FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE
AMOUNT OF THREE MILLION DOLLARS (\$3,000,000) FOR THE 110 NAVAJO NATION
CHAPTER'S SUMMER YOUTH EMPLOYMENT

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation established the Budget and Finance Committee (BFC) as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered BFC to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 300 (A), 301 (B)(2).
- B. The Navajo Nation established the Resources and Development Committee (RDC) as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such gave RDC oversight over Navajo Nation Chapters. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 500 (A), 501 (C)(1).
- C. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation standing committee and as such proposed legislation that requires final

1 action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti'
2 Committee. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 700 (A).

4 **SECTION 2. FINDINGS**

5 A. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:

- 6 1. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M), all requests for annual operating funds and
7 supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget
8 (“OMB”) for budget impact analysis. A preview of the appropriation
9 legislation is available to the OMB for their budget impact analysis response.
10 The OMB review for this legislation has not yet been completed and must be
11 provided prior to the approval of this legislation.
- 12 2. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), when the Controller identifies additional
13 sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections,
14 supplemental appropriations may be allocated by the Navajo Nation Council.
15 The Office of the Controller has provided a Report that as of April 10, 2019 the
16 update balance in the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance is
17 \$42,334,700.00. This report is attached as Exhibit B.

18 B. “Diné Customary Law declares and teaches that: [i]t is the right and freedom of
19 the people that our children are provided with education to absorb wisdom, self-
20 knowledge, and knowledge to empower them to make a living and participate in
21 the growth of the Navajo Nation.” 1 N.N.C. § 204 (F).

22 C. One way for the Navajo Nation to honor Diné Customary Law is to assist high
23 school and college students with temporary employment.

24 D. The Summer Youth Employment program offers high school and college
25 students the opportunity to gain work experience during their summer breaks.

26 E. The Summer Youth Employment program offers high school and college
27 students the opportunity to earn funds to pay for some of their school expenses.

28 F. The Summer Youth Employment program aligns with Diné Customary Law by
29 providing Navajo Nation children with “education to absorb wisdom, self-
30

1 knowledge, and knowledge to empower them to make a living and participate in
2 the growth of the Navajo Nation.” 1 N.N.C. § 204 (F).

- 3 G. The supplemental funding to the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters shall be allocated
4 as follows: “fifty percent (50%) of the appropriation shall be divided equally
5 among all chapters and the remaining fifty percent (50%) shall be divided
6 proportionately among the chapters using a percentage equal to that figure which
7 the number of registered voters in each chapter bears to the whole of registered
8 Navajo Nation votes as determined by the most current voter registration figures
9 available as of the date of the appropriation.” 12 N.N.C. § 820(O).
- 10 H. The supplemental funding will be deposited with each of the 110 Navajo Nation
11 Chapters per the Budget Forms. These forms are attached as Exhibit A.
- 12 I. The Navajo Nation hereby finds it is in the best interest of the Navajo People to
13 approve this supplemental funding request.

15 **SECTION 3. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE**
16 **UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF**
17 **\$3,000,000 FOR 110 NAVAJO NATION CHAPTERS, BUSINESS UNIT**
18 **NUMBERS 108014-108123**

- 19 A. This supplemental appropriation of \$3,000,000 shall be from that amount of
20 funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated
21 Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller and to the 110
22 Navajo Nation Chapters, Business Unit Numbers 108014-108123.
- 23 B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves supplemental funding from the Unreserved,
24 Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of \$3,000,000 for the 110 Navajo
25 Nation Chapters, Business Unit Numbers 108014-108123, to fund the Summer
26 Youth Employment program.
- 27 C. The supplemental funding will be deposited with each of the 110 Navajo Nation
28 Chapters using the 50/50 formula as described in 12 N.N.C. § 820(O), per
29 Exhibit A.

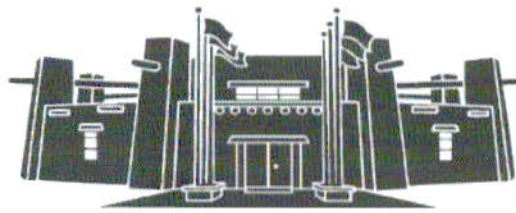

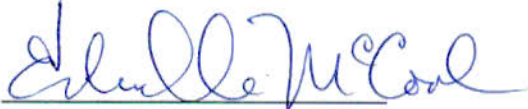

2. The One Hundred and Ten (110) Navajo Nation chapters cannot afford to be inactive for any extended period of time due to existing need, responsibilities, expectation of the constituency
3. The One Hundred and Ten (110) chapters contend it is in the best interest of the Navajo people to prevent interruption of governmental service at the local level, and seek reasonable concessions and compromise from the central government; and
4. The result of this decrease would be even fewer meetings that the chapter officials can convene and would affect the business that the chapter membership can conduct in Fiscal Year 2019.
5. This would disrupt progress at the chapter on approving any new or old businesses that requires chapter officials participation and approvals

SUBJECT: Review of Legislation No. 0121-19 Proposed Supplemental Funding from the UUFB in the amount of \$3,000,000 for Summer Youth Employment to 110 Navajo Nation Chapters

Pursuant to 12 NNC 820 (M), OMB reviewed the subject legislation and provides the following information:

1. The Office of the Auditor General has submitted Report No. 19-11, dated March 2019, stating that the Chapters summer Youth Employment Fund has an available balance of \$1.1 Million as of September 30, 2018. Attached is the Exhibit B that shows all the Chapters Summer Youth Employment available balance. The true and actual balance as of April, 2019, by Office of Auditor General or Division of Community Development, should be considered before any action is taken.
2. Summer Youth Employment is the responsibility of the Department of Dine Education (DODE) Office of Dine Youth by Plan of Operation and Title 2. DODE/ODY currently has a similar proposal under review for \$1.3 million. To avoid duplication and redundancy, perhaps the two (2) budget proposals could be merged or consolidated.
3. The FY 2018 Summer Youth employment resolution (CMY-51-18) budgeted \$2 million to serve 6,600 youth individuals (60 x 110), yet this new proposal for \$3 million would serve 5,500 youth (50 x 110). Why is it more costly when less youth would be served?
4. The legislation on page one (1) indicates it will go to Budget and Finance Committee first then Resource and Development Committee. It seems this should be reversed. DOJ or Legislative Service should review this.
5. OMB advises the Branch Chiefs to prioritize all supplemental funding proposals pursuant to the FY 2019 Budget Resolution CS-68-18 (paragraph 'M'), the FY 2019 Budget Instructions Manual (Section XIV), and the Appropriations Act. This activity should be completed by the three branches to determine priorities. Priorities should be considered first for funding.

3. On page 3, line 30, insert a new Section 4 and new language as follows:
SECTION FOUR. WAIVING §§ 820(F) AND (L) REGARDING THE RESTRICTION OF APPROPRIATIONS OF NON-RECURRING REVENUES TO RECURRING COSTS
The Navajo Nation Council hereby waives 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(F) AND (L) with regard to the restriction of appropriations of non-recurring revenues to recurring costs.
4. Renumber or re-letter succeeding paragraphs or sections accordingly, if necessary; and this amendment shall supersede inconsistent language contained in any other committee amendment, which shall be conformed to the intent or language of this amendment. The Office of Legislative Services, with notice to the sponsor(s) of the Legislation, is hereby authorized to make necessary grammatical changes.
