites.

3.9.1 Transportation Use Network

The primary road found in Indian Wells Chapter is Navajo Route 15 and Navajo Route 6. From these highways, numerous dirt roads, including unpaved BIA bus routes, provide access to most areas of the chapter.

3.9.2 Land Use Plans

The Indian Wells Chapter has a community land use plan in effect. The proposed action will not affect the current land use pattern or plans.

3.9.3 Agriculture

Agricultural activities are important land uses within this region. There are 32 family farms in the Indian Wells Chapter (Rodgers 2004). Livestock grazing of cattle, sheep and horses are a large part of the agricultural activities within the chapter. Based on site visits, no prime or unique farmlands are found on or near the project areas.

3.9.4 Outdoor Recreation

No government or private sponsored outdoor recreation areas occur on or near the proposed or alternate sites.

3.10 Other Values

3.10.1 Wilderness Areas

The nearest designated wilderness area is the Painted Desert Wilderness area located 20 miles east of the proposed project site. It is managed by the National Park Service.

3.10.2 Sound and Noise

Man-made sound and noise sources near the project site include traffic along Navajo Route 15, Navajo Route 6 and neighborhood activities. Natural sound and noise sources near the project site primarily consist of atmospheric phenomena such as wind, thunder, and rain.

3.10.3 Public Health and Safety

The Indian Wells Chapter community is served by the Keams Canyon Indian Hospital, Winslow Health Center, and Dilkon Health Station. Fire protection within the Indian Wells Chapter is provided by a volunteer fire station located in Dilkon, AZ. Wildfire protection is provided by the BIA. The Indian Wells Chapter receives police protection through the Dilkon Police District with headquarters in Dilkon, AZ.

3.10.4 Visual Setting

The proposed project site is located in a scenic region of the Navajo Nation. However, no scenic byways or scenic areas that are protected by law occur in the project area.

4.0 ENVIRONMENTAL CONSEQUENCES OF THE PROPOSED ACTION

This section discusses the impacts to the natural and human environment on and near the project site as a result of the proposed action. Mitigation measures that reduce or eliminate impacts are discussed where appropriate.

4.1 Land Resources Impacts

The project site which includes five acres is quite flat. Vegetation and soils will be permanently disturbed in areas where buildings and parking lot will be installed. During construction, soils will be vulnerable to rain and runoff; storm runoff from a non-stabilized construction site can result in soil erosion. Under Section 402 of the Clean Water Act (CWA) all construction site operators engaged in clearing, grading and excavating activities that disturb one-half acre or more must obtain coverage under a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit for storm water discharges. The permit requires a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) that outlines best management practices for preventing soil erosion. With adherence to a SWPPP, impacts to soil erosion will be minor and short-term.

4.2 Water Resources Impacts

Since the project is not located near any stream, the project will not impact surface waters. During construction, however, storm runoff can collect sediment, trash, and pollutants such as oil and grease from construction sites and deposit contaminants on-site and off-site. Since the project will disturb more than one-half acre, the project requires coverage under the National Discharge Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) general permit, as discussed above. The permit requires a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) that outlines best management practices for preventing impacts to storm runoff. With adherence to a SWPPP the impact to surface water will be negligible and short-term.

The proposed project activities will not involve deep excavation, and therefore, ground water resources will not be impacted.

4.3 Air Resources Impacts

Construction activity within the project site will cause a slight degradation of the air quality due to increased airborne dust (particulate matter) and exhaust emissions (carbon monoxide) into the atmosphere. However, this impact will be minor and short-term.

4.4 Biological Resources Impacts

Limited earthmoving and clearing of the project site vegetation will occur as part of the project activity. The impacted areas will likely recover after the construction. Therefore, the impact to the vegetation will be minimal and short-term. No wildlife inhabits the proposed project site and surrounding area; therefore, there will be no impact to wildlife.

Potential impacts to threatened and endangered and sensitive (TES) species were evaluated as part of the BE. The BE identified several special-status species with suitable habitat in or near the project area. The Project Biologist concluded there would be no adverse effects to these species or their habitats are anticipated as a result of the proposed project. NDFW concurred and issued a Biological Resource Compliance Form (*Appendix A*).

4.5 Cultural Resources Impacts

No cultural resources were encountered during the field survey. A report was prepared by the Project Archaeologist and submitted to the Navajo Historic Preservation (NHPD) who later issued a Cultural Resources Compliance Form for the proposed project (*Appendix B*).

4.6 Socioeconomic Conditions Impacts

The project will potentially have minor, indirect positive impacts to the socioeconomics conditions of the community, by providing a facility for social service and community programs.

4.7 Environmental Justice

Based on the nature of the project and its purpose, no disproportional adverse human health or environmental effects to minority or low income populations are anticipated due to the proposed project. The proposed project will only benefit the local community which is mainly comprised of low income minority citizens.

4.8 Environmental Module

No RCRA, CERCLA or TSCA sites occur on or near the proposed project sites; therefore, no impacts to or from such sites are anticipated as result of the proposed project.

4.9 Resource/Land Use Patterns

- <u>Transportation Use Network</u>: The project will yeild additional traffic in the local area. The impact to transportation use network will be minor, direct, yet long-term.
- <u>Land Use Plans</u>: The five-acre project site will be withdrawn from rangeland status. Due to the vast area that is considered rangeland in Indian Wells Chapter, the proposed project will create minor, direct, yet long-term impacts to the loss of five acres of rangeland.

4.10 Other Values

- <u>Sound and Noise:</u> The project will result in minor direct and short term impacts to existing noise levels during construction.
- <u>Public Health and Safety</u>: No impact to the public health and safety of the Indian Wells Chapter community is anticipated as a result of the proposed project.
- Visual Setting: No impact to area visual resources is anticipated as a result of the proposed project.

Cumulative Impacts

The impacts resulting from project activities are very minor in the form of temporary and highly localized surface disturbances. Cumulative impacts result from the incremental impact of the action when added to other past, present, or reasonably foreseeable future actions regardless of what agency or person undertakes these actions. Cumulative impacts can result from individually minor, but collectively significant actions taking place over a period of time. No adverse cumulative impacts are anticipated as a result of the proposed project.

5.0 LIST OF AGENCIES AND ORGANIZATIONS CONSULTED

The information used in this analysis was obtained from reports, government databases, biological and archaeological field surveys, and direct communication either by phone or letters with the following agencies: Navajo Fish and Wildlife, Navajo Historic Preservation Department, Navajo Tribal Utility Authority, and Navajo Department of Water Resources-Branch of Water Management.

Species of concern with potential to occur on the 7.5-minute *Mitten Peak*, *AZ* quadrangle(s) containing the project boundaries include the following. Potential is based primarily on quadrangle-wide coarse habitat characteristics and species range information. Your project biologist should determine habitat suitability at the project site(s).

1. Aquila chrysaetos (Golden Eagle); NESL Group 3; MBTA.

2. Buteo regalis (Ferruginous Hawk); NESL Group 3; MBTA.

¹"Species of concern" include protected, candidate, and other rare or otherwise sensitive species, including certain native species and species of economic or cultural significance. For each species, the following tribal and federal statuses are indicated: Navajo Endangered Species List (NESL), federal Endangered Species Act (ESA), Migratory Bird Treaty Act (MBTA), and Eagle Protection Act (EPA). The Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency's Public Water Systems Supervision Program ("PWSSP") reviewed Document No. 008217: Rez Line Bible Church, Inc. This project proposal includes a church facility for Sunday worship, bible study, revivals, camp meetings, vacation bible school, and special events. The owner proposes to install a cistern and a septic tank. Installing a cistem will require the owner to care for potential contamination to the water source and while PWSSP recommends approval of this document, PWSSP also precautions the owner of cross contamination incidents of hauling water practices.

All proposed drinking water projects will need to be permitted by the PWSSP-NNEPA. All proposed drinking water projects (extensions, upgrades, new wells, new public water systems, etc.) must also comply with the design review and construction permit requirements of the PWSSP pursuant §§1501 and 1601 of the Navajo Nation Primary Drinking Water Regulations.

All proposed wastewater projects will need to be permitted by the Domestic Wastewater Program-NNEPA. Extensions, upgrades, new sewer infrastructure, septic tanks, and other wastewater infrastructure must comply with the design review and construction permit requirements pursuant to §201 of the Domestic Wastewater Program.
