I am pleased to sign into law this resolution CMY-38-23 approving the Fiscal Recovery Funds Delegate Regional Project Plan for Honorable Begay's Delegate Region in the amount of \$4,003,468.00.

My Administration supports the plans of these Chapters who have worked very hard to put together their Regional Plans and is working very closely with the Fiscal Recovery Fund Office to ensure that these funds are put to use. As such, when Chapters are running into roadblocks in expending their Fiscal Recovery Funds and the roadblock is coming from the Executive Branch, I encourage them to reach out to the Office of the President and Vice President and inform my office of the roadblock and we will work to overcome those roadblocks.

I do want to take the moment to express my concern that any amendments to the Regional Plans must be approved by the Council. In addition, the prior Navajo Nation Council has set the expectation that Fiscal Recovery Funds be encumbered by June 30, 2024. This deadline is not far off. As a construction expert, I know that there are unpredictable factors that can prevent even the best of plans from moving forward on the proposed timeline. We should be designing systems that are flexible, accountable, and transparent. We do not currently have that system and I look forward to working with you and the entire Council to improve the Navajo Nation systems, so we are supporting our communities to take advantage of this historic funding.

Now let's get to work!

## RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 25th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - FIRST YEAR, 2023

## AN ACTION

RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING CAP-10-23, THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE HELENA NEZ BEGAY'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: COPPERMINE, K'AI'BII'TÓ, LECHEE, TONALEA/RED LAKE, BODAWAY/GAP), TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL PROJECTS FOR THIS DELEGATE REGION

### BE IT ENACTED:

### SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A).
- B. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the delegated responsibility to hear proposed resolution(s) that require final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9).
- C. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, incorporated herein by reference, mandates that Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund. ("NNFRF") Delegate Region Project Plans be approved by Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).
- D. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CAP-10-23, herein by reference, mandates that amendments to the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Honorable Helena Nez Begay's Delegate Region (Chapter: Coppermine, K'ai'bii'tó, LeChee, Tonalea/Red Lake, Bodaway/Gap) be approved by a Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).

## SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

A. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; ALLOCATING \$1,070,298,867 OF NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND EXPENDITURE PLANS FOR: CHAPTER AND REGIONAL PROJECTS; PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS, E911, AND RURAL

ADDRESSING PROJECTS; CYBER SECURITY; PUBLIC HEALTH PROJECTS; HARDSHIP ASSISTANCE; WATER AND WASTEWATER PROJECTS; BROADBAND PROJECTS; HOME ELECTRICITY CONNECTION AND ELECTRIC CAPACITY PROJECTS; HOUSING PROJECTS AND MANUFACTURED HOUSING FACILITIES: BATHROOM ADDITION PROJECTS; CONSTRUCTION CONTINGENCY FUNDING; AND REDUCED ADMINISTRATIVE FUNDING, was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on July 15, 2022.

- B. CJN-29-22, Section Three, states, in part and among other things, that
  - 1. The Navajo Nation hereby approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund in the total amount of two hundred eleven million two hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148) to be divided equally between the twenty-four (24) Delegate Regions in the amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340) per Delegate Region . . . and allocated through Delegate Region Project Plans approved by Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation . . . . See CJN-29-22, Section Three (B).
  - 2. The Delegate Region Project Plan funding will be allocated to the Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department, to implement the projects rather than directly to the Chapters. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (D).
  - 3. The Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department, shall manage and administer funds and Delegate Region Project Plans on behalf of Non-LGA-Certified Chapters. The Navajo Nation Central Government may award funding to LGA-Certified Chapters through sub-recipient agreements to implement and manage specific projects, but shall maintain Administrative Oversight over such funding and Delegate Region Project Plans. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (E).
  - 4. Each Navajo Nation Council delegate shall select Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible projects within their Delegate Region to be funded by the NNFRF Chapter and Regional Projects Expenditure Plan through a Delegate Region Projects Plan. The total cost of projects selected by each Delegate shall not exceed their Delegate Region distribution of eight million eight hundred two thousand

three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340). See CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).

- 5. Each Delegate Region Project shall identify its Administrative Oversight entity and its Oversight Committee(s) and be subject CJY-41-21's NNDOJ initial eligibility determination. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (L)(5) and (L)(6).
- C. The Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CAP-10-23, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE HELENA NEZ BEGAY'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: COPPERMINE, K'AI'BII'TÓ, LECHEE, TONALEA/RED LAKE, BODAWAY/GAP), was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on May 5, 2023.
- D. CAP-10-23, Section Four, states that:
  - 1. Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).
- E. All additional projects listed in the Hon. Helena Nez Begay's Delegate Region Projects Plan, attached as Exhibit A, have been deemed Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible by NNDOJ. In addition, Hon. Helena Nez Begay's Delegate Region Projects Plan does not exceed the amount of \$8,802,340, as set forth in CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).
- F. The Navajo Nation Council hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation and the Hon. Helena Nez Begay's Delegate Region Chapters and communities to approve and adopt the additional projects as part of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Helena Nez Begay's Delegate Region (Chapters: Coppermine, K'ai'bii'tó, LeChee, Tonalea/Red Lake, Bodaway/Gap) as set forth in Exhibit A.

SECTION THREE. AMENDING CAP-10-23, THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE HELENA NEZ BEGAY'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: COPPERMINE, K'AI'BII'TÓ, LECHEE, TONALEA/RED LAKE, BODAWAY/GAP), TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL PROJECTS FOR THIS DELEGATE REGION

A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the additional projects as part of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Helena Nez Begay's Delegate Region (Chapters:

Coppermine, K'ai'bii'tó, LeChee, Tonalea/Red Lake, Bodaway/Gap) set forth in Exhibit A.

- B. The Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall comply with all applicable provisions of CJY-41-21, CJN-29-22, and BFS-31-21.
- C. Any inconsistencies between this legislation, the Delegate Region Project Plan, and the individual project appendix, shall be resolved in favor of the project appendix reviewed by Department of Justice during their eligibility determination(s).

## SECTION FOUR. AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).

### SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

This legislation shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221(B), 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).

## SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

If any provision of this legislation is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those provisions of this legislation not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

Good afternoon Navalyn,

In receipt of your email from Delegate Paul Begay's LDA, Jerry Williams. Thanks for sending out the email to him requesting additional information on the approval for our chapter.

Here are my responses to the four questions you had asked.

- 1. A community needs assessment based on multi generation homes, with overcrowding. Alot of our residents here in LeChee were affected by COVID 19 and had to leave their employment and homes off the reservation, then when they moved home there was no housing available for them to move their young families into, also they had to move back into their parents place or live with grandparents, and take a lower salary position to make monthly ends meet. We have an overcrowded household living together, ie. 2 bedrooms with 2 families of more than 6+ people.
- 2. Our request is to purchase module homes and get them placed within the community where they have infrastructure set up already. 3 bedroom home with a 704+ square foot. (This information was provided to you in the original proposal we turned in)
- 3. The City of Page is near by which we will make a comparison to.
- a. The 3 bedroom home is estimated at \$250k with the land/taxes City of Page
- b. 3 bedroom modular home \$91,000.00 + infrastructure setup \$3,000.00 Mobile home vendor.
- c. To build a 3 bedroom house in LeChee with manpower/infrastructure estimated by square footage of 704 feet = \$175k.
- 4. I am not sure what these programs are and never research them. I have never researched them because the chapter assumed that during our presentation from Tom Platero the ARPA funding was made available to all chapters to assist the

community members based on the impact of COVID 19 Pandemic. During his presentation he did not mention we need to look for other funds that could help the chapters. This is the first time this question has come up.

The homes will be a single modular home with two bedrooms, kitchen, living room and bathroom area. Homes will either be built or be mobile homes. The square footage is 864 square feet and approximately 24 x 36 in size.

I do not know the estimated size and cost per home in the area as most homes are based on different income criteria and eligibility determination for housing assistance. Some homes are old and there are a lot of mobile homes that are purchased by homeowners.

4. Please explain whether the home construction projects would qualify for any federal funded housing programs, including, but not limited to the National Housing Trust Fund, Indian Housing Block Grant program, the Indian Community Develop Block Grant program, or the BIA Housing Improvement Program.

I am not familiar with those programs and do not know how this will benefit these families in need. I am sure that majority of these families have applied for assistance for housing with Navajo Housing Authority and other entities to try to secure housing, but to no avail as housing was not available. With that being said, this is the opportune time to get these families in homes especially those that are in dire need and the eligibility criteria being used.

  - Proof of Chapter Voter Registration
  - Approved homesite/residential lease (with Navajo Nation environmental Compliance Forms)
- f. All records shall be considered confidential information pertaining to the applicant(s) request for assistance, and/or assistance provided shall not be made public without the written consent of the applicant.
- g. Applications shall not be taken over the phone or fax and verbal applications shall not be accepted.
- h. A map of residence is required to provide directions to the primary residence/home.
- i. A referral from a governmental agency, official representative or medical physician will justify the applicant's need for housing assistance.

# 2. Application Homesite Assessments:

- a. Kaibeto Chapter officials/Chapter Administration will conduct applicant homesite assessment to verify all information on the application is accurate, if any information on application is determined false, applicant will be ineligible for housing assistance.



Dear Ms. Platero,

You have requested for additional information on our ARAP Packet. We have submitted our packet under, Title: 215 Long Term Housing Security Affordable Housing; 218 Housing Support: Other Housing Assistance.

# 1. How will recipients be select?

Tonalea Chapter is partnering with Choice Humanitarian, a non-profit 501 (c) (3) organization. An organization that helps to achieve a better quality of life. They are currently working with the Navajo Chapters from the Former Bennett Freeze Area ('FBFA"), affects nine (9) chapters in the Western Navajo Agency. Tonalea Chapter is one of the nine chapters. Choice Humanitarian utilize a software, KOBO Toolbox software in conducting assessment for the families residing on the Former Bennett Freeze Area. The same software can be used for the entire Tonalea community. We met with Choice Humanitarian and receiving training on how to utilize the software.

# 2. What is the criteria to be approve for a new home or other assistance?

Utilizing the KOBO toolbox to collect data, it can also be utilized to develop a priority list base on the survey. The Chapter wants to ensure that all individuals interviewed for home repairs/renovation/replacement are given the same questions, and it's their answers that will be used to establish the priority list. The software will determine the priority list for home repairs/renovations/replacements.

Tonalea Chapter Staff and Officials have gone through KOBO toolbox training for assessing the homes and edit the questionnaires and made it specifically for Tonalea. The questionnaires will be completed this week. The KOBO toolbox can be downloaded onto laptop, iPad and cell phone and utilize to conduct the assessment with the families. The interviewer does not need to have internet services at the time of interview, it can be uploaded and once the interviewer has internet, it will be uploaded to CLOUD for storages. Once it is uploaded to Cloud, the interviewer will not have accesses to the survey answers to the questions. The answers to the questionnaires are only available to the Chapter Administrative Staff. The assessments will not be shared with others without the permission from Tonalea Chapter.

# Please describe in more details the homes to be built, including square footage, number of bedrooms, etc.

Based on the assessments, Tonalea Chapter would like to do repairs/renovation/replacements to existing homes. \$1,760,4638.00 is not enough to address the needs of constructing new homes. I understand the size of the homes is base of the size of the families. If a single home has 8 people, you need at least four-bedroom. We have to take into consideration of the material cost, transportation and delivery of lumbers, storage, and labor cost. According to HUD, minimum requirement for square footage to be legally called a bedroom is a minimum of 70 square feet of floor space. This translates to a room measuring 7-feet by 10-feet.

Part of Tonalea Chapter services area was partition to the Hopi Tribe. The families that ended on the Hopi Partitioned Lands ("HPL") relocated into Navajo Partitioned Lands ("NPL") and Big Navajo pursuant to the Navajo-Hopi Land Settlement Act of 1974. In 1974, the Settlement Act was intended to provide for the final settlement of a land dispute between the Navajo and Hopi tribes that originated nearly a century ago. The act also created the Office of Navajo Hopi Indian Relocation ("ONHIR") to carry out the relocation of Navajo and Hopi Indians off land partitioned to the other tribe.

The ONHIR office-built homes and it is expected that Tonalea Chapter build these homes with the ARPA funding. The funding is not enough to build Relocation type homes. Therefore, Tonalea Chapter is proposing to repairs/renovate/replacement of severely dilapidated homes.

4. Please describe how the estimated size and cost per home compares to homes in the area?

We have Navajo Housing Authority ("NHA") housing and Navajo Hopi Indian Relocation Housing within Tonalea Chapter services area. The approximate cost of these homes' ranges from \$200,000 to \$400,000 per homes, which includes appliance, waterline, electric line hook — up. Out in the remote area of the Tonalea, we do not have powerline and waterline extension. These homes were constructed by companies who are specialized in construction. Tonalea does not have a construction company, we would have to look within our own community to hire labors who are familiar with construction of homes. Hire a Project Manager, Senior Carpenter, Carpenters and general labors. Tonalea Chapter did not budget to hire personnel and we would have to look into our own Chapter budget to hire the personal.

5. Please explain whether the home construction projects would qualify for any federally funded housing program, including not mot limited to the National Housing Trust Fund, Indian Housing Block Grant program, the Indian Community Development Block Grant program, or the BIA Housing Improvement Program.

Tonalea Chapter is scheduling a work session on Housing that will include the Tonalea Chapter Officials, Staff, Division of Community Development-Community Housing Infrastructure Development, USDA Rural Development. We have missed the deadline to applied for Community Development Block Grant and Rural Development have grants and low interest rate loan for housing. Red Feather, a non-profit 501 (c) (3) also provides some housing repairs assistance. We hope to Partner with these groups to share some of the cost. Tonalea Chapter have some fundings, Housing Discretionary Funds to contribute toward the hosing projects. For the elderlies, we hope to partner with Tuba City Regional Health Care Corporation- for Independent Living, for elderlies that may need ramps and rails for their homes.

Tonalea Chapter has (4) four different land status, 1) Former Bennett Freeze Area, 2) Navajo Partitioned Land, 3) Hopi Partitioned Land and 4) Big Navajo Reservation. The type of soil we have in Tonalea is sandy, green clay, and red clay. The soil itself is not stable, the sand moves with the wind, once the green and red clay gets wet, it expands, continuously moving. With the land continuously moving, it will create cracks in the homes. I believed that the soil has to be stabilized.

I believed that the title that we used for our ARPA funding, 215 Long Term Housing Security Affordable Housing; 218 Housing Support: Other Housing Assistance may not be the appropriate title for our projects. We want to renovate/repairs/replacement of existing homes base on the assessment, if the homes require a replacement, then we need to take the necessary steps to rebuilt their homes. Originally, we had budgeted for Personal, but it was recommended by our Delegate that we take that out. I would like to make the request to include funds for personnel.

We look forward to a positive response to our application and if we need to make the necessary changes to our application, we will work on it and resubmit our ARPA application. Thank you.


