TITLE OF RESOLUTION - AN ACTION RELATING TO NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; CONFIRMING THE PROBATIONARY APPOINTMENT OF HON. TINA TSINIGINE AS ASSOCIATE JUSTICE OF THE NAVAJO NATION SUPREME COURT

**PURPOSE:** This resolution, if approved, will confirm the probationary appointment of Hon. Tina Tsinigine as Associate Justice of the Navajo Nation Supreme Court.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

17	Section One. Authority	
18	A. The Navajo Nation established the Law and Order Committee as a Navajo Nation	
19	standing committee and as such gave the Law and Order Committee authority to	
20	recommend to the Navajo Nation President the probationary appointment of an	
21	Associate Justice of the Supreme Court. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 600 (A), 601	
22	(B)(7)(a).	
23	B. The Law and Order Committee delegated its responsibility and authority to the	
24	Judicial Conduct Commission to screen applicants and to recommend the	
25	probationary appointment of judges and justices. LOCS-19-18.	
26	C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council.	
27	2 N.N.C. § 700(A). Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(9), a proposed resolution that	
28	requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council must be assigned to the	
29	Naabik'íyátí' Committee before it is considered by the Navajo Nation Council.

- D. The Judicial Conduct Commission made its recommendation to the Navajo Nation President for Tina Tsinigine to be appointed as a probationary Associate Justice of the Navajo Nation Supreme Court. JCC-05-19.
- E. The President of the Navajo Nation shall appoint the Chief Justice, Associate Justices, and District Court Judges with confirmation by the Navajo Nation Council from among those applicants recommended by the Law and Order [Judiciary] Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. The Navajo Nation Council shall confirm judicial appointments. 2 N.N.C. § 601 (B)(7)(b), 7 N.N.C. § 355(A).

## Section Two. Findings

- A. The Supreme Court of the Navajo Nation shall consist of the Chief Justice of the Navajo Nation and two Associate Justices of the Supreme Court. 7 N.N.C. § 301(A).
- B. The Chief Justice and the Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, and all District Court Judges shall be appointed for a probationary period of two years and upon permanent appointment shall serve thereafter during good behavior. 7 N.N.C. § 355(B).
- C. Hon. Tina Tsinigine, currently a Navajo Nation District Court judge, is an enrolled member of the Navajo Nation and is an applicant for appointment as Associate Justice. Judge Tsinigine's application and qualifications have been reviewed by Judicial Conduct Commission, and she has been interviewed by Judicial Conduct Commission. See JCC-05-19, attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- D. The Judicial Conduct Commission has determined that Judge Tsinigine meets the qualifications for appointment as Navajo Nation Associate Justice and has recommended her for probationary appointment to the Navajo Nation President. Id.
- E. The Navajo Nation President, after an interview of the applicant, has appointed Judge Tsinigine as Navajo Nation Associate Justice, subject to confirmation by the Navajo Nation Council. *See* Appointment Letter and Qualification Documents attached hereto as **Exhibits B** and **C**, respectively.



## Section Three. Confirming Probationary Appointment

The Navajo Nation confirms the Honorable Tina Tsinigine as a probationary Associate Justice of the Navajo Nation Supreme Court for a period of two years from the date of this confirmation. 7 N.N.C. § 356(A).

## Section Four. Navajo Nation Privacy Act

Confidential information within the application documents shall remain protected except upon its authorized disclosure by the appointee. 2 N.N.C. § 81 et seq.

## JUDICIAL CONDUCT COMMISSION

## FORWARDING TO THE NAVAJO NATION PRESIDENT NAMES OF APPLICANTS FOR ASSOCIATE JUSTICE OF THE SUPREME COURT OF THE NAVAJO NATION

## BE IT ENACTED:

## SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY.

- A. Navajo Nation Supreme Court Justices are selected by appointment and confirmation. See generally, 7 N.N.C. §355. The Law and Order Committee of the Navajo Nation Council initially determines the qualifications of all applicants for judgeships. 2 N.N.C. §601(B)(7) and 7 N.N.C. §355(A). The names of those deemed qualified are forwarded to the President of the Navajo Nation for appointment. The appointments of the President are subject to Navajo Nation Council confirmation.
- B. The Law and Order Committee has delegated the responsibility and authority to the Judicial Conduct Commission regarding the screening of applicants for and recommendation of probationary appointment of judges and justices of the Navajo Nation by Resolution LOCS-19-18.
- C. The Navajo Nation President makes appointments for judge and justice positions, subject to confirmation by the Navajo Nation Council.

### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS.

- A. To improve the quality and effectiveness of the justice system, the Navajo Nation Judicial Branch needs to have a fully seated judiciary; however, there has been a vacant Associate Justice position since October 2010. Two applicants have applied for this vacancy.
- B. The applicants took the writing test as required by Title 7.
- C. The Judicial Conduct Commission conducted the interview of the applicants on December 7, 2019.
- The Judicial Conduct Commission reviewed the applicants' qualifications for judicial appointment.

## SECTION THREE. RECOMMENDATION FOR PROBATIONARY APPOINTMENT

- A. The Judicial Conduct Commission recommends to the Navajo Nation President the following names of applicants for Navajo Nation Supreme Court Associate Justice (in order of the interview):
  - 1. Tina Tsinigine

SECTION FOUR. DIRECTIVE.

The Judicial Branch Office of Human Resources shall immediately submit to the Navajo Nation President all documents provided by the applicants recommended for the Associate Justice position. Confidential information within application documents shall remain protected except upon authorized disclosure by the applicant. 2 N.N.C. § 81 et seq. (2009)



## Good morning:

These comments represent my personal opinion and not those of any past or present employer or client.

The selection of the Hon. Tina Tsinigine to be an Associate Justice of the Navajo Nation Supreme Court is an excellent choice.

Judge Tsinigine has always worked tirelessly to bring justice to all Navajos and educate the Navajo Public on how to utilize the Courts of the Navajo Nation to resolve disputes. She certainly stands for and has worked to achieve "justice for all."

In addition, the approval of Justice Tsinigine's appointment will mean that the long-standing vacancy on the Supreme Court will, at last, be filled.
