

RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' AND THE NAVAJO NATION
COUNCIL; AMENDING 2 N.N.C §§ 1060 - 1067 AND 17 N.N.C. §§ 101 - 103 BY
ENACTING THE NAVAJO NATION PEACE OFFICER STANDARDS AND TRAINING
CERTIFICATION ACT

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

A. The Law and Order Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council and is empowered with the authority to review and make recommendations to the Navajo Nation Council on amendments to and enactments in the Navajo Nation Code. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(1), 600 (A), and 601(B)(14).

B. The Naabik'iyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(9), reviews proposed legislation which requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council. CO-45-12.

C. The Navajo Nation Council must review and approve enactments or amendments of positive law. 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

18-174-1

1 A. The Navajo Nation is a sovereign government responsible for providing critical
2 governmental services to and protecting its people.

3 B. The Navajo Nation employs a large number of law enforcement officers, including
4 police officers, rangers, fish and wildlife and forestry officers, environmental protection
5 officers and criminal investigators. Law Enforcement officers within the Navajo Nation
6 currently receive training through standards of states, including Arizona.

7 C. It is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation, a sovereign government, to set its own
8 standards and training requirements for law enforcement officers serving within the Navajo
9 Nation.

10
11 **SECTION THREE. APPROVING AND ENACTING THE NAVAJO NATION**
12 **PEACE OFFICER STANDARDS AND TRAINING CERTIFICATION ACT**

13 The Navajo Nation hereby amends 2 N.N.C. §§ 1060 - 1067 and 17 N.N.C. §§ 101 -
14 103 by enacting the *Navajo Nation Peace Officer Standards and Training Certification Act*
15 as follows:

18 **Title 2**

19 **Navajo Nation Government**

20 **Chapter 5. Executive Branch**

22 **Subchapter 4. Navajo Nation Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission**

23
24 **§ 1060. Establishment and Purpose; Navajo Nation Peace Officer Standards and**
25 **Training Commission**

26 A. There is hereby established a Navajo Nation Peace Officer Standards and Training
27 Commission.

28 B. The purpose of the Commission is to administer and manage matters of initial and re-
29 qualification, training, basic training certification requirements, and commissioning of
30 Navajo Nation Peace Officers, who are vested with the powers of arrest, search and

1 seizure, or any person who is a law enforcement officer vested by law with a duty to
2 maintain public order or make arrests whether that duty extends to all offenses or is
3 limited to specific classes of offenses within the Navajo Nation.

4 C. The Commission shall adopt, administer, and enforce regulations it promulgates.

5
6 **§1061. Membership**

7 A. The Commission shall be composed of six (6) members, who shall be the following:

8 1. Chief Prosecutor of the Navajo Nation;

9 2. Chief of Police, Navajo Nation Police Department;

10 3. A Commissioned Law Enforcement officer employed within the Division of
11 Natural Resources and selected by the Division of Natural Resources
12 commissioned officers;

13 4. Chief of Police, Navajo Nation Ramah Police Department;

14 5. Supervisor of the Navajo Environmental Protection Agency's Criminal
15 Enforcement Section; and,

16 6. Public-at-Large member from the public selected by the Commission.

17 B. Any Commission member who ceases to hold the office that qualified the member
18 for appointment will be deemed to have resigned from the Commission. If an official
19 vacates his or her underlying manager position, the acting replacement official shall
20 fulfill the roles and responsibilities of the Commission member.

21 C. The Public-at-Large member shall be selected by the Commission from among
22 applications submitted to the Commission.

23 1). Qualifications for the Public-at-Large position on the Commission shall be as
24 follows:

25 a. Enrolled membership with the Navajo Nation;

26 b. United States of America citizenship;

27 c. Residency within the external boundaries of the Navajo Reservation or Navajo
28 Nation trust or fee lands;

29 d. Twenty-one (21) years of age or older;

1 e. Possession of an associate's degree or higher from an accredited college,
2 university, graduate school, or law school;

3 f. Possession of a valid driver's license;

4 g. No conviction of a serious misdemeanor under Navajo Nation criminal laws
5 within the three-year period immediately preceding his or her application or
6 other crime involving moral turpitude;

7 h. No conviction of a felony or violation of a tribal, federal, or state law relating to
8 aggravated assault, theft, driving while intoxicated or driving under the
9 influence, or controlled substances; and

10 i. Shall not have been dishonorably discharged from the armed forces of the
11 United States.

12 2). The Public-at-Large member selected by the Commission shall serve for a period
13 of four (4) years, and shall receive per diem and expenses reimbursement from the
14 Commission.

15 D. The Commission is authorized to obtain legal services from an attorney or attorneys
16 from the Department of Justice or a Division that provides peace officer law enforcement
17 services to the Navajo Nation or both. The Commission is also authorized to maintain an
18 office staff to administer the duties of the Commission.

19 E. Meetings shall be held quarterly or more frequently as requested by the Chairperson
20 or by the written request of three (3) members of the Commission or by the President of
21 the Navajo Nation.

22 F. Members shall receive travel expense reimbursements from their respective
23 governmental office, program, or department.

24 G. The President of the Navajo Nation and the Law and Order Committee of the Navajo
25 Nation Council shall be the oversight authority over the Commission, as such authority is
26 defined at 2 NNC §110(R).

27
28 **§1062. POWERS**

29 The Navajo Nation Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission shall:
30

1 A. Establish rules for the governance and conduct of the Commission including meeting
2 times and matters to be placed on the agenda of each meeting and selection of a
3 Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, and Secretary;

4 B. Make recommendations, consistent with this Act, to the President, the Speaker of the
5 Navajo Nation Council, the Navajo Nation Council, or all Committees of the Navajo
6 Nation Council;

7 C. Set reasonable minimum qualifications, or re-qualifications, for the commissioning of
8 peace officers of the Navajo Nation. The qualifications shall relate to physical, mental,
9 and moral fitness and shall govern the recruitment, appointment and retention of all
10 individuals assuming or exercising the power of arrest, search and seizure, or other duties
11 and any person who is a law enforcement officer vested by law with a duty to maintain
12 public order or make arrests whether that duty extends to all offenses or is limited to
13 specific classes of offenses within the Navajo Nation. The Commission shall constantly
14 review and may amend such qualifications at any time.

15 D. Prescribe minimum standards for training of peace officers, including in-service
16 requirements, firearms qualifications and re-qualification, and programs for continuing
17 training, education, and professional development of peace officers of the Navajo Nation.
18 The Commission may accept the training certification or graduation certificates of basic
19 police officer training programs or academies accredited by a State or the Federal
20 government, which meet or exceed the standards and requirements as established by this
21 Commission. The Navajo Nation Police Academy shall conduct basic peace officer
22 training courses. The Commission shall accept training certification or graduation
23 certificates issued by the Navajo Nation Police Academy. The basic Navajo Nation
24 Police Academy may admit qualified individuals who are appointed as peace officers, but
25 require basic training certification. The Commission may prescribe qualifications for
26 instructors and prescribe courses of instruction for basic peace officer training and in-
27 service peace officer training.

28 E. Recommend curricula for advanced courses and seminars in peace officer and
29 criminal intelligence gathering training in local institutes of higher education.
30

1 F. Develop policies and procedures to ensure that all commissioned peace officers of the
2 Navajo Nation and the departments, offices, or entities that employ them are adhering to
3 the standards for recruitment, appointment, basic training certification, retention, in-
4 service training, re-qualifications, and training established by the Commission in
5 accordance with this Chapter.

6 G. Deny, suspend, revoke or cancel the commission of an officer who is not in
7 compliance with the qualifications, or based upon a finding of misconduct or lacking
8 good moral character as established by the Navajo Nation Peace Officer Standards and
9 Training Commission.

10 H. Provide training and related services to assist state, tribal, and local peace officer
11 agencies to better serve the public.

12 I. Enter into contracts to carry out its powers and duties.

13 J. Administer oaths, subpoena persons, and take testimony on any matter within the
14 Commission's jurisdiction.

15 K. Perform all other acts appropriate to the development and operation of peace officer
16 training and education.

17 L. Receive appropriated funds and manage an annual fiscal year budget. Receive
18 revenues from all fines paid from citations issued by all peace officers of the Navajo
19 Nation.

20 21 **§ 1063. Categories of Peace Officers**

22 **A. Peace Officer categories.** The categories for which an individual may be
23 commissioned as a peace officer are:

24 1). Full-authority peace officer;

25 2). Specialty peace officer;

26 3). Such other limited authority peace officers as the Navajo Nation Peace Officer
27 Standards and Training Commission shall authorize.

28 **B. Full authority peace officer.** A full authority peace officer is a peace officer whose
29 authority to enforce the laws of the Navajo Nation is not limited by this Act.

1 **C. Specialty peace officer.** A specialty peace officer has full authority to exercise the
2 powers of arrest, search, and seizure, or other duties and privileges incident and
3 belonging to any person who is a law enforcement officer vested by law with a duty to
4 maintain public order or make arrests and that duty extends to specific classes of offenses
5 within the Navajo Nation that he or she is authorized to enforce. If, within the course of
6 his or her regular duties, the specialty peace officer encounters clear violations of
7 criminal or motor vehicle laws of the Navajo Nation he or she may exercise the powers of
8 arrest, search, and seizure in accordance with all of the provisions of the Navajo Nation
9 Motor Vehicle Code (Title 14) and the Navajo Nation Criminal Code (Title 17).

11 **§ 1064. Hearings**

12 **A. Hearings**

13 1. An individual subject to denial, suspension, revocation, or cancellation of a peace
14 officer commission may request and have a hearing to present evidence, test evidence
15 against them, and cross-examine witnesses prior to the final decision of the matter by
16 the Commission.

17 2. The Commission may appoint a hearing officer to receive testimony and make
18 recommendations to the Commission concerning matters of denial, suspension,
19 revocation, or cancellation of a peace officer commission.

20 3. An individual subject to these Commission proceedings may be represented by
21 legal counsel. All such legal expenses shall be borne by the individual.

22 4. Neither a member of the Commission nor appointed hearing officer shall
23 participate in any adjudicatory proceeding or hearing if, for any reason, a
24 Commission member or hearing officer cannot afford a fair and impartial hearing to
25 the parties.

26 **B. Commission decisions**

27 1. The Commission shall render all decisions in writing.

28 2. The Commission shall serve notice of all decisions on each party as set forth in
29 rules and regulations promulgated by the Commission.

1 **§ 1065. Appeal of Adverse Decisions**

2 An individual may appeal any adverse decision made by the Commission concerning
3 their application or commission as a peace officer of the Navajo Nation to the Navajo
4 Nation Supreme Court.

5
6 **§ 1066. Cross-Commissioning**

7 Lawfully appointed United States Marshals, Federal Bureau of Investigation Agents
8 or Special Agents, Bureau of Indian Affairs police officers or criminal investigators,
9 Special Commissioned Peace Officers, or State Police Officers, or other duly
10 commissioned police officers in good standing with the jurisdiction in which they are
11 commissioned may be cross-commissioned as Navajo Nation Peace Officers in the
12 discretion of the Commission. A cross-commissioned officer loses his or her commission
13 as a Navajo Nation Peace Officer if he or she ceases to be or fails to maintain his or her
14 commission/ certification as a peace officer by an outside criminal law enforcement or
15 police entity.

16
17 **§ 1067. Retention and Continuation of Previously Commissioned Officers**

18 All Navajo Nation peace officers, police officers, Rangers, Wildlife Conservation
19 Officers, Forestry Officers, Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Officers, Navajo
20 Nation Criminal Investigators wherever commissioned to enforce the laws of the Navajo
21 Nation shall not forfeit any duly held peace officer or law enforcement commission by
22 passage of this Act, and will be issued a Navajo Nation peace officer commission by the
23 Navajo Nation Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission.

27 **Law and Order**

28 **Chapter 1. Enforcement of the Criminal Code**

29
30 **§ 101. Responsibility**

1 The Navajo Nation assumes responsibility for the enforcement of the Criminal Code,
2 including such amendments thereof and additions thereto as may hereafter be enacted.

3
4 **§ 102. Requirements to Become a Navajo Nation Peace Officer**

5 A. All personnel assuming or exercising the power of arrest, search and seizure, or any
6 person who is a law enforcement officer vested by law with a duty to maintain public
7 order or make arrests whether that duty extends to all offenses or is limited to specific
8 classes of offenses within the Navajo Nation must be qualified, trained, and
9 commissioned as a peace officer in accordance with the requirements set forth by the
10 Navajo Nation Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission.

11 B. The provisions concerning the commissioning of peace officers of the Navajo Nation
12 may be referred to as the “Navajo Nation Peace Officer Standards and Training
13 Certification Act.”

15 **§ 102 103. Authority to enter into cooperative agreements with federal and state**

23 **SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE**

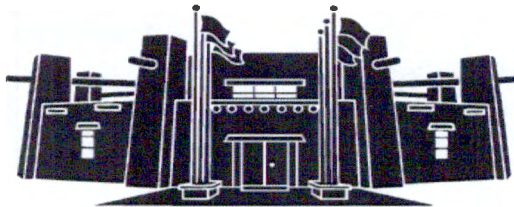
24 The act enacted herein shall be effective pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §221(B).

25
26 **SECTION FIVE. CODIFICATION**

27 The provisions of the act shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The
28 Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate all provisions of the act in the next
29 codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

1 **SECTION SIX. SAVINGS CLAUSE**


2 Should any provision of the act be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or
3 the District Courts of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those
4 provisions of the act not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Nation.
