TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES, LAW AND ORDER, AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF THE NAVAJO NATION CODE TO TRANSFER LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT OVER VETERAN SERVICES TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE

PURPOSE: This resolution, if approved, will amend certain sections of the Navajo Nation Code to transfer legislative oversight over veteran services to the Naabikiyati Committee.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed resolution in detail.

19	A. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee is a standing committee of	
20	the Navajo Nation Council and has the power to review and recommend resolutions	
21	relating to veterans and veteran services. 2 N.N.C. §§ 400(A), 401(B)(6). In addition,	
22	the Health Education and Human Services Committee shall recommend to the Navajo	
23	Nation Council to rescind that plan of operation or an existing plan of operation	
24	for any Division or Department under the Committee's oversight. 2 N.N.C. § 401

26	B. The Law and Order Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council	
27	and has the power to review and make recommendations to the Navajo Nation	
28	Council on proposed amendments to and enactments in the Navajo Nation Code. 2

- C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council and has the power to review proposed legislation which requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. §§ 700(A), 164(A)(9). In addition, the Naabikiyati Committee serves as the oversight for the Office of Legislative Services and other offices, programs, commissions, boards or task forces under the Legislative Branch of the Navajo Nation Government, unless otherwise designated by Navajo Nation law, and to approve and amend plans of operation thereto. 2 N.N.C. § 701 (A)(5)
- D. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. In 2011, the Navajo Nation Council adopted Resolution CAP-10-11 which amended certain sections of the Navajo Nation Code, Title 2 §§ 101 through 835, to conform to the newly established 24-member Navajo Nation Council and made necessary revisions to the legislative process and current standing committee structure.
- B. Resolution CAP-10-11 established the Health, Education and Human Services Committee with legislative oversight over veteran services. 2 N.N.C. § 400(C)(3).
- C. The purpose of this legislation is to transfer legislative oversight over veteran services from the Health, Education and Human Services Committee to the Naabikiyati Committee.
- D. The Navajo Nation Council finds it in the best interest for the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration and Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council to be under the legislative oversight of the Naabikiyati Committee because Diné veterans are highly honored in Diné society and culture and all veteran matters and concerns should be addressed by the full Council at the Naabikiyati Committee level.

SECTION THREE. AMENDING TITLE 2 OF THE NAVAJO NATION CODE TO TRANSFER LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT FOR THE NAVAJO NATION VETERANS ADMINISTRATION AND NAVAJO NATION VETERANS ADVISORY COUNCIL TO THE NAABKIYATI COMMITTE

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SECTION FOUR. AMENDING 2 N.N.C §§ 400 et. seq. AND 2 N.N.C. § 701 TO TRANSFER LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT FOR VETERAN SERVICES FROM THE HEALTH EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE TO THE NAABKIYATI COMMITTEE

The Navaio Nation hereby amends the Navajo Nation Code, Title 2, as follows:

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CHAPTER 3. LEGISLATIVE BRANCH SUBCHAPTER 9. STANDING COMMITTEES

TITLE 2. NAVAJO NATION GOVERNMENT

Article 2. Health, Education and Human Services Committee

§ 400. Establishment; Membership; Purposes

(C) The purposes of Committee are:

(3) To oversee Navajo Nation efforts in implementing and ensuring compliance with employment and labor laws and policies of the Navajo Nation, and the laws relating to veterans services.

§ 401. Powers

B. The Committee Shall have the following enumerated powers:

6. To review and recommend:

- Resolutions relating to social services, health, environmental health, a. education, veterans and veterans services, employment and labor.
- b. Navajo Nation agreements and contracts negotiated with federal, state, regional, and tribal governments, private and Navajo Nation health and


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SECTION SIX. CODIFICIATION

The provisions of this legislation which amend the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

SECTION SEVEN. SAVINGS CLAUSE

Should any provisions of this legislation be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those portions of this legislation which are not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.
