PURPOSE: The purpose of this legislation is to fund Chapter Heavy Equipment purchases and Emergency Water Projects through the Síhasin Fund.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

24	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY The Nation of the Navaio Nation 2
25	A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2
26	N.N.C. § 102 (A).
27	B. The Naabik'iyati' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to
28	review all proposed legislation which requires final action by the Navajo Nation
29	Council. 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(9).
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- C. The Budget and Finance Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the budgeting, appropriation, investment, and management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. § 301 (B)(2).
- D. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to provide oversight over water and chapter activities, as well as oversight over community and economic development on the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §501 (C)(1).
- E. The Navajo Nation Code provides that the purpose of the Navajo Nation Síhasin Fund ("Síhasin Fund") is as follows:

§ 2502 Purpose

- A. The purposes of this Fund are to provide financial support and/or financing for:
 - The planning and development of economic development and regional infrastructure supporting economic development, and community development, infrastructure as, but not limited to, including such buildings, housing, commercial and government development, waterline, solid waste management and powerline projects, and transportation Navaio Nation: communication systems, within the and
 - 2. Education opportunities for members of the Navajo Nation.
- B. For the Purpose in § 2502(A)(1), Fund expenditures for infrastructure shall not be limited by 12 NNC § 1310(F) or TCDCJY-77-99.
- C. Leveraging the Fund by way of guaranteeing loans, match funding, direct funding in part, and other weighted uses of the Fund, including loan financing from the Fund, for the purposes in § 2502(A)(1), shall be favored over direct funding in whole.

12 N.N.C. § 2502, as amended by CJA-03-18.

F. The Síhasin Fund provides that "Fund Principal" shall consist of all deposits made to the Síhasin Fund and that "Fund Income" shall consist of all earnings (interest, dividends, etc.) generated and realized by the Fund Principal, and that Fund Income shall be deposited in and added to Fund Principal until such time as a Fund Expenditure Plan is duly adopted. 12 N.N.C. §§ 2504 and 2505 (C).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The World Health Organization (WHO) declared a Public Health Emergency of International Concern related to the outbreak of coronavirus (COVID-19), a highly contagious and sometimes fatal respiratory virus, on January 30, 2020; the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services declared a Public Health Emergency related to the COVID-19 outbreak on January 31, 2020; and the WHO declared a global pandemic due to COVID-19 on March 11, 2020.
- B. The Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management, with the concurrence of Navajo Nation President Jonathan Nez, declared a Public Health State of Emergency on the Navajo Nation on March 11, 2020 due to COVID-19. Resolution No. CEM 20-03-11. The Navajo Nation Department of Health subsequently issued numerous Public Health Emergency Orders. Public Health Orders 2020-001 through 2020-030 are incorporated by reference into this resolution.
- C. The U.S. Congress on March 27, 2020, enacted the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, Pub. L. No. 116-136, 134 Stat. 281 (2020) (the "CARES Act"), which, at Title V, §5001, entitled "Coronavirus Relief Funds", set aside \$8 billion in emergency aid for Tribal governments for the COVID-19 pandemic.
- D. As of June 30, 2020, the Navajo Nation has received seven hundred fourteen million one hundred eighty-nine thousand six hundred thirty-one dollars and forty-seven cents (\$714,189,631.47) as the Nation's share of the U.S. Treasury's initial distributions of the Coronavirus Relief Fund.

- E. The CARES Act provides the Coronavirus Relief Fund shall be used to cover only those costs that:
 - a. are necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to COVID-19;
 - b. are not accounted for in the Tribal budget most recently approved as of March 27, 2020; and
 - c. are incurred from March 1, 2020 through December 30, 2020.
- F. Pursuant to the U.S. Treasury "Coronavirus Relief Fund Guidance for State, Territorial, Local, and Tribal Governments" updated on September 2, 2020, related to the permissible uses of the Coronavirus Relief Fund, for a CARES Act expense to have been "incurred" requires that services actually be performed and goods actually received by December 30, 2020.
- G. The Navajo Nation has enacted Resolutions No. CJN-46-20, CJN-47-20, CJY-67-20, CS-73-20 and CS-74-20, incorporated herein by reference, allocating the Nation's share of the U.S. Treasury's initial distributions of the Coronavirus Relief Fund through numerous CARES Fund Expenditure Plans, including the CARES Fund Chapter Distribution Expenditure Plan enacted by CS-73-20 and the Water Projects Expenditure Plan enacted by CJY-67-20.
- H. The purpose of the CARES Fund Chapter Distribution Expenditure Plan was to provide funding to all Navajo Nation Chapters (both LGA Certified and non-certified), through the Division of Community Development, to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic and ensure that Navajo communities have access to the funding necessary to ensure that community members are adequately protected from exposure to COVID-19 and able to comply with the Center for Disease Control (CDC) COVID-19 prevention guidance.
- I. The purpose of the CARES Fund Water Projects Expenditure Plan was to provide emergency funding to Department of Water Resources to ensure that the Navajo Nation populace has adequate access to safe potable water necessary to mitigate the spread COVID-19 and comply with CDC COVID-19 prevention guidance.

- J. Resolutions No. CJY-67-20 and CS-73-20 include that the progress of all approved Navajo Nation Cares Fund Expenditure Plan projects, including Chapter Distribution Expenditure Plan projects and Water Projects Expenditure Plan projects, shall be reviewed by the Budget and Finance and Naabik'íyáti' Committees during the month of October 2020 and that the funding for any project that has not made enough progress to demonstrate that it will be fully completed by December 30, 2020, will be re-allocated to the Hardship Assistance Expenditure Plan through Naabik'íyáti' Committee. See CJY-67-20, Section Three (Q) and CS-73-20, Section Three (F).
- K. On October 30, 2020, the Naabik'íyáti' Committee enacted NABIO-49-20, incorporated herein by reference, which states that

Any remaining CS-73-20, CJY-67-20 and/or CJN-46-20 CARES Fund Expenditure Plan funds not fully expended, not including encumbered and obligated funds, by November 20, 2020, regardless of recipient or intended recipient, shall be automatically reallocated to the Hardship Assistance Expenditure Plan. Funds still encumbered as of December 15, 2020, shall be unencumbered and unobligated and automatically reallocated to the Hardship Assistance Expenditure Plan. The Office of Management and Budget and Office of Controller shall implement these reallocations without the need for further authorization.

NABIO-46-20, Section Three (D).

- L. Numerous Chapters have requested that the Division of Community Development (DCD) use their respective Chapter Distribution funds to purchase heavy equipment; however, due to COVID-19 business restrictions and shut-downs, DCD was not able to execute the heavy equipment purchases, set forth in **Exhibit** A, by NABIO-46-20's November 20th expenditure mandate and the funding was automatically reallocated to the Hardship Assistance Expenditure Plan.
- M. Similar to DCD, the Department of Water Resources (DWR) was unable, due to COVID-19 business restrictions and shut-downs, to execute the water project purchases, set forth in **Exhibit B**, by NABIO-46-20's November 20th expenditure

- mandate and the funding was automatically reallocated to the Hardship Assistance Expenditure Plan.
- N. Notwithstanding the automatic reallocation to the Hardship Assistance Expenditure Plan, the purchase of the heavy equipment, as set forth in **Exhibit A**, is important to both the Chapters' response to COVID-19 and its overall community development, both short-term and long-term.
- O. Notwithstanding the automatic reallocation to the Hardship Assistance Expenditure Plan, funding of the water projects, as set forth in **Exhibit B**, is important to both the Navajo People' access to safe potable water and overall community development, both short-term and long-term.
- P. The Navajo Nation finds that using the Síhasin Fund for the purchase of heavy equipment, as set forth in **Exhibit A**, is within the purposes of 12 N.N.C. § 2502 (A) (1) and is in the best interests of Navajo communities and the Navajo People.
- Q. The Navajo Nation also finds that using the Síhasin Fund to fund the emergency water projects, as set forth in **Exhibit B**, is within the purposes of 12 N.N.C. § 2502 (A) (1) and is in the best interests of the Navajo People and Navajo communities.

SECTION THREE. ALLOCATION OF \$11,924,571 TO THE DIVISION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND ADOPTION OF THE CHAPTER HEAVY EQUIPMENT EXPENDITURE PLAN

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby allocates eleven million nine hundred twenty-four thousand five hundred seventy-one dollars (\$11,924,571) from the Síhasin Fund to the Division of Community Development to implement the Síhasin Fund Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan as detailed in **Exhibit A**.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves and adopts the Síhasin Fund Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan as set forth in this resolution and in **Exhibit A**.

SECTION FOUR. APPROVAL AND ADOPTION OF CHAPTER HEAVY EQUIPMENT EXPENDITURE PLAN ADMINISTRATION

The Navajo Nation hereby approves administration of the Síhasin Fund Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan as follows:

- 1. The Navajo Nation Controller shall determine whether the source of the \$11,924,571 allocation from the Síhasin Fund will be from Fund Principal or Fund Income or a combination of both;
- 2. The funds allocated for the Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan shall be distributed to the Division of Community Development within ten (10) days following enactment of this legislation;
- 3. The funds allocated for the Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan shall be used solely to purchase the equipment described in Exhibit A and any and all cost-savings shall be returned to the Síhasin Fund once the Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan is completed; and
- 5. The funds allocated for the Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan shall revert to the Síhasin Fund principal if not spent or encumbered within ninety (90) days of distribution to the Division of Community Development, unless recommended otherwise by the Resources and Development Committee and approved by the Naabik'íyáti' Committee.

SECTION FIVE. ALLOCATION OF \$33,876,114 TO THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES AND ADOPTION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES EMERGENCY PROJECTS EXPENDITURE PLAN

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby allocates thirty-three million eight hundred seventy-six thousand one hundred fourteen dollars (\$33,876,114) from the Síhasin Fund to the Department of Water Resources to implement the Síhasin Fund Department of Water Resources Emergency Projects Expenditure Plan as detailed in **Exhibit B**.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves and adopts the Síhasin Fund Department of Water Resources Emergency Projects Expenditure Plan as set forth in this resolution and in **Exhibit B**.

SECTION SIX. APPROVAL AND ADOPTION OF DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES EMERGENCY PROJECTS EXPENDITURE PLAN ADMINISTRATION

The Navajo Nation hereby approves administration of the Síhasin Fund Department of Water Resources Emergency Projects Expenditure Plan as follows:

- The Navajo Nation Controller shall determine whether the source of the \$33,876,114 allocation from the Síhasin Fund will be from Fund Principal or Fund Income or a combination of both;
- 2. The funds allocated for the Department of Water Resources Emergency Projects
 Expenditure Plan shall be distributed to the Department of Water Resources
 within ten (10) days following enactment of this legislation;
- 3. The funds allocated for the Department of Water Resources Emergency Projects Expenditure Plan shall be used solely to fund the projects described in Exhibit B and any and all cost-savings shall be returned to the Síhasin Fund once the Department of Water Resources Emergency Projects Expenditure Plan is completed; and
- 5. The funds allocated for the Department of Water Resources Emergency Projects Expenditure Plan shall revert to the Síhasin Fund principal if not spent or encumbered within one hundred twenty days (120) days of distribution to the Department of Water Resources, unless recommended otherwise by the Resources and Development Committee and approved by the Naabik'íyáti' Committee.

SECTION SEVEN. EFFECTIVE DATE

This legislation and the Síhasin Fund Chapter Heavy Equipment and Department of Water Resources Emergency Projects Expenditure Plans Expenditure Plan, as set forth above, shall become effective pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 2505.

SECTION EIGHT. SAVINGS CLAUSE

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Should any provision(s) of this Action be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of the Action shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

SECTION NINE. DIRECTIVES

The Division of Community Development and Department of Water Resources shall report, in writing, the status of expenditures and project progress under their respective Expenditure Plans to the Naabik'iyati' Committee and Office of the President and Vice-President by the fifth day of each month following the enactment of this legislation.

- 3. The U.S. Congress on March 27, 2020, enacted the Coronavirus aid, Relief, Economic Security Act (CARES Act), Pub L. No. 116-136, 134 Stat. 281 (2020). The CARES Act, at Title V, §5001, entitled Coronavirus Relief Funds which set aside \$8 Billion in emergency aid for Tribal Governments for the COVID-19 Pandemic; The Navajo Nation received from the CARES Act funding in the amount of \$714,189,631.47 to be used to address the COVID-19 Pandemic; From Navajo Nation Council Resolution CS-73-20, an amount of \$90 Million was appropriated for Navajo Nation Chapters and this was approved the Navajo Nation Office of the President & Vice-President; The Chinle Chapter Government was allocated an amount of \$1,814,490.00 under Business Unit Number 10815; Chinle Chapter Government requested through the appropriated funds a Backhoe and Chapter Heavy Duty Truck to haul and transport the backhoe via the NN CARES Act Funds and initially the Navajo Division of Community Development approved such purchase but was denied by the Navajo Office of the Controller; and

The Chinle Chapter Government formally submits this letter of request to you for acknowledgement and approval in our request for new equipment for the chapter. The chapter is dire need of a new Backhoe as well as chapter truck due to the COVID-19 Pandemic as the Chinle Chapter has been in constant operation of providing assistance to the general public since the Pandemic was announced, March 2020. As part of the continued operation, the chapter was tagged to be the District Distribution Center for Chinle Agency and given our LGA status, we also provided essential assistance through Burials, Trash Services and distribution of goods and services. All of which required the chapter to use our chapter truck and backhoe for these services and this meant a constant wear and tear and excessive mileage for our chapter equipment.

Also, within the allocation of the Navajo Nation CARES Act, Legislation CS-73-20 was approved and that enacted funding for chapters and through the Guidance of the Coronavirus Relief Fund for State, Territorial, Local and Tribal Governments, it states that that necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) can be considered.

Then within the Navajo Nation CARES Fund Chapter Distribution Expenditure Plan listed in the purpose cites infrastructure equipment like a backhoe for COVID related deceased matters as well as a vehicle which provided the transportation of Pandemic relief of goods and services throughout the Chinle Agency, providing services for up to ten chapters.

In closing, the Chinle Chapter is requesting approval of purchasing a backhoe and chapter truck as replacements for our existing worn, tired and need of replacement equipment. We have determined to have such equipment replaced it will cost, \$175,524.91 and attached is the quotation of such items. We thank you for consideration and any questions can be brought to our attention.

Chapter Support Program - Standard Equipment Justification Memo

The Navajo Nation understands that many Chapters have a need for the acquisition of heavy equipment or the repair of existing equipment due to overuse during the pandemic. Such items include backhoes, trailers, and other transportation equipment. Given these are Federal dollars, there are many Federal compliance requirements that accompany the use of funds. As with all uses of payments from the CARES Act, the use of payments to acquire or improve property and equipment is limited to that which is necessary due to the COVID-19 public health emergency. In the context of acquisitions of equipment, this means that the acquisition itself must be necessary. Per compliance requirements, you must:

- Determine the Chapter is not able to meet the need arising from the public health emergency in a cost-effective manner by leasing property or equipment
- Maintain documentation to support this determination.

Additionally, such acquisitions must be completed and the acquisition of equipment be put to use in service of the COVID-19-related use for which it was acquired or improved by December 30, 2020 to support compliance requirements, please provide answers to the following questions for each piece of equipment or vehicles that you would like procured or are requesting reimbursement. ¹

1. Please provide an explanation of how this equipment or heavy machinery will directly allow your Chapter to respond to or mitigate circumstances caused by COVID-19.

The purchasing of the Backhoe will allow the continuance of assisting not only the Chinle Chapter but nearby surrounding chapters with the digging of burial plots for those individuals that passed on due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. Given that the Chinle Chapter is an LGA Chapter we have been in continued operation since the start of the Pandemic, March 2020, and this laid the burden of making sure loved ones were properly laid to rest. The wear and tear on our existing backhoe were significant and this included the chapter truck which pulled the backhoe within the Chinle Community and the surrounding communities. The need for backhoe assistance is ongoing and given the increase in positive cases of COVID-19 will not end. The need to have graves dug will last well into the end of 2020 and go directly into 2021. Replacement of the current backhoe is a must and need.

The chapter is also needing to replace its chapter truck that transports the Backhoe as well as they go hand in hand and being able to get the Backhoe to the community cemetery is a must and needed. The size of the Backhoe warrants having to be transported to the cemetery as well as community burial sites and the constant wear and tear on the chapter truck has been evident and a replacement is warranted and needed.

2. Please confirm the vendor will guarantee that the item will be delivered and the Chapter will make use of the item before 12/30. Funds must be expended before 11/30, but all goods must be delivered and operational before 12/30 to be eligible. Note – please also include confirmation from the vendor stating the date of delivery (e.g., a purchase order, invoice).

The chapter is well aware of the parameters and deadlines needing to be meet and we will have the backhoe delivered to the Chapter before December 30, 2020 and this also includes the chapter truck and once they have arrived, they will be in full operation as we get requests for burial assistance weekly. Also see the attached emails as well as the individual Quotations which indicate delivery prior to December 30, 2020.

3. Provide an explanation to support that the Chapter is not able to meet the need in a more cost-effective manner (i.e., why there was a need to purchase the backhoe as opposed to rent through December 30, 2020). This analysis should be focused on the covered period (through 12/30) and why there is not a more cost-effective option over the next two months as opposed to purchasing the piece of equipment. As a reminder, the intention of CARES Act funding is for the covered period through December 30, 2020 and future use of the item in 2021 is not an appropriate justification. If the item is not available to rent, that is an acceptable justification.

The cost of renting is not deemed acceptable nor does having to abide by the rules of meeting the necessary expectations of servicing the equipment through that one vendor only. Whereas purchasing of a new backhoe allows more flexibility in service of unit. Also renting of unit is not readily available in our location.

There is no funding to rent or commit to a long term renting agreement and purchasing of a new chapter truck is deemed feasible at this time.

Mr. Speaker, Members of Navajo Nation Council, Division of Natural Resources, Community Development and Office of the President please accept my comments and recommendations to Legislation 0309-20. This legislation is to continue fighting the coronavirus and to provide Navajo resources (Shihasin Fund) in the total amount of \$45,800,685 to Division Natural Resources and Division Community Development to purchase water resources emergency projects and heavy equipment for chapters.

First, I want to thank the foresight of the sponsors for putting forth a legislation using Navajo resources to continue to address issues to fight the deadly coronavirus on Navajo land. These are issues that could not be addressed through the federal CARES Act due to its stringent guidelines.

I wish to again resubmit the proposal (Sleeping Mountain Water Project, see attachment) which was not funded under the Navajo Nation CARES Act. This proposal was submitted to the Division of Community Development and Mr. Yellowhair for funding however, it did not make the list as many other important projects. I'm asking the Navajo Nation to seriously consider funding this extremely important project.

Briefly, the Peabody Coal and Kayenta Black Mesa Pipeline has been using the N-aquifer of Black Mesa for almost 50 years denying local residents the use of its sole water source. In 2005 and November, 2019 the coal mining finally ceased, thus the use of 6,400 AFY also ceased. The N-aquifer should and must be returned to local residents for their use. Early 2020 the Tuba City Health Services allocated over \$2,080,000 (nonfederal CARES fund) to construct over 22 miles of water lines servicing 36 homes in southern Forest Lake and northern Hardrock chapters (see attached letter). IHS is now in the process of surveying the right of way and to complete all related planning by the end of 2020. Their plan is to install water lines in 2021 and with completion by end 2022.

Of the 36 homes identified by Tuba City, 18 are either federal relocation, NHA or chapter built homes and are equipped with bathroom/kitchen facilities, 18 of the 36 are homes built by owners over 60 years ago and do not have bathroom and kitchen facilities. The Tuba City service unit said they are not responsible for those facilities; it is up to the Navajo Nation and the chapters. The proposal is to provide funding in the amount of \$906,500 for these bathroom/kitchen additions and to assess working conditions of cistern and septic systems of those homes already equipped with those

facilities. IHS also skipped several homes and with this proposal all those homes will be included plus one burned out.

Scientists and health experts told the Navajo Nation one of the major reasons why the virus was extremely high on Navajo land was many homes lack clean running water. This proposal will help address this issue and provide water to 45 homes.

Both chapters by resolutions and letters are in total support and asking for your consideration for funding the bathroom/kitchen facilities. Should you have any questions please contact the chapters or myself at this email or cell phone 928-

Proposed Plan of Action for Installations of Bathroom/Kitchen Forest Lake and Hardrock Chapters

"To' éi 'iiná até, water is life. All on Mother Earth need water to survive. Water is the most precious resource, without water there is no life. Water is a living matter, Dine' offer their sacred stone to water and talk to it and ask for healthy living"

I. Introduction

Forest Lake and Hardrock Chapters are located in the Dziłíyijiin area, on Black Mesa. Both communities have had their share of hardship, as a result of the unsettled and the settlement of land ownership between the Navajo and Hopi tribes. This is particularly true for the Hardrock chapter, losing approximately 70% of its land base to the partition. Hardrock Chapter, through the relocation program received over 200 families from the Hopi partition land to the Navajo partition land. The federal relocation program provided very little economic and other support to accommodate the host resettled area. Forest Lake Chapter, likewise received very little support from the Peabody mine. Forest Lake Chapter lost their land base not only to the partition, but to the 64,000 acres leased to Peabody for mining. Both communities' sole source of water is the N-aquifer which was dedicated to Peabody/Kayenta mines for 50 years.

This proposal lays out the need for, cost of, and impact of providing water and sanitation infrastructure to 35-45 homes in the Hardrock and Forest Lake Chapters on the Navajo Nation. It attempts to address the most important criteria in justifying funds for water and sanitation projects:

- The deficiency levels of sanitation facility projects in the Navajo Nation's Hardrock and Forest Lake Chapters;
- The number of homes associated with the project; and
- The estimated costs to correct the identified deficiencies.

I. Purposes for project

Health experts and scientists have reported that the lack of access to clean water on the Navajo Nation has significantly increased the susceptibility to diseases, especially to the corona virus, which has cost the lives of our people at an unheard of rate. We have never experienced so many of our people taken away in such a short amount of time. The Corona Virus has claimed nearly 500 members of our Navajo Nation, our leaders cannot allow this to continue.

a. IHS Sleepy Mountain Water Project Pipeline will provide first water service to 35 homes in the Hardrock and Forest Lake Chapters

To address the lack of household water, the Indian Health Services (IHS) and Tuba City Regional Healthcare have funded (see attached letter) the *Sleepy Mountain Water Project* to build a water line to serve 35 homes in the Forest Lake and Hardrock Chapters. Approximately \$2,080,000 will be used for

the pipeline project, which will install approximately 22.7 miles of water line, serving 35 homes. (Pers. Comm. IHS)

IHS wants to complete all planning related work before the end of the year, this includes any archeological clearances. IHS plans to start installing the water lines beginning in 2021 and to finish by the end of 2022.

The IHS schedule presents incredibly challenging tasks for both Chapters. To get the homes ready to receive water, and to make use of the CARES Act Funding, all 35 homes will require infrastructure upgrades as soon as possible, but no later than December 31, 2020.

Neither the Hardrock Chapter nor the Forest Lake Chapter has the resources required to build the additions, purchase materials and provide the labor to get need upgrades planned and built in time to benefit from the Sleepy Mountain Water Project Pipeline in 2022.

b. This project seeks funding to install new, and in some cases upgrade, bathroom and kitchen additions and sanitation systems at 35-45 homes in the Forest Lake and Hardrock Chapters to address deficiencies not correctable by routine operation and maintenance for homes to be served by the Sleepy Mountain Water Project Pipeline.

All 35-45 homes in this project meet the criterion W4.1 from <u>Appendix E: Guidance on Assigning Project Impact Deficiency Levels</u>, which is:

"A lack of piped drinking water to homes (i.e. no connection to a community water system, individual well, or cistern system with regulated water delivery), including appropriate interior plumbing as necessary and allowable per the Criteria Document."

This project will install or upgrade water and sanitation facilities in 35-45 homes that will be served by the Sleepy Mountain Water Project Pipeline.

- II. Project scope: Existing Deficiencies and Proposed Facilities.
 - a. Provide first service to 18 existing homes that lack sanitation facilities.

The Sleepy Mountain Water Project Pipeline will provide first service to 18 existing Navajo homes that lack sanitation facilities. These 18 homes need both a bathroom addition/kitchen upgrade to be built before water can be connected to each home. Providing sewer service to these homes is not feasible, so new septic systems are also required.

b. Design and Cost Estimation for Needed Bathroom/Kitchen Additions and Sanitation Facilities for 18 homes

Estimates for the cost of bathroom additions/kitchen plumbing and for the cost of septic tank & drain field come from the NAVAJO NATION CARES FUND WATER PROJECTS EXPENDITURE PLAN,

Exhibit 3 Water Projects from CJY-67-20.pdf. Personal communication between Percy Deal and a local contractor suggest, however, that actual costs for septic tank and drain field installation in the area to be served by the Sleepy Mountain Water Project is, on average, \$8,500.

c. Provide first service to 17 existing homes that may require repairs or upgrades to address deficiencies in old, unused sanitation facilities

The Sleepy Mountain Water Project Pipeline will provide water to an additional 17 homes that are federal relocation homes, mobile homes, NHA homes or chapter assistance homes. These homes are already equipped with bathroom and kitchen facilities, however these homes, especially the relocation homes, are over 25 years old and will need their facilities (cistern and septic system) assessed to determine if there is a need for an upgrade or repairs of the cistern and/or septic systems and then funding for any repairs and upgrades needed.

d. Additional Needs

There apparently were homes skipped in the original selection under the current water plan as follows:

• Forest Lake Chapter:

- Two homes were skipped in the original inventory. One is mobile home about a mile south of Red Hill. All other homes in the vicinity have water, but this mobile home was brought in a few years ago. The other is a house located east of house project #99808 approximately 2 miles.
- There is one burned out home that needs replacement. The elderly lady lost her home in 2012 and it was never replaced. The home should be replaced.

Hardrock Chapter: There are 7 relocation homes all in one location about 3 miles northwest of
the Rocky Ridge School just outside the Hopi partition land. These families were relocated after
the mid 1980's by the federal relocation program. Homes are equipped with cistern and septic
systems but no water. Most members are elderly aged. Most have health problems: diabetes,
mental problems, amputees and etc.

All of the above homes should be included in this proposed water project.

 Estimated Additional Cost: Addressing the needs of these additional homes will cost approximately \$207,000 which includes bathroom additions and septic system additions for the two homes in Forest Lake at \$25,000 each, \$7,000 for cistern and septic system inspection for the 7 relocation homes in Hardrock (Rocky Ridge) at \$1,000 each, and finally the replacement of burned out house at \$75,000 plus septic system installation.

The total cost for all 45 homes is \$837,000.

III. Schedule of Activities

a. CARES Act Spending Requirements

There is an urgent need to get this project moving as fast as possible. The federal CARES Act fund has a strict timeline: the use of CARES Act funding for the bathroom addition project will have to conclude at the end of calendar year 2020. The project must start in early October 2020 and end by December 2020, less than 12 weeks. Most of the additions should be completed during that timeframe. The remaining additions will have to continue after the New Year utilizing nonfederal CARES Act funding.

Because of the tight spending timelines of the CARES Act and challenges facing the Navajo Nation's budgeting process, there is a strong likelihood this project may not be funded until late October, 2020 or later. Any further delays will put the project on an even tighter schedule than estimated and jeopardize the completion of the entire project. The two chapters and the Navajo Nation should be prepared to pick up any cost after the New Year for orderly completion of the project.

b. Assessment

One of the early requirements for this project is for IHS to partner with the Navajo Nation's project supervisor and the Chapters to visit each of the 35 homes, beginning with the 18 homes in need of a bathroom and kitchen facilities, to assess and determine the floorplan, and site plan for the incoming fresh water and outgoing waste water lines. They will create a list of needed materials.

c. Supervision, Materials and Labor

IHS indicated they will provide limited plumbing resources, the remaining needs will have to be furnished by the Navajo Tribe.

Listed below are suggested personnel, their duties, materials and other costs associated with the project:

- Supervisor: Will be responsible for the entire bathroom/kitchen additions. The Supervisor will work with and coordinate very closely with the IHS, the Navajo tribe and the chapters until the project is completed. The Supervisor will visit each home with an IHS representative for floor/site plan, inspect the cistern and waste facilities at each relocation home and other homes that have bathroom and kitchen facilities. The Supervisor will be responsible to order supplies needed, hire a team of laborers and schedule them for building the additions. The Supervisor will complete any required reports and be responsible for the laborer timesheets. The Supervisor will need to be experienced in housing construction and have ability to effectively supervise a crew. The Supervisor will be responsible for answering any questions from auditors related to the expenditures for this project. The timeline is very stringent, the Supervisor must have the ability to work within the time constraints.
 - Salary: Must be commensurate with experience and knowledge of similar construction projects.
- Assistant: This person will assist the supervisor in every area of the project. Will have to have significant experience with in home construction.
 - Salary: Must be commensurate with experience and knowledge of similar construction projects.
- Cost: The Navajo Nation has estimated \$25,000 per home all costs related to bathroom/kitchen additions (NAVAJO NATION CARES FUND WATER PROJECTS EXPENDITURE PLAN,
 <u>Exhibit 3 Water Projects from CJY-67-20.pdf</u>). This amount should cover the cost of labor and housing supplies. The Chapters anticipate completion of the additions in 12 weeks.
- Crews: To complete the 18 additions by the end of the calendar year will require 4 crews with 4 laborers on each crew. The crew must be able to work within the time restrictions.
- Housing Improvements Estimates: The Nation has estimated a cost of \$25,000 for each bathroom addition/plumbing upgrade and \$25,000 for each new septic system, for a total of \$900,000 for the 18 homes. An additional \$1,000 is estimated to be needed for each of the 17 relocation homes, to provide an inspection of the cistern and septic systems, for a total of an additional \$17,000. The additional 2 missed house, 7 relocation homes, and replacement of the burned out one-bedroom house would cost an additional \$207,000.

Housing Improvements Estimate total for all 45 homes is: \$906,500.

V. Project Impact

This proposal for infrastructure upgrades at 45 homes in the Hardrock and Forest Lake Chapters for the Navajo Nation will allow Navajo Nation residents to benefit from the Sleepy Mountain Water Project, which will be planned and constructed between 2020 and 2022. The Navajo Nation has detailed, generic plans for bathroom additions, septic systems, and other infrastructure needed to complete this project and we propose having project oversight (Supervisor and Assistant) to ensure site visits are completed

and detailed plans drawn up for each home and that construction is completed efficiently and well to meet the requirements of the CARES Act and IHS.

With this project, dozens of people, including many tribal elders, will have running water and sanitation in their homes for the first time. In this time of COVID-19 and the risks it poses to the Diné, this project is urgent to protect the health and well-being our people and culture.

Based on the IHS SDS criteria estimating project impact, in the attached **Appendix A**, we used the limited data available to use to begin to score the impacts of this project.

Because of the strong possibility of delays in getting funding and tight spending timeline for the CARES Act, there is a strong likelihood this project may not be funded until late October, 2020 or later. Any further delays will put the project on extremely tight schedule and jeopardize the completion of the entire project. The Hardrock and Forest Lake Chapters and the Navajo Nation should be prepared to pick up any costs beginning in January 2021 for orderly completion of these urgent and necessary upgrades to address the long-standing sanitization deficiencies at these 45 homes.

The Navajo Area Indian Health Service (NAIHS) has commenced with preliminary surveying activities for the construction of sanitation facilities to serve families residing within the Forest Lake and Hardrock Chapter community. The subject project is being undertaken in accordance with Public Law 86-121 to serve 38 homes.

To assist us in fulfilling our service, 18 project homes are identified on the project and will require construction of bathroom additions to provide accommodation for interior-plumbing and installation of plumbing fixtures. NAIHS will make every effort and it is our goal to provide potable water to the project homes. Unfortunately, the project does not receive funding to construct bathroom additions. Therefore, we are requesting the Hardrock and Forest Lake Chapter to solicit financial support for the construction of bathroom addition for these 18 project homes.

The interior-plumbing consists of a common rough-in plumbing which contains water supply piping, 3-inch drain waste, vent piping, and finally hanging of the bathroom fixtures on one side of the plumbing wall and a kitchen sink with water heater on the other side. The NAIHS will provide the rough-in plumbing and fixtures after the fulfillment of the bathroom additions. The bathroom additions must be completed before the NAIHS can initiate the provision of water supply and sewage disposal facilities to the project homes requiring bathroom additions.

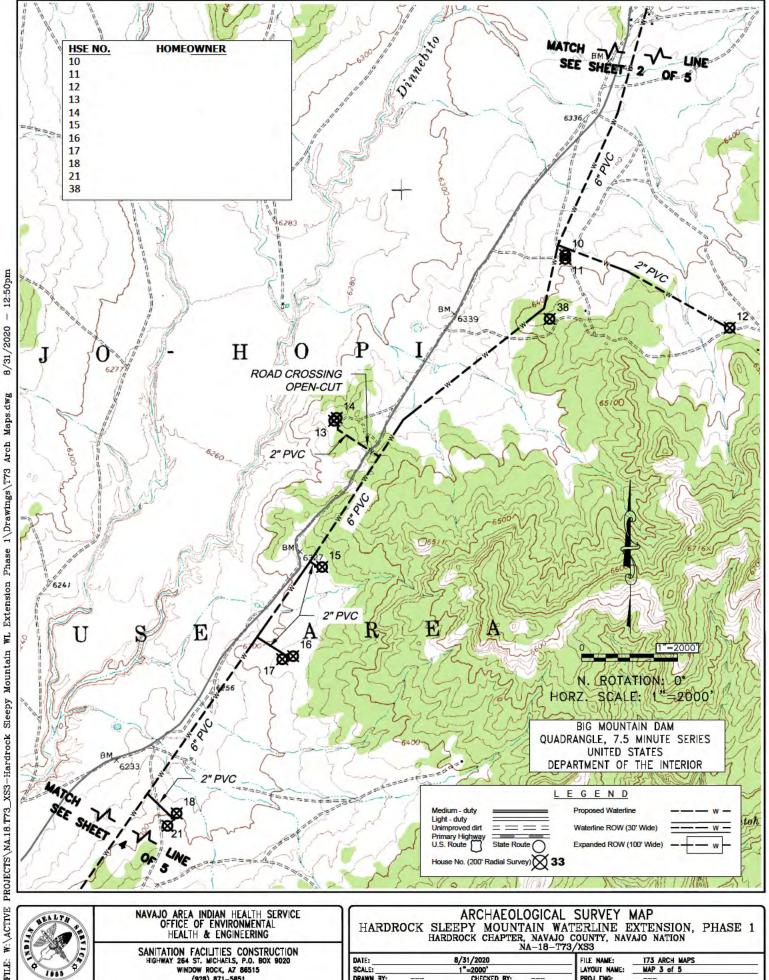

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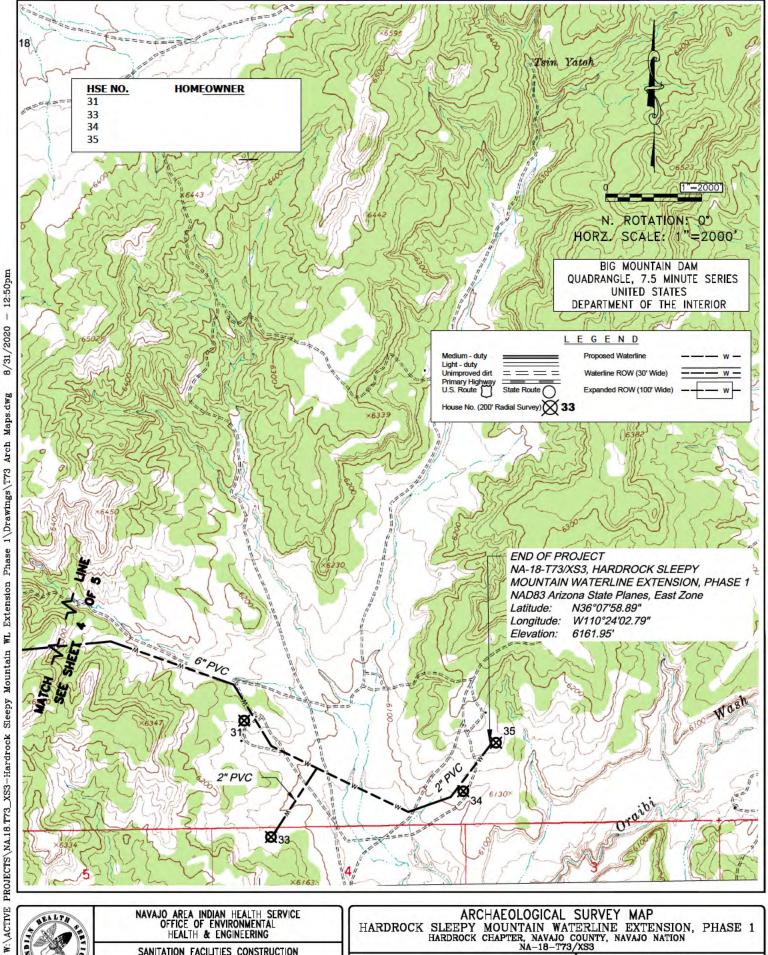

With this information, the Chapter will address the issues by making decisions in order to reach the community's goals and achieve its vision.

The Community Needs Assessment is a collection of information from the Chapter, federal, state, and local governments that has been compiled into one document. The focus of the Community Needs Assessment is to prevent, prepare for, and/or respond to the novel coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic by addressing and prioritizing such as purchasing supplies needed to help prevent or minimize the impact of COVID-19.

The Navajo Nation has determined that immediately providing funding for Navajo Nation Chapters to combat the effects of COVID-19 and mitigate the future spread at the community level is vital in sustaining a comprehensive response to the COVID-19 public health emergency and mitigating the effects of the pandemic.

This assessment is based on the affects of the COVID-19 pandemic has brought to the community and ensure that Community Needs Assessment and its expenditures must benefit the general public and community as a whole by adequately addressing and protecting them from exposure to COVID-19 and able to comply with the Center for Disease Control (CDC) COVID-19 prevention guidance necessary to mitigate the spread of the virus.

Chapter has used hundred of dollars to repair the current backhoe and soon the Backhoe will break down leaving the Chapter without a heavy equipment to provide essential services.

At times, Leupp Chapter receives donations of firewood, but we don't have the high capacity wood splitter and Chapter does not have the funds to provide labors to chop the wood by hand therefore creating loss of time. With Generator, the wood splitter can be operated at

		the warehouse with ease. The heavy-duty generator will also be used to make repairs where electric is needed in area where there is not electricity.

The postal system is used to deliver, among other things, important governmental information and benefits, mail that is essential to the functioning of our economy, elections materials, and packages containing vital necessities, including medicines and other goods, and is a part of the nation's critical infrastructure. To address the no heat, no AC, no bathroom and lack of PO Box, more funds will be needed to address and fix the problems equating to purchase of new building with COVID-19 protect such as bullet proof glass service windows, additional boxes for community and working AC, Heater and Bathroom for the employee to run the post office.

Dear Honorable President Nez:

Attached please find the most current Indian Health Service (IHS) Sanitation Deficiency System (SDS) report for domestic water, waste water and solid waste unmet needs for existing Navajo homes. The SDS is mandated by Public Law 94-437, the Indian Health Care Improvement Act, as amended. Although we update this list annually and submit it to our Headquarters office for inclusion into the national list, it may be amended at any time, and we seek and welcome your comments for the purpose of thoroughness. This Navajo SDS list was reviewed and updated during the 2020 calendar year, and was officially made part of the IHS Headquarters record on December 2, 2020.

The first page of the report is a summary of the identified reportable and eligible sanitation deficiencies for the Navajo Nation. The following five pages of the report is a one-line listing of the 374 reportable sanitation facilities projects, in priority order, that are necessary to correct these sanitation deficiencies. The funding priority is based on several scoring factors, with the dominant factors being the deficiency levels and the cost per home of each project.

The total estimated cost of all reportable projects is approximately \$535 million, an increase of \$15.5 million from the previous year. The total cost of projects that are economically feasible for IHS funding is approximately \$166 million. Although the Navajo Area IHS, one of twelve IHS Areas nationally, secures approximately 20% of all the Public Law 86-121 funding by Congress for these projects, at the current level of funding it will take approximately 6 years to fund the feasible projects.

In preparing this SDS list we have worked with the local Chapters, the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority, and the Nation's Department of Water Resources. The scope of work consists of upgrading the existing line under load which will consist of installing new poles, and larger overhead primary conductor. This estimate below shows the cost sharing amount between Navajo Housing Authority and Lukachukai Community School.

 - S. Per memorandum dated May 7, 2018, **Exhibit C**, the Navajo Nation President line-item vetoed certain CAP-35-18 projects approved by the Navajo Nation Council, including Shiprock Chapter's "Former BIA Compound" Project, listed as No. 70 in CAP-35-18's Exhibit D, for \$350,000.00.
 - T. Per CAP-45-18, Section Four (C), each Council District was awarded Sihasín Funding of \$4,166,666.67; the President's line-item veto of the Former BIA Compound Project resulted in the Shiprock Council District receiving less than \$4,166,666.67 and less funding than all other Council Districts.
 - U. As set forth in Shiprock Chapter Resolution No. 10-13-19-006-SHIP (amending 09-17-19-073-SHIP), attached as **Exhibit D**, the Shiprock Chapter requests that the Navajo Nation Council approve the following projects totaling \$350,000 to replace the line-item vetoed "Former BIA Compound" project: Veteran Cemetery for \$110,000; Veterans Waterline for \$15,000; Shiprock Baseball Field for \$75,000.00; and a Portable Building for Elected Officials for \$150,000, as set forth in the Shiprock Chapter Project Recapture Expenditure Plan attached as **Exhibit E**.
 - V. The Navajo Nation also finds that using the Síhasin Fund to fund the Shiprock Chapter projects, as set forth in **Exhibit E**, is within the purposes of 12 N.N.C. § 2502 (A) (1) and is in the best interests of the Navajo People and Navajo communities.
- 3. On page 8, line 23, insert new sections as follows:
 - SECTION SEVEN. ALLOCATION OF \$350,000 TO THE CAPITAL PROJECTS MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT AND ADOPTION OF THE SHIPROCK CHAPTER PROJECT RECAPTURE EXPENDITURE PLAN

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby allocates three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000) from the Síhasin Fund to the Capital Projects Management Department on behalf of the Shiprock Chapter to implement the Síhasin Fund Shiprock Chapter Project Recapture Expenditure Plan as detailed in **Exhibit E**.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves and adopts the Síhasin Fund Shiprock Chapter Project Recapture Expenditure Plan as set forth in this resolution and in **Exhibit E**.

SECTION EIGHT. APPROVAL AND ADOPTION OF SHIPROCK CHAPTER PROJECT RECAPTURE EXPENDITURE PLAN ADMINISTRATION

The Navajo Nation hereby approves administration of the Síhasin Fund Shiprock Chapter Project Recapture Expenditure Plan as follows:

- 1. The Navajo Nation Controller shall determine whether the source of the \$350,000 allocation from the Síhasin Fund will be from Fund Principal or Fund Income or a combination of both;

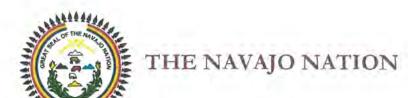

Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. 1005 (C)(10), action for Resolution No. CAP-35-18 is being submitted to the Navajo Nation Council, through the Office of the Speaker within the ten (10) days requirement. Furthermore, the Navajo Nation President has line item veto authority for budget items within the Supplemental Appropriations, which are not subject to override by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. 164 (A)(17).

After review of Resolution No. CAP-35-18, I hereby exercise my line-veto to:

- 1. Section Three. Approval and Adoption of Expenditure Plan.
- 2. Section Four. Approval and Adoption of Expenditure Plan Administration.
- 3. EXHIBIT D. SISHASIN FUND POWERLINE AND CHAPTER CAPITAL PROJECTS EXPENDITURE PLAN

- a. NO. 42 YEAR 1 Funding \$46,100.00, YEAR 2 Funding \$143,250.00, YEAR 3 Funding \$643,983.00, SIHASIN FUNDS REQUESTED in the total amount of \$833,333.00.
- b. NO. 70 YEAR 1 Funding \$350,000.00, SIHASIN FUNDS REQUESTED in the total amount of \$350,000.00

After consultation with the impacted Divisions, I have decided to exercise my line-item veto authority. The justification and details for use of the President's line-item veto is set forth below.

- a. NO. 42 YEAR 1 Funding \$46,100.00, YEAR 2 Funding \$143,250.00, YEAR 3 Funding \$643,983.00, SIHASIN FUNDS REQUESTED in the total amount of \$833,333.00.
- b. NO. 70 YEAR 1 Funding \$350,000.00, SIHASIN FUNDS REQUESTED in the total amount of \$350,000.00

First, the 110 Chapters have millions in unexpended dollars and should expend these fund for the many uses and projects on this Sihasin project listing. There are still many people that need water and electricity and these dollars should be priority for these funds. Second, the two projects vetoed are Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) projects and should remain under the BIA funding. Third, I support these appropriations as they also fulfill our four (4) pillars for Veterans, Youth and Elders, Jobs and Infrastructure.

I am pleased to sign this legislation into law as it will stimulate our economy by creating much needed jobs and bringing in infrastructure for our People.

Therefore, I will exercise my line-item veto authority to only two (2) items.

AN ACTION

RELATING TO HEALTH EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES, RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT, BUDGET AND FINANCE AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; ADOPTING THE SÍHASIN FUND POWERLINE AND CHAPTER PROJECTS EXPENDITURE PLAN PURSUANT TO CD-68-14, AS AMENDED BY CJA-03-18, AND 12 N.N.C §§ 2501 - 2508, AS AMENDED; WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 810 (F), 820 (I) AND (M) AND 860 (C) RELATING TO THE CAPITAL BUDGET AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROCESS

BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Authority

- A. The Health Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to provide legislative oversight on matters involving health, social services, education, general governmental services and human services. 2 N.N.C. §400 (C) (1).
- B. The Resource Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to exercise oversight authority on matters involving roads and transportation, communications and utilities, information technology, chapter activities, economic and community development, rights-of-way, public utilities and housing. 2 N.N.C. § 500 (C).
- C. The Budget and Finance Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the budgeting, appropriation, investment, and management of all funds and to coordinate and review all fiscal, financial and investment activities of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §§ 301 (B) (2) and (5).
- D. The Naabik'iyati' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to review all proposed legislation which requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A) (9).
- E. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee additionally has the authority to delegate its authority as appropriate for efficiency and streamlining of government process to appropriate entities

and to establish a subcommittee that consists of committee members which the committee selects. 2 N.N.C. §§ 186 and 701 (B). The Naabik'íyáti' Committee adopted NABIAP-20-15 establishing the Naabik'íyáti' Síhasin Fund Subcommittee to "recommend to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee and Navajo Nation Council financial support and/or financing plan(s) for the purposes designated in CD-68-14 [Navajo Nation Breach of Trust Settlement Act of 2014, establishing the Síhasin Fund]".

F. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102 (A).

Section Two. Findings

- A. On November 1, 2006, the 20th Navajo Nation Council unanimously passed Resolution No. CN-57-06 authorizing the Navajo Nation Attorney General to file a lawsuit against the United States for the alleged breach of its fiduciary duties to the Nation arising under treaties, executive orders, public laws, statutes, regulations and contracts due to its mismanagement of the Nation's tribal trust assets, including tribal trust funds and select tribal resources, specifically excluding water and assets held in trust for individual Navajo members. Resolution No. CN-57-06 was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on November 13, 2006.
- B. On September 26, 2013, the Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council passed NABIS-42-13 creating a Trust Mismanagement Litigation Task Force ("Task Force"), composed of Council Delegates, from each agency and each standing committee, as well as Presidential appointees, to assist and consult with the Navajo Nation Office of the Attorney General, Department of Justice, outside legal counsel and the Office of the Navajo Nation President & Vice-President in evaluating whether any proposals put forth by the United States to settle the lawsuit, Navajo Nation v. United States, No. 06-945L, (United States Court of Federal Claims) were in the best interests of the Nation.
- C. On May 16, 2014, the United States made a settlement offer that was acceptable to the Nation's Attorney General, outside legal counsel, the Task Force and the Office of the President & Vice-President as being in the best interests of the Navajo Nation and on May 30, 2014, the 22nd Navajo

Nation Council adopted Resolution No. CMY-28-14 accepting a settlement of the Navajo Nation's lawsuit, Navajo Nation v. United States, No. 06-945L, against the United States for its historical mismanagement of the tribe's trust assets and its failure to ensure that the Navajo Nation received all funds due and owed under the United States' trust obligations and fiduciary duties. Resolution No. CMY-28-14 was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on June 4, 2014.

- D. The 22nd Navajo Nation Council recognized that during the many decades that the United States was in breach of its trust obligations and fiduciary duties to the Nation and engaged in the mismanagement of the Nation's tribal trust assets and resources, the tribal government was without sufficient funds to provide basic services and amenities to the Diné of past generations. The tribal government was also without funds to develop an infrastructure within the four sacred mountains that would support the growth and development of opportunities crucial for the prosperity of future generations of Diné. See Resolution No. CMY-28-14.
- E. Between October 6, 2014 and November 8, 2014, the Office of the Speaker held seven (7) Public Hearings, as directed by the Navajo Nation Council's Naabik'iyati' Committee, to receive input from Navajo Nation members on how the net proceeds from Navajo Nation v. United States' should be used. During that same time period, the Office of the President & Vice-President also held five (5) town hall meetings for a similar purpose.
- F. On December 13, 2014, in the best interests of the Nation and consistent with the collective wishes expressed by its members, the 22nd Navajo Nation Council adopted Resolution No. CD-68-14 enacting the Navajo Nation Breach of Trust Settlement Act of 2014 (hereinafter "2014 Act") and establishing the Navajo Nation Síhasin Fund at 12 N.N.C. § 2501 et seq. The President of the Navajo Nation signed Resolution No. CD-68-14 into law on December 31, 2014.
- G. On January 31, 2018, the 23rd Navajo Nation Council adopted Resolution No. CJA-03-18 enacting amendments to CD-68-14 clarifying the intent of the 22rd Navajo Nation Council, including that Sihasin Fund infrastructure projects were not to be limited by 12 N.N.C. § 1310(F) (Navajo Nation Bond Financing Act) or by TCDCJY-77-99 (Capital Improvement Projects Guidelines Policies and Procedures).

Resolution No. CJA-03-18 was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on February 8, 2018.

- The 2014 Act, as amended by CJA-03-18, mandates that the Η. net proceeds and earnings thereon received by the Navajo Nation from the settlement of Navajo Nation v. United States, No. 06-945L, be deposited into the Sihasin Fund and managed and invested to provide financial support and/or financing for (1) the planning and development of economic development and regional infrastructure supporting economic development and community development, including infrastructure as, but not limited to, housing, commercial government buildings, waterlines, solid management development, powerline projects, transportation and communication systems, within the Navajo Nation; and/or education opportunities for members of the Navajo Nation. See 12 N.N.C \S 2501 and \S 2502 (A), as amended.
- I. The 2014 Act, as amended, also established that "leveraging of the [Síhasin] Fund by way of guaranteeing loans, match funding, direct funding in part and other weighted uses of the Fund, including loan financing from the Fund for the purposes in § 2502 (A)(1), shall be favored over direct funding in whole". 12 N.N.C § 2502 (C), as amended.
- J. The 2014 Act further established that with the exception of outstanding and accrued litigation costs, Sihasin Fund Principal and Income shall only be expended pursuant to a Fund Expenditure Plan consistent with the purposes set forth in the 2014 Act, as amended, at 12 N.N.C. §2502 and adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Navajo Nation Council. See 12 N.N.C. § 2505 (A).
- K. On April 9, 2015, the Naabik'íyáti' Committee adopted NABIAP-20-15 establishing the Naabik'íyáti' Síhasin Fund Subcommittee to "recommend to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee and Navajo Nation Council financial support and/or financing plan(s) for the purposes designated in CD-68-14 [Navajo Nation Breach of Trust Settlement Act of 2014, establishing the Síhasin Fund]".
- L. Between April 2015 and March 2018, the Subcommittee, assisted by the Office of Legislative Services, Office of the Speaker, Office of Legislative Counsel and outside legal counsel, met on more than thirty (30) occasions in either work sessions or official meetings to review and evaluate comments and recommendations from the Navajo

People; hear proposals from Navajo Nation entities, Chapters, programs and officials; and develop expenditure plan(s) for the Síhasin Fund Principal and Income consistent with the purposes set forth in the 2014 Act, as amended.

- Μ. After reviewing the comments and recommendations submitted during the Public Hearings and town hall meetings, as well as the reports and comments made during Sihasin Fund Subcommittee meetings, the Subcommittee determined that powerline projects and Chapter capital and economic development projects were a high priority for Navajo communities and that the funding of such projects would afford Navajo communities the opportunity to start and complete local projects currently stalled by the lack of sufficient funds, apply for additional state and federal funds requiring an identified match, as well as support CMY-28-14's intent to expand infrastructure(s) Navajo Nation, spur economic development at the local level and provide amenities to Navajo communities.
- In November of 2017, the Subcommittee issued a directive to Ν. the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council to develop a nationwide powerline projects expenditure plan combining Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance ("UUFB") and Sihasin to total one hundred million (\$100,000,000.00) divided equally amongst the twenty-four Council Delegate Districts equaling \$4,166,666.67 per District. On February 15, 2018, the Navajo Nation Council issued a further directive to the Speaker to have his staff meet with Navajo Nation Council Delegates and the Chapters they represent to develop a nationwide powerline and chapter projects expenditure plan for one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000.00) divided equally amongst the twenty-four Council Delegate Districts with the Sihasin Fund as the intended funding source.
- Ο. Between March 5, 2018 and March 16, 2018, Office of the Speaker staff, contract legal counsel, Captial Projects Management Department ("CPMD") staff, and Navajo Tribal Utilities Authority ("NTUA") staff, met twice with each and their Chapter Council Delegate representatives, including but not limited to Chapter Officials, Chapter Managers and Community Service Coordinators, to review each District's proposed projects for (1) compliance with the 2014 Act's, as amended, purpose of "the planning and development of economic development and regional

infrastructure supporting economic development and community development, including such infrastructure as, but not limited to, housing, commercial and government buildings, waterlines, solid waste management development, powerline projects, transportation and communication systems, within the Navajo Nation"; and (2) readiness status, e.g., project ready, construction ready or shovel ready, as applied by CPMD.

- P. Powerline, economic development and infrastructure projects were proposed at the March meetings including, but not limited to, Head Start facilities, senior and veteran centers, and road improvements. A listing of the proposed projects, including match and contribution funding, is included on attached Exhibits A through E.
- Q. To ensure that Sihasin Funds are not prematurely withdrawn and continue to earn investment earnings for as long as possible, CPMD, with the assistance of the Office of the Speaker and NTUA, compiled the proposed projects into nationwide three-year funding plans, i.e., Chapter Projects, NTUA Powerlines, Non-NTUA Powerlines, and Waterlines, attached as Exhibits A through E, based on individual project readiness status.
- R. On March 23, 2018, contract legal counsel and CPMD updated the Sihasin Subcommittee on the Office of the Speaker's efforts to develop the powerline and Chapter projects expenditure plan, including the identification of almost twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000.00) in already secured project matching funds.
- S. During the update to the Sihasin Subcommittee, the following accountability and implementation measures were discussed:
 - Due to their experience and expertise, as well as economies of scale, the funding and responsibility for implementing Chapter projects and Non-NTUA Powerline projects should be allocated to CPMD with a template in place, e.g., Memorandum of Agreement or other form of grant agreement, for CPMD to transfer the project funds and responsibilities to Local Governance Act Certified Chapters at their request;
 - 2. Due to their experience and expertise, as well as community need to lock-in project pricing, the funding

- and responsibility for NTUA Powerline and waterline projects should be allocated directly to NTUA;
- 3. If the funding for NTUA Powerline and Waterline projects is disbursed directly to NTUA and the funding for Chapter and non-NTUA Powerline projects is disbursed directly to CPMD, the funding for projects at Chapters sanctioned pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 9 should not be subject to § 9 (B)'s ten percent (10%) withholding;
- 4. All of the proposed projects were vetted by CPMD and NTUA, respectively, for project readiness before being apportioned into the three-year plans based on project readiness status; therefore, if the funding for a project is not spent or encumbered within twenty-four (24) months of distribution, the project funds should revert to the Sihasin Fund; and
- 5. To support expeditious administration and implementation of the more than two hundred (200) Chapter projects, CPMD operations should be supplemented with administrative costs.
- T. In addition, during the District meetings with Delegates and their Chapter officials and community representatives to select and vet powerline and Chapter projects, concerns were raised that the President's line-item veto of even a single project would disrupt the equal distribution of funds among the Districts, as well as, negate local choice in project selection and impair Chapter and community efforts to procure additional matching funds from federal and state sources.
- U. The Navajo Nation Council finds that the Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan proposal, attached as Exhibits A through E, meets the purposes of the 2014 Act, as amended, i.e., "the planning and development of economic development and regional infrastructure supporting economic development and community development, including infrastructure as, but not limited to, housing, commercial solid government buildings, waterlines, and management development, powerline projects, transportation and communication systems, within the Navajo Nation"; as well as the leveraging preference criteria of the 2014 Act, as Síhasin Funds will only fund a portion of the overall total cost of the projects with at least \$19,440,279.45, as

set forth on **Exhibits A through E**, of projects' costs covered by other Navajo Nation funds or federal, state or private entities through match funding, joint funding, contribution funding, cost-share funding or similar arrangements and agreements.

- V. The Navajo Nation Council also finds that the proposed Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan proposal, attached as **Exhibits A through E**, supports community choice and addresses CMY-28-14's intent to expand infrastructure(s) on the Navajo Nation, provide economic development at the local level and provide amenities to Navajo communities.
- W. The Navajo Nation Council hereby determines that allocating Sihasin Funds to implement the Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan, as set forth in Exhibits A through E, fits within the priorities established under the July 20, 2015 One Nation, One Voice Navajo Nation Three Branch Agreement and that it is in the best interests of the Navajo Nation, as well as in the best interests of community development, the expansion of infrastructure(s) on the Navajo Nation, economic development at the local level and the provision of amenities to Navajo communities, to adopt the Sihasin Fund Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan, attached as Exhibits A through E.

Section Three. Approval and Adoption of Expenditure Plan

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves and adopts the Sihasin Fund Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan, attached and incorporated herein as **Exhibits A through E**.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves and adopts total funding from the Síhasin Fund in the amount of one hundred million six hundred thousand dollars (\$100,600,000.00) with \$18,696,787.92 allocated to Navajo Tribal Utility Authority ("NTUA") for powerline projects; \$4,242,192.99 allocated to NTUA for waterline projects; \$74,076,413.86 allocated to Captial Projects Management Depart ("CPMD") for Chapter projects; \$3,584,605.24 allocated to CPMD for Non-NTUA powerline projects; as summarized in Exhibit A, to implement the Síhasin Fund Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan as follows:
 - 1. Year 1: The distribution of \$42,294,332.87 of Sihasin Funds in Navajo Nation Fiscal Year 2018 allocated as

follows: \$2,866,370.94 to NTUA for the first year of NTUA Powerline projects, as set forth in **Exhibit B**; \$560,557.00 to NTUA for the first year of Waterline projects, as set forth in **Exhibit E**; \$37,423,205.14 to CPMD for the first year of Chapter projects and administrative costs (\$200,000.00), as set forth in **Exhibit D**; and \$1,444,199.79 to CPMD for the first year of Non-NTUA Powerline projects, as set forth in **Exhibit C**.

- Year 2: The distribution of \$46,203,956.06 of Sihasin Funds in Navajo Nation Fiscal Year 2019 allocated as follows: \$12,154,756.58 to NTUA for the second year of NTUA Powerline projects, as set forth in Exhibit B; \$1,068,666.66 to NTUA for the second year of Waterline projects, as set forth in Exhibit E; \$31,124,968.21 to CPMD for the second year of Chapter projects and administrative costs (\$200,000.00), as set forth in Exhibit D; and \$1,855,564.61 to CPMD for the second year of Non-NTUA Powerline projects, as set forth in Exhibit C.
- 3. Year 3: The distribution of \$12,101,711.08 of Sihasin Funds in Navajo Nation Fiscal Year 2020 allocated as follows: \$3,675,660.40 to NTUA for the third year of NTUA Powerline projects, as set forth in Exhibit B; \$2,612,969.33 to NTUA for the third year of Waterline projects, as set forth in Exhibit E; \$5,528,240.51 to CPMD for the third year of Chapter projects and administrative costs (\$200,000.00), as set forth in Exhibit D; and \$284,840.84 to CPMD for the third year of Non-NTUA Powerline projects, as set forth in Exhibit C.
- C. The Sihasin Funds allocated for the Sihasin Fund Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan may be further leveraged by the Navajo Nation through bond or loan financing pursuant to the Navajo Nation Bond Financing Act, 12 N.N.C. § 1300 et seq., as amended, using Sihasin Fund Earnings for repayment and financing costs upon the recommendation of the Budget & Finance Committee and approval by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Navajo Nation Council.

Section Four. Approval and Adoption of Expenditure Plan Administration

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves administration of the Síhasin Fund Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan as follows:
 - 1. The Navajo Nation Controller shall determine whether the source(s) of the annual distributions of the \$100,600,000.00 will be Síhasin Fund Principal or Income or a combination of both;
 - 2. NTUA Powerline and Waterline Projects. The annual distributions for NTUA Powerline and Waterline Projects, as set forth in Exhibits B and E, shall be released to NTUA through Grant Agreement(s), executed pursuant to 2 N.N.C. \$164 (B), as amended, as follows:
 - a. The First Year (Fiscal Year 2018) distributions shall be released to NTUA by no later than the end of Navajo Nation Fiscal Year 2018;
 - b. The Second and Third Year (Fiscal Years 2019 and 2020) distributions shall be released to NTUA by no later than the end of the first quarter of the respective Navajo Nation Fiscal Year;
 - c. NTUA shall not require the Navajo Nation, including its Chapters, nor Navajo individuals, to contribute more funding to complete any project listed in Exhibits B and E, regardless of year funded;
 - d. Any individual Powerline or Waterline project funds that are not spent or encumbered within twenty-four (24) months of distribution to NTUA shall be returned to the Sihasin Fund; and
 - e. NTUA shall account for the Sihasin Funds spent and such accounting or expenditure report, including project status, shall be submitted to CPMD, the Office of President & Vice-President, and the Resources and Development Committee on a quarterly basis.
 - 3. Chapter and Non-NTUA Powerline Projects. The annual distributions for Chapter and Non-NTUA Powerline Projects, as set forth in Exhibits C and D, shall be released to CPMD as follows:

- a. The First Year (Fiscal Year 2018) distributions, including administration costs, shall be released to CPMD by no later than the end of the third quarter of Navajo Nation Fiscal Year 2018;
- b. The Second and Third Year (Fiscal Years 2019 and 2020) distributions, including administration costs, shall be released to CPMD by the end of the first quarter of the respective Navajo Nation Fiscal Year;
- c. Annual distributions to CPMD for administration costs shall not lapse on an annual basis pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §820 (N) or otherwise be returned to or deposited in the Sihasin Fund principal or Navajo Nation General Fund until such time as all Chapter Projects listed on Exhibit C are fully completed;
- d. 12 N.N.C. § 9 (B) is hereby waived and individual Chapter and non-NTUA Powerline Projects implemented and administered by CPMD shall not be subject to 12 N.N.C. § 9 (B)'s ten percent (10%) withholding;
- e. Individual Chapter and non-NTUA Powerline Projects shall be implemented and administered by CPMD consistent with the Navajo Nation Budget Instruction Manual, as amended, unless inconsistent with other provisions of this resolution;
- f. If requested, CPMD may transfer individual Chapter Project funds, accountability, and responsibility to a Local Governance Act ("LGA") Certified Chapter pursuant to a Memorandum of Agreement or other form of grant agreement executed pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (B), as amended;
- g. Any individual Chapter or non-NTUA Powerline Project funds that are not spent or encumbered within twenty-four (24) months of distribution to CPMD or transfer to a LGA Certified Chapter shall be returned to the Sihasin Fund;

- h. With the exception of project funds and responsibilities transferred to LGA Certified Chapters, CPMD shall account for the Síhasin Funds spent and such accounting or expenditure report shall be included as part of the Executive Branch's quarterly program report submitted to the Resources and Development Committee; and
- i. LGA Certified Chapters that have been granted Sihasin Fund project funds and responsibilities, shall account for the money spent and such accounting or expenditure report, including project status, shall be submitted to CPMD, the Office of President & Vice-President, and the Resources and Development Committee on a quarterly basis.
- В. NTUA, CPMD and LGA Certified Chapters shall have the authority to enter into match, funding, partnership, cooperative and other cost saving or cost sharing arrangements or leveraging agreements with Navajo Nation entities and enterprises, Navajo Nation Chapters and other political subdivisions, other Navajo Nation programs and federal and state agencies and such agreements shall not be deemed procurement contracts subject to the Navajo Nation Procurement Act, 12 N.N.C. §§ 301 - 371 or Navajo Business Opportunity Act 5 N.N.C. §§ 201 - 215.
 - Notwithstanding the above, all Chapters, working in conjunction with NTUA and/or CPMD, shall have the continuing responsibility to identify ways to further leverage the allocated Sihasin Funds;
 - 2. NTUA and CPMD shall each present an annual leveraging report to the Resource & Development Committee and Budget & Finance Committee during the first quarter of each Navajo Nation Fiscal Year identifying the efforts and success of Chapter(s) in securing additional matching or contribution funding; and
 - 3. With the approval of the Resources & Development Committee, any project costs saved or reduced through leveraging or otherwise shall be available for expenditure on any other project within the respective Chapter deemed construction-ready by CPMD; if there are no construction-ready projects within the respective Chapter, then, with the approval of the

Resources & Development Committee, the saved or reduced costs shall be available for expenditure on any other project within the respective District.

- C. A chapter project, powerline, or waterline project may be changed, including the year funded, or added to Exhibits A through E with the concurrence of the Delegate representing the chapter's Council District and the approvals of the Resources and Development Committee and Budget and Finance Committee, as long as such project has been certified as construction-ready by CPMD or NTUA and the total Sihasin Funding for the District does not exceed \$4,166,666.67.
- D. NTUA, CPMD and LGA Certified Chapters shall report the status of the Sihasin Funds allocated or transferred to them to implement the Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan, specifically including the use and status of the Sihasin Funds and the status of projects for which they are responsible, to the Resources & Development, Budget & Finance and Naabik'íyáti' Committees and Office of the President & Vice-President on a quarterly basis.

Section Five. Waiving Navajo Nation Code Provisions Regarding the Capital Budget and Capital Improvement Process Effective Date

Notwithstanding that Sihasin Fund projects are specifically not subject to the Capital Improvement Projects Guidelines Policies and Procedures set forth by TCDCJY-77-99, the Navajo Nation hereby waives the application of 12 N.N.C. \$ 810 (F), \$\$ 820 (I) and (M) and \$ 860 (C) regarding the Capital Budget and Improvement processes to the Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan.

Section Six. Effective Date

The Sihasin Fund Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan, as set forth above, shall become effective pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 2505.

Section Seven. Directives

A. All Navajo Nation programs, specifically including, but not limited to, the Office of Controller, Office of Management & Budget, CPMD, and Chapters, as well as NTUA, shall take all steps necessary to expeditiously implement the Sihasin Fund Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan.

- All Navajo Nation programs, as well as NTUA, named in this В. legislation shall be held accountable for the progress of tasks under their responsibility and control and shall participate in work group meetings, if any, necessary to expeditiously implement the Sihasin Fund Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan.
- C. Office of Legislative Services will adjust all figures throughout the legislation and exhibits to reflect amendment totals, with the concurrence of the sponsor. The Navajo Nation directs the Office of Legislative Services to recalculate the final monetary totals such that the figures conform to the amendments passed by the Navajo Nation.

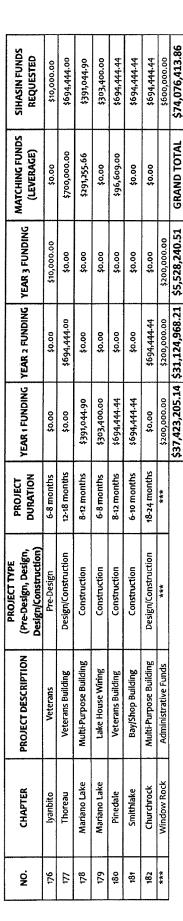
