Subject: Recommendations for Legislation: 4.1 Million Capital Outlay Projects

Ya'at eeh! The following listing is a recommendation of topics for the legislation regarding the process for the chapter's capital projects that have been identified. These recommendations will assist the project management aspect and provide consideration to on-going preparation for capital projects to become construction ready within the communities.

Recommendation 1: Funds Availability

Office Of Management & Budget and Office of Controller make funds immediately available by June 1, 2018, as a directive by Council, for projects that have been identified to be completed in the first year.

Recommendation 2: Project Balance

A – The Chapter will identify a new construction ready project for unspent or remaining funds from their completed project.

B – If a Chapter, within the same district, does not have any construction ready projects, the remaining balance can be redistributed to another chapter within the same district.

C – If there are unspent monies remaining in a district, the remaining balance will return to the Sihasin Funds.

NEED

The Mariano Lake Multi-Purpose Building will address the need of adequate space for the entire community members. Presently, there are over 2000 residents residing in Mariano Lake between the ages of 0 to 91. 35% are Seniors, 40% are adults and the remaining 25% are youth. There are over 48 Veterans residing within the community. There is an average 112 count participation of seniors involved in the Senior Citizen activities and neighboring Senior Centers. Data is based on the Mariano Lake Chapter's Community Land Use Plan- Update Project. Annually, the Chapter employs over 90 youth students completing projects such as weaving, sewing, crafts, carpentry i.e. building picnic tables, cooking cultural foods and many more, including conducting youth activities/events, as well as an annual youth day focusing on health, communication, encouragement, culture, and educational values. The Chapter provides community sessions, classes, and workshops with USDA, NHA, OEHE, NTUA, CDEC, TANF, Work Force, Churches, Non-Profits, and many more to serve the community, Including infrastructure needs and community meetings. There are also annual celebrations such as the Annual Treaty Day Celebration with a participation count of over 500 people, and other annual activities such as the Veterans Parade & Events, Community Holiday Celebrations, and more. In the community, there is also a Headstart and BIE School starting from the Face Program to Sixth Grade, which shows the need for community involvement programs for youth participants. Mariano Lake is an active community year round, and during extreme weather conditions, the community facility is a crucial facility to provide assistance and services. The existing Chapter House is in need of repair and is insufficient in providing the amount of space needed for all activities including the future growth of services to be offered to the community, to enhance the quality of life to the community members. The community members are in full support to transition the existing chapter building to a multi-purpose facility, through a full renovation and addition to meet the need of adequate space for a community cafeteria, library, computer lab, senior citizen activity room, veterans activity room, Community Health Representative Office, Staff Offices and an improved meeting room with a concession room.

BENEFITS

The construction for renovation and addition will create a safe space for the community to gather while providing a venue for the improvement of the community; and improve the support and resources to all the community members through a more organized and sufficient space to all ages and participants during their classes, workshops, job fairs, training, meetings, and more.

A community cafeteria will provide for the Seniors, Veterans, and community members on a year round basis to reduce the traveling to neighboring centers and improve the goal of healthy eating habits through a healthy menu.

A renovated meeting room with concession area and sufficient technology will increase the knowledge retention for all community

meetings/activities/events/workshops/classes, etc. to provide better training and communication.

A Veterans activity room will assist their need for privacy during their counseling sessions, trainings and activities, including sufficient space for their storage of specific needs.

A Senior Citizens Activity room will assist their specific need or request for their services/trainings/activities.

A library and computer lab with access to the internet will enhance education, participation, engaging and job search.

Improved offices for the Staff and the Community Health Representative will provide a more properly structured and organized operation for the administrative functions to address all the needs and requests of our children, teenagers, adults and elders.

PROJECT READINESS

The preliminary planning for this project began with community workshops starting in September 2015. In conclusion to the workshops, the community members decided to renovate the existing building and transition to a Multi-Purpose Building that will assist with providing a community cafeteria, library, computer lab, offices and improved meeting room, to fully meet the provisions of services from the youth to seniors. The intent of the multi-purpose building is to be fully prepared for operation and maintenance in one large unit, rather than provide separate buildings with higher costs of operation and maintenance, and most importantly, to meet a more realistic and feasible cost for the community. The community input has been provided from the beginning and is to continue throughout until the completion of the project.

In 2016, the New Mexico Capital Outlay awarded \$120,000.00 but after deducting the amount for Arts In Public Places, the allocation became \$118,800.00 for planning and design. Mariano Lake Chapter provided matching funds in the total amount of \$172,455.66 for the planning and designing of the project. Having to properly meet all Governmental requirements with the Navajo Nation and State of New Mexico, the selection and contracting of an architect firm was approved and finalized on February 22, 2018. The selecting Architect Firm is Indigenous Design Studio & Architecture, LLC. The first project meeting was conducted on March 1, 2018, and the entire Team has strongly begun the project.

The design will be completed by June 2018, which will make the project construction ready. The design process includes site feasibility/ programming/ schematic design, design development and construction documents. A full set of Construction Documents and specification will be ready for General Contractors to bid on the future Multi-Purpose building of Mariano Lake.

The design will be finalized and approved by community members in June 2018, therefore the funds for construction are vital to secure and complete this project. The program of spaces allocated for the addition to the facility total approximately 9,000 SF of space. This facility will play a major role in educating the entire community members from providing child development classes to home improvement or renewable

energy workshops, and training for improved employment possibilities, including so much more with the implementation of all the current classes.

Components the project will complete

\$375/sf of New Construction for Addition of 6,900 SF.

\$325/sf of Renovation of Existing Chapter of 2,100 SF.

And 40% construction increase for the isolation location factor and Navajo Nation Sales Tax @ 5%, resulting to the total construction cost with tax in the amount of \$4,806,900.00.

The funds used will be to complete the CONSTRUCTION of renovation and addition for the new facility.

There is no Air Conditioning for the summer heat. The restrooms have no heat and are cold year round, and plumbing is out-dated. There are no shower facilities in case of community emergencies. The meeting facility is either very cold during the winter or to meet records safety and storage. The kitchen meets basic Office Of Environmental Health Requirements, but does not meet overall Full services are difficult to provide because of the existing building condition, which has poor weatherization and is hugely affected by the changing seasons. The present heating system is not adequate and does not provide sufficient heating during inclement weather. very hot during the summer and is in extreme need of renovation.

Full services are difficult to provide because of the existing building condition, which has poor weatherization and is hugely affected by the changing seasons. The present heating system is not adequate and does not provide sufficient heating during inclement weather. There no shower facilities in case of community emergencies. The space is small and limited for the chapter administration making it difficult to requirements to provide meals for the Seniors and youth, per the regulations. The meeting facility is either very cold during the winter or is no Air Conditioning for the summer heat. The restrooms have no heat and are cold year round, and plumbing is out-dated. There are meet records safety and storage. The kitchen meets basic Office Of Environmental Health Requirements, but does not meet overall very hot during the summer and is in extreme need of renovation.
