### RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL

### 23rd NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL -- Fourth Year, 2018

### AN ACTION

RELATING TO NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OF KENNETH MARYBOY TO THE COMMISSION ON NAVAJO GOVERNMENT DEVELOPMENT FOR A TERM OF FOUR YEARS, AS THE NORTHERN NAVAJO AGENCY REPRESENTATIVE

### BE IT ENACTED:

### SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 970, the Naabik'íyáti' Committee shall have legislative oversight authority over the Commission on Navajo Government Development and the Office of Navajo Government Development.
- B. The Navajo Nation established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered the Naabik'íyáti' Committee to recommend all resolutions to the Navajo Nation Council on matters within the Committee's jurisdiction pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 701(A)(3).
- C. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 972(A)(5), "[f]ive members shall be nominated from the five agencies of the Navajo Nation."

### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Commission on Navajo Government Development is an "entity created by the Navajo Nation Council with quasi-independent authority to accomplish the Council's project of instituting reforms necessary to ensure an accountable and responsible government." 2 N.N.C. § 970.
- B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 970, the Commission shall be responsible directly to the Navajo Nation Council with respect to overall activities.
- C. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 971(A)-(B), the purpose of the Commission on Navajo Government Development shall be as follows:

- 1. To review and evaluate all aspects of the existing government structure of the Navajo Nation including laws, rules and regulations, practices, functions, goals and objectives of the central government as it relates to Chapters, and local communities and the relationship of Chapters and local communities and the relationship of Chapters and local communities to the central government.
- 2. To develop recommendations and proposals for alternative forms of Chapter government and Chapter empowerment or local community empowerment for consideration and possible adoption by the Navajo People through a referendum vote.
- D. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C.  $\S$  972(A), the Commission shall consist of twelve (12) members confirmed by and serving at the pleasure of the Navajo Nation Council.
- E. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 972(A)(5), "[f]ive members shall be nominated from the five agencies of the Navajo Nation. Each agency council shall nominate one member from recommendations to be submitted by Chapters in each agency, said nominees shall be either Chapter officers or Grazing Committee/Land Board members. These members shall serve a term of four years from the date of confirmation by the Navajo Nation Council so long as they continue as Chapter officer or Grazing Committee/Land Board member."
- F. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 972(D), Commission members shall be chosen from among individuals who have demonstrated scholarship, strong sense of public interest, knowledge of Navajo history and cultural heritage, spiritual leadership, leadership in the Navajo government and abilities likely to contribute to the fulfillment of the duties of the Commission.
- G. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 972(A)(5), the Northern Navajo Agency Council has recommended Kenneth Maryboy to represent the Northern Navajo Agency on the Commission on Navajo Government Development. See Northern Navajo Agency Council Resolution NNAC-58-011718 attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.
- H. Kenneth Maryboy's letter of interest, résumé, and election documents are attached hereto as **Exhibits B**, C, and D, respectively.

### SECTION THREE. APPOINTMENT

Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 972(A)(5), the Navajo Nation Council hereby confirms the appointment of Kenneth Maryboy as the Northern Navajo Agency representative to serve on the Commission on Navajo Government Development, for a term of four years from the date of confirmation by the Navajo Nation Council.

### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

 The Northern Navajo Agency Council approves to support and recommend appointing Kenneth Maryboy, Chapter President of the Mexican Water Chapter and the Navajo Utah Commission Member to serve on the Northern Navajo Nation Government Development Commission and to receive acknowledge of the appointment.
