PURPOSE: This resolution, if approved, will amend approve the withdrawal of 1.50 acres, more or less, of Navajo Nation Trust Land for mission site purposes, and will approve the revocable use permit for the Azee' Bee Nahagha of Dine Nation of Whippoorwill Chapter.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed resolution in detail.

19	Section One. Findings
20	A. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §501 (B)(2)(a), the Resources and Development Committee of
21	the Navajo Nation Council has authority to give final approval of land withdrawals
22	and non-mineral leases of Navajo Nation trust land.
23	B. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1151 (C), the Resources and Development Committee of the
24	Navajo Nation Council has the authority to give approval on behalf of the Navajo
25	Nation for all revocable use permits for Mission Sites.
26	C. The Azee' Bee Nahagha of Dine Nation of Whippoorwill Chapter, P.O. Box 4228, Blue
27	Gap, Arizona 86520 has applied for a Revocable Use Permit for a Religious Site in the
28	Whippoorwill community to withdraw 1.50 acres, more or less, of Navajo Tribal Trust
29	lands, as further described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein this
30	reference.

- D. The Whippoorwill Chapter passed Resolution No. WC14-025 supporting the withdrawal of 1.5 acres, more or less, in the Whippoorwill Chapter vicinity, Navajo Nation (Navajo County, Arizona) for the establishment of the Azee' Bee Nahagha of Dine Nation to conduct Native American Church ceremonies, conferences, and meetings. The resolution and signed petition by local residents are attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit B.
- E. The proposed land withdrawal of Navajo Nation trust lands is more particularly described on the survey map attached hereto as Exhibit C.
- F. The site encompasses 1.50 acres, more or less, of the Navajo Nation Trust Land, which is located in the Southeast (SE1/4) of Section 9, Township 30 North, Range 21 East, situated in the Whippoorwill Spring area, Navajo County, Arizona. The land description appears on the survey plat attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit C.
- G. The District Grazing Official, David Shonie, identified two land users, who gave their consent without objection. The consent forms are attached as Exhibit D.
- H. Biological, Historical, Cultural and Archaeological surveys and clearances for this permit were completed including an Environmental Assessment report, and are all attached and labeled as Exhibit E.
- I. It is in the best interest of Whippoorwill community and the Navajo Nation that a land withdrawal and a Revocable Use Permit be approved for use by the Azee' Bee Nahagha of Dine Nation of the Whippoorwill Chapter. See additional supporting documents and approvals attached and labeled as Exhibit G.

Section Two. Approval:

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the withdrawal of 1.5 acres, more or less, of Navajo Nation Trust Land for mission site purposes. The 1.5 acres, more or less, are located in Whippoorwill Chapter, Navajo Nation (Navajo County, Arizona), as described in Exhibit C.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves and consents to the issuance of a Revocable Use Permit to the Azee' Bee Nahagha of Dine Nation of the Whippoorwill Chapter,

- subject to, but not limited to the attached Terms and Conditions both contained in Exhibit F which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.
- C. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council does hereby authorize the President of the Navajo Nation to execute all documents to affect the intent and purpose of the resolution.

All corporations must attach hereto a certified copy of their Articles of Incorporation. If foreign to the state where religious site is to be located, the corporation must supply a certified copy of their authority to do business in the state.

All corporations must furnish evidence of authority of the person(s) signing this application to execute papers on their behalf. Evidence should ordinarily be in the form of a general resolution of the Board of Directors certified by the Secretary over the seal of the corporation.

For the purpose of conducting business within the Navajo Reservation, all corporations must file their Articles of Incorporation with the Economic Development Commerce Department of the Navajo Nation. The Commerce Department will issue a corporate number to the church organization.

In all cases of applications on behalf of Unincorporated bodies where documents do not explicit give one individual authority to execute necessary papers, a power of attorney executed before a notary public by all associated parties for this purpose should be attached. If this is not supplied, all such persons must personally sign this application and all other documents submitted to the Navajo Agency.

Unincorporated applicants should submit articles depicting their organization, unless none exits, in which case an explanation of the nature of the organization should be listed on a separate sheet.

Applicant agrees to give preference to qualified local residents of the Navajo Nation for employment in the construction of any improvement on the church site if the permit is granted.

- 1. The Navajo Nation Council Resolution CS-34-98 enacted the Navajo Nation Local Governance Act and codified it under Title 26 of the Navajo Nation Code; and
- 2. Pursuant to Title 26 N.N.C., Section B-1&2, the purpose of the Local Governance Act is to recognize at the local level and to delegate to chapter government with respect to local matters consistent with Navajo Laws including custom and tradition and to make decisions over local matter; and
- 3. On October 04, 1981, he Whippoorwill Chapter approved land withdrawal of Native American Church of Navajoland (NACNL) of Whippoorwill Chapter, aid land located ¾ -mile south from the Whippoorwill Chapter House (attached EXHIBIT "i"); and
- 4. On December 02, 1981, he residents of the Whippoorwill Chapter submitted a petition to BIA Real Property Management, Chinle Agency, supporting land withdrawal for (NACNL) of Whippoorwill Chapter (attached EXHIBIT "ii"); and
- 5. On January 13, 1982, three (3) affected local customary land users signed a Land Use Consent form for (NACNL) of Whippoorwill Chapter for religious and related activities (attached EXHIBIT "<u>iii</u>"); and
- 6. On August 02, 2003, the (NACNL) officially changed its name from (NACNL of Whippoorwill Chapter (attached EXHIBIT "iiii"); and
- 7. On November 11, 2013, the Red Valley Survey performed a legal survey of the proposed land withdrawal for the ABNDN of Whippoorwill Chapter (attached EXHIBIT "iiii").

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Whippoorwill Chapter hereby supports and re-affirms the approval of One and Half (1.5) Acres of land withdrawal for the Azee Bee Nahagha of the Whippoorwill Chapter.



Ms. Genevieve Pino, Archeologist with the Navajo Nation Cultural Resource Management Program (NNCRMP) has recommended archeological clearance for a Native American Church site near Whippoorwill, which she surveyed on December 9,1981 (Report #CRMP-81-210).

The site lies on unplatted land in Navajo County at UTM coordinates (12), 582460E. 3986230N. A 3-acre tract was surveyed.

The inspection revealed no cultural resources within the project impact zone. Therefore, archeological clearance is granted for the 3-acre church tract described herein and indicated on the enclosed map.

This clearance does not constitute approval of right-of-way or concurrence in the proposed project by the Bureau of Indian Affairs. It is one of several mandated requirements which must be accomplished prior to the granting of rights-of-way, easements, or approvals by the BIA for land-modifying projects on lands under their jurisdiction.

Should any previously unrecorded and/or previously undetected cultural material be discovered during construction operations, all work must cease in the immediate area of the exposed resources. Archeologists from this office and from the NNCRMP should then be notified to arrange an on-site inspection to determine the significance and disposition of the archeological remains.

It is the responsibility of project sponsors to notify subcontractors of the boundaries of the archeological clearance and stipulations under which clearance is granted.



The Azee'Beee Nahagha of Dine Nation of Whippoorwill Chapter, PO Box 4228, BlueGap, Arizona, 86520, submitted a revocable use permit (RUP) application to withdraw 1.5 acres of the Navajo Nation land located in Whippoorwill, Navajo County, Arizona. The land site will be used to establish church house, office space and peyote ceremonies for Azee'Bee Nahagha of Dine Nation. A 25'x60' building will be built to serve as a church house and office space. A water well will be dug on the premise. Power is readily available from the main power line. The proposed site is located at LAT/LONG: 36°00'53.2"N 110°05'16.8"W, SE/4 of Section 09, T30N, R21E, G&SRM, Whipporwill, Navajo County, Arizona.

The Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency (NNEPA) reviewed 1 and recommends conditional approval for the proposed action. NNEPA Public Water System Supervision Program (PWSSP) recommends all proposed drinking water projects to be permitted by the PWSSP and all proposed drinking water projects (extensions, upgrades, new wells, new public water systems, etc.) must also comply with the design review and construction permit pursuant the \$\infty\$1501 and 1601 of the Navajo Nation Primary Drinking

3. Proposed Action

A. Project Description

The proposed project is a request for a Mission Site Permit and a withdrawal of Navajo Tribal trust land for programs of benefit to the Native American Church members and other activities associated to enhance and preserve religious teachings. The types of construction would include erection and completion of an office and church building, distribution of electrical and sanitary lines and equipment, and improvements but not a major alterations of natural environmental quality or degradation of important aesthetic resources.

B. Purpose and Need

The establishment of a church in the area is requested by public involvement in the decision making processes leading to proposed actions to foster, promote and preserve human values and religions. The need for a permit is a requirement of the Navajo Tribal Code and the Code of Federal Regulations promulgating procedures and practices on the Navajo Reservation in determining the best use and interest of property.

C. Location

The project would be in Northeastern Arizona in Navajo County of the newly Navajo Partition Land of the former Executive Order Joint-Use Area approximately one mile south of the Whipporwill Chapter. The total area to be impacted by this project is approximately two (2) acres, more or less.

D. Vicinity Map





Figure 1. Vicinity map of area where project will take place. The study site is indicated with a star.

- a. Figure 1 is a map showing the general location of the proposed project and action within Arizona.
- b. Figure 2 shows the site location on a reduced vicinity map of the area affected.

4. Existing Environment

A. Topography

Topography varies from a low, flat valley elevation of 6,100 feet above sea level surrounded by mesas and sloping plateaus that range up to 6,600 feet above sea level. The project area contains no unique topographical features, but is situated directly east at the base of Whippoorwill Spring Mesa.

B. Climate

The climate surrounding the Whippoorwill Chapter is representation of an area with low humidity and high aridity. The average annual precipitations is concentrated in the months of July through October.

The average minimum winter temperature is 10 degrees F and average maximum summer temperature is 95 degrees F.

C. Air Quality

The air quality in the proposed project area is very good.

D. Soils

The soil is generally poor in quality with a low production potential. The soil is witnessed to have little or no erosion hazard risk in the project area.

E. Water

The water supply in the immediate area is diminutive. However, there are 2 wells within the chapter area from where the community residents haul water. The IHS has initiated the construction of a new regional water system with 100,000 to 500,000 gallon capacity storage tank to service Pinon and Whippoorwill Chapters. No impact is anticipated on water quality or quantity.

F. Vegetation

The pre-dominent plant in the community is greasewood, rabbit brush with some scattered Pinon-Juniper in the higher elevations. Grounds cover consists of bunch grasses, shrubs such as rabbit brush, saltbrush, greasewood, shallowweed and some yucca. Vegetation of the project site is not unique or unusual, and reflects a history of heavy grazing by domestic animals, and very little forage remains.

G. Wild Life

The wild life species that are found in this area are prairie dogs, jack rabbits, antelope squirrels, pocket mouse, kangaroos rats, various lizards and snakes. Mammals living on or near project site will be unaffected by the project and will avoid human contact.

H. Domestic Livestock

Some of the domestic livestocks found in the area are owned by local livestock owners, and they are sheep, goats, horses and some hereford bred cattles. The project will not have a negative impact on domestic livestock because of the two acres involved and the poor grazing potential in its current state.

I. Threatened and/or Endangered species

There are no known endangered species inhabiting this vicinity.

J. Socio-economics

There are about seven (7) families living near the project area and the chapter house is about one (1) mile north from the area. The

presence of the mission site will not impact but provide direct and indirect benefits to the area residents with its support facilities.

K. Archeological

There are no archeological sites in the general project area. Archeological clearance has already been granted for this project as recommended in the archeological survey report submitted by Genevieve Pino, Navajo Nation Cultural Resource Management Program.

5. Impacts:

A. Physical Impacts:

Two (2) acreas of land will be utilized for the proposed project. The water quality will not be effected by the project. The air quality maybe temporarily altered by dust in the vicinity of the project during excavation of trench for footing and foundation of building.

B. Biotic Impacts:

There will be a slight impact on the wildlife in the immediate project area. There are no biotic biological impacts anticipated directly on the domestic livestocks.

C. Threatened and/or Endangered Species Impact:

There are no known endangered species in the vicinity, therefore, no serious impacts anticipated.

D. Socio-economic Impacts:

No socio-economic impact is anticipated in the general project area. There are no public facilities, or developed areas which will be adversely effected by proposed project.

E. Archeological Impacts:

There are no archeological sites on the project area. Archeological survey was conducted by Genevieve Pino, Navajo Nation Cultural Resource Management Program, and clearance No. is NTM 81-601. Survey was done December 09, 1981. Report No. CRMP-81-201.

6. Mitigation Measures

A. Physical Resources

There are no proposed compensation for the anticipated adverse impacts of the land, water and air quality. The quality of water and air will remain quite unchanged by this project.

B. Biotic Resources

The project after its completion will be fenced and anticipation of compensation for biotic impacts is negative. Livestock interference should be minimal because of sparse vegetation.

C. Socioeconomic Resources

The need for a Mission site has been petitioned for and a chapter meeting has been conducted that favored mission activities in the proposed area. Local land users have consented to use of their land use area.

This is a Revocable Use Permit ("Permit") entered into by and between The Navajo Nation and Azee' Bee Nahagha of Dine Nation of Whippoorwill Chapter ("Permittee"), P.O. Box 4228 Blue Gap, Arizona 86520

THE TRACT COVERED BY THIS PERMIT

The Tract covered by this Permit is an area located in the vicinity Whippoorwill Spring Chapter, and is specifically described as follows:

Legal Description

A tract of land located in the Southeast Quarter (SE ¼) of Section 9, Township 30 North, Range 21 East, G.&S.R.M., Navajo County, Arizona situated in the Whippoorwill Spring area and is more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the Point of Beginning a point being the Southwesterly corner of said Parcel which bears North 50° 59' 49" East, a distance of 1,291.80 feet from a reference Monument which is set for the South Quarter of said Section 9;

Thence North 09° 01' 40" East, a distance of 400.78 feet;

Thence South 83° 17' 45" East, a distance of 163.16 feet;

Thence South 09° 01' 56" West, a distance of 400.51 feet;

Thence North 83° 23' 28" West, a distance of 163.14 feet to the Point of Beginning

Said Parcel containing 1.5± Acres more or less in area and being subject to any restrictions, easements and reservations of record.

TERM OF USE

The term of the Permit is effective beginning on the date the permit is approved by	y the Re	esources
and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council or authorized representative	. This P	Permit is
authorized by Resources and Development Committee No		

This Permit is revocable at the discretion of the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. The Permit will automatically be revoked if the Permitee fails to use the land herein described for meetings, conferences and ceremonial purposes, or is in violation of any other provision of the Permit. It is understood and agreed that this instrument is **NOT A LEASE**. This Permit shall not to be construed as granting any leasehold interest or right in the land herein described, but is merely a temporary and terminable permit.

COMPENSATION FOR USE

The annual rental is set at \$\frac{1}{2} per year and is due on or before the first day of January of each year the Permit remains in effect. If the Permittee fails to pay the rent when due, this Permit will be automatically terminated. The Permittee is responsible to make direct payments to the Navajo Nation Accounts Receivable Section, Post Office Box 3150, Window Rock, Arizona 86515.

This Permit shall be reviewed every five (5) years to reevaluate the rent and compliance with the terms and conditions.

REVOCABLE USE PERMIT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

TERMS AND CONDITION OF USE

1. APPLICABILITY OF TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF USE

The terms and conditions contained herein shall extend to and be binding upon the successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees and agents, including all contractors and subcontractors, of the Permittee, and the term "Permittee," whenever used herein, shall be deemed to include all such successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees and agents.

2. PURPOSE AND CONDUCT OF BUSINESS

This Permit is issued to Permitee for the use and occupation of Navajo Nation Trust Lands for conducting meetings, conferences and ceremonial purposes, and shall be subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein.

3. TRANSFERABILITY

This Permit is not transferable. The Permittee shall not assign, convey or transfer, in any manner whatsoever, the permit or any interest therein, or in or to any of the improvements on the land subject to the permit, without the prior written consent of the Navajo Nation. Any such attempted assignment, conveyance or transfer of the permit without such prior written consent shall be void and of no effect. The consent of the Navajo Nation may be granted upon conditions or withheld in the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation.

4. DEVELOPMENT OF LAND

The Permitee may develop, use and occupy the area under the permit for the purpose(s) of conducting meetings, conferences and ceremonial functions. The Permittee may not develop, use or occupy the area under the permit for any other purpose without the prior written approval of the Navajo Nation. The approval of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon conditions or withheld in the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation.

5. LAWFUL ACTIVITY

The Permittee may not develop, use or occupy the area under the permit for any unlawful purpose. In all activities conducted by the Permittee within the Navajo Nation, the Permittee shall abide by all laws and regulations of the Navajo Nation and of the United States, now in force and effect or as hereafter may come into force and effect, including but not limited to the following:

- a. Title 25, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 162;
- b. All applicable federal and Navajo Nation antiquities laws and regulations, with the following additional condition: In the event of a discovery all operations in the immediate vicinity of the discovery must cease and the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department must be notified immediately. As used herein, "discovery" means any previously unidentified or incorrectly identified cultural resources, including but not limited to archeological deposits, human remains, or location reportedly associated with Native American religious/traditional beliefs or practices;
- c. The Navajo Preference in Employment Act, 15 N.N.C. §§ 601 et seq., and the Navajo Nation Business Opportunity Act, 5 N.N.C. §§ 201 et seq.; and

REVOCABLE USE PERMIT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- d. The Navajo Nation Water Code, 22 N.N.C. § 1101 et seq. Permittee shall apply for and submit all applicable permits and information to the Navajo Nation Water Resources Department, or its successor.
- e. All applicable air quality laws requiring Permitee to ensure that the air quality of the Navajo Nation is not jeopardized due to violation of applicable laws and regulations by its operations pursuant to the permit.

6. MAINTENANCE OF THE LAND AND IMPROVEMENTS THEREON

The Permittee shall clear and keep clear the lands within the permit area to the extent compatible with the purpose of the permit, and shall dispose of all vegetation and other materials cut, uprooted, or otherwise accumulated during any surface disturbance activities.

The Permittee shall at all times during the term of the permit and at the Permittee's sole cost and expense, maintain the land subject to the permit and all improvements located thereon and make all necessary and reasonable repairs.

7. INDEMNIFICATION

The Permittee shall indemnify and hold harmless the Navajo Nation and their respective authorized agents, employees, land users and occupants, against any liability for loss of life, personal injury and property damages arising from the development, use or occupancy of the permit area by the Permittee.

8. TERMINATION OF PERMIT

- a) The Navajo Nation may terminate the permit due to Permittee's violation of any of the terms and conditions stated herein. In addition, the permit shall be terminable in whole or part by the Navajo Nation or authorized representative for any of the following causes:
 - i. Failure to comply with applicable laws or regulations;
 - ii. Non-use of the permit; and
 - iii. Any use of the land within the permit area that is inconsistent with the purpose for which the permit is granted.
- b) At the termination of the permit, the Permittee shall peaceably and without legal process relinquish the possession of the premises in good condition, usual wear and tear excepted. Upon the written request of the Navajo Nation, the Permittee shall provide the Navajo Nation, at the Permittee's sole cost and expense, with an environmental audit assessment of the premises at least sixty (60) days prior to delivery of said premises.
- c) Holding over by the Permittee after the termination of the permit shall not constitute a renewal or extension thereof, or give the Permittee any rights to the land subject to the permit or to any improvements located thereon.
- d) The Permittee shall be given at least thirty (30) days written notice before this Permit is terminated and revoked, except in the case of nonpayment. If the Permittee fails to pay the rent when due, this Permit will be automatically terminated.

REVOCABLE USE PERMIT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

e) Upon termination of the Permit, the Permittee shall have ninety (90) days in which to remove from the site any and all buildings, structures, materials, equipment, and other personal property owned by the Permitee. After the expiration of ninety (90) days, the Permittee shall peacefully and without legal process deliver the possession of the premises to the Navajo Nation. All improvements not removed after ninety (90) days will become the property of the Navajo Nation, unless the Navajo Nation demands in writing that the improvements be removed.

INSPECTION OF PREMISES

The Navajo Nation shall have the right, at any reasonable time during the term of the permit, to enter upon the premises, or any part thereof, to inspect the same and any improvements located thereon.

10. JURISDICTION

- a) By acceptance of the grant of permit, the Permittee consents to the full territorial, legislative, executive, and judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation, including but not limited to the jurisdiction to levy fines and to enter judgments for compensatory and punitive damages and injunctive relief, in connection with all activities conducted by the Permittee within the Navajo Nation or which have a proximate (legal) effect on persons or property within the Navajo Nation.
- b) By acceptance of the grant of the permit, the Permittee covenants and agrees never to contest or challenge the legislative, executive, or judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation on the basis that such jurisdiction is inconsistent with the status of the Navajo Nation as an Indian nation, or that the Navajo Nation government is not a government of general jurisdiction, or that the Navajo Nation government does not possess full police power (i.e., the power to legislate and regulate for the general health and welfare) over all lands, persons and activities within its territorial boundaries, or on any other basis not generally applicable to a similar challenge to the jurisdiction of a state government. Nothing contained in this provision shall be construed to negate or impair federal responsibilities with respect to the land subject to the permit or to the Navajo Nation.
- c) There is expressly reserved to the Navajo Nation full territorial legislative, executive and judicial jurisdiction over the area under the permit and all lands burdened by the permit, including without limitation over all persons, including the public, and all activities conducted or otherwise occurring within the area under the permit; and the area under the permit and all lands burdened by the permit shall be and forever remain Navajo Indian Country for purposes of Navajo Nation jurisdiction.

11. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Any action brought by the Permittee against the Navajo Nation in connection with or arising out of the terms and conditions of the permit shall be resolved through informal negotiation and mediation.

12. SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY OF THE NAVAJO NATION

Nothing contained herein shall be interpreted as constituting a waiver, express or implied, of the sovereign immunity of the Navajo Nation.

REVOCABLE USE PERMIT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

13. CHOICE OF LAW

Except as prohibited by applicable federal law, the law of the Navajo Nation shall govern the construction, performance and enforcement of the terms and conditions contained herein.



RESOLUTION OF THE ABNDN, INC. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Approving the Azeé Bee Nahaghá of Diné Nation, Inc. Articles of Incorporation

WHEREAS:

- The Azeé Bee Nahaghá of Diné Nation, Inc. (ABNDN) is governed by the Board of Directors as provided for in its Constitution and Bylaws; and
- 2. The Native American Church of Navajoland (NACNL), now known as ABNDN, Inc., was established on June 11, 1966 as a non-profit organization. It incorporated in the state of New Mexico on May 15, 1972 by filing an Articles of Incorporation and a Certificate of Incorporation was issued on the same date; and
- In October 1982, Lloyd and Violet Etsitty of Chinle, Arizona filed an application to the Navajo Tribal Council and the Bureau of Indian Affairs requesting relinquishment of their farmland and assignment to the NACNL, Inc. for church and conferences site; and
- 4. On December 12, 1989, the Navajo Tribal Council Advisory Committee approved a Revocable Use Permit for parcel of land located in Chinle, AZ for NACNL, Inc. On April 3, 1992, the President of the Navajo Nation signed the permit designating a permanent business location for NACNL, Inc. in Chinle, Arizona; and
- 5. On June 11, 1984 and May 14, 1999, NACNL, Inc. incorporated in the state of Arizona in Phoenix, AZ and the Navajo Nation in Window Rock, AZ respectively as a foreign corporation; and
- 6. On August 2, 2003, the NACNL, Inc. Board of Directors officially approved changing the name of NACNL, Inc. to ABNDN, Inc.; and
- On January 23, 2004, the Navajo Nation officiated a Certificate of Amendment changing Corporate Name from Native American Church of Navajoland, Inc. to Azeé Bee Nahaghá of Diné Nation, Inc. through file # 100455; and
- 8. The initial Articles of Incorporation was filed with the state of New Mexico on May 15, 1972, since then the documents had been updated as follow:
 - A. December 27, 1993
 - B. August 4, 1997; and



ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION AZEÉ BEE NAHAGHÁ OF DINÉ NATION, INC.

ARTICLE I NAME AND LOCATION

SECTION 1.1 The name of the corporation shall be: Azeé Bee Nahaghá of Diné Nation, Inc. (ABNDN, Inc.)

SECTION 1.2 The principle place of business shall be:

Azeé Bee Nahaghá of Diné Nation, Inc. U. S. Hwy 191, Mile Post 452 P. O. Box 1570 Chinle, AZ 86503

SECTION 1.3 The ABNDN, Inc. will exist perpetual in the manner provided by law.

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

The purpose of this corporation (ABNDN, Inc.) is to:

SECTION 2.1 Foster, promote, protect, and preserve the teaching of Hinááh Azeé following the principles of Nitsáhákees, Nahat'á, Iiná, and Sihasin.

SECTION 2.2 Enhance self-reliance, self-respect, sobriety, charity, rightful living and work for unity in the meaningful use of Hinááh Azeé in a bona fide Azeé Bee Nahaghá.

SECTION 2.3 Advocate, support, sustain, and conduct traditional healing that cultivate mental and social wellbeing, seek harmony, balance, and strive for the common goods.

SECTION 2.4 Make it known that ABNDN, Inc. is a non-profit organization with tax exempt status exclusively for charitable and spiritual healing (Nahaghá) purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) and 509(a) of Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE III POWERS

SECTION 3.1 The Corporation shall be composed of members rather than stockholders. It shall issue no capital stock. No part of the corporation revenue shall be used to the benefit of, or be distributed to its members, board of directors, executive officials, or other private person,

except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distribution in furtherance of its purposes.

SECTION 3.2 The property of this corporation is dedicated to ABNDN 501(c)(3) exempt purpose(s), and no part of the assets of this corporation shall be used to the benefit of any member, director, official, or any private person. The greatest amount of indebtedness or liability to which the corporation may at any time subject itself, is \$100,000.

ARTICLE IV POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

SECTION 4.1 No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation. The corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE V INDEMNIFICATION

SECTION 5.1 The corporation shall indemnify (reimburse) any person for expenses incurred while serving at its direction, in all circumstances in which such indemnification is specifically permitted and provided for by the ABNDN Bylaws.

ARTICLE VI DISSOLUTION

SECTION 6.1 Upon the dissolution of this corporation, its remaining assets, if any, shall be distributed by the Board of Directors to one or more non-profit, charitable and spiritual healing (Nahaghá) organizations which are tax exempted under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, so that the remaining assets shall be used for the purpose of carrying on an activity consistent with the purposes for which this corporation was organized.

ARTICLE VII BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SECTION 7.1 The Board of Directors shall oversee the general affairs of the ABNDN, Inc. The Board of Directors may be elected or re-elected every four (4) years for additional term(s).

SECTION 7.2 There shall be at least not less than twelve (12) and not more than eighteen (18) Board of Directors; and shall serve a four (4) year term; coinciding with the term of the Executive officials. If a Board of Directors position becomes vacated, an ABNDN certified member shall be elected or appointed to serve the remaining term.

ARTICLE VIII EXECUTIVE OFFICIALS

SECTION 8.1 The Executive Official, the President and Vice-President shall be elected or reelected for a four (4) year term and shall appoint the Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 11.2 ABNDN membership is authorized and protected by; 1NNC Navajo Bill of Rights; 17 NNC Subsection 394(c) and 395(c), P.L. 103-344 American Indian Religion Freedom Act of 1994 and 1978, ARS § 13-3402B, NM Stat § 30-31-6 Schedule I.D, Utah Stat § 58-37-8(12)(a) and the Constitution of the United States of America.

ARTICLE XII AMENDMENT

SECTION 12.1 The Board of Directors shall have the power to adopt, amend, and rescind these Articles.

SECTION 12.2 Any proposed amendment(s) to the Article(s) shall be presented first to the general membership, then to the Board of Directors for final adoption. The amendment(s) shall be adopted by affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) majority votes cast at a meeting.


On February 19, 2014 our office staff met with Sylvia Mike to conduct a sanitary clearance located in the Southeast Quarter of Section 9, Township 30 North, Range 21 East, Gila and Salt River Meridian, Navajo County, Arizona, in Whippoorwill Springs area. The site is approximately 0.75 miles South-Southwest of Whippoorwill Chapter House off of Indian Route 65 in Whippoorwill, Arizona.

The site is a rectangular 1.5 acres tract of open land. It is flat and slopes down towards the East. The site has a fence running around the entire perimeter.


The proposed operations for this site are to conduct Native American Church activities such as gatherings, ceremonies, and other similar events. The site is currently used for activities a few times per year in which 150-200 people are usually anticipated to attend. The site was assessed to determine the feasibility of holding such activities as an operation.

There is one small open-air 'shack' that is set up to provide some shade and shelter and to be utilized for activities. There is no running water supply and no septic system for the site. Portable toilets are set up during events to control human wastes. Water supplies are brought in containers. It was indicated that there were no current plans to develop running water, gas supply, or septic systems. There were also no current plans to develop other structures that would need these utilities. There is one power line that runs to a pole that supplies the small shack structure on the property. There is no telephone service to this site.

The site is favorable for its intended functionality based on the information provided to us during the site visit and subsequently described within this document.


