PURPOSE: If approved, this resolution will approve supplemental funding in the amount of \$400,000.00 from the Unreserved Undesignated Fund Balance for the Bond and Bond Business Site Redevelopment Project and will waive the Capital Improvement Process.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

The Navajo Nation established the Budget and Finance Committee (BFC) as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered BFC to 28 review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the management of all 29 funds. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 300 (A), 301 (B)(2). 30

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C. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation standing committee and as such proposed legislation that requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 700 (A).

SECTION TWO. TITLE 12 FINANCE ACT SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION PROCESS AND THE TITLE 12 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROCESS

- A. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:
 - 1. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), when the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be allocated by the Navajo Nation Council.
 - 2. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L), "Supplemental appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at § 820 (F). The Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for designating recurring and non-recurring revenues and purposes."
 - 3. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M), all requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for budget impact analysis.
- B. The Title 12 Capital Improvement Process includes:
 - 1. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 810(F), "Capital Improvement" means a major project undertaken by the Navajo Nation that is generally not recurring on an annual basis and which fits within one or more of the following categories:
 - (1) All projects requiring debt obligation or borrowing;
 - (2) Any acquisition or lease of land;
 - (3) Purchase of major equipment or vehicles, with a life expectancy of five years or more, valued in excess of an amount to be established by the Controller;

- (4) Major building improvements that are not routine maintenance expenses and that substantially enhance the value or extend the useful life of a structure:
- (5) Construction of new buildings or facilities including engineering, design, and other pre-construction costs with an estimated cost in excess of an amount to be determined by the Controller; and/or
- (6) Major equipment or furnishing required to furnish new buildings or other projects, the cost of which is above a certain amount to be established by the Controller.
- 2. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (I), the "[d]evelopment of the Capital Budget shall be coordinated with development of the Operating Budget. All budget requests for capital improvements shall be in compliance with an adopted Capital Improvement Plan and shall not be approved unless in compliance with the Plan."
- 3. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (M), the Office of Management and Budget shall coordinate the overall preparation, adoption and implementation of both the annual operating and capital budgets of the Navajo Nation. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget for budget impact analysis and other appropriate action.
- 4. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 501 (B)(4)(c), the Resources and Development Committee is to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council through the appropriate process supplemental appropriations to the capital improvement projects annual budget to fund necessary additional capital improvement projects.
- 5. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 860 (C)(2) "[t]he appropriation portion of the Capital Improvement Plan is subject to approval of the Navajo Nation Council upon recommendation of the Budget and Finance Committee. Any modification or amendment affecting the approved Capital Improvement Plan is subject to

review and concurrence by the Resources and Development Committee prior to consideration by the Navajo Nation Council."

SECTION THREE. FINDINGS

- A. This is a funding request for a supplemental appropriation from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of \$400,000. See Exhibit A.
- B. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 810(F), the Bond and Bond Business Site Redevelopment Project is considered a capital improvement project due to the long-term forecast that the site will be used for commercial development.
- C. The Bond and Bond Business Site Redevelopment Project is not included in the Title 12 Capital Improvement Plan because the Capital Improvement Plan was rescinded by Navajo Nation Council by CAP-23-17.
- D. Pursuant to the 2018 Budget Instructions Manual Section XIV. B., the supplemental funding request budget forms are attached as **Exhibit B**.
- E. The Office of Management and Budget has completed a Budget Impact Analysis of the Bond and Bond Business Site Redevelopment Project pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M) and is attached as **Exhibit C**.
- F. The Office of the Controller has provided a memorandum dated October 18, 2017, indicating the balance in the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as of September 8, 2017 is \$31,258,217. This memorandum is provided to meet the requirements of 12 N.N.C, 820 (L). The Controller of the Navajo Nation has designated the funds as non-recurring. This memorandum is attached as **Exhibit D**.
- G. Pursuant to Executive Order 07-2013, the Executive Review/164 Process must be completed for requests originating in the Executive Branch. The Legislative 164 Review Process is attached as **Exhibit E**.
- H. The Navajo Nation finds it in the best interest of the Navajo people to approve this supplemental appropriation request and to waive the Capital Budget and Capital Improvement Plan requirements as stated in 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(I) and 860 (C) regarding Bond and Bond Business Site Redevelopment Project.

SECTION FOUR. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$400,000 FOR THE BOND AND BOND BUSINESS SITE REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the supplemental appropriation from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to Navajo Nation Small Business Development Department for the Bond and Bond Business Site Redevelopment Project.
- B. This supplemental appropriation of \$400,000.00 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller and to the new business unit number assigned to the Round Rock Trading Post Business Site Redevelopment Project.

SECTION FIVE. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(I) AND 860 (C) REGARDING THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROCESS

The Navajo Nation Council hereby waives 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(I) and 860(C) with regard to the Capital Improvement process and the Bond and Bond Business Site Redevelopment Project. The waiver of 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(I) and 860(C) includes submittal of the Capital Project to the Capital Project Management Department for review, guidance and advice or the requirements pursuant to TCDCJY-77-99 regarding the Capital Improvement Projects Guidelines Policies and Procedures.

SECTION SIX. EFFECTIVE DATE

The provisions of this Act shall become effective in accord with 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).

The project's estimated cost is: \$1,455,000

SUMMARY DEMOLITION PROJECT FORMER BOND & BOND BUILDINGS Shiprock, New Mexico

The project will consisted of an assessment and demolition of former decaying buildings located in Shiprock, New Mexico. The buildings were built on a business site lease containing 2.59 acres, more or less under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Indians Affairs. There are three buildings location on site, one is considered a former trading post, then came the other two buildings, the two building were built after the trading post and consist of approximately 10, 790 square feet.

The project scope also includes the disposal of possible asbestos remediation of contaminated floor titles and roof. The objectives of the project were to demolition buildings on the property and make the land site available for future reuse of land for prime commercial development.

Proposed project cost is estimated at \$400,000.00, this will involve assessment of possible hazardous materials, demolition of existing buildings on the property and land improvements for future development of prime commercial property.

a. Bond & Bond Business Site Redevelopment.........\$400,000
b. Jim Business Site Redevelopment.......\$2,215,000
c. Round Rock Trading Post Business Site Redevelopment.......\$400,000
d. Chee's Store Business Site Redevelopment.......\$1,455,000

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) has reviewed the above packet and provides the following:

- 1. Because of the limited availability of funds, OMB advises the Branch Chiefs to prioritize all supplemental funding proposals pursuant to the FY 2018 Budget Resolution CS-53-17 (paragraph 'L'), the FY 2018 Budget Instructions Manual (Section XIV), and the Appropriations Act. This activity should be completed by the three branches to determine priorities.
- 2. OMB recommends compliance with the Navajo Nation Appropriations Act regarding Supplemental Appropriations (Section 820, L). This has not been done. Compliance includes:
 - a. Branch Chief's concurrence of the supplemental request (NN President).
 - b. Non-recurring expenses only.
 - c. The supplemental Funding Proposal Summary (Appendix K, FY 18 BIM)
- 3. The Budget Instructions Manual states that Supplemental Funding request for Capital Projects shall be submitted to DCD-Capital Project Management Department (CPMD) for review, guidance, and advice. There is no indication that this was done.
- 4. The Appropriations Act, at 12 NNC 820 (I), requires that the capital outlay comply with an adopted Capital Plan. Currently, there is no approved Capital Plan.
- 5. Corrections need to be made to the proposed budgets. The proposed budget for Jim Business Site Redevelopment, Project Form 3, indicated \$320,000 but does not calculate into the budget amount. This needs to be reviewed and amounts recalculated.

The document as submitted is deemed "insufficient" for the reasons listed above. If there are any further questions contact me at extension 6230.

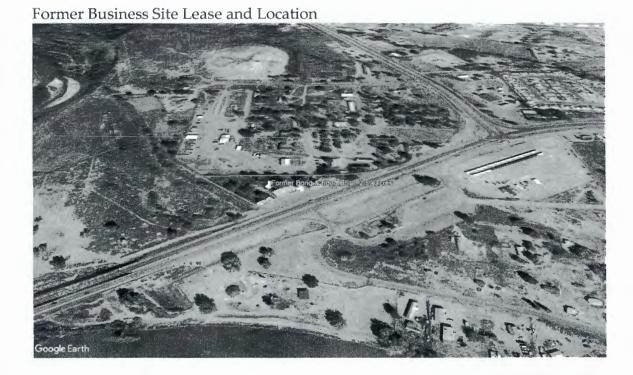

SUMMARY DEMOLITION PROJECT FORMER BOND & BOND BUILDINGS Shiprock, New Mexico

The project will consisted of an assessment and demolition of former decaying buildings located in Shiprock, New Mexico. The buildings were built on a business site lease containing 2.59 acres, more or less under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Indians Affairs. There are three buildings location on site, one is considered a former trading post, then came the other two buildings, the two building were built after the trading post and consist of approximately 10, 790 square feet.

The project scope also includes the disposal of possible asbestos remediation of contaminated floor titles and roof. The objectives of the project were to demolition buildings on the property and make the land site available for future reuse of land for prime commercial development.

Proposed project cost is estimated at \$400,000.00, this will involve assessment of possible hazardous materials, demolition of existing buildings on the property and land improvements for future development of prime commercial property.

The un-audited balance of the UUFB is \$10,073,560 as of April 11, 2018; there are a number of other supplemental requests that will be considered by the Navajo Nation Council in the near future. This supplemental request is for \$400,000 which for an assessment and demolition of former decaying buildings for the Bond and Bond Business Site Redevelopment project. Also please be reminded that the UUFB balance is unaudited and is subject to change pending the completion of the FY 2017 audit.
- 2. The costs for this project we determined are NON-RECURRING costs.
- 3. Important Note: Our office is currently monitoring the Nation's actual minerals revenue to-date versus the projected revenues for FY 2018. Additionally, our office has started the revenue projection task for the upcoming 2019 operating budgets. Being that minerals revenue levels are decreasing, we recommend the Nation spend the UUFB in a prudent and conservative manner for these reasons The Navajo Nation actual minerals revenue to date vs. the projection for FY 2018 is a real concern going forward as well as for the upcoming Fiscal 2019 therefore is this type of spending prudent as there may be possible shortfall in revenue in the near future which would affect the UUFB.

I am pleased to present to you the following information related to General Fund financial data up to January 31, 2018.

The General Fund Financial data is as follows:

The gross General Fund Revenues (see Exhibit "A") as of January 31, 2018 is \$99,205,877, and the total set asides total \$33,057,058. The Net Revenue for the General Fund is \$66,148,819, which is 44.45% of the projection.

The total expenditures by branch are shown on Exhibit "B".

- The Legislative Branch has expenditures of \$4,736,197, encumbrances of \$540,894 with a remaining budget of \$11,563,745.
- The Executive Branch expenditures are \$60,501,243 encumbrances are \$5,813,170 with a remaining budget of \$109,189,810.
- The Judicial Branch expenditures are \$3,933,787 with zero encumbrances and remaining budget of \$9,914,134.
- Total General Fund expenditures are \$69,171,228; total encumbrances are \$6,354,064 with an overall remaining budget of \$130,667,690.

The updated UUFB as of February 14, 2018 is \$27,717,798 (see Exhibit "C"). There have been two supplemental appropriations during Fiscal Year 2018 in the total amount of \$3,909,557.
