RESOLUTION OF THE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE 23rd Navajo Nation Council --- Fourth Year, 2018

AN ACTION

RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE; CONFIRMING THE REAPPOINTMENT OF BELINDA ERIACHO TO SERVE ON THE NAVAJO TRIBAL UTILITY AUTHORITY MANAGEMENT BOARD OF DIRECTORS FOR A TERM OF THREE YEARS

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation established the Resources and Development Committee ("RDC") as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such gave the Committee oversight authority over public utilities. 2 N.N.C. §§ 500 (A),(C).
- B. RDC has the authority to grant final confirmation of appointments to enterprise boards. 2 N.N.C. § 501 (B)(9).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Navajo Nation established the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority ("NTUA") as an enterprise. 21 N.N.C. § 2.
- B. The NTUA is authorized to acquire, construct, operate and maintain utility systems throughout the Navajo Nation. See 21 N.N.C. § 1 (B).
- C. The general purpose of NTUA is to operate, maintain and promote existing utility systems furnishing electric, gas, water, sewer utility services; generation, and telecommunications and information services for the benefit of residents of the Navajo Nation; including the establishment, ownership, operation and maintenance of electric generating, telecommunications and information services on or off the Navajo Reservation; and to provide utility generation, telecommunications and information services on a non-profit basis and at a reasonable cost to residents of the Navajo Nation consistent with the economical operations of the Enterprise. See 21 N.N.C. § 5 (A)(1)-(6).

- D. The NTUA Management Board shall have the delegated authority and responsibility for the management and operation of the Enterprise. See 21 N.N.C. \S 7 (A)(1).
- E. The management board shall consist of seven persons, all of whom shall be appointed by the [Naabik'íyáti'] Committee of the Navajo Nation Council whose authority to confirm appointments to enterprise boards has been delegated to the Resources and Development Committee. See 21 N.N.C. § 9 (A); See also 2 N.N.C. § 501 (B) (9).
- F. Members of the board shall be called directors, and shall have the following qualifications: (1) [f]our of the directors shall be members of the Navajo Nation who speak English with fluency and who have sufficient education and experience to qualify them for learning utility business practices and procedures and making sound judgements; (2) [f]our of the directors shall be persons having not less than 10 years experience in business management of substantial character and at least two of such persons shall have had such experience in the management and operation of a utility business. See 21 N.N.C. § 9 (B)(1)-(2).
- G. Directors shall be eligible for reappointment. See 21 N.N.C. \S 9 (C)(1).
- H. Ms. Belinda Eriacho was formerly appointed to the NTUA Management Board of Directors for a term of three years that expired at the annual board meeting in October 2018. See RDCAP-23-16.
- I. Ms. Belinda Eriacho has expressed her continued interest in being reappointed as a Director to the NTUA management board in her Letter of Interest and is attached as **Exhibit A**; See also 21 N.N.C. § 9 (C)(1).
- J. The Management Board of the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority recommends to the Resources and Development Committee that Belinda Eriacho be reappointed as a member of the Management Board for a 3-year term, which shall commence at the annual meeting of the Management Board in October 2018. See NTUA Resolution attached as **Exhibit C**.
- K. In December 2018, Ms. Belinda Eriacho was selected, by an interview panel composed of Resources and Development Committee members, to be reappointed to the NTUA manage board. No appointment letter was provided.

- L. Ms. Belinda Eriacho meets the qualifications as required by 21 N.N.C. 9 (B) (1) (2), Résumé is attached as **Exhibit B.**
- M. The reappointment of Ms. Belinda Eriacho will be for a period of three years with the term expiring at the annual board meeting in October 2021. See 21 N.N.C. § 9 (C)(2).

SECTION THREE, CONFIRMING RE-APPOINTMENT

The Navajo Nation Council Resources and Development Committee finds that Ms. Belinda Eriacho meets the requisite qualifications to be reappointed as a director for the NTUA management board as set forth in 21 N.N.C. § 9 (B) (1)-(2), and hereby reappoints Ms. Belinda Eriacho for a term of three years, with the term expiring at the annual board meeting in October 2021 pursuant to 21 N.N.C. § 9 (C) (2).
