### RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 25<sup>th</sup> NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - FIRST YEAR, 2023

### AN ACTION

RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYATI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OF MS. SHARON WARREN TO THE COMMISSION ON NAVAJO GOVERNMENT DEVELOPMENT FOR A TERM OF FOUR (4) YEARS AS THE FORT DEFIANCE AGENCY COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVE

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee has legislative oversight authority over the Commission on Navajo Government Development and the Office of Navajo Government Development. 2 N.N.C. § 970.
- B. The Naabik'íyáti Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council which is empowered to recommend all resolutions to the Navajo Nation Council on matters within the Committee's jurisdiction pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §§ 700(A), 701(A)(3).
- C. The Navajo Nation Council confirms appointments to the Commission on Navajo Government Development. 2 N.N.C. § 972(A)(5).

#### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Commission on Navajo Government Development is a special entity created by the Navajo Nation Council with quasiindependent authority to accomplish the People's project of instituting reforms necessary to ensure an accountable and responsible government. 2 N.N.C. § 970.
- B. The Commission consists of twelve (12) members confirmed by and serving at the pleasure of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 972(A).
- C. Five (5) members shall be nominated from the five (5) agencies of the Navajo Nation. Each agency council shall nominate one (1) member from recommendations to be submitted by chapters in each agency, said nominee shall be either Chapter officers, local Government/Governance Commissioners, Grazing Committee/Land Board members, or school board members. These members shall serve a term of four (4) years from the date of

confirmation by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 972(A)(5).

- D. Commission members shall be chosen from among individuals who have demonstrated scholarship, a strong sense of civic interest, knowledge of Dine' history and cultural heritage, spiritual leadership, leadership in the Navajo government and abilities likely to contribute to the fulfillment of the duties of the commission. 2 N.N.C. § 972(D).
- E. The Navajo Nation Fort Defiance Agency Council nominated and recommended Ms. Sharon Warren to serve on the Commission on Navajo Government Development pursuant to Resolution No. FDAC 04-23-001, attached as Exhibit A, to fill the Fort Defiance Agency Council Representative position.
- F. Ms. Sharon Warren's letter of interest and resumé are attached as Exhibit B.

SECTION THREE. CONFIRMATION OF MS. SHARON WARREN

The Navajo Nation hereby confirms the appointment of Ms. Sharon Warren as the Fort Defiance Agency Council Representative, to the Commission on Navajo Government Development, for a term of four (4) years from the date of confirmation by the Navajo Nation Council.

## **RESOLUTION OF THE FORT DEFIANCE AGENCY COUNCIL**

## REQUESTING THE 25TH NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL TO AFFIRM THE APPOINTMENT OF SHARRON WARREN OF COYOTE CANYON CHAPTER AS THE FORT DEFIANCE AGENCY REPRESENTATIVE TO THE COMMISSION OF NAVAJO GOVERNMENT DEVELOPMENT

### WHEREAS;

1. The Fort Defiance Agency Chapters encompass twenty-seven (27) of 110 Chapters officially recognized as Navajo Nation communities, they are Cornfields, Coyote Canyon, Crystal, Dilkon, Fort Defiance, Ganado, Houck, Indian Wells, Jeddito, Kinlichee, Klagetoh, Low Mountain, Lower Greasewood, Lupton, Mexican Springs, Naschitti, Nahata Dzil, Oak Springs, Red Lake #18, Sawmill, St. Michaels, Steamboat, Teesto, Tohatchi, Twin Lakes, Whitecone and Wide Ruins; and

2. The Fort Defiance Agency Council serves as a local governing body to address local community needs, analyze, and recommend consensus effective and efficient plan of action(s) to the Navajo Nation, County, State and/or Federal government; and

3. The Fort Defiance Agency Council comprise of elected Chapter Officials, Governance Commissioners, Grazing Officials, Land / Farm Board, School Board Members and Board of Election Supervisors; and

4. The Fort Defiance Agency Council; and confirms the appointment of Sharron Warren to the Commission of Navajo Government Development; and

5. The Fort Defiance Agency Council recognizes that pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §§ 970 and 971(1)(2), the Commission on Navajo Government Development ("Commission") was established as a special entity with quasi-independent authority to accomplish the Council's project of instituting reforms necessary to ensure an accountable and responsible government; and

6. The Fort Defiance Agency Council recognizes that five members shall be nominated from the five agencies of the Navajo Nation. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 972(A)(5), each agency council shall nominate one member whom is qualified to serve on the Commission on Navajo Government Development; ["Each Agency Council shall nominate one member from recommendations to be submitted by chapters in each agency; nominees shall be either Chapter Officers or Grazing Committee / Land Board Members. These members shall serve a term of four (4) years, from the date of confirmation by the Navajo Nation Council so long as they continue as a chapter officer or as a Grazing Committee / Land Board member ". (Emphasis added.)]; and

7. The Fort Defiance Agency Council has every confidence in Commissioner Sharron Warren to be Fort Defiance Agency's voice and vote on any government reform matters – acknowledging and learning from Navajo traditions in the quest for genuine and suitable government reform; and

8. The Fort Defiance Agency Council seeks to ensure the Commission of Navajo Government Development upholds tribal government, including local Navajo Chapter governments, as an important and unique element of our Native culture and tradition with the inherent power to self-govern.

### NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Fort Defiance Agency Council hereby strongly supports and affirms Sharron Warren of Coyote Canyon Chapter as the Fort Defiance Agency Representative to the Commission on Navajo Government Development.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** the Fort Defiance Agency Council calls upon the Fort Defiance Council Delegates, Honorable Lomardo Aseret, Honorable Vince R. James, Honorable Seth Damon, Honorable Brenda Jesus, Honorable Dr. Andy Nez, Honorable Nathan Notah, and Honorable Cherilyn Yazzie, of the 25th Navajo Nation Council to stand strong and united with the Fort Defiance Agency in the appointment of Sharron to the Commission of Navajo Government Development.

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** the Fort Defiance Agency Council calls upon the 25th Navajo Nation Council to take proper action to confirm Sharron Warren as the Fort Defiance Agency representative on the Commission of Navajo Government Development.
