**PURPOSE:** The purpose of this resolution, if passed, is to rescind CD-85-18, regarding the expenditure of the permanent fund income pursuant to the Permanent Income Five Year Expenditure Plan for Fort Defiance Agency from three economic development projects to one economic development project, the Indian Wells Economic Development Project. By rescinding CD-85-18, to fully restore the \$3,700,000 funding, allocated through CAP-19-16, to the Indian Wells Economic Development, the Fort Defiance Agency's Fourth Year Project.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

- A. The Navajo Nation Council passed and the Navajo Nation President signed into law CAP-19-16, the Navajo Nation Permanent Fund Income Five Year Expenditure Plan. See CAP-19-16.
- B. In CAP-19-16 the Navajo Nation approved use of the Permanent Fund Income for major waterline projects throughout the Navajo Nation and economic development projects in regional centers across the Navajo Nation; including the Fourth Year economic development project for Indian Wells Economic Development Project totaling \$3,700,000. CAP-19-16, Exhibit A attached as Exhibit 2.
- C. The Navajo Nation Council amended CAP-19-16 by enacting CD-85-18 which is attached as Exhibit 1. Resolution CD-85-18 amended the Fort Defiance Agency economic development project from one project—the Indian Wells Economic Development funded at \$3,700,000—to three economic development projects—the Indian Wells Economic Development project at \$1,500,000, Greasewood Springs Economic Development Convenience Store at \$1,500,000, and Little Colorado River Corporation Economic Development at \$700,000; a total of \$3,700,000.
- D. The Indian Wells Chapter through its resolution IWC-19-150, attached as Exhibit 3, "supports and approves a request for the 24<sup>th</sup> Navajo Nation Council to Rescind the 23<sup>rd</sup> Navajo Nation Council Resolution CD-85-18 restoring an original funding amount of \$3,700,000 to the Indian Wells 10 Acre Commercial Site Project."

## Section Three. Rescinding CD-85-18

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby rescinds CD-85-18, Exhibit 1, regarding the expenditure of the permanent fund income pursuant to the Permanent Income Five Year Expenditure Plan for Fort Defiance Agency from three economic development projects to one economic development project, the Indian Wells Economic Development Project.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby rescinds CD-85-18 to fully restore the \$3,700,000 funding, allocated through CAP-19-16, to the Indian Wells Economic Development, the Fort Defiance Agency's Fourth Year Project.

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## Section Four. Directing OMB and OOC

The Office of Management and Budget and the Office of the Controller are hereby directed to implement the intent and purpose of this resolution.

### AN ACTION

RELATING TO BUDGET AND FINANCE AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES, AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING THE NAVAJO NATION PERMANENT FUND INCOME FIVE YEAR EXPENDITURE PLAN, CAP-19-16, REGARDING FOURTH YEAR FUNDING FOR FORT DEFIANCE AGENCY PROJECTS

BE IT ENACTED.

## SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation, pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 102 (A).
- B. The Naabik'iyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9), reviews proposed legislation which requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council.
- C. The Budget and Finance Committee is empowered to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the budgeting, appropriation, investment, and management of all funds.
  N.N.C. § 300(B)(2).
- D. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 300(C)(3), the Budget and Finance Committee of the Navajo Nation Council shall exercise oversight authority including, but not limited to, budget, finance, investment, bonds, contracting, insurance, audits, accounting, taxes, loans, chapter budget and finance for the purpose of recommending to the Navajo Nation Council the adoption of resolution designed to strengthen the fiscal and financial position of the Navajo Nation and to promote the efficient use of the fiscal and financial resources of the Navajo Nation.

## SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Navajo Nation Council passed, and the Navajo Nation President signed, into law CAP-19-16, the Navajo Nation Permanent Fund Income Five Year Expenditure Plan. See CAP-19-16.
- B. As stated in CAP-19-16, the Navajo Nation Permanent Fund sets out the procedures for expenditure of fund income by stating "[no Fund income shall be expended, except as set forth in §§

908 and 909 of this Chapter, for a period of 20 years from date of the first Navajo Nation contribution to the Fund. Thereafter, ninety-five percent (95%) of the Fund income may be expended in accordance with a plan for its use covering at least a five-year period adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council provided that the expenditure of income in any fiscal year shall not exceed the income earned during that year. The remaining five percent (5%) of the Fund income shall be reinvested in the Permanent Fund." 12 N.N.C. \$905.

- C. In CAP-19-16 the Navajo Nation contemplated the use of the Permanent Fund Income for major waterline projects throughout the Navajo Nation and economic development projects in regional centers across the Navajo Nation; including the Fourth Year economic development projects for Indian Wells totaling \$3,700,000. See CAP-19-16, Exhibit A.
- D. The Fort Defiance Agency proposes amending CAP-19-16, Exhibit A, of a single project plan to three economic development projects which include the Indian Wells Economic Development at \$1,000,000, Greasewood Springs Economic Development Convenience Store at \$1,500,000, and Little Colorado River Corporation Economic Development at \$1,200,000; a total of \$3,700,000. See preliminary project descriptions attached as Exhibits B, C and D, respectively.

## SECTION THREE. APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO CAP-19-16

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby amends CAP-19-16, **Exhibit A**, regarding the expenditure of the permanent fund income pursuant to the Permanent Income Five Year Expenditure Plan for Fort Defiance Agency; from a single economic development project to three economic development projects.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby amends CAP-19-16 to include, for Fort Defiance Agency's Fourth Year Projects as:
  - Indian Wells Economic Development at \$1,000,000; Exhibit B,
  - Greasewood Springs Economic Development Convenience Store at \$1,500,000, Exhibit C, and,
  - Little Colorado River Corporation Economic Development at \$1,200,000. Exhibit D.





## Indian Wells Commercial Site Development

In 2005, the Indian Wells Community withdrew 25 acres of land for commercial development. Of the 25 acres, the Division of Economic Development, Small Business Development Department, is currently working on developing infrastructure for 10 of the 25 acres.

The 10 acres infrastructure project consists of the following:

- 1. Clearing, grubbing and grading of the site, which is currently raw land.
- 2. Construction of two access roads to the project site, earthwork only.
- 3. Drainage works.
- 4. Installation of a watermain to the project site.
- 5. Installation of an on-site sewer disposal system. The sewer system includes 8 inch gravity sewermains; manholes; distribution boxes; and a drainfield.

The Infrastructure Engineering Design/Construction Documents for the 10 acres was completed by the project consultant, iina' ba', inc. The costs of the engineering work totaled \$89,867.50, which was funded by DED.

The infrastructure work was publicly advertised in order to procure a contractor to construct the project. The amount of funds that were available limited the scope of work to clearing, grubbing, grading, access roads and drainage works. Arviso Construction Company, Inc. was awarded the construction contract in the amount of \$601,013. The funding for the contract included DED sales tax funds and Tourism funds.

In order to complete the infrastructure project within the 10 acres, additional funds are necessary. Funds are also needed to develop the additional 15 acres. In order to fully develop the whole 25 acres in a consistent and efficient manner, a Commercial Development Feasibility Study to evaluate the market, technical, financial and organizational aspect of the development is indispensable. Along with the Feasibility Study, a Masterplan for the entire 25 acres is essential.


Further expenditures for full development will be determined by the Feasibility Study and Master Plan.

## Indian Wells Commercial Site Infrastructure Project Summary

Location: Intersection of Navajo Route 6 and Navajo Route 15.

Awarded a construction contract, in the amount of \$601,012.96, to Arviso Construction, Inc. for site preparation work. The work is being funded by DED Tourism funds and the Sales Tax funds. The Project is scheduled to be completed in 60 days, with December 15 projected as the completion date.

- 1. The Site Preparation Scope of Work includes:
  - A. Grade and Drain work on 10 acres. Grade the current raw land and prepare it for development.
  - B. Construct 2 access road turnouts to site. One from Route 6 and one from Route 15. Grade an drain only.
- Upon funds availability, the rest of the infrastructure can be completed, including extension of a 6 inch waterline to the site and installation of the wastewater disposal system.
- 3. Upon completion of the infrastructure, development of commercial projects within the 10 acre site can proceed.
- 4. Concurrently, a Feasibility Study and Master Plan for the entire 25 acres Commercial Site is recommended.





## AN ACTION

RELATING TO BUDGET AND FINANCE AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES, AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION PERMANENT FUND INCOME FIVE YEAR EXPENDITURE PLAN AND WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §1162(B) FOR A LIMITED TIME PERIOD

BE IT ENACTED.

## Section One. Authority

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation, pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 102 (A).
- B. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(9), reviews proposed legislation which requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council.
- C. The Budget and Finance Committee is empowered to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the budgeting, appropriation, investment, and management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. §300(B)(2).
- D. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §300(C)(3), the Budget and Finance Committee of the Navajo Nation Council shall exercise oversight authority, including but not limited to, budget, finance, investment, bonds, contracting, insurance, audits, accounting, taxes, loans, chapter budget and finance for the purpose of recommending to the Navajo Nation Council the adoption of resolution designed to strengthen the fiscal and financial position of the Navajo Nation and to promote the efficient use of the fiscal and financial resources of the Navajo Nation.

## Section Two. Findings

A. The Navajo Nation Permanent fund, established in 1985, made available certain funds after a 20 year period and such funds have been available for use since 2005;

however, the fund income of the Navajo Nation Permanent fund continues to be reinvested in the Permanent Fund.

- B. The Navajo Nation Permanent Fund was established for the purpose of creating reserves for future generations after finding that the Navajo Nation's General Reserve Fund had been declining. See CJY-53-85, Whereas Clause Two and Six.
- C. The Navajo Nation Permanent Fund defines fund income as consisting of all earnings generated by the principal of the Fund. 12 N.N.C. §903(B).
- D. The Navajo Nation Permanent Fund sets out the procedures for expenditure of fund income by stating "[n]o Fund income shall be expended, except as set forth in §§903 and 909 of this Chapter, for a period of 20 years from date of the first Navajo Nation contribution to the Fund. Thereafter, ninety-five percent (95%) of the Fund income may be expended in accordance with a plan for its use covering at least a five-year period adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council provided that the expenditure of income in any fiscal year shall not exceed the income earned during that year. The remaining five percent (5%) of the Fund income shall be reinvested in the Permanent Fund." 12 N.N.C. §905.
- E. As stated above, the permanent fund income has been available for use since 2005 and a prospective plan for the use of the permanent fund income covering a 5-year period, attached as Exhibit A, includes major waterline projects throughout the Navajo Nation and economic development projects in regional centers across the Navajo Nation and is generally described as:
  - Navajo Nation Waterline Projects, Total: \$68,250,000, detailed in Exhibit B;
  - 2. Regional Economic Development Projects, Total: \$81,750,000, detailed in Exhibit C;
- F. The Navajo Nation Local Governance Trust Fund is established with an appropriation that "Beginning in Fiscal Year 2007, the Fund shall annually receive fifty-percent (50%) of the income available from the Navajo Nation

Permanent Fund pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §905; However to accomplish the essential Navajo Nation waterline and regional economic development projects it is necessary to lessen the appropriation to the Local Governance Trust Fund for the five year period of the expenditure plan. See 12 N.N.C. §1162 regarding annual appropriation and Exhibit A for Fund appropriation over the five year period.

G. The Navajo Nation finds it in the best interest of the Nation to approve the Permanent Fund Income Five Year Expenditure Plan.

## Section Three. Waiving 12 N.N.C. §1162(B)

The Navajo Nation hereby waives 12 N.N.C. §1162(B) for the period of the Permanent Income Five Year Expenditure Plan and approves the reduced annual appropriation to the Navajo Nation Local Governance Trust Fund to Confirm with the Permanent Income Five Year Expenditure Plan.

## Section Four. Recommending and Approving

The Navajo Nation hereby recommends and approves the expenditure of the permanent fund income pursuant to the Permanent Income Five Year Expenditure Plan described as:

- A. Navajo Nation Waterline Projects, Total: \$68,250,000;
- B. Regional Economic Development Projects, Total: \$81,750,000

Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Navajo Nation Local Governance Act, the Navajo Nation Council delegates to Chapters governmental authority with respect to local matters, consistent with Navajo law, including customs and traditions, to make decisions over local matters, and to govern with responsibility and accountability to the local citizens, and;
- Pursuant to Navajo Nation Council resolution CAP-19-16, the Navajo Nation Council allocated \$3.7 million to the Indian Wells Economic Development for the 4<sup>th</sup> year of the five-year plan from the Navajo Nation Permanent Fund Income Five Year Expenditure Plan, and;
- The Navajo Nation Council Resolution number CD-85-18 reduced the Indian Wells Economic Development project funds from \$3.7 million to \$1 million, reallocating \$2.7 to other projects, and;
- 5. The Indian Wells Chapter advocates for the continued economic development preparation as initially planned by the Community.

## NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

 The Indian Wells Chapter and its community membership supports and approves a request for the 24<sup>th</sup> Navajo Nation Council to Rescind the 23<sup>rd</sup> Navajo Nation Council Resolution CD-85-18 restoring an original funding amount of \$3,700,000 to the Indian Wells 10 Acre Commercial Site Project.
