PURPOSE OF THIS LEGISLATION: to allocate \$540,528 from the UUFB to Rehoboth Christian School to pay for student transportation costs, a Navajo language teacher, summer school opportunities, new furniture in the Special Ed classroom, and new HVAC/air conditioning in the Elementary School.



RELATING TO THE HEALTH, EDUCATION, AND HUMAN SERVICES,
BUDGET AND FINANCE, AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES, AND
TO THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING \$540,528 IN
SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED
FUND BALANCE TO REHOBOTH CHRISTIAN SCHOOL TO FUND
STUDENT TRANSPORTATION COSTS, A NAVAJO LANGUAGE TEACHER
POSITION, SUMMER SCHOOL EXPENSES, AND OTHER NEEDS

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

A. The Navajo Nation established the Health, Education, and Human Services Committee (“HEHSC”) as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee, and as such gave HEHSC the authority to oversee the education initiatives of the Navajo Nation by promoting academic excellence and culturally relevant education. 2 N.N.C. §401(C)(2).

B. The Navajo Nation established the Budget and Finance Committee (“BFC”) as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee, and as such empowered BFC to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. §300(A), and §301(B)(2).

C. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation

1 standing committee, and proposed legislation requiring final action by the Navajo Nation
2 Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(9) and
3 §700(A).

4 D. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation, with the authority
5 to approve supplemental appropriations. 2 N.N.C. §102(A), 12 N.N.C. §820(L).

6 E. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §820(L): "[t]he Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve
7 supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year.
8 Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted,
9 if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue
10 projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at
11 §820(J)."

12 F. The Title 12 Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:

13 1. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to
14 the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for budget impact analysis. 12 N.N.C.
15 §820(M).

16 2. When the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the
17 initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be approved by
18 the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. §820(L).

19 3. Supplemental Appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for
20 non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at §820(F). The Controller of the
21 Navajo Nation shall be responsible for the designation of recurring and non-recurring
22 revenues. 12 N.N.C. §820(L).

23 4. The Navajo Nation Code provides: "[t]he Nation shall restrict non-recurring revenues
24 to budget non-recurring expenditures. In addition, non-recurring revenues will be
25 budgeted only after an examination by the Controller to determine whether or not the
26 revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between recurring revenues and expenditures,
27 and expenditures may be authorized only if a long-term (three-five year) forecast shows
28 that the operating deficit will not continue. Otherwise, non-recurring revenues will be
29 added to the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund balance. This provision may be amended
30 or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full Navajo Nation Council." 12 N.N.C. §820(F).

1 **SECTION TWO. FINDINGS**

2 A. The Rehoboth Christian School (“RCS”) has submitted a letter, dated October 5, 2021,
3 attached as **EXHIBIT A**. RCS is seeking supplemental funding from the Unreserved,
4 Undesignated Fund Balance (“UUFb”) to provide education to its students and to meet
5 other needs of RCS. According to this letter, 75% of RCS students are Native American,
6 and most of these students are enrolled Navajo Nation members.

7 B. RCS’ supplemental funding proposal in the amount of \$540,528, along with budget forms
8 and related documents, including Appendix K “Supplemental Funding Proposal
9 Summary,” are attached as **EXHIBIT B**. RCS’ required grant application is attached as
10 **EXHIBIT C**.

11 C. Regarding this UUFb funding request, the Controller may be asked to satisfy the
12 requirements of 12 N.N.C. §820(L) by memorandum, or telephonically or in person when
13 this matter is heard by the Navajo Nation Council.

14 D. Regarding this UUFb funding request, the OMB may be asked to provide the budget
15 impact statement required by 12 N.N.C. §820(M) by memorandum, or telephonically or in
16 person when this matter is heard by the Navajo Nation Council.

17 E. The Bahastl’ah Chapter through Resolution BAH-21-04-29-015, attached as **EXHIBIT D**,
18 supports RCS’ request for this funding.

19
20 **SECTION THREE. APPROVING AN ALLOCATION OF \$540,528 FROM THE**
21 **UUFb TO REHOBOTH CHRISTIAN SCHOOL**

22 A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves \$540,528 in supplemental funding out of the
23 Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to the Rehoboth Christian School, as requested
24 in **EXHIBIT B** and for the purposes explained in **EXHIBIT A**.

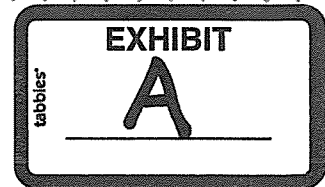
25 B. This supplemental appropriation of \$540,528 shall be from that amount of funds that
26 exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance, as
27 determined by the Office of the Controller.

28
29 **SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE**

30 This Act shall become effective as provided in 2 N.N.C. §221(B) and 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(17).

1 **SECTION FIVE. SAVING CLAUSE**

2 If any provision of this Act is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court or a
3 District Court of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the
4 remainder of this Act shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

Dear Honorable Speaker Seth Damon and Council Delegates of the 24th Navajo Nation Council,

Rehoboth Christian School is submitting a request for funding from the Navajo Nation's Unreserved, Undesignated Balance to support a school whose population is 75% Native American and who come from a 3,000 square mile area. Most of our indigenous students are enrolled in the Navajo Nation. Rehoboth families represent over 50 chapters. Rehoboth seeks these funds for the following purposes:

- a. Assistance with transportation costs with bus routes that serve the communities of Fort Defiance, Crownpoint and Houck.
- b. Assistance for resources to effectively teach the Navajo language through the K-12 curriculum.
- c. Assistance for summer school opportunities to help address the learning loss due to COVID.
- d. Assistance in furnishing a new Special Education classroom as the school tries to more effectively meet the needs of all learners.
- e. Assistance in providing air conditioning to the elementary school to provide for a better learning environment and safer environment so windows do not have to be open.

On behalf of all of the parents and students of Rehoboth Christian School, I extend my sincerest gratitude and appreciation for your consideration and for your commitment to education for students of the Navajo Nation.


PART II. REASON FOR REQUEST AND STATEMENT OF NEED:


Rehoboth Christian School has been providing education to the four corners region since 1903. Today, 75% of Rehoboth's 430 students are Native American and most of those individuals are enrolled in the Navajo Nation. Rehoboth has valued the support of its efforts to provide a quality Christian education to students from many chapters and communities by providing transportation and a rich educational experience for all students. This education includes Navajo language, summer school experiences and special education opportunities which all are dependent on financial resources. An additional need for HVAC in the Elementary School is increasingly clear since we experience more and more hot days during instructional times. In addition, unfortunately, we live during a time when open windows and doors for ventilation are exactly what you want to avoid when it comes to school safety concerns. Rehoboth seeks to raise support through donors from around the country who truly love the students and families of our community. While we are blessed to have contributions from our constituents, it is powerful to see that the school is supported locally through alumni, individual donors, businesses and through local government support. Our hope is that the Navajo Nation will once again join others in moving Rehoboth forward by providing financial assistance to help Rehoboth fulfill its purpose by providing a life changing and excellent education for students of the Navajo Nation and the four corners region. Our greatest joy is to see a high percentage of our students go to college or join the military or attend trade school but eventually return and serve their community. We appreciate the Navajo Nation's commitment to education as evidenced through the many ODY and Chief Manuelito Scholarships awarded to Rehoboth students.

PART III. LIST ALTERNATIVE FUNDING SOURCES BEING PURSUED AND CONTINGENCY PLAN IF REQUEST IS NOT FUNDED:

Without additional funding, our ability to expand our Navajo Language Curriculum, offer summer school, remodel and furnish a Special Education classroom or provide a more comfortable and safe elementary school will need to be put on hold. We do share these needs with donors and we apply for grants which sometimes help with such specific needs. We have been fortunate to receive support from McKinley County and from the State of New Mexico through the EANS grant. (Emergency Assistance to Non Public Schools). However, each grant has its restrictions in terms of how that money might be allocated. We wait patiently for the right fit. Thank you for considering our request.



Description of Work

Elementary School to Mid School HVAC power project.

This estimate is to install conduit and wiring to power-up two large air conditioners with sanitizer functions, which are to be installed, and also to tie the Elementary power into the Mid-School, for the purpose of having 3-phase power for the A/C units. These A/C units will not pull more than 30 Amps 3-Phase with less than 60 amp disconnects.

- 1) Install two main feeders to the East end of the school to the old panel locations.

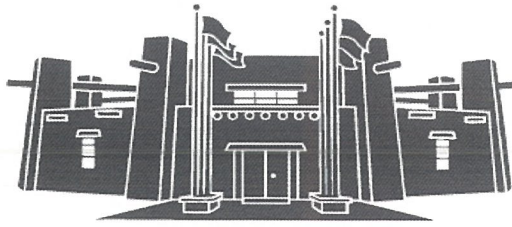


