RESOLUTION OF THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL

23rd NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL -- First Year, 2015

AN ACTION

RELATING TO NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE; ESTABLISHING THE SACRED SITES TASK FORCE AS A SUB-COMMITTEE OF THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE

BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Findings

- A. The Navajo Nation established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such Naabik'íyáti' Committee's purpose is "to provide for the compilation and publication of all Navajo Nation laws, rules and regulations". 2 N.N.C. §700 (A) (2012) see also CO-45-12.
- B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §186 each committee may establish subcommittees consisting of members selected by the committee.
- C. The sub-committee shall exist until its assigned tasks are completed and report and recommendation is made to the committee.
- D. Through NABIJY-51-12, 22nd Navajo Nation Council, §2 (2012), the Sacred Sites Task Force was established as a subcommittee of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee.

Section Two. Establishment

- A. The Sacred Sites Task Force was established for the following purposes:
 - To identify all sacred sites within the Navajo Nation; and
 - To identify the nature and detail of any and all controversies pertaining to any sacred site within the Navajo Nation; and

- Obtain testimony and expert guidance for the purposes of developing necessary assessment and strategies regarding matters of sacred site controversy; and
- strategies and action plans the 4. Recommend consideration and Naabik'íyáti' Committee for recommendation the Navaio Nation Council as to appropriate.
- B. The Sacred Sites Task Force shall consist of five Delegates of the Navajo Nation Council as appointed by the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council and shall operate pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §186.
- C. The Sacred Sites Task Force shall be chaired by the Chair of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee and "shall meet at the call of the chair".

Section Three. Appointment

- A. The Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council hereby appoints Otto Tso, Dwight Witherspoon, Jonathan Hale, Jonathan Perry and Davis Filfred to serve on the Naabik'íyáti' Sacred Sites Task Force as provided for by 2 N.N.C. §186; see attached Exhibit A Appointment Memorandum.
- B. The Chair of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee, LoRenzo Bates, shall chair the Sacred Sites Task Force.


