AN ACTION

RELATING TO NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL,
CONFIRMING THE NAVAJO NATION PRESIDENT'S APPOINTMENT OF JACKSON
BROSSY, AS NAVAJO NATION WASHINGTON OFFICE DIRECTOR

BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Findings

- A. The Navajo Nation President appoints a person as the Navajo Nation Washington Office Director. 2 N.N.C. § 1152(B).
- B. The appointed Navajo Nation Washington Office Director serves at the Navajo Nation President's pleasure. *Id.*
- C. The Navajo Nation Council gave the Naabik'íyáti' Committee legislative oversight over the Navajo Nation Washington Office. 2 N.N.C. §§ 1154 and 701(A)(2) *see also* CJA-03-13, 22nd Navajo Nation Council, sect. 5, 30 (2013).
- D. The Navajo Nation Council confirms the Navajo Nation President's appointment to the Navajo Nation Washington Office Director position. 2 N.N.C. §1152(B).
- E. The Navajo Nation Washington Office Director's duties, responsibilities and authority are found at 2 N.N.C. § 1153.

Section Two. Appointment of the Navajo Nation Washington
Office's Director

The Navajo Nation President appoints Jackson Brossy as the Navajo Nation Washington Office's Director. Mr. Brossy's appointment letter and resume are attached as EXHIBIT A.

Section Three. Confirmation of the Navajo Nation Washington Office's Director

The Navajo Nation Council confirms the Navajo Nation President's appointment of Jackson Brossy as the Navajo Nation Washington Office's Director.




