TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES, LAW AND ORDER, AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF THE NAVAJO NATION CODE TO TRANSFER LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT OVER VETERAN SERVICES TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE

PURPOSE: This resolution, if approved, will amend certain sections of the Navajo Nation Code to transfer legislative oversight over veteran services to the Naabikiyati Committee.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed resolution in detail.

VETERAN SERVICES TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. FINDINGS

- A. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council and has the power to review and recommend resolutions relating to veterans and veteran services. 2 N.N.C. §§ 400(A), 401(B)(6). In addition, the Health Education and Human Services Committee shall recommend to the Navajo Nation Council... to rescind that plan of operation or an existing plan of operation for any Division or Department under the Committee's oversight. 2 N.N.C. § 401 (C)(1).
- B. The Law and Order Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council and has the power to review and make recommendations to the Navajo Nation Council on proposed amendments to and enactments in the Navajo Nation Code. 2 N.N.C. §§ 600(A), 601(B) (14)

- 1 C. The Naabik'iyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council
2 and has the power to review proposed legislation which requires final action by the
3 Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. §§ 700(A), 164(A)(9). In addition, the Naabikiyati
4 Committee serves as the oversight for the Office of Legislative Services and other
5 offices, programs, commissions, boards or task forces under the Legislative Branch
6 of the Navajo Nation Government, unless otherwise designated by Navajo Nation
7 law, and to approve and amend plans of operation thereto. 2 N.N.C. § 701 (A)(5)
- 8 D. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §
9 102(A).

11 **SECTION TWO. FINDINGS**

- 12 A. In 2011, the Navajo Nation Council adopted Resolution CAP-10-11 which amended
13 certain sections of the Navajo Nation Code, Title 2 §§ 101 through 835, to conform
14 to the newly established 24-member Navajo Nation Council and made necessary
15 revisions to the legislative process and current standing committee structure.
- 16 B. Resolution CAP-10-11 established the Health, Education and Human Services
17 Committee with legislative oversight over veteran services. 2 N.N.C. § 400(C)(3).
- 18 C. The purpose of this legislation is to transfer legislative oversight over veteran services
19 from the Health, Education and Human Services Committee to the Naabikiyati
20 Committee.
- 21 D. The Navajo Nation Council finds it in the best interest for the Navajo Nation Veterans
22 Administration and Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council to be under the
23 legislative oversight of the Naabikiyati Committee because Diné veterans are highly
24 honored in Diné society and culture and all veteran matters and concerns should be
25 addressed by the full Council at the Naabikiyati Committee level.

- 16 C. Duties and Responsibilities of the Navajo Veterans Housing Program shall include
17 administering the Navajo Nation Veterans Administrations Housing Program Policies
18 and Procedures. The Veterans Administration Housing Program Policies and
19 Procedures shall be approved by the ~~Health, Education and Human Services Committee~~
20 Naabik'íyáti' Committee, upon the recommendation of the Navajo Nation Veterans
21 Advisory Council.

23 **§ 1035. Oversight**

24 The Navajo Nation authorizes the establishment of the Navajo Nation Veterans
25 Administration, the Navajo Veterans Housing Program, and the Navajo Nation Veterans
26 Advisory Council. Legislative oversight shall be provided by the ~~Health, Education, and~~
27 ~~Human Services Committee~~ Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, which
28 will have final approval of the respective plans of operation.

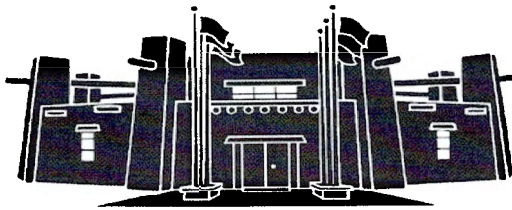
28 This Act and the Navajo Nation Code amendments enacted herein shall be effective
29 pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).

1 **SECTION SIX. CODIFICATION**

2 The provisions of this legislation which amend the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified
3 by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate
4 such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

6 **SECTION SEVEN. SAVINGS CLAUSE**

7 Should any provisions of this legislation be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation
8 Supreme Court, or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo
9 Nation Supreme Court, those portions of this legislation which are not determined invalid
10 shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.
