RESOLUTION OF THE LAW AND ORDER COMMITTEE 23RD NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - Third Year, 2017

AN ACTION

RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER COMMITTEE; DIRECTING THE NAVAJO NATION DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE TO COMPLETE THE MODIFICATION OF THE CONSENT DECREE WITHIN THIRTY (30) DAYS

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE: AUTHORITY

A. The Law and Order Committee (LOC) of the Navajo Nation Council, has legislative oversight over law enforcement and emergency management, to enhance the operations and coordination of all departments within the Navajo Division of Public Safety in order to increase the availability, quality and effectiveness of public safety services on the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 600(C).

SECTION TWO: FINDINGS

- A. "The Consent Decree addresses concerns about numerous jail conditions such as jail closures, jail overcrowding, fire safety, health care, nutrition, sanitation, and physical facilities." See Memorandum from Department of Justice, May 30, 2017.
- B. On April 10, 2017, the Law and Order heard a report from the Department of Justice regarding the status on the modification of the consent decree, the Department of Justice at that time indicated the revision could take up to thirty (30) days.
- C. On May 30, 2017, a memorandum was issued by the Department of Justice indicating the Status if Modification of 1992 Consent Decree along with estimates on the modification filed with the Navajo Nation District Court.
- D. The Consent Decree modification is a high priority for the Law and Order Committee to protect the rights and interest of the Navajo People but to also enable the Navajo Nation to

more effectively provide efficient public safety services on the Navajo Nation.

E. The Navajo Nation hereby finds it is in the best interest to direct the Navajo Nation Department of Justice to complete the modification of the Consent Decree within thirty (30) days.

SECTION THREE: DIRECTIVE

The Navajo Nation Law and Order Committee hereby direct the Navajo Nation Department of Justice to complete the modification of the Consent Decree within thirty (30) days.
