TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY; ADOPTING A CONTINUING BUDGET RESOLUTION FOR THE OPERATION OF THE NAVAJO NATION GOVERNMENT; BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2015 AND ENDING NO LATER THAN MARCH 31, 2016; WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §840(B)

**PURPOSE:** This resolution, if approved, will adopt a continuing resolution to ensure the continued operation of the Navajo Nation government and waive 12 N.N.C. §840(B) regarding the adoption of a comprehensive budget.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed resolution in detail.

MARCH 31, 2016; WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §840(B)

#### BE IT ENACTED:

#### Section 1. Findings

- A. The Navajo Nation Council hereby finds that the current lack of an adopted Navajo Nation Fiscal Year 2016 budget resolution constitutes an emergency for purposes of 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(16) due to the impending cessation of law enforcement services, disaster relief services, and fire protection services which would result from the lack of a Navajo Nation Fiscal Year 2016 budget resolution.
- B. Navajo Nation law provides a choice of law provision wherein Navajo courts may, in the absence of Navajo statutory laws and regulations or Diné bi beenahaz'áanii, apply federal laws or regulations as applicable, 7 N.N.C. §204; similarly in the absence of a provision for a continuing resolution the Navajo Nation Council may look to federal laws or regulations for guidance.
- C. The federal process for appropriations contains the provision for a continuing resolution defined as "An appropriation act that provides budget authority for federal agencies, specific activities, or both to continue in operation when Congress and the President have not completed action on regular appropriation acts by the beginning of

- the fiscal year." Principles of Federal Appropriations Law, Third Edition, General Accounting Office, Jan. 2004, Chapter 8.
- D. The Navajo Nation Council determined the need to commence further study and consideration of a Fiscal Year 2016 budget. To allow for further detailed examination of the needs of the Navajo Nation, the Navajo Nation Council hereby finds it is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation to enact a Continuing Resolution.

#### Section 2. Approval of Continuing Resolution

- A. The Navajo Nation Council hereby resolves that all Navajo Nation Government divisions, departments, offices, programs and Navajo Nation Chapters shall receive 1/2 of their Original Navajo Nation FY 2015 general fund, proprietary fund, and fiduciary fund allocations, for operation of the Navajo Nation Government beginning October 1, 2015 and ending no later than March 31, 2016 in accord with the Navajo Nation Council Resolution CS-46-14, as amended. The Continuing Budget Resolution amounts shall be based on 100% (one hundred percent) of the final Navajo Nation approved Fiscal Year 2015 Budget amounts in order that there is consistency between this Continuing Budget Resolution amounts and the Fiscal Year 2015 General Revenue Fund projections, excluding supplemental appropriations made in Fiscal Year 2015
- B. In order for the continuing resolution budgets to be entered into the Financial Management and Information System (FMIS), all Navajo Nation programs and Chapters shall submit continuing resolution budgets to the Office of Management and Budget at the level of funding stated in paragraph number two (2) above by September 29, 2015
- C. The Navajo Nation Council directs the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council to convene a special session no later than twenty (20) days before the end of the Continuing Resolution period for the exclusive purpose of consideration and adoption of the proposed Navajo Nation Fiscal Year 2016 Comprehensive Budget.
- D. The Branch Chiefs, in conjunction with the Office of the Controller and the Office of Management and Budget, shall issue any necessary instructions for the proper

implementation of this Continuing Budget Resolution, including all expenditures as required by statute, contract or government policy, including but not limited to Risk Management, scholarship, school clothing, employee insurance, retirement, match fund requirements and higher education.

E. The Navajo Nation Council hereby waives 12 N.N.C. §840 (B) pertaining to the adoption of a comprehensive twelve month budget in order that this Continuing Budget Resolution be adopted. This waiver shall cease to be in effect upon adoption of the Navajo Nation Comprehensive Budget for Fiscal Year 2016.

#### Section Three. Effective Date

The action is effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §221(B).
