PURPOSE: The purpose of this resolution is to approve a supplemental appropriation to the Health Operations Command Center.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

22	SECTION 1. AUTHORITY	
23	A. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee has oversight of the Navajo	
24	Nation Department of Health. 2 N.N.C. § 401(C)(1). The Health Operations	
25	Command Center is within the Department of Health.	
26	B. The Budget and Finance Committee is empowered to review and recommend to the	
27	Navajo Nation Council the budgeting, appropriation, investment and management of	
28	all funds. 2 N.N.C. §301 (B)(2).	
29	C. A proposed resolution that requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be	
30	assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9).	

- D. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing of body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A).
- E. The Navajo Nation Council has the authority to approve supplemental appropriations. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L). Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L), "[t]he Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at § 820(J)."
- F. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:
 - 1. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget for budget impact analysis. 12 N.N.C. § 820(M).
 - 2. When the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be approved by the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
 - 3. Supplemental Appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at § 820(F). The Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for designation recurring and non-recurring revenues. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
 - 4. The Nation shall budget all recurring operating expenses, including capital maintenance, from recurring revenues. Long term debt shall not be used to finance recurring operating expenses. 12 N.N.C. §820(E).
 - 5. The Navajo Nation Code provides, "[t]he Nation shall restrict non-recurring revenues to budget non-recurring expenditures. In addition, non-recurring revenues will be budgeted only after an examination by the Controller to determine whether or not the revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between recurring revenues and expenditures, and expenditures may be authorized only if a long-term (three-five year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue. Otherwise, non-recurring revenues will be added to the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund balance.

This provision may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full Navajo Nation Council." 12 N.N.C. § 820(F).

SECTION 2. FINDINGS

- A. The Health Command Operations Center has requested a supplemental appropriation to address the effects of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19).
- B. The Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management, with the concurrence of the President of the Navajo Nation, Jonathan Nez, declared a public health state of emergency on the Navajo Nation, on March 11, 2020 due to COVID-19. Emergency Management Commission Resolution No. CEM 20-03-11. Resolution CEM 20-03-11 is incorporated by reference into this resolution.
- C. The Navajo Nation has issued numerous public health orders in recognition of the severity of COVID-19. These Public Health Emergency Orders (2020-001 through 2020-031) are incorporated by reference into this resolution. Most recently, the Navajo Nation Department of Health issued Public Health Emergency Order No. 2020-031, entitled, "Continuing the Stay at Home (Shelter in Place) Lockdown Order for an Additional Three (3) Weeks, Including Full 57-Hour Weekend Lockdowns," to continue to combat the spread of COVID-19.
- D. COVID-19 infections and deaths continue to be a serious issue within the Navajo Nation and are straining an already overburdened healthcare system. As of December 8, 2020, the Navajo Nation reached a total of 18,324 positive cases and 688 COVID-19 related deaths.
- E. The supplemental funding will allow the Health Operations Command Center to engage contractual personnel for alternate site care for patients throughout the Navajo Nation who are required to quarantine or isolate as a result of COVID-19 exposure.
- F. The funding will also enable the Health Operations Command Center the ability to provide public outreach through oral and video materials to educate the Navajo public on how to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Additionally, this funding will allow for additional personnel to carry out these objectives.

- G. This supplemental appropriation is requested in the total amount of Seventeen Million Four Hundred Twenty Thousand Four Hundred Eighty-Two Dollars (\$17,420,482). The budget documents are attached as **Exhibit A**.
- H. The Office of the Controller was requested to provide a memorandum to satisfy the requirements in 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L). The memorandum was not ready at the time of drafting this resolution, but will be included as an exhibit when it is available.
- I. The Office of Budget and Management has provided a memorandum to serve as the budget impact analysis required by 12 N.N.C. 820 (M). The memorandum dated December 9, 2020, is attached as Exhibit B.

SECTION 3. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF SEVENTEEN MILLION FOUR HUNDRED TWENTY THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED EIGHTY-TWO DOLLARS (\$17,420,482) TO THE HEALTH COMMAND OPERATIONS CENTER

- A. This supplemental appropriation of \$17,420,482 to the Health Command Operations Center shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller and as indicated the documents in **Exhibit A**.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves supplemental funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of \$17,420,482 as indicated in the documents in **Exhibit A**.

OMB review of Navajo Department of Health (NDOH) FY2021 Health Command

Center Proposed Budget in the amount of \$17,420,482, business unit #113022.

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) reviewed the above budget documents according to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (M) and the following is noted:

- Because of the limited availability of funds, OMB advises the Branch Chiefs to prioritize all supplemental funding proposals pursuant to the FY 2021 Budget Instructions Manual (Section XII), and the Appropriations Act. This activity should be completed by the three branches to determine priorities.
- 2. OMB recommends compliance with the Navajo Nation Appropriations Act regarding Supplemental Appropriations (Section 820, L). This has not been done. Compliance includes:
 - a. Branch Chief's concurrence of the supplemental request (NN President). Budget Forms 1 and 2 are currently not signed,
 - b. Non-recurring expenses only. Personnel salary is a recurring expense and the budget includes permanent and temporary staff. Budget Form 3 and Budget Form 4 in the proposed budget given indicates 2 permanent staff, UUFB funds are non-recurring and the staff will work according to funds availability.
- 3. No fund source is indicated, but the current UUFB available amount is \$36,746,624. The FY21 budget resolution to be acted on by the Navajo Nation President on 12/10 would set aside \$20 million for the FY 2022 Budget. If enacted as is, the UUFB would not be enough to fund this proposal at the current amount.
- 4. Budget Form 2 should have five (5) significant goal statement or program performance measures developed.
