TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO THE LAW AND ORDER, BUDGET AND FINANCE, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES, AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE SHIPROCK JUDICIAL AND PUBLIC SAFETY CENTER FACILITIES SÍHASIN FUND EXPENDITURE PLAN PURSUANT 12 N.N.C §§ 2501 – 2508

PURPOSE: The purpose of this legislation is to allocate Síhasin Funds for a Judicial and Public Safety Center in Shiprock, New Mexico.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

- E. The Naabik'íyáti Committee of the 24th Navajo Nation Council continued the Naabik'íyáti Síhasin Fund Subcommittee in Resolution NABIAP-23-19. The Naabik'íyáti Síhasin Fund Subcommittee was initially established in 2015 by Resolution NABIAP-20-15 to provide recommendations to the Naabik'íyáti Committee and Navajo Nation Council for projects to be funded using Síhasin Funds. Notwithstanding the creation and continuation of the Naabik'íyáti Síhasin Fund Subcommittee, approval from the Subcommittee is not a requirement for the Navajo Nation Council to approve Síhasin Fund expenditure plans.
- F. The Navajo Nation Code provides the purpose of the Navajo Nation Síhasin Fund ("Síhasin Fund") is as follows:

§ 2502 Purpose

- A. The purposes of this Fund are to provide financial support and/or financing for:
 - The planning and development of economic development and regional infrastructure supporting economic development and community development, including such infrastructure as, but not limited to, housing, commercial and government buildings, waterline, solid waste management development, powerline projects, and transportation and communication systems, within the Navajo Nation; and
 - Education opportunities for members of the Navajo Nation.
- B. For the Purpose in § 2502(A)(1), Fund expenditures for infrastructure shall not be limited by 12 NNC § 1310(F) or TCDCJY-77-99.
- C. Leveraging the Fund by way of guaranteeing loans, match funding, direct funding in part, and other weighted uses of the Fund, including loan financing from the Fund, for the purposes in § 2502(A)(1), shall be favored over direct funding in whole.

- G. The Sihasin Fund provides that "Fund Principal" shall consist of all deposits made to the Sihasin Fund and that "Fund Income" shall consist of all earnings (interest, dividends, etc.) generated and realized by the Fund Principal, and that Fund Income shall be deposited in and added to Fund Principal until such time as a Fund Expenditure Plan is duly adopted. 12 N.N.C. §§ 2504 and 2505 (C).
- H. The Síhasin Fund provides that "Fund Principal and Income shall not be expended except pursuant to a Fund Expenditure Plan consistent with the purposes set forth in § 2502 of this Chapter and adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Navajo Nation Council." 12 N.N.C. § 2505(A).

Section Two. Findings

- A. The Shiprock Judicial Public Safety Facility Project will replace the Northern Navajo Agency Judicial and Public Safety Facility in Shiprock, New Mexico. The public safety facility has been closed due to structural and environmental concerns. These concerns include the presence of lead, asbestos, and mold. As a result, the Navajo Nation has been denied a sanitation permit since 2010.
- B. The Northern Navajo Agency Judicial and Public Safety facility serves an area consisting of 2,726,438 acres of land with a population of over 29,803. Additional details on the service area are provided in the "Shiprock Judicial Public Safety Project" attached as Exhibit A.
- C. Proposed budgets and a proposed construction schedule can be found at Exhibit B.
- D. The proposed Shiprock Judicial Public Safety Facility will consist of the following:
 - 1. Corrections Facility, (budget \$35,541,420),
 - 2. Police Facility, (budget \$14,455,819),
 - 3. Courts Facility, (budget \$10,185,069),
 - 4. Medical Examiner Facility, (budget \$1,759,692), and
 - 5. Relocation Costs, (budget \$4,094,301).
 - This reflects a total cost of construction and relocation for all facilities of \$66,036,301.

E. The total cost to the Navajo Nation for construction of the Shiprock Judicial Public Safety Facility will be offset by \$3,150,000 from Authorized New Mexico Funds Credit. This is a reimbursable credit that will result in cost savings to the Navajo Nation, Additionally, preconstruction costs have been paid for through the allocation of \$3,150,000 from the Navajo Nation Judicial/Public Safety Fund.

Section Three. Approval and Adoption of Expenditure Plan

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves and adopts the Shiprock Síhasin Public Safety Facility Expenditure Plan, attached and incorporated herein as Exhibit B.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves and adopts funding to the Shiprock Síhasin Public Safety Facilities Expenditure Plan for \$66,036,301.
- C. The Síhasin Funds allocated for the Síhasin Public Safety Facilities Expenditure Plan may be further leveraged by bond or loan financing pursuant to the Navajo Nation Bond Financing Act, 12 N.N.C. § 1300 et seq., as amended, using Síhasin Fund earnings for repayment and financing costs upon the recommendation of the Budget and Finance Committee and approval by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Navajo Nation Council.

Section Four. Approval and Adoption of Expenditure Plan Administration

The Navajo Nation hereby approves administration of the Shiprock Síhasin Public Safety Facility Expenditure Plan follows:

- 1. The Navajo Nation Controller shall determine whether the source of the annual allocations from the total allocation of \$66,036,301 will be Síhasin Fund Principal or Income or a combination of both;
- 2. The funding for the Shiprock Síhasin Public Safety Facility Expenditure Plan will be distributed to the Division of Public Safety pursuant to a construction plan or drawdown schedule agreed to by the Office of the Controller and the Department of Public Safety, within 30 days of the formal adoption of this legislation.

- 3. The funds allocated for the Síhasin Public Safety Facilities Expenditure Plan shall be used solely to design, plan, and construct the Síhasin Public Safety Facilities Expenditure Plan described in Exhibits A and B. Any and all costsavings shall be returned to the to the Síhasin Fund once the safety facilities are completed; and
- 4. The funds allocated for the Síhasin Public Safety Facilities Expenditure Plan shall not lapse on an annual basis pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §820(N), however, any funds not spent or encumbered within twenty-four (24) months of the date funds are made available to the Department of Public Safety shall revert to the Síhasin Fund principal, unless recommended otherwise by the Law and Order Committee of the Navajo Nation Council and approved by the Naabik'íyáti' Committee.

Section Five. Effective Date

The Síhasin Public Safety Facilities Expenditure Plan, as set forth above, shall become effective pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 2505.

Section Six. Directives

The Department of Public Safety shall report the status of the Shiprock Síhasin Public Safety Facilities Expenditure Plan to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee on a quarterly basis.

This proposal is for project funding to replace the Northern Navajo Agency Judicial & Public Safety facility in Shiprock, New Mexico. The public safety facility has been closed due to extensive structural and environmental health concerns causing an emergency situation for this vast area of the Navajo Nation and northern New Mexico. The Northern Navajo Medical Center's Office of Environmental Health and Sanitation has conducted yearly inspections of the Shiprock Public Safety facility and has recommended against the renewal of the sanitation permit. The last time a sanitation permit was issued was in 2010 due to the severe environmental and safety conditions, which include the presence of mold, lead and asbestos throughout the facility. This facility was built in 1959. The Navajo Police had 3,100 square feet space to operate from and the Shiprock Detention uses 4,400. The Court is located adjacent to the Public Safety facility and has the same structural conditions although it was built in 1972.

The Northern Navajo Agency Judicial and Public Safety facility provides services that cover 2,726,438 acres of land with a population of over 29,803 (U.S. Census, 2010). The Shiprock Public Safety alone serves the 21 Navajo Chapters in the northern region of the Navajo Nation. There are two Navajo Nation judicial courts in Aneth, Utah, and Shiprock New Mexico, that serve this region and rely on the Shiprock Navajo Police and Detention to house individuals who are sentenced to serve time in jail. Sometimes the Shiprock Police and/or Detention transport detainees to Aneth, Utah, for court.

The Shiprock Judicial District, including the district and family courts, Peacemaking Program, and Office of Probation & Parole Services, that would be housed in the proposed Judicial and Public Safety facility covers 17 Navajo Nation chapters, in whole or in part. Most of the service area is in New Mexico. The judicial district has on average more than 60 daily visitors and an annual caseload of 6,782. This judicial district has had the second highest caseload of all judicial districts of the Navajo Nation from Fiscal Year 2015 to Fiscal Year 2017.

The Northern Navajo Agency is the largest populated community of the Navajo Nation. The closure of the public safety facility which serves this entire region will devastate 21 Navajo communities. Each year the Navajo Police respond to more than 25,000 calls for services with more than 7,000 individuals detained in the Shiprock Detention facility. The closure of the detention facility has handicapped the operation of the Navajo Police and Criminal Investigators limiting the arrest, detention and prosecution of criminals. When the Navajo Police make arrests, they will be transporting individuals either 101 miles to the Kayenta correctional facility or 116 miles to the Crownpoint facility. These transports can take an officer off the road a full day and time spent transporting arrestees and inmates limits the response of Police Officers to calls for services.

The Northern Navajo Judicial Public Safety Facility (Project) is designed as one of the large Judicial Public Safety Centers on the Navajo Nation. The proposed replacement of the Shiprock facility is to construct a 115,000 square ft. facility at an estimated cost of \$76,565,004 for planning, design and construction. The Project team received \$3,150,000 from the Navajo Nation through Judicial/Public Safety Special Revenue. The Nation is requesting \$3,500,000 from the New Mexico Governor's Office to assist with the project.

As requested, I have prepared the above-referenced proposed resolution and associated legislative summary sheet pursuant to your request for legislative drafting. Based on existing law and review of documents submitted, the resolution as drafted is legally sufficient. As with any action of government however, it can be subject to review by the courts in the event of proper challenge.

Please ensure that this particular resolution request is precisely what you want. You are encouraged to review the proposed resolution to ensure that it is drafted to your satisfaction.

The Office of Legislative Counsel confirms the appropriate standing committee(s) based on the standing committees' powers outlined in 2 N.N.C. §§301, 401, 501, 601 and 701. Nevertheless, "the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council shall introduce [the proposed resolution] into the legislative process by assigning it to the respective oversight committee(s) of the Navajo Nation Council having authority over the matters for proper consideration." 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(5).
