RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL, CONFIRMING BIDTAH N. BECKER AS NAVAJO NATION DIVISION OF NATURAL RESOURCES EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Findings

- A. The Navajo Nation President appoints a person as the Navajo Nation Division of Natural Resources Executive Director. 2 N.N.C. § 1903.
- B. The appointed Navajo Nation Division of Natural Resources Executive Director serves at the Navajo Nation President's pleasure. *Id*.
- C. The Navajo Nation Council gave the Resources and Development Committee legislative oversight over the Navajo Nation Division of Natural Resources. 2 N.N.C. §§ 501(C)(1) see also CJA-03-13, 22nd Navajo Nation Council (2013) and 1905 see also CJA-03-13, 22nd Navajo Nation Council, sect. 5, 30 (2013).
- D. A proposed resolution requiring final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9).
- E. The Navajo Nation Division of Natural Resources Executive Director maintain the purposes found at 2 N.N.C. §1902.

Section Two. Appointment of the Navajo Nation Division of Natural Resources Executive Director

The Navajo Nation President appoints Bidtah N. Becker as the Navajo Nation Division of Natural Resources Executive Director. Ms. Becker's appointment letter and resume are attached as EXHIBIT A.

Section Three. Confirmation of the Navajo Nation Division of Natural Resources Executive Director

- 1. The Navajo Nation Council confirms Bidtah N. Becker as the Navajo Nation Division of Natural Resources Executive Director. 2 N.N.C. §1903.
- 2. Ms. Becker shall serve at the Navajo Nation President's pleasure. *Id.*


