TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO RESOURCE AND DEVELOPMENT, BUDGET AND FINANCE, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED TWENTY FIVE DOLLARS (\$150,125) TO COALMINE CANYON CHAPTER FOR STRUCTURAL ANALYSIS

PURPOSE: EMERGENCY LEGISLATION. This legislation approves supplemental funding from the UUFB of \$150,125 to the Coalmine Canyon Chapter for a structural analysis to determine the extent of deterioration to the Chapter facility.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed resolution in detail.

19	Section One. Authority
20	A. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), the Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve
21	supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal
22	year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are
23	permitted, (1) if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or
24	current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve
25	amount set for in § 820(J), or (2) when the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund balance
26	(UUFB) is in excess of the reserve amount set forth at § 820(J).
27	B. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation
28	standing committee and as such proposed legislation that requires final action by the
29	Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. §
30	164 (A)(9), 701(A)(3).

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- C. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 300 (C)(3) the Budget and Finance Committee is authorized to recommend adoption of resolutions related to the expenditure of the Nation's financial resources.
- D. Budget and Finance Committee may recommend supplemental appropriations to the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L).
- E. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 501 (C)(5), the Resources and Development Committee exercises oversight authority over chapter activities, and economic and community development, for the purpose to promote, review, coordinate and approve projects to be financed by funds designed for capital improvement.

Section Two. Findings

- A. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C. § 3 the Coalmine Canyon Chapter is a duly recognized and certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation.
- B. The Coalmine Canyon Chapter facility was completed in 2004 with funds provided by the Office of Navajo-Hopi Indian Relocation with ownership transferred to the Navajo Nation; however, since 2004, due to faulty construction and lack of attention by previous Chapter administration, the facility continues to deteriorate and is unsafe for public use. See Coalmine Canyon Chapter resolution CCC-04-0065-17 attached as Exhibit A.
- C. The Coalmine Canyon Chapter submitted a claim to the Navajo Nation's Risk Management Office on August 20, 2015 and the claim was denied on June 21, 2016. See Exhibit B.
- D. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:
 - Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), all requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for budget impact analysis. A preview of the appropriation legislation is available to the OMB for their budget impact analysis response. The OMB review for this legislation has not yet been completed and must be provided prior to the approval of this legislation.

- 2. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), when the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be allocated by the Navajo Nation Council. Controller's memorandum attached as Exhibit C.
- E. There are sufficient funds available in the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to provide the Coalmine Canyon Chapter with an appropriation of One Hundred Fifty Thousand One Hundred and Twenty Five Dollars (\$150,125) to conduct a structural analysis to determine the extent of damage to the facility and the required renovation and repair cost. Budget forms attached as **Exhibit D**.
- F. The Navajo Nation Council finds it in the best interest of the Coalmine Canyon Chapter to approve the supplemental appropriation from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to the Coalmine Canyon Chapter for the cost of a structural analysis of the Chapter building.

Section Three. Approvals

- A. The Navajo Nation Council hereby approves a supplemental appropriation to the Coalmine Canyon Chapter for a structural analysis of the Chapter building. This supplemental appropriation to be funded from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance, and used solely to determine the condition of the Coalmine Canyon Chapter facility and required renovation and repair cost.
- B. This supplemental appropriation of One Hundred Fifty Thousand One Hundred Twenty Five Dollars (\$150,000) shall be to a Business Unit # NEW and from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance. See Exhibit D.

Section Four. Effective Date

The provisions of this Act shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).

Section Five. Savings, Severability, and Survivability

Should any provision herein be determined invalid by the Navajo courts or other court of competent jurisdiction, all other provisions of this legislation not determined to be invalid shall remain in full force and effect.

Resolution of the Coalmine Canyon Chapter CCC-04-0065-17

REQUEST FOR EMERGENCY BASIS FROM THE UNDESIGNATED UNRESERVED FUND BALANCE (UUFB) TO COVER EXPENSES ASSOCIATED WITH COMPLETION OF FACILITY AUDIT.

WHEREAS:

- Pursuant to 26 NNC, Section 3; Chapter Certification and 11 NNC Part 1, Section 10, the Coalmine Canyon Chapter is a duly recognized and certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government; and,
- Pursuant to 26 NNC, Chapter 1; Navajo Nation Chapters; Section 1, (B) Purpose (1) & (2),
 the Navajo Nation Council delegated to Chapters governmental authority with respect to
 local matters consistent with Navajo law, including custom and tradition and allows chapters
 to make decisions to govern with responsibility and accountability to community
 membership; and,
- The community of Coalmine Canyon has been impacted by both the Bennett Freeze Act of 1966 and the Navajo Hopi Land Settlement Act of 1974 (PL-93-531) which has prohibited improvement or development. This Executive Order has resulted in the ongoing negative physiological, psychological and sociological impact of its community members; and,
- 4. The Coalmine Canyon Chapter strives for the improvement of the community membership by providing and assisting them with opportunity for improvement in their livelihood, health and education; and,
- 5. The Coalmine Canyon Chapter facility construction was completed in 2004 and funded by Office of Navajo Hopi Indian Relocation (ONHIR) and has since transferred ownership to the Navajo Nation to maintain and manage. However, due to faulty construction and lack of attention by former administration, the building has deteriorated and is unsafe for public use; and,
- The Coalmine Canyon Chapter has kept detailed records in the deterioration of the chapter building which obviously shows visible deterioration of the interior and exterior structure; and,
- 7. The Coalmine Canyon Chapter has submitted a claim and attached photos to the Navajo

Nation Risk Management Program on August 20, 2015 and claim was denied on June 21, 2016. Denial letter stated "Our Property Policy excludes/does not insure against normal settling or normal shrinkage of walls, floors or ceiling". Therefore, claim was denied for repairs; and,

- 8. The Coalmine Canyon Chapter has exhausted all avenues in notifying the appropriate Navajo Nation Government Authorities and other affected agencies to address the deterioration of the facility and is very concerned for the safety of the public and employees; and,
- The Navajo Nation stipulates in NOSHA and Workman's Comp policies to ensure the physical safety and well-being of its employees.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

 The Coalmine Canyon Chapter hereby approves an Emergency Basis request for Funds from the Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance (UUFB) to Cover Expenses Associated with Completion of Facility Audit.

Updated Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance

The Office of Controller has updated the unaudited Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance (UUFB) at \$6,824,260, as of March 28, 2017. Please see attached UUFB Schedule.

The appropriation in resolution CJA-02-17-Social Services for amount \$5,038,678 utilized the Minimum Fund Balance. After reviewing the Attorney General's Opinion [01-17], the Minimum Fund balance needs to be replenished to its required 10% of previous annual budget. Such required amount is \$17,265,400. Since the last report of UUFB on February 28, 2017 we performed additional analysis and revised our estimates, which had the following impact on UUFB:

- Increase UUFB for lower estimated adjustments from audit AJE's
- Increase UUFB for lower estimated expense to the Contingency Management Fund
- Decrease UUFB for the Permanent Fund set aside (CS-46-14)
- · Decrease UUFB for additional capital projects

We believe our estimates to be prudent, reasonable, and conservative in nature and subject to the completion of the annual audit. The net impact of these changes resulted in UUFB of \$7,972,352. However, \$1,148,092 of UUFB was transferred to replenish the Minimum Fund Balance back up to the required 10%. Therefore, the UUFB balance is \$6,824,260 as of today.

COAL MINE CHAPTER

On December 6th 2012 DES conducted a site assessment of the existing Chapter house.

The chapter house was conducting business and had not been closed down

The facility is a relatively new facility which the chapter occupied in

OBSREVATIONS:

The chapter house is experiencing differential settlement which is causing structural cracking at the south exterior cmu walls, the concrete floor, and interior partitions. The electrical system is malfunctioning which could be attributed to the settlement. Water intrusion has occurred and has caused evidence of mold.

At this point it is difficult to determine specifics; poor compaction, lack of quality assurance and quality control, insufficient oversight, engineered fill failing to meet specifications, all could be contributing factors.

Design Engineering has asked the chapter to compile all plans, testing reports, as built drawings, inspection reports and all close out documentation so as to assist in determining any and all proposed remedies and corrective action for bringing the

facility back in to compliance meeting all life and safety requirements and certifying the facility safe for occupancy

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Procure the services of an Architectural Engineering firm to access the extent of damage to the structure, the electrical, system, the HVAC system, the plumbing system, and drainage issues.
- 2. The Architectural Engineering will assist Design and Engineering in developing a scope of work
- 3. The Architectural engineering firm will assist Design and Engineering in developing an accurate cost estimate
- 4. Advise CIO of estimated cost and have chapter submit proposal for funding
- 5. The Architectural Engineering firm will prepare the necessary contract document necessary for bidding and negotiation
- 6. Prepare Advertisement for bid to all certified contractors in the area

Chapter for Structural Analysis.

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) has reviewed the above legislation and provides the following:

- 1. The current undesignated, unreserved fund balance (UUFB) is \$6,585,060 as of April 30, 2017, per the Office of the Controller.
- 2. DCD should provide the available fund balance for Coalmine Canyon Chapter.
- 3. Because of the limited availability of funds, OMB advises the Branch Chiefs to prioritize all supplemental funding proposals pursuant to the FY 2017 budget resolution CS-49-16 (paragraph 'M'), the FY 2017 Budget Instructions Manual (Section XIV), and the Appropriations Act. This activity should be completed by the three branches to determine priorities.
- 4. OMB recommends compliance with the Navajo Nation Appropriations Act regarding Supplemental Appropriations (Section 820, L). Compliance includes:
 - a. Branch Chief's concurrence of the supplemental request (NN President).
 - b. Non-recurring expenses only.
- 5. During the 2017 Spring Session, the Navajo Nation Council decided to defer all UUFB supplementals until the FY 2018 revenue projection is made clear due to a possible budget shortfall. This proposal should be treated the same.
- 6. The correct name should be used for the attached budget and resolutions. Currently it is identified as Coalmine Canyon Chapter, Coalmine Mesa Chapter or just Coalmine Chapter. This needs to be clarified.
- 7. Corrections need to be made to the proposed budgets. The sales tax should be incorporated into the object codes given. Add sales tax to the Architecture Design and Geo Tech Services and recalculate the amounts.

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- C. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 300 (C)(3) the Budget and Finance Committee is authorized to recommend adoption of resolutions related to the expenditure of the Nation's financial resources.
- D. Budget and Finance Committee may recommend supplemental appropriations to the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L).
- E. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 501 (C)(5), the Resources and Development Committee exercises oversight authority over chapter activities, and economic and community development, for the purpose to promote, review, coordinate and approve projects to be financed by funds designed for capital improvement.

Section Two. Findings

- A. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C. § 3 the Coalmine Canyon Chapter is a duly recognized and certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation.
- B. The Coalmine Canyon Chapter facility was completed in 2004 with funds provided by the Office of Navajo-Hopi Indian Relocation with ownership transferred to the Navajo Nation; however, since 2004, due to faulty construction and lack of attention by previous Chapter administration, the facility continues to deteriorate and is unsafe for public use. See Coalmine Canyon Chapter resolution CCC-04-0065-17 attached as Exhibit A.
- C. The Coalmine Canyon Chapter submitted a claim to the Navajo Nation's Risk Management Office on August 20, 2015 and the claim was denied on June 21, 2016. See Exhibit B.
- D. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:
 - 1. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), all requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for budget impact analysis. A preview of the appropriation legislation is available to the OMB for their budget impact analysis response. The OMB review for this legislation has not yet been completed and must be provided prior to the approval of this legislation.

- 2. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), when the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be allocated by the Navajo Nation Council. Controller's memorandum attached as Exhibit C.
- E. There are sufficient funds available in the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to provide the Coalmine Canyon Chapter with an appropriation of One Hundred Fifty Thousand One Hundred and Twenty Five Dollars (\$150,125) to conduct a structural analysis to determine the extent of damage to the facility and the required renovation and repair cost. Budget forms attached as Exhibit D.
- F. The Navajo Nation Council finds it in the best interest of the Coalmine Canyon Chapter to approve the supplemental appropriation from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to the Coalmine Canyon Chapter for the cost of a structural analysis of the Chapter building.

Section Three. Approvals

- A. The Navajo Nation Council hereby approves a supplemental appropriation to the Coalmine Canyon Chapter for a structural analysis of the Chapter building. This supplemental appropriation to be funded from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance, and used solely to determine the condition of the Coalmine Canyon Chapter facility and required renovation and repair cost.
- B. This supplemental appropriation of One Hundred Fifty Thousand One Hundred Twenty Five Dollars (\$150,000) shall be to a Business Unit # NEW and from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance. See Exhibit D.

Section Four. Effective Date

The provisions of this Act shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).

Section Five. Savings, Severability, and Survivability

Should any provision herein be determined invalid by the Navajo courts or other court of competent jurisdiction, all other provisions of this legislation not determined to be invalid shall remain in full force and effect.

- Pursuant to 26 NNC, Section 3; Chapter Certification and 11 NNC Part 1, Section 10, the Coalmine Canyon Chapter is a duly recognized and certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government; and,
- 2. Pursuant to 26 NNC, Chapter 1; Navajo Nation Chapters; Section 1, (B) Purpose (1) & (2), the Navajo Nation Council delegated to Chapters governmental authority with respect to local matters consistent with Navajo law, including custom and tradition and allows chapters to make decisions to govern with responsibility and accountability to community membership; and.
- The community of Coalmine Canyon has been impacted by both the Bennett Freeze Act of 1966 and the Navajo Hopi Land Settlement Act of 1974 (PL-93-531) which has prohibited improvement or development. This Executive Order has resulted in the ongoing negative physiological, psychological and sociological impact of its community members; and,
- 4. The Coalmine Canyon Chapter strives for the improvement of the community membership by providing and assisting them with opportunity for improvement in their livelihood, health and education; and,
- 5. The Coalmine Canyon Chapter facility construction was completed in 2004 and funded by Office of Navajo Hopi Indian Relocation (ONHIR) and has since transferred ownership to the Navajo Nation to maintain and manage. However, due to faulty construction and lack of attention by former administration, the building has deteriorated and is unsafe for public use; and,
- The Coalmine Canyon Chapter has kept detailed records in the deterioration of the chapter building which obviously shows visible deterioration of the interior and exterior structure;
- 7. The Coalmine Canyon Chapter has submitted a claim and attached photos to the Navajo

Nation Risk Management Program on August 20, 2015 and claim was denied on June 21, 2016. Denial letter stated "Our Property Policy excludes/does not insure against normal settling or normal shrinkage of walls, floors or ceiling". Therefore, claim was denied for repairs; and,

- 8. The Coalmine Canyon Chapter has exhausted all avenues in notifying the appropriate Navajo Nation Government Authorities and other affected agencies to address the deterioration of the facility and is very concerned for the safety of the public and employees; and,
- 9. The Navajo Nation stipulates in NOSHA and Workman's Comp policies to ensure the physical safety and well-being of its employees.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

 The Coalmine Canyon Chapter hereby approves an Emergency Basis request for Funds from the Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance (UUFB) to Cover Expenses Associated with Completion of Facility Audit.

Updated Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance

The Office of Controller has updated the unaudited Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance (UUFB) at \$6,824,260, as of March 28, 2017. Please see attached UUFB Schedule.

The appropriation in resolution CJA-02-17-Social Services for amount \$5,038,678 utilized the Minimum Fund Balance. After reviewing the Attorney General's Opinion [01-17], the Minimum Fund balance needs to be replenished to its required 10% of previous annual budget. Such required amount is \$17,265,400. Since the last report of UUFB on February 28, 2017 we performed additional analysis and revised our estimates, which had the following impact on UUFB:

- Increase UUFB for lower estimated adjustments from audit AJE's
- Increase UUFB for lower estimated expense to the Contingency Management Fund
- Decrease UUFB for the Permanent Fund set aside (CS-48-14)
- · Decrease UUFB for additional capital projects

We believe our estimates to be prudent, reasonable, and conservative in nature and subject to the completion of the annual audit. The net impact of these changes resulted in UUFB of \$7,972,352. However, \$1,148,092 of UUFB was transferred to replenish the Minimum Fund Balance back up to the required 10%. Therefore, the UUFB balance is \$6,824,260 as of today.

COAL MINE CHAPTER

On December 6th 2012 DES conducted a site assessment of the existing Chapter house.

The chapter house was conducting business and had not been closed down

The facility is a relatively new facility which the chapter occupied in

OBSREVATIONS:

The chapter house is experiencing differential settlement which is causing structural cracking at the south exterior cmu walls, the concrete floor, and interior partitions. The electrical system is malfunctioning which could be attributed to the settlement. Water intrusion has occurred and has caused evidence of mold.

At this point it is difficult to determine specifics; poor compaction, lack of quality assurance and quality control, insufficient oversight, engineered fill failing to meet specifications, all could be contributing factors.

Design Engineering has asked the chapter to compile all plans, testing reports, as built drawings, inspection reports and all close out documentation so as to assist in determining any and all proposed remedies and corrective action for bringing the

facility back in to compliance meeting all life and safety requirements and certifying the facility safe for occupancy

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Procure the services of an Architectural Engineering firm to access the extent of damage to the structure, the electrical, system, the HVAC system, the plumbing system, and drainage issues.
- 2. The Architectural Engineering will assist Design and Engineering in developing a scope of work
- 3. The Architectural engineering firm will assist Design and Engineering in developing an accurate cost estimate
- 4. Advise CIO of estimated cost and have chapter submit proposal for funding
- 5. The Architectural Engineering firm will prepare the necessary contract document necessary for bidding and negotiation
- 6. Prepare Advertisement for bid to all certified contractors in the area

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) has reviewed the above legislation and provides the following:

- The current undesignated, unreserved fund balance (UUFB) is \$6,585,060 as of April 30, 2017, per the Office of the Controller.
- 2. DCD should provide the available fund balance for Coalmine Canyon Chapter.
- Because of the limited availability of funds, OMB advises the Branch Chiefs to prioritize all supplemental funding proposals pursuant to the FY 2017 budget resolution CS-49-16 (paragraph 'M'), the FY 2017 Budget Instructions Manual (Section XIV), and the Appropriations Act. This activity should be completed by the three branches to determine priorities.
- 4. OMB recommends compliance with the Navajo Nation Appropriations Act regarding Supplemental Appropriations (Section 820, L). Compliance includes:
 - a. Branch Chief's concurrence of the supplemental request (NN President).
 - b. Non-recurring expenses only.
- During the 2017 Spring Session, the Navajo Nation Council decided to defer all UUFB supplementals until the FY 2018 revenue projection is made clear due to a possible budget shortfall. This proposal should be treated the same.
- 6. The correct name should be used for the attached budget and resolutions. Currently it is identified as Coalmine Canyon Chapter, Coalmine Mesa Chapter or just Coalmine Chapter. This needs to be clarified.
- 7. Corrections need to be made to the proposed budgets. The sales tax should be incorporated into the object codes given. Add sales tax to the Architecture Design and Geo Tech Services and recalculate the amounts.

The above findings should be addressed before the legislation is considered further. If there are any questions, contact Lisa Jymm at OMB at extension 6230.
