**DATE:** June 13, 2018

**PURPOSE:** The purpose of this legislation is to oppose the budget cuts proposed by the Trump Administration in the area of Education.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate review the proposed resolution in detail.

19	A. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee (HEHSC) is a standing
20	committee of the Navajo Nation Council. The Committee is empowered to review
21	and recommend resolutions regarding certain matters, including health, education and
22	social services. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 400 (A), 401 (B)(6)(a) (2012); see also C0-
23	45-12.
24	B. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council.
25	Among other duties and responsibilities, it "coordinate[s] all federal, county and state
26	programs with other standing committees and branches of the Navajo Nation
27	government to provide the most efficient delivery of services to the Navajo Nation. 2

- C. The Trump Administration is proposing budget cuts to Post-Secondary programs in the amount of \$42 million including elimination of all funds in Scholarship and Adult Education. See Exhibit A.
- D. The Navajo Nation receives approximately \$11 million of scholarship and adult education funds, the rest being distributed to other tribes.
- E. Twenty-eight (28) positions within the Navajo Scholarship Office would be eliminated under these proposed budget cuts. The Navajo Nation would have to fully fund any continuation of the scholarship Office under these reductions.
- F. Other proposed cuts and eliminations include Special Higher Education Scholarships at \$2,972,000; Science Post Graduate Scholarship Funds at \$2,433,000; Johnson O'Malley at \$14,678 TPA funding. See Exhibit A.
- G. The Navajo Nation finds it to be in the best interest of the students and families of the Nation to oppose these proposed cuts in education as found at Exhibit A.
- H. The Navajo Nation finds it to be in the best interest of the Diné to direct that the President of the Navajo Nation, the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council and the Navajo Nation Washington Office coordinate their efforts in opposing the implementation of these proposed budget cuts.

# Therefore Be It Resolved

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby opposes the proposed budget cuts by the Trump administration in these areas of education as found at Exhibit A.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby directs the President of the Navajo Nation, the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council and the Navajo Nation Washington Office to coordinate their efforts in opposing the implementation of these proposed budget cuts.

The Office of Navajo Nation Scholarship and Financial Assistance distributed the attached press release today. Please forward to appropriate officials. It is about the Trump administration's proposal to eliminate funding for several education-related programs including the Higher Education Grant Program.

• Thousands of undergraduate scholarships would be lost as federal funds are the primary source for these awards.

• Twenty-eight positions within the Navajo scholarship office would be eliminated as P.L. 93-638 funds are used for personnel and operating costs.

• The Navajo Nation would have to fully fund any effort to continue the scholarship office and serve the thousands of students who apply for scholarships annually.

- Also, thousands of students would be without aid from Johnson O Malley programs.
- · Major cuts also are proposed for tribal colleges and universities.

The ONNSFA budget is within Post-Secondary Programs. (I've attached a table summarizing the Trump administration's proposed budget,) Overall, proposed cuts to Post-Secondary programs are \$42,606,000 with elimination of all funds in Scholarship and Adult Education. Cuts to Scholarship and Adult Education amount to \$34,547,000. The Navajo Nation receives about \$11 million of scholarship and adult education funds and the rest goes to other tribes. Other budget eliminations include: Special Higher Education Scholarship s-\$2,972,000. The American Indian Graduate Center administers these funds; and Science Post Graduate Scholarship Funds -\$2,433,000 and Johnson O'Malley \$14,678 TPA funding.
