TITLE OF RESOLUTION: PROPOSED STANDING COMMITTEE RESOLUTION, AN ACTION RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT; AMENDING RDCD-97-18 TO ALLOW WAIVER OF 100% RIGHT-OF-WAY CONSIDERATION TO THE NONPROFIT ELECTRIC UTILITY COMPANIES PROVIDING SERVICE TO THE NAVAJO RESIDENTS ON NAVAJO TRUST LANDS ON THE EASTERN NAVAJO AGENCY

PURPOSE: The purpose of this legislation is to amend RDCD-97-18 such that non-profit electric utility companies that provide service to Navajo residents on Navajo Trust land in the Eastern Navajo Agency may be afforded a waiver of one hundred percent (100%) of the right-of-way consideration.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

Navajo Trust land in the Eastern Navajo Agency may be provided one hundred percent (100%) waiver of the right-of-way consideration because these companies are serving the needs of Navajo residents. See the Eastern Navajo Land Commission through resolution ENLCMY-02-19 attached as **Exhibit B**.

SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby amends RDCD-97-18 SECTION THREE. APPROVAL as follows:

The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby limits the waiver of utility right-of-way consideration to up to fifty (50) percent of the total consideration except instances of pre-existing contracts and agreements stating otherwise and except regarding non-profit electric utility companies that provide service to Navajo residents on Navajo Trust land in the Eastern Navajo Agency for which one hundred percent (100%) of the right-of-way consideration may be waived.





RESOLUTION OF THE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE 23rd Navajo Nation Council --- Fourth Year, 2018

AN ACTION

RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE; APPROVING A LIMIT OF THE WAIVER OF RIGHT-OF-WAY CONSIDERATION OF UP TO FIFTY PERCENT (50%) OF THE ASSESSED CONSIDERATION

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

A. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 501 (B) (2), the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has authority to give final approval of all land withdrawals, non-mineral leases, permits, licenses, rights-of-way, surface easements and bonding requirements on Navajo Nation lands and unrestricted (fee) land. This authority shall include subleases, modifications, assignments, leasehold encumbrances, transfers include, renewals, and terminations.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Resources and Development Committee receives many requests from utility companies seeking one hundred percent (100%) waivers of payment of right-of-way consideration.
- B. Right-of-way consideration fees generate substantial income for the Navajo Nation which is used to fund Navajo Nation programs for the Navajo People. With the anticipated closure of the Navajo Generating Station, the Navajo Nation will more urgently rely upon funds raised from right-of-way consideration. Because of the obligation to fund Navajo Nation programs, it is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation to limit the waiver of right-of-way consideration.
- The Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) § 169.110 (a) (1)(2)(3) provides that the Navajo Nation may negotiate its right-of-way compensation, not require valuation of the right-of-way and authorize that it "[h]as determined that accepting such agreed-upon compensation and waiving valuation is in its best interest".

D. The Navajo Nation has agreement to waive consideration with the United States Bureau of Reclamation for the Navajo-Gallup Water Supply project. Limiting the waiver of consideration will not apply to these type of agreements between the Navajo Nation and the federal government.

SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

A. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby limits the waiver of utility right-of-way consideration to up fifty (50) percent of the total consideration except instances of pre-existing contracts and agreements stating otherwise.



RESOLUTION OF THE EASTERN NAVAJO LAND COMMISSION

Recommending to the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council
that It Amends Its Resolution No. RDCD-97-18 to Waive All Consideration in Connection
with Its Approvals of Rights-of-Way on Navajo Nation Trust Lands for Non-Profit
Electric Utilities Companies Providing Service to Navajo Residents in the
Eastern Navajo Agency

WHEREAS:

- 1. The Eastern Navajo Land Commission (the "Commission") is established as a Commission of the Navajo Nation Council charged with, among other things, coordinating Navajo efforts with respect to Eastern Navajo Agency land-related matters in dealings with private interests in legislative settings, 2 N.N.C. § 862; and
- 2. It is well known that many of the Navajo residents in the Eastern Navajo Agency lack electrical service, to the detriment of their health and safety and the educational achievements of the affected Navajo children; and
- 3. The Navajo Tribal Utility Authority ("NTUA") was established as a wholly-owned Navajo Nation enterprise to provide electrical service to Navajo tribal members, but NTUA does not provide electrical service within the Eastern Navajo Agency; and
- 4. Electrical service to the Eastern Navajo Agency is provided by five companies, primarily by the Continental Divide Electrical Cooperative, Inc. ("CDEC") or the Jemez Mountain Electrical Cooperative, Inc. ("Jemez"), and secondarily by Gallup Joint Utilities, Farmington Electric Utility System, and Socorro Electric Cooperative; and
- 5. Recently, both CDEC and Jemez received approval from the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, which Committee has authority to approve grants of rights-of-way, by Resolutions Nos. RDCAP-008-19 (Apr. 24, 2019) and RDCAP-007-19 (Apr. 24, 2019), both of which resolutions approved the grant of twenty-year rights-of-way, waived the requirement for the utilities to post a bond or other security, and waived 50% of the monetary consideration that would normally be required; and
- 6. CDEC and Jemez are both non-profit electrical cooperatives that must recoup their costs, including right-of-way costs, from their ratepayers; thus, the Navajo ratepayers in most of the Eastern Navajo Agency bear right-of-way costs that are not imposed on Navajo ratepayers by NTUA, which is fully exempted by Navajo law from such right-of-way consideration; and
- 7. The Commission has considered all aspects of this matter and has concluded that it should respectfully recommend to the Resources and Development Committee that the Committee amend its Resolution No. RDCD-97-18 (Dec. 17, 2018) to permit a waiver of 100% of the right-of-way consideration for easements over Navajo Nation land sought by non-profit utility companies to serve Navajo residents in the Eastern Navajo Agency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Eastern Navajo Agency Council hereby respectfully recommends to the Resources and Development Committee that it amends its Resolution No. RDCD-97-18 to waive all consideration in connection with its approvals of rights-of-way on Navajo Nation Trust lands for non-profit electric utilities companies providing service to Navajo residents in the Eastern Navajo Agency.
