23rd NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - Second Year, 2016

AN ACT

RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER; BUDGET AND FINANCE, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI',
AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM
THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF THREE
HUNDRED FORTY THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS
(\$340,725) FOR THE DZIL YIJIIN REMODEL

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. FINDINGS

- A. The Navajo Nation established the Law and Order Committee as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered the Law and Order Committee to serve has legislative oversight over the Navajo Nation Judiciary Branch. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 600 (A), 601 (C)(1) (2012) *see also* CJA-03-13.
- B. The Navajo Nation established the Budget and Finance Committee (B&F) as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered B&F to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 300 (A), 301 (B)(2) (2012) *see also* CJA-03-13 and 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L) (2009).
- C. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation standing committee and as such proposed legislation that requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 700 (A) (2012) *see also* CO-45-12.
- D. "The Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year." 12 N.N.C. § 820(L) (2009).


- E. At the recommendation of the Law and Order Committee, the Budget and Finance Committee may recommend supplemental appropriations to the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L) (2009).
- F. The Law and Order Committee shall use Nitsáhákees, Nahat'á, Iiná, and Siihásin in exercising legislative oversight over the Judiciary Branch to establish and develop the Navajo Nation justice system infrastructure, including but not limited to, the justice system facilities. 2 N.N.C. § 600 (C)(3) (2012).
- G. One way for the Navajo Nation to establish and develop judicial infrastructure is to assist with the Dził Yijiin Remodel project.
- H. The Supplemental Funding will be deposited with the Dził Yijiin Remodel; the Program Budget Summary. EXHIBIT A.
- I. The Navajo Nation received certification by the Office of the Controller that as of September 21, 2015 the balance in the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance is \$4,306,679. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L) (2009). EXHIBIT B.
- J. The Navajo Nation received certification by the Office of Management and Budget that the supplemental funding request had a budget impact analysis and other appropriate action. 12 N.N.C. § 820(M) (2009). EXHIBIT C.
- K. The Navajo Nation finds approving this supplemental funding request in the best interest of the Navajo People.

SECTION TWO. ADOPTING AND APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF THREE HUNDRED FORTY THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$340,725) FOR THE DZIL YIJIIN REMODEL, BUSINESS UNIT NUMBER NEW

The Navajo Nation adopts and approves supplemental funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of three hundred forty thousand seven hundred twenty-five dollars (\$340,725) for the Dził Yijiin Remodel, Business Unit Number NEW, to renovate a modular building used by the Dził Yijiin District Court.





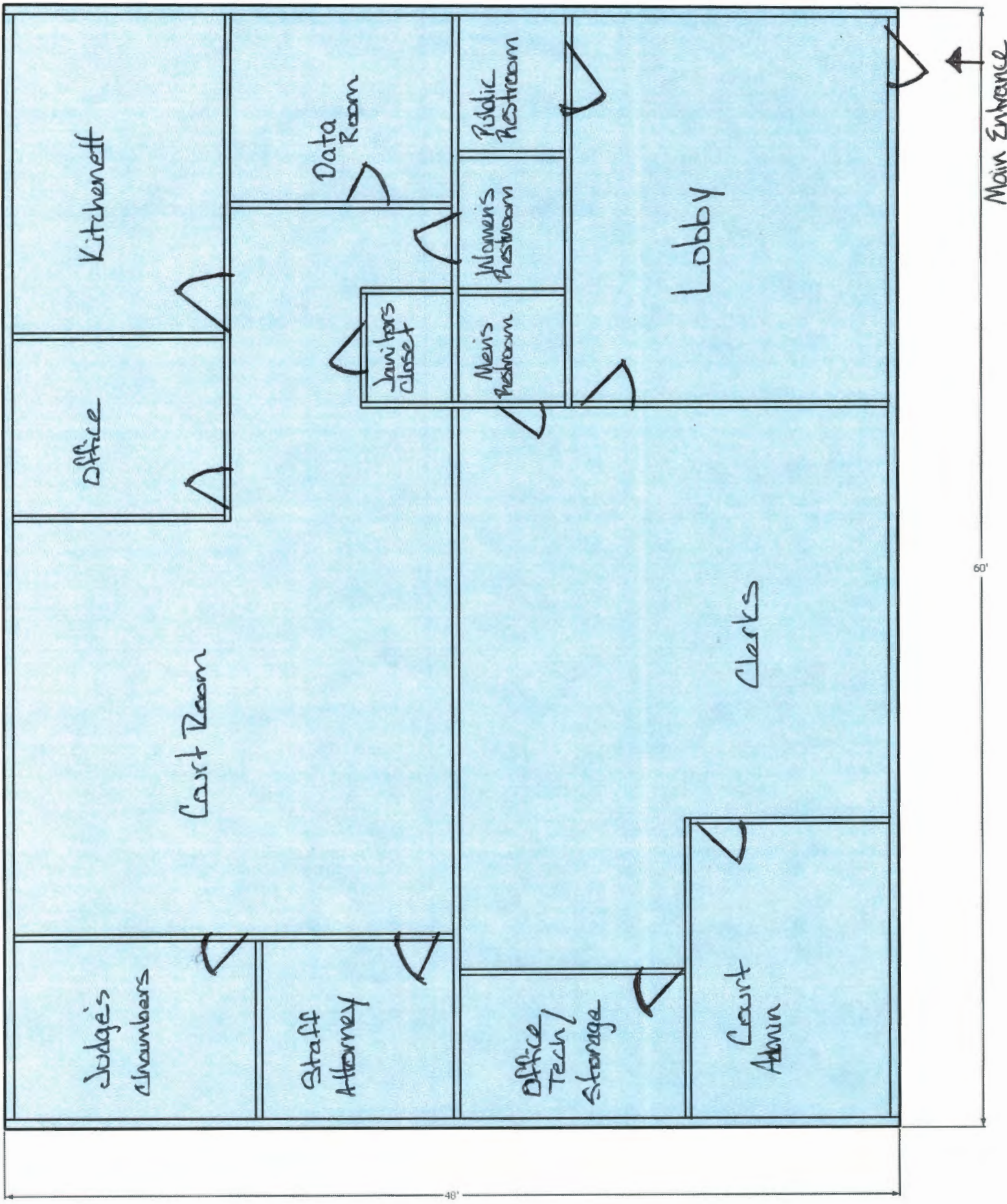

THE DZIL YIJIIN REGIONAL COUNCIL HEREBY SUPPORTS THE DZIL YIJIIN JUDICIAL DISTRICT IN SEEKING EMERGENCY FUNDING FOR THE DZIL YIJIIN JUDICIAL DISTRICT FOR ADEQUATE OFFICE BUILDING. THE DYRC ALSO SUPPORTS THE DISTRICT FOR ADDITIONAL COURT STAFF TO MEET THE NEEDS OF THE PEOPLE THEY SERVE.

WHEREAS: The Dzil Yijiin Regional Council specifically hereby certifies;

- 1. The Dzil Yijiin Judicial District was established on May 2012, has been in operation for three years without a permanent building to provide Court, Probation and Peacemaking Services, currently these services are provided out of a rented building in Whippoorwill which only can hold a limited amount of people with the increasing number of cases; and**
- 2. Dzil Yijiin Courts has moved four times in the past years they have been in operation; first they were located in the Pinon Hogan then Pinon Chapter House, then Pinon Community School, and currently at Whippoorwill.**
- 3. Dzil Yijiin Courts is in dire need of a permanent facility as soon as possible;**
- 4. Dzil Yijiin Court currently has a Judge, Court Administrator, Office Technician, two Court Clerks, one Bailiff, Traditional Program Specialist (Peacemaking), and part time Probation Officer they share with Chinle Courts and this is not fully staff; and**
- 5. Dzil Yijiin Court continues to lack adequate office and communication equipment to make the court run efficiently and effectively.**

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. The Dzil Yijiin Regional Council Members supports the Dzil Yijiin Public Safety and Judiciary Complex efforts and seek funding for a Public Safety and Judiciary Complex.**
- 2. The Dzil Yijiin Regional Council Members supports that the Dzil Yijiin Judicial District to be moved to a #1 priority list.**
- 3. The Dzil Jijiin Regional Council Members request the Law & Order Committee hold a Committee meeting at the Whippoorwill Chapter and tour the Dzil Yijiin Judicial District.**
- 4. The Dzil Yijiin Regional Council Members request the Law & Order Committee make a directive to the Division of Community Development to have Navajo DES complete an assessment cost for the State of Arizona DES building in Whippoorwill for repair to meet OSHA requirements.**
- 5. The Dzil Yijiin Regional Council Members request emergency funding for the Dzil Yijiin Judicial District to acquire adequate office building and communication equipment to help run their courts efficiently and effectively.**
- 6. The Dzil Yijiin Regional Council Members requests emergency funding for the Dzil Yijiin Judicial District for additional court staff to fully staff the Dzil Yijiin Judicial District to meet the needs of people they serve.**

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT



PROPOSING TO THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL JUDICIAL AND PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEES TO IDENTIFY SERVICE BOUNDARY AND ESTABLISH A DZILIJIIN JUDICIAL AND PUBLIC SAFETY DISTRICT.

WHEREAS:

1. Black Mesa Chapter is a Navajo Nation Chapter located in the Former Joint Use Area (JUA) of the Navajo-Hopi Land Dispute, with the vested authority over the general welfare of its members and review/approves all matters affecting the development of the community; and
2. Pursuant to CAP-34-98, the Navajo Nation Council approved the Local Government Act which recognizes Chapter governance at the local level. The Act recognizes governmental authority of the local Chapters with respect to local matters consistent with Navajo Nation law, including custom and tradition.
3. Black Mesa Chapter and the District IV Chapters are diligently in pursuit of establishing a local Public Safety and Judicial Court System by building a 3,200 square feet facility to house a detention center for female and male, law enforcement and court system. The project is in the Design and Engineering Phase by the hired Architects, VCBO.
4. District IV Chapter Communities are in a very unique situation due to its location in the Former Joint Use Area of the Navajo-Hopi Land Dispute for near half a century and was under Federal Freeze, thus, became very federally impacted in all social, economic, education and public safety, law enforcement with court its system. An outcry from local communities became apparent due increased crimes, drug trafficking, substance abuse, gang crimes, etc.
5. District IV Chapter Communities are remote and located on top of DziliYiJiin (Black Mesa), therefore, response time for public safety are over two hours, a day or no response. Local Public Safety and Judicial Systems are essentials due to distances to all Navajo Agency districts.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. Black Mesa Chapter is hereby proposing to the Navajo Nation Council Public Safety and Judicial Committees to identify Service Boundary for the DziliYiJiin Public Safety and Judicial District, and to approve to establish the DziliYiJiin District for Public Safety and Judicial System.
2. **FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** Black Mesa Chapter approved its current Chapter service boundaries to be recommended for the Navajo Nation approval for the newly establish DziliYiJiin District for the Public Safety and Judicial System.

1. Blue Gap/Tachee Chapter is a certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation established and recognized by the Navajo Nation Council as a foundation of the Navajo Nation government vested with the authority to plan and implement projects in the best interests of the community. See generally 2 N.N.C. §4021 et seq. AND 26 N.N.C. S103; and
2. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. S102 (A), the Navajo Nation Council is governing body of the Navajo Nation; and
3. By resolution CAP-34-98, the Navajo Nation Council approved the "Local Governance Act" wherein the Navajo Nation Council delegated governmental authority to the Chapters of the Navajo Nation to address matters of local concern with Navajo Law, custom and tradition; and
4. 





The Judicial Branch is requesting supplemental funding in the amount of \$340,725 from the FY2015 Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance (UUFB) to renovate a 60'x48' modular building for the use by Dził Yijiin Court. The Dził Yijiin Court is currently occupying half of the Regional Business Development Office in Whippoorwill, Arizona, to provide court services. There is inadequate space for current employees or for growth as their caseload increases. A modular building next to the RBDO/ DZ Court has been inspected by Navajo Nation Design and Engineering Services and deemed usable after some remodel of the interior (drywall, flooring, appliances, finish trim), rewiring and plumbing, exterior grading to create positive drainage and access to the modular, etc.

Further detailed information is provided in the attachments. I am requesting a supporting resolution by the Law and Order Committee so it can move forward to the Navajo Nation Budget & Finance Committee for consideration.



The Dzil Yijiin Courts is currently occupying half of the Regional Business Development Office in Whippoorwill to provide court services. There is inadequate space for current employees or for growth as their caseload increases. A modular building next to the RBDO/ DZ Courts has been inspected by Navajo Nation Design and Engineering Services and deemed usable after some remodel of the interior (drywall, flooring, appliances, finish trim), rewiring and plumbing, exterior grading to create positive drainage and access to the modular, etc.

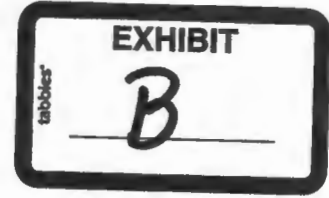



1. The balance in the available UUFB as of December 7, 2015 is \$14,080,043. The initial FY 2016 UUFB was \$18,131,940 but it has been reduced by three(3) appropriations since.
2. The 5-Year Capital Plan, resolution CAP-18-14, lists a Pinon Public Safety Complex project in the total amount of \$2.6 million. We presume the court facility is part of this complex. The DCD-Capital Improvement Office should clarify this.
3. The current request for \$340,725 is to renovate a modular building for the Court.
4. OMB has recently advised the Branch Chiefs to prioritize over 160 Additional Need Proposals in total exceeding \$116 million so that the government can consider priorities. The Dzil Yijiin Court is listed with an additional need for \$50,031 as recommend by the Law and Order Committee by resolution LOCAU-11-15. There is however, no amount requested for construction/renovation – it is for a Court Clerk position.
5. The Law and Order Committee, by resolution LOCAU-11-15, has recommended 14 unmet needs for the Judicial Branch in an amount exceeding \$19 million. This is why Branch Chief prioritization is important.
6. Budget Form 2 is missing.
