# RESOLUTION OF THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' STANDING COMMITTEE 24th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL -- Third Year, 2021

AN ACTION RELATING TO NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE; CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OF MR. STANFORD LAKE TO SERVE ON THE NAVAJO HOUSING AUTHORITY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO FILL THE 6 N.N.C. § 606(B) POSITION OF THE "CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT OR ENGINEERING OR BUSINESS MANAGEMENT OR EQUIVALENT FIELD EXPERIENCE WITH BACKGROUND IN INDIAN HOUSING OR FEDERAL HOUSING"

### SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. Pursuant to 6 N.N.C. § 606(A), [t]he Board Members shall be appointed, and may be reappointed, by the Nominations Committee composed of the Navajo Nation President, Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council, Resources and Development Committee designee, and confirmed by the Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council.
- B. Pursuant to 6 N.N.C. § 606(A), a resolution of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council as to the appointment or reappointment of any Commissioner shall be conclusive evidence of the due and proper appointment of the Commissioner.

### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- Pursuant to 6 N.N.C. § 602(A), the Navajo Nation established a public body of the Navajo Nation known as the Navajo Housing Authority (Authority) to: remedy unsafe and unsanitary housing conditions that are injurious to the public health, safety and morals; alleviate the acute shortage of decent, safe, and sanitary dwellings for persons of low income; provide employment opportunities through the construction, reconstruction, improvement, extension, alteration or repair operation of low income dwellings; and promote economic growth and development activities within and near the Navajo Nation. See 6 N.N.C. § 604(A)-(D).
- B. The affairs of the Authority shall be managed by a Board of Commissioners composed of five persons. 6 N.N.C. § 605; CJA-13-17.
- C. "One Commissioner shall have construction management or engineering or business management or equivalent field

- experience with background in Indian Housing or Federal Housing." 6 N.N.C. § 606(B); CJA-13-17.
- D. Pursuant to 6 N.N.C. § 606 the Nominations Committee, composed of the Navajo Nation President, Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council, Resources and Development Committee designee, has appointed Mr. Stanford Lake. The appointment letter is attached as Exhibit A.
- E. Mr. Lake's letter of interest is attached as **Exhibit B**. Mr. Lake states that he has "21 years [of] experience in design and construction sector." He also states that he has "experiences with planning with different tribes in the southwest including Navajo Nation, with county building departments, and latest building codes." He also has "experiences running my own business for five years...."
- F. A majority of the Commissioners shall be members of the Navajo Nation. 6 N.N.C. § 606(B); CJA-13-17. Mr. Stanford Lake's Navajo Nation Certificate of Indian Blood is attached as Exhibit C.
- G. "The term of office shall be four years and staggered. When a Board is first established, one member's term shall be designated to expire in one year, another to expire in two years, a third to expire in three years, and the last two in four years. Thereafter, all appointments shall be for four (4) years, except that in the case of a prior vacancy, an appointment shall be only for the length of the unexpired term. Each member of the Board shall hold office until his successor has been duly appointed." 6 N.N.C. § 607.
- H. The current Navajo Housing Authority Board of Commissioners member filling the position of "construction management or engineering or business management or equivalent field experience with background in Indian Housing or Federal Housing" is Ms. Derrith Watchman-Moore who was confirmed through Resolution NABIMY-46-17. Ms. Watchman-Moore has submitted a letter of resignation, attached as Exhibit D. Ms. Watchman-Moore's four year term expires on May 25, 2021.
- I. The duration of Mr. Lake's appointment shall be in accordance with 6 N.N.C. § 607 which states: "in the case of a prior vacancy, an appointment shall be only for the length of the unexpired term. Each member of the Board shall hold office until his successor has been duly appointed." Therefore, Mr. Lake's term shall end on May 25, 2021.

### SECTION THREE. CONFIRMING APPOINTMENT

- A. Pursuant to 6 N.N.C. § 606(B), the Naabik'íyáti' Committee hereby confirms the appointment of Mr. Stanford Lake to serve on the Navajo Housing Authority Board of Commissioners to fill the 6 N.N.C. § 606(B) position of the "construction management or engineering or business management or equivalent field experience with background in Indian Housing or Federal Housing."
- B. Pursuant to 6 N.N.C. § 607, Mr. Stanford Lake is appointed for the remainder of the term of his successor; therefore Mr. Lake's term will end on May 25, 2021.

#### CERTIFICATION





### Honorable President Nez:

It has been a great privilege to serve on the Board of Commissioners of the Navajo Housing Authority (NHA) since my appointment in May 2017. I am writing to inform you of my intention to resign my position by August 1, 2019 or as soon as a replacement is identified. My decision is based on additional work added to my current full-time role as Trustee for the second phase of the Navajo Environmental Response Trust overseeing environmental investigations of select abandoned uranium sites on the Navajo Nation. I will begin the "cleanup" phase of this work beginning in 2020; and this work requires my fullest attention for the next few years.

The NHA plays a critical role in assisting Navajo families with the greatest housing needs. To do this with diminishing revenues, NHA is moving toward partnerships with other entities on the Navajo Nation and the federal government to contribute to infrastructure development such as water and electricity. NHA is also working towards changing its business model to be the economic engine that it is by procuring more Navajo small business services and building mixed income homes in our communities. Underlying these changes, is NHA's focus on financial stability and compliance with federal and tribal laws. By the Board of Commissioners direction, NHA continues to find and address "lost communities" that once relied on NHA to provide initial funding to build homes; but the management entities failed and went defunct years ago. For years to come, NHA will have to address non-compliance issues and make these projects "whole" by corrective action measures that entail spending non-federal or tribal funds to demolish, rebuild, or build the homes as originally planned.

It has also been a pleasure to also work with my colleagues: Kris Beecher, soon to enter the ranks of aspiring Attorney, Frankie Lee, a Navajo professional engineer returning to the Navajo Nation with vast private sector experience to assist in infrastructure planning and development, and Ms. Kerrie Begay, a wonderful single mother and human resource professional addressing housing tenant concerns. Our professional experiences have taken NHA down a transparent path of decision making and sound fiscal management while addressing past serious misappropriation of NHA funds. The Board of Commissioners, as it currently stands, is steadfast, energetic, innovative, and unwavering of political pressure and media releases tainted with mistruths. Because of these qualities, I am confident in the current Board of Commissioners and the work that lies ahead of them.

Finally, I am deeply honored to have served the Navajo Nation and the Navajo People while at the NHA. I will continue my service to the Navajo Nation in another capacity and invite any questions regarding this letter.
