17	A. The Navajo Nation established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation	
18	Council standing committee and as such empowered the Naabik'íyáti' Committee to	
19	coordinate all requests for information, appearances and testimony relating to	
20	proposed county, state and federal legislation impacting the Navajo Nation. See 2	
21	N.N.C. §§ 700 (A), 701 (A)(6). See also CO-45-12.	
22	B. The Navajo Nation established the Health, Education and Human Services Committee	
23	as a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 400(A). The	
24	Committee exercises oversight authority over the matters concerning health, education,	
25	human services and veteran affairs. 2 N.N.C. §§ 400 (A), 401(B)(7). See also CO-45-	
26	12.	
27	C. The Navajo Nation has a government-to-government relationship with the United	
28	States of America, Treaty of 1868, Aug. 12, 1868, 15 Stat. 667.	
29	D. On January 25, 2019, New Mexico Senator Tom Udall along with Senators Jon	
30	Tester, Catherine Cortez Mastro, Tina Smith, Martin Heinrich, Elizabeth Warren,	

Brian Schatz and Jeff Merkley introduced to the 116<sup>th</sup> Congress Senate Bill 229 titled the "Indian Programs Advance Appropriations Act." *See* S. 229 attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.

E. The Indian Programs Advance Appropriations Act was introduced to "provide advance appropriations authority for certain accounts of the Bureau of Indian Affairs and Bureau of Indian Education of the Department of the Interior and the Indian Health Service of the Department of Health and Human Services, and for other purposes." *Id*.

#### THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby supports Senate Bill 229 titled the "Indian Programs Advance Appropriations Act" attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby authorizes the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council, President of the Navajo Nation, and their designees, to advocate the Navajo Nation's support of the Indian Programs Advance Appropriations Act.

### A BILL

To provide advance appropriations authority for certain accounts of the Bureau of Indian Affairs and Bureau of Indian Education of the Department of the Interior and the Indian Health Service of the Department of Health and Human Services, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Indian Programs Ad-
- 5 vance Appropriations Act".

1	SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION FOR ADVANCE APPROPRIATIONS.
2	(a) In General.—For each fiscal year, beginning
3	with fiscal year 2020, new budget authority provided in
4	an appropriations Act for the covered accounts shall—
5	(1) be made available for that fiscal year; and
6	(2) include, for each such account, advance new
7	budget authority that first becomes available for the
8	first fiscal year after the budget year.
9	(b) Estimates Required.—Each applicable Sec-
10	retary shall include in documents submitted to Congress
11	in support of the President's budget submitted pursuant
12	to section 1105 of title 31, United States Code, detailed
13	estimates of the funds necessary for the covered accounts
14	of the Department of the Interior or the Department of
15	Health and Human Services, as applicable, for the fiscal
16	year following the fiscal year for which the budget is sub-
17	mitted.

Please review the proposed resolution to ensure it is drafted to your satisfaction. If you approve, please sign as "Primary Sponsor" and submit it to the Office of Legislative Services where the proposed resolution will be given a tracking number and referred to the Office of the Speaker. If the proposed legislation is unacceptable to you, please contact me at the Office of Legislative Counsel and advise me of the changes you would like to make to the proposed resolution.
