**PURPOSE:** This resolution, if adopted, would accept Grant No. 2020-Vd-Bx-0632 for project entitled Navajo Nation Coronavirus Emergency Response in the amount of \$486,348.00 from the Office of Justice Programs, U.S. Department of Justice for the period January 20, 2020 to January 31, 2022.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

23	A. The Law and Order Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation	
24	Council. 2 N.N.C. § 600(A). Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 601 (C)(1), the committee serves as	
25	oversight for the Navajo Nation Division of Public Safety.	
26	B. The Budget and Finance Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation	
27	Council. It has the authority to "authorize, review, approve and accept agreements,	
28	including contracts and grants, between the Navajo Nation and any federal, state or regional	
29	authority upon the recommendation of the standing committee which has oversight of the

C. The Navajo Nation has a government-to-government relationship with the federal government. *Treaty of 1868*.

#### **SECTION TWO. FINDINGS**


- A. The Navajo Nation Division of Public Safety, under project entitled "Navajo nation Coronavirus Emergency Response" and pursuant to pursuant to the Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding Program, Public Law 116-136 submitted a grant request to the Office of Justice Program, U.S. Department of Justice. On May 20, 2020, the Office of Justice Program approved the request and authorized an award in the amount of \$486,348.00. See attached **Exhibit A**, award notice and conditions of the award.
- B. The Navajo Nation Department of Justice reviewed the award and related documents, and determined such documents to be legally sufficient. See attached **Exhibit B**.
- C. On August 21, 2020, Navajo Nation President Jonathan Nez signed the grant as awarded.
- D. It is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation that the grant award provided to the Navajo Nation in the amount of \$486,348.00 by the Office of Justice Program, U.S. Department of Justice.

#### SECTION THREE. ACCEPTING AND APPROVING GRANT AWARD

The Navajo Nation hereby accepts and approves grant no. 2020-VD-BX-0632 for project entitled "Navajo Nation Coronavirus Emergency Response" in the amount of \$486,348.00 from the Office of Justice Programs, U.S. Department of Justice for the period January 20, 2020 to January 31, 2022. On behalf of Attorney General William P. Barr, it is my pleasure to inform you that the Office of Justice Programs (OJP), U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), has approved the application by Navajo Nation Tribal Government for an award under the OJP funding opportunity entitled "BJA FY 20 Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding Program." The approved award amount is \$486,348. These funds are for the project entitled Navajo Nation Coronavirus Emergency Response.

Congratulations on your recent award. The Office for Civil Rights (OCR), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) has been delegated the responsibility for ensuring that recipients of federal financial assistance from the OJP, the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS), and the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) are not engaged in discrimination prohibited by law. Several federal civil rights laws, such as Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, require recipients of federal financial assistance to give assurances that they will comply with those laws. Successful completion of such a training on or after January 1, 2018, will satisfy this condition.

In the event that either the POC or an FPOC for this award changes during the period of performance, the new POC or FPOC must have successfully completed an "OJP financial management and grant administration training" by 120 calendar days after -- (1) the date of OJP's approval of the "Change Grantee Contact" GAN (in the case of a new POC), or (2) the date the POC enters information on the new FPOC in GMS (in the case of a new FPOC). Successful completion of such a training on or after January 1, 2018, will satisfy this condition.

The recipient should anticipate that OJP will immediately withhold ("freeze") award funds if the recipient fails to comply with this condition. The recipient's failure to comply also may lead OJP to impose additional appropriate conditions on this award.

6. Requirements related to "de minimis" indirect cost rate

A recipient that is eligible under the Part 200 Uniform Requirements and other applicable law to use the "de minimis" indirect cost rate described in 2 C.F.R. 200.414(f), and that elects to use the "de minimis" indirect cost rate, must advise OJP in writing of both its eligibility and its election, and must comply with all associated requirements in the Part 200 Uniform Requirements. If so, the recipient must promptly notify the DOJ awarding agency (OJP or OVW, as appropriate) in writing of the potential duplication, and, if so requested by the DOJ awarding agency, must seek a budget-modification or change-of-project-scope grant adjustment notice (GAN) to eliminate any inappropriate duplication of funding.

B. Employment eligibility confirmation with E-Verify

For purposes of satisfying the requirement of this condition regarding verification of employment eligibility, the recipient (or any subrecipient) may choose to participate in, and use, E-Verify (www.e-verify.gov), provided an appropriate person authorized to act on behalf of the recipient (or subrecipient) uses E-Verify (and follows the proper E-Verify procedures, including in the event of a "Tentative Nonconfirmation" or a "Final Nonconfirmation") to confirm employment eligibility for each hiring for a position in the United States that is or will be funded (in whole or in part) with award funds.

42. Authorization to obligate (federal) award funds to reimburse certain project costs incurred on or after January 20, 2020






